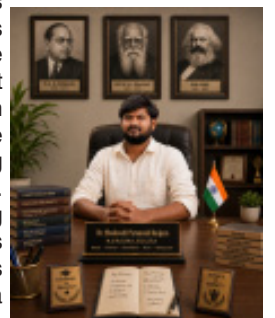

Stop Politicizing in the Name of Gods – MLA Nayini Rajender Reddy

“““Hanamkonda, May 14 (Indian Chronicle) : Nayini Rajender Reddy stated that it is highly unfortunate to invoke the names of deities and exploit religious sentiments merely to cover up one's own mistakes. Speaking at a press conference held at his camp office in Balasamudram, Hanamkonda, he leveled severe criticism against Union Minister Bandi Sanjay Kumar. “He emphasized that everyone is equal before the law. He made it clear that the Congress government would not tolerate a situation where one standard of justice applies to ordinary citizens, while a different standard applies to the families of Union Ministers. Questioning why Bandi Bhagirath is failing to appear for questioning if he has committed no wrongdoing, the MLA asserted that invoking the name of Backward Classes (BC) communities to conceal their errors is merely an attempt to mislead the public. He alleged that BJP leaders are misusing their authority to divert the public's attention away from real issues. “Rajender Reddy remarked that the BJP, having failed on the development front, is attempting to gain political mileage by inciting religious, caste, and regional sentiments. He demanded that the party put an end to its divisive politics and seek votes solely on the basis

of the developmental works it has undertaken—ranging from the national level down to the state level in Telangana. Questioning why the eight BJP Lok Sabha members elected from Telangana remain silent on this matter, he urged the party to clarify its stance on the issue. Remarking that a situation has arisen where the slogan 'Jai Shri Ram' is being used as a shield to cover up their own misdeeds, he asserted that exploiting deities for political gain constitutes an insult to Hindu Dharma. He stated that while he begins his daily routine by invoking Lord Rama, he has never utilized God's name for political ends. “Challenging the BJP's sincerity regarding temple-related matters, he demanded that the Central Government disclose the details of funds allocated to temples in Telangana. He recalled that since assuming power under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, the Congress government has sanctioned substantial funds for the development of prominent pilgrimage sites such as the Bhadrachalam Sri Seetha Ramachandra Swamy Temple, the Basara Gnana Saraswathi Temple, the Vemulawada Rajarajeshwara Temple,



and the Sammakka Saralamma Jatara. “He criticized both the BJP and the BRS parties for failing to undertake the comprehensive development of temples in Telangana during their respective decades-long tenures. Referring to the development of the Yadadri Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy Temple, he noted that the controversies surrounding land-related issues are well known to the public. He warned that the people are closely observing the attempts being made to divert their attention through

religious politics, rather than focusing on genuine development. The MLA alleged that BJP leaders are deliberately creating unnecessary controversies because they are unable to stomach the welfare and development programs being implemented by the Congress government in Telangana. He demanded that the Central Government disclose the details of funds allocated for the development of temples, mosques, and churches over the past decade. He advised the BJP to engage in politics based on development rather than on religious animosity.

Demand to Procure Paddy and Maize Completely: Farmers' Union Protest in Khammam



“Khammam, May 14 Indian Chronicle: ““The Telangana State Farmers' Union has demanded that the government immediately complete the procurement of paddy and maize without delay and remove obstacles in the purchasing process. Farmers' Union State President Bagam Hemanth Rao alleged that millers were exploiting farmers in the name of deductions and urged the government to control such practices. “Under the leadership of the CPI Farmers' Union, farmers staged a protest in front of the Collectorate on Thursday demanding immediate procurement of agricultural produce and timely payment into farmers' bank accounts. As ministers were simultaneously reviewing procurement issues, the union intensified its agitation. “Police denied permission for the protest near the

Collectorate and reportedly attempted preventive arrests of several farmers' union leaders. Despite restrictions, a large number of farmers gathered near the Collectorate and organized a rally toward the premises. “Addressing the protesters, Bagam Hemanth Rao said the government had failed in handling paddy and maize procurement in Khammam district. He stated that the lack of advance planning had created storage issues, while shortages of gunny bags and other logistical problems were troubling farmers. “He criticized officials for failing to identify and prepare adequate warehouses based on the expected agricultural produce. Due to these shortcomings, many farmers were forced to sell maize to private traders, while the remaining produce was still awaiting government procurement. “Hemanth Rao demanded the immediate withdrawal of the rule limiting maize procurement to 26 quintals per acre. He also pointed out that payments for maize procured nearly two months ago had still not been credited to farmers' accounts and urged authorities to release the funds without further delay. “He called upon the government to deploy MARKFED to speed up procurement operations. The union leader also alleged that lorry owners transporting paddy were charging farmers illegally between ₹20 and ₹80 per bag and demanded an immediate halt to such extra charges. “Further, he accused rice millers of cheating farmers through unfair weight deductions and called for strict action to stop exploitation in the name of milling cuts. “Police later obstructed the rally, and earlier in the day, reportedly attempted to arrest leaders including Bagam Hemanth Rao and Kondaparthi Govinda Rao. “Several leaders from CPI and farmers' organizations participated in the protest, including Dondapati Ramesh, Jammula Jitender Reddy, SK Jaanimiah, Epuri Ravindra Babu, Pagadala Mallesh, Nanabala Ramakrishna and others.

Lorries loaded with grain at rice mills should be unloaded immediately:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...May 14):- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti said that lorries loaded with grain at rice mills should be unloaded immediately.” On Thursday, District Collector Anurag Jayanti inspected the Mallikarjuna Rice Mill in Ankireddy Gudem, Choutuppal Mandal, along with SP Akshanksh Yadav and Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy. Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector said.. He inquired about



how many grain-laden lorries are currently in the rice mill. He said that the lorries that have come with loads should be unloaded at any time. They asked how many lorries were coming to the mill with a load of grain every day. They asked how long it would take to unload each lorry and asked the porters to unload it as soon as they arrived. They asked whether the mill had enough porters to unload the grain and if there were not enough porters, they should hire more people and import the grain. “They said that under no circumstances should the vehicles that came with a load of grain be allowed to stop at the mills. They wanted the lorry that arrived on any given day to be unloaded and sent on the same day. They wanted the lorries to be sent back immediately without causing any problems to the farmers. Later, the District Collector, SP Akshanksh Yadav, inspected the piles of grain at the market yard in Choutuppal mandal center and inspected it along with Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy. On this occasion, the District Collector... asked and found out how much grain had arrived in the market yard so far. He asked how much grain has been purchased so far and whether the moisture content is being checked every day. He said that the grain should be bagged as soon as the moisture content is found. He said that it should be transported to the mills by lorries as soon as the bag is loaded. He asked how many lorries are coming to the yard every day, is it enough or is there a need for more. He said that sufficient lorries will be sent without the possibility of storing the weighed grain in a lorry. He said

that the purchase of grain should not be delayed under any circumstances and the purchased grain will be loaded into a lorry immediately and transported to the mills. The concerned officials participated in this program.

AITUC Struggle Led to Release of MPHA (Female) Exam Results: Thota Ramanjaneyulu



“Khammam, May 14 Indian Chronicle:” “Telangana State Second ANMs Association (AITUC) State Honorary President Thota Ramanjaneyulu stated that the release of the Multi-Purpose Health Assistant (Female) examination results was achieved due to the continuous struggle led by AITUC. He expressed gratitude to the government and the MHSRB Board Secretary following the release of the examination results on Monday. “Speaking on the occasion, he said that in 2023, AITUC had organized an indefinite strike demanding unconditional regularization of Second ANMs. As a result of that agitation, the then government released 1,531 MPHA (Female) posts. “He further recalled that due to AITUC’s persistent efforts, an additional 400 posts were sanctioned and the upper age limit was increased up to 53 years. However, he expressed disappointment that the weightage marks, which were initially fixed at 30, were later reduced to 20 following a court case allegedly triggered by certain unions. “Ramanjaneyulu said that the provisional selection list has now been released and urged the authorities to complete the recruitment process at the earliest and provide regular appointments to the candidates. “He explained that from the day of the examination until the release of the results, AITUC had organized nearly 22 protest demonstrations in front of the MHSRB Board and Commissioner’s offices. “He also demanded that Second ANMs who appeared for the examination but did not secure jobs should be provided with 100% gross salary, and those who were not eligible for the examination should be given retirement benefits of ₹10 lakh. “On this occasion, he thanked all the Second ANMs who actively participated in the union-led protests and dharnas. He further announced that a state committee meeting of Second ANMs would soon be organized to discuss and announce the future course of action.

Scientists from the KVK Wyra participated in the program and urged farmers to reduce the usage of urea fertilizers. “The scientists explained that excessive use of urea not only increases soil and environmental pollution but also leads to the spread of pests and diseases in crops. Farmers were advised to use only the fertilizers recommended by agriculture officials, as overuse of fertilizers can damage soil



fertility. “Officials also encouraged farmers to adopt crop rotation practices. They stated that cultivating the same crop repeatedly can increase pest and disease infestation and reduce soil productivity.
