

‘Indiramma’ House a Symbol of Dignity for the Poor - MLA KR Nagaraju Sanction Letters Distributed to 61 Beneficiaries

““““Hanumakonda, May 12 (Indian Chronicle) : Stating that fulfilling the dream of home ownership for the poor is a primary objective of the people’s government, Vardhannapet MLA and retired IPS officer KR Nagaraju said that providing shelter and security to every poor family is the government’s responsibility. “On Tuesday, at the MLA camp office in Subedari, Hanumakonda, he distributed Indiramma housing sanction letters to 61 beneficiaries from Divisions 2, 46, 56, and 64 under the limits of the Greater Warangal Municipal Corporation. “Congratulating the beneficiaries on the occasion, the MLA advised them to complete the construction of their houses within the stipulated timeframe and make proper use of the financial assistance provided under the scheme. Describing a house as “a symbol of self-respect for the poor,” he said that, in line with the promise made during the elections, sanction letters are being issued to eligible poor families who possess house sites and land ownership documents. He instructed beneficiaries to construct houses measuring between 400 and 600 square feet as per government guidelines. “He explained that the government would provide a total financial assistance of ₹5 lakh in four phases for the construction of Indiramma houses. An amount of ₹1 lakh will be deposited after completion of the basement, ₹1 lakh after the walls are built, ₹2 lakh after the slab is completed, and the remaining ₹1 lakh after the full completion of the house. The funds will be directly credited to the beneficiaries’ bank accounts through a transparent green channel system. “The MLA assured that he would personally visit and inspect each house during the construction phase and extend support like a family member. He urged beneficiaries to begin construction immediately and complete it at the earliest. “He further stated that efforts would be made to facilitate loans through women’s self-help groups if required, and assistance would be provided to those who do not have bank accounts to open them. For beneficiaries lacking financial capacity, steps would be taken to undertake house construction with the support of Astronic



Company, if necessary. He reassured that no one should lose confidence, reiterating that the government’s goal is to ensure that every eligible poor family realizes the dream of owning a home. “Leaders, party workers, women, youth representatives, beneficiaries, and officials from the concerned divisions participated in the programme.

CM warns officials against negligence in paddy, maize procurement

Collectors told to ensure smooth operations, adequate storage and timely payments to farmers.

KARIMNAGAR May 12 (Correspondent): Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Tuesday warned officials of strict action against negligence in paddy and maize procurement operations and directed district administrations to work in mission mode to prevent inconvenience to farmers during the procurement season.

Reviewing procurement operations with District Collectors through a video conference, the Chief Minister instructed officials to ensure proper coordination at all levels and strengthen storage, transportation and monitoring mechanisms across the State.

He directed officials to take private warehouses under government control if necessary and utilise community halls and Rythu Bazaars as temporary storage facilities to manage the large inflow of produce. Stressing transparency in procurement, Mr. Reddy said quality checks should be completed at procurement centres and receipts issued immediately to farmers. He expressed concern over reports of deductions being made after paddy reached rice mills and said such practices would not be tolerated. The Chief Minister instructed officials to ensure full utilisation of local hamalis and prevent shortages at procurement centres. He also directed authorities to deploy all available tractors, DCMs and transport vehicles for shifting produce and keep tarpaulin covers ready in view of possible rains. District Collectors were asked to



conduct regular field visits and respond immediately to complaints and adverse reports related to procurement operations. Warning against laxity, Mr. Reddy said action would be taken against officials and transport contractors found neglecting their duties. Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy said the State had set a target of procuring 90 lakh metric tonnes of paddy during the Yasangi season. So far, 25.78 lakh metric tonnes had been procured through 8,575 procurement centres across Telangana, he said. The Minister stated that ₹3,873 crore had already been released towards Minimum Support Price payments to farmers and added that sufficient quantities of gunny bags had been arranged across the State. Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said maize production during the Yasangi season had been high and instructed officials to ensure smooth procurement without causing hardship to farmers. Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao said the State government had approved ₹4,178 crore for maize procurement and added that large-scale storage

arrangements were being made to accommodate arrivals. District Collector Chitra Mishra, Additional Collector Srinivas Reddy and senior officials from the Civil Supplies, Marketing and Police departments participated in the review meeting from Karimnagar.

Encroachment of Canal Land in Minister Ponguleti's Constituency

**“Government Must Take Immediate Action Against Illegal Constructions
DVN Sharath Kumar, Cvongress Party**

Vice President, Edulapuram 2nd Ward

Khammam, Edulapuram May 12 Indian Chronicle: “DVN Sharath Kumar, Vice President of the Congress Party's 2nd Ward in Edulapuram Municipality, alleged that people are facing severe difficulties due to encroachments on the NSP Link Canal in Khammam Rural Mandal. He expressed surprise that such illegal encroachments are continuing in the constituency represented by Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy. He demanded that the government immediately take strict action to protect public lands. “On this occasion, he submitted a representation to Edulapuram Municipal Commissioner Alla Srinivas Reddy. Speaking to the media later, Sharath Kumar stated that illegal constructions are rapidly increasing around the NSP Link Canal within the limits of Edulapuram Municipal-



ity in Khammam Rural Mandal. “He alleged that some private individuals had illegally occupied canal land and undertaken unauthorized house constructions. Local residents, he said, are expressing concern that these encroachments are creating serious problems during the rainy season. “He further stated that illegal constructions are reportedly taking place in the buffer zone of the link canal that flows from the NSP main canal through Pallegudem, Reddypalli, Polepalli, Sai Ganesh Nagar, Shirdi Sai Nagar, and Karunagiri areas before joining the Munneru stream, violating government regulations. “Sharath Kumar said that despite repeated complaints to the concerned authorities, no action has been taken so far. Due to these constructions, the natural width of the canal has reduced and the water flow path has also changed, according to local residents. “As a result, natural drainage of floodwater during the monsoon season is being severely obstructed, leading to waterlogging on roads. Stagnant floodwater in vacant areas is also causing an increase in mosquito breeding and the risk of infectious diseases, while foul smell is creating inconvenience for residents. “He noted that roads and other public infrastructure built by the state government at a cost of crores of rupees are also being damaged due to the encroachments. “Sharath Kumar said complaints have already been submitted to the Edulapuram Municipal Commissioner and the District Collector regarding the issue. Local residents are demanding a joint survey by the Municipal, Revenue, and Irrigation Departments to determine the original dimensions of the canal and the details of the buffer zone. “He also revealed that an RTI application under the Right to Information Act, 2005, has been submitted to the Irrigation Department Chief Engineer seeking details of the original canal records, buffer zone information, previous survey reports, action taken against illegal constructions, and future protection measures. “Residents are urging the concerned departments to respond immediately and take strict action against the illegal encroachments in order to protect public lives, health, and government property. “[6:42 PM, 5/12/2026] +91 96187 88997: End

NEET Exam Cancelled – Students' Future Plunged into Darkness – Rahmathulla Mohammed

““Hanumakonda, May 12 (Indian Chronicle) : Congress youth leader Rahmathulla Mohammed expressed deep concern, stating that the cancellation of the NEET-2026 examination has cast the future of lakhs of students across the country into uncertainty. ““He recalled that over 2.2 million students had prepared for this examination, toiling tirelessly day and night in their pursuit of achieving their goals. He noted that some parents had incurred debts to fund their children's education, while others made immense sacrifices—even selling their jewelry—to secure their children's future. ““He criticized the Central Government, asserting that students who studied honestly and worked hard are now forced to face severe consequences solely due to the Centre's negligence toward the education system and its failure to curb paper-leakage rackets. He stated that recurring paper leaks, corruption, and administrative failures are subjecting students to immense mental stress, financial burdens, and deep uncertainty regarding their future. He remarked that it is highly unfortunate that while those involved in paper-leakage rackets manage to evade the law, it is the honest students who end up suffering the losses. ““He warned that if the education system is allowed to function under the sway of money and political influence—rather than prioritizing merit and hard work—the future of the nation's youth will be in grave peril. Rahmatullah Mohammed demanded that the Central Government conduct a comprehensive inquiry into this incident, take strict action against those responsible, and ensure that justice is served to the victimized students.



Routhu Sankepalli Progressing on the Path of Development

““Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, May 12: Integrated Tribal Development Agency Project Officer Manda Makarand stated that Routhu Sankepalli village in Asifabad district has been steadily progressing on the path of development over the past eight months under the guidance of the State Governor. “On Tuesday, the Project Officer inspected the ongoing development activities in Routhu Sankepalli village. Speaking on the occasion, he said that the government is committed to rural development and that, based on the requests of villagers, the Governor had provided special guidance for undertaking developmental activities in the village. “He stated that special focus has been given to issues related to land, land titles, drinking water, roads, and agriculture. “During the interaction, villagers urged officials to transfer forest land title deeds to the legal heirs of deceased farmers through mutation and provide inheritance rights to their family members. “They also requested that poor tribal families who have been cultivating government lands for several years be granted permanent land ownership rights in accordance with government rules. “Villagers further explained that, despite possessing title deeds for forest lands, restrictions imposed by Forest Department officials are creating serious difficulties for farmers in carrying out agricultural activities. They appealed to the authorities to issue suitable directions to ensure that farmers can cultivate their lands freely. “The villagers also brought several infrastructure-related issues to the attention of



the Project Officer. They highlighted the severe drinking water problem in the Kolam Guda area and requested immediate resolution. “They appealed for the construction of CC roads in the village to improve transportation facilities and reduce hardships faced by people during the rainy season. “Village elders assured full cooperation to all government initiatives aimed at village development and requested the Governor to give special consideration to the problems faced by the villagers and initiate immediate measures for their resolution. “Later, the Project Officer visited the Kolam Guda Multipurpose Centre in Golethi village of Rebbena mandal and reviewed the facilities, maintenance, and services being provided to the public. Farmer Welfare-Government's Primary Goal: CM Revanth Reddy

“Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, May 12: Telangana Chief Minister Anumula Revanth Reddy stated that farmer welfare and the overall development of the state are the primary objectives of the government. “On Tuesday, the Chief Minister conducted a review meeting through video conference from Hyderabad with state ministers, senior officials, District Collectors, Additional Collectors, and other concerned officers from all districts. “Speaking on the occasion, the Chief Minister said that, as part of the government’s commitment to farmer welfare, procurement centres have been established to purchase quality paddy from farmers as per prescribed norms, and payments are being directly credited into farmers’ bank accounts. “He instructed officials to ensure that farmers visiting procurement centres do not face any inconvenience and directed that the procurement process be carried out swiftly. In view of the unseasonal rains, officials were also asked to make necessary arrangements to prevent the harvested grain from getting wet. “The Chief Minister further directed officials to effectively implement the 99-day action plan under the Praja Palana Progress Programme through proper coordination among departments. “District Collector K. Haritha, Additional Collector (Revenue) David, Kagaznagar Sub-Collector Shradha Shukla, and other concerned officials attended the video conference from the Integrated District Offices Complex conference hall at the district headquarters. “Later, the District Collector held a review meeting with district-level officials. Addressing the meeting, she stated that maize procurement centres have been established through MARKFED in Jainoor, Kagaznagar, and Koutala mandals, and around 900 quintals of maize have been procured so far. “She further informed



that 40 procurement centres have been opened for Yasangi season paddy procurement, and paddy procurement operations are currently underway in nine centres. Higher arrivals of paddy are expected at procurement centres located in Dahegaon, Laggam, Odduguda, Giravelli, Chandrapelli, Sandgaon, Dubbaguda, Veeravelli, Gudladori, Sirpur-T, Seethanagar, and Ravindra Nagar. “The Collector stated that additional hamalis (loading workers) and weighing machines are being arranged, and there is no shortage of gunny bags in the district. She also instructed officials to procure gunny bags locally from farmers wherever available by making payments accordingly. “Officials were advised to utilise local labourers instead of depending on workers from other states. Mandal Agriculture Officers and Agriculture Extension Officers are to be appointed as in-charge officers for each procurement centre. “District-level officers were instructed to visit procurement centres daily, monitor procurement activities, and submit morning and evening reports regularly. “The Collector clarified that there is no shortage of warehouse space in the district and directed officials to ensure that weighed paddy is immediately transported to the allotted rice mills for timely unloading. “She also stated that there is no shortage of transport vehicles and advised officials to utilise locally available vehicles whenever necessary. “Officials were instructed to work in coordination to ensure that the procurement process is carried out smoothly without causing inconvenience to farmers. Necessary precautions were also directed in view of the unseasonal rains. “District Rural Development Officer Dattarao, Cooperative Department Officer Mohan, District Transport Officer Ram Chander, Marketing Officer Ashwak Ahmed, and other officials participated in the programme. “Issued by the District Public Relations Officer, Kumuram Bheem Asifabad District.

Help Desk Set Up in Bhadrachalam for SIR Mapping Process

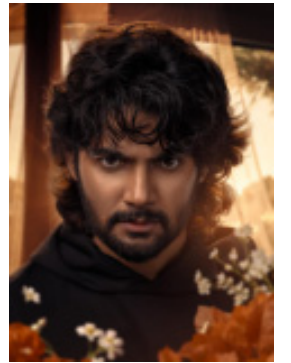

Addressing a press conference at state party office here, Rao condemned the criticism from CM Revanth Reddy and Congress National President Mallikarjun Kharge asserting that the Prime Minister's call for self-reliance and financial discipline was made in the interest of the nation's future. "The PM has urged citizens to use public transport, solar pumps, and electric vehicles while supporting 'Vocal for Local, he said adding that these are measures for environmental protection and fuel conservation, practiced even by world leaders in London, Singapore, and Japan,". He emphasized that individual financial discipline is the bedrock of a nation's economic strength. Taking a dig at the Congress party, BJP state chief reminded Congress leaders that their own leaders had appealed for public sacri-

ifice by Jawaharlal Nehru, Lal Bahadur Shastri and Indira Gandhi when they were Prime Minister. While Jawaharlal Nehru had asked citizens to reduce rice and bread consumption and suggested fasting once a week. CM Revanth Reddy (Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle" 12):- State Chief Minister Revanth Reddy has warned the concerned officials that immediate action will be taken against the officials if they neglect to purchase grain and maize crops. On Tuesday, on the purchase of maize and grain * CM Revanth Reddy, Ministers Uttam Kumar Reddy, Tummala Nageswara Rao, Komatireddy Venkat Reddy, Vakiti Srihari, Dhanasari Anasuya (Sitakka), Adluri Laxman Kumar, State Chief Secretary K. Along with Ramakrishna Rao*, a meeting was held with the Collectors of all the districts through video conference and reviewed. District Collector Anurag Jayanthi along with Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy participated from the video conference hall. In this context, the Chief Minister of the state said that he directed the district collectors to work in coordination with the district administration so that the farmers do not face any problems in the purchase of maize and grain. It is suggested that every private warehouse in the district should be taken over by the government if necessary and all necessary laws should be used to increase the storage facilities. Community halls and farmers' markets were ordered to be used as temporary sheds. The district SPs and high-level police officers are advised to actively participate in the purchase process and complete the necessary vehicle arrangements immediately. He suggested that activities should be designed so that the local porters can be used 100% in the district and measures should be taken to avoid shortage of porters anywhere. It has been clarified that if the porters demand a large amount of money, their licenses should be canceled and the necessary cooperation of the police should be taken. In some places, the CM has made it clear that cuts are being made due to the receipts being given to the farmers after reaching the rice mills. The officials were directed to make full use of all the vacant vehicles, tractors and DCMs for crop transportation. It is advised to keep tarpaulin covers ready at the purchase centers. He said that necessary arrangements should be made for the purchase of wet grain. The CM ordered that an effective officer should be appointed to supervise the purchases for each rice mill and the respective officials should send reports every day. It has been clarified that the District Collectors should take full responsibility for the purchase of purchases. The CM ordered the District Collectors to work in mission mode. He ordered to hold a teleconference every day and review the progress of the purchases. He warned that immediate action will be taken against the officials who take the matter of purchases lightly. The CM ordered that the farmers should not be on the road due to various problems every day, and criminal cases should be registered against the transport contractors who did not give vehicles for transportation as per the rules. Later, Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy said. He said that the target of purchase has been set. He said that the central government has set a target of only 52 lakh metric tons. He said that so far 25 lakh 78 thousand metric tons of grain has been purchased through 8,575 grain buying centers across the state. At present, 11 lakh 52 thousand tons of grain is pending at the buying centers. So far for minimum support price payments to farmers Rs. 3,873 crores have been released through banks, he said. He clarified that 18 crore 68 lakh gunny bags have been made available across the state and there is no shortage. It is suggested that there should be a system so that no matter what kind of problems there are in the field, feedback should be received immediately. The minister made it clear that the district collectors should take full responsibility for the purchase of grain. Officials have been ordered to take action without shortage of gunny bags, porters and transport vehicles at the purchase centers. He suggested that the tab entries should be completed immediately so that the payments are made to the farmers quickly. Similarly, Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao said that there has been a huge yield of maize during the Yasangi season and the farmers should carry out the purchases smoothly without any problems. The minister ordered the officials to be alert to prevent grain and maize from other states from entering Telangana. It is suggested to arrange necessary arrangements and vigilance. He directed the offi-



cial to increase the speed of purchases by conducting a regular review of the rain forecasts..Also, the chief secretary of the state government said that large scale purchases of maize are being done in the state. It is suggested that the next one month is very important and steps should be taken to ensure that the farmers do not suffer any loss. He said that during the Yasangi season, 16 lakh acres of maize was cultivated across the state and the average yield was 25 quintals per acre. For maize purchases, the state cabinet has allocated Rs. He said that 4,178 crores have been approved. So far 8 lakh metric tonnes of maize has been purchased by the government, but after the government started buying, private traders also bought another 6 lakh tonnes at high prices. He said that while a total storage capacity of 14 lakh 90 thousand metric tons is required, 10 lakh tonnes of storage capacity has already been prepared. It is stated that if the farmers themselves bring gunny bags, they will make payments through DBT. He said that continuous coordination with the collectors on the issues of porters, gunny bags and storage capacity is continuing. Hamali charges per bag Rs. It is said that it has been increased to 8.50. Necessary transport vehicles have also been kept ready, he said. After this VC, District Collector Anurag Jayanthi told the concerned officials that the loads of grain received at the purchase center in the district should be imported from time to time and the fork should be dumped. If there are not enough porters at the centers but not at the mills, they want to increase the number of porters and ensure that the farmers do not face any problems. If necessary, additional lorries should be installed to transport the grain to the mills. The transport officials should talk to the concerned contractors and ensure that there is no shortage of lorries. At the purchase centers and mills, a special officer should be appointed and an officer should be appointed to inspect the field immediately without delay in the purchase and submit regular monitoring and submit reports every day. The Collector directed the concerned officials to speed up the process of purchase of grain without any irregularities in the purchase of grain. District Rural Development Officer Nagireddy, District Civil Supply Manager Harikrishna, District Civil Supply Officer Roja Rani, District Co-operative Officer Murali, Trans District Transport Officer Sai Krishna and others participated in this video conference.
