“Telangana Agricultural Workers' Union State General Secretary R. Venkatramulu” (Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...May 17):- Telangana Agricultural Workers' Union State General Secretary R. Venkatramulu criticized the BJP Modi government for cheating people in the name of saving. They alleged that Modi is enjoying himself abroad by telling people to reduce facilities. The Telangana Agricultural Workers' Union Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Committee was held at Sundarayya Bhavan, Bhuvanagiri under the chairmanship of District President Bollu Yadagiri. Khammam Cyber Crime Police Arrest Cyber Fraud Accused

“““KHAMMAM, 17 MAY (INDIAN CHRONICLE) :““Khammam Cyber Crime Police arrested a cyber fraud accused in Mogalturu of West Godavari district, Andhra Pradesh, in connection with an online trading and investment fraud case in which nearly ₹1 crore was cheated, said Khammam Commissioner of Police Sunil Dutt.“According to the case details, a government employee from Khammam district came into contact with WhatsApp groups through YouTube advertisements. The fraudsters lured the victim by promising huge profits through online trading and investments. Believing them, the victim invested around ₹13 lakh through WhatsApp and trading links and was subsequently cheated.“In connection with this case and several other cases, the police arrested the account holder and accused, Kadali Chandrasekhar, aged 23 years, from Mogalturu in West Godavari district. He was produced before the Khammam Cyber Crime Court and later remanded to judicial custody.“Khammam CP Mr. Sunil Dutt, IPS, appreciated Cyber Crime DSP CH.R.V. Phaninder, who played a key role in the investigation, along with Inspector of Police Bhukya Ravi Kumar, SIs Ranjith Kumar and Vijay Kumar, Head Constable Srinivasa Rao, Constable Bhanu Murthy, and the staff of the Cyber Crime Police Station for their efforts in the operation.

“KHAMMAM, 17 MAY (INDIAN CHRONICLE) :“ District President and Secretary of the Telangana State Women’s Federation (affiliated to NFIW), Batthineni Neeraja and Epuri Latha Devi, stated that an action plan has been prepared to fight for the implementation of promises made to women by both the Central and State Governments. “They said that phased programmes would be taken up starting from the village level. Addressing a media conference held on Sunday at Giriprasad Bhavan in Khammam, they explained the resolutions passed at the 22nd Mahasabha of the Women’s Federation held in Wyra, along with details of the newly elected committee. “Neeraja and Latha Devi said that around 500 delegates representing 20 mandals, five municipalities, and the corporation attended the Mahasabha. ““““---Rs 25 Lakh Ex-Gratia Must Be Announced for the Deceased's Family““““Narsampet/Warangal, May 17 (Indian Chronicle) : Expressing deep anguish over the tragic death of a farmer at a crop procurement center, former Narsampet MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy stated that this incident clearly highlights the severe hardships farmers are enduring due to the excessive delays plaguing the crop procurement process. ““It is reported that Gajula Pedda Venkateshwarlu—a maize and paddy farmer hailing from Alamkhanipet village in Nekkonda Mandal—suffered a fatal heart attack while waiting at the procurement center. Describing the incident as “extremely unfortunate,” Sudarshan Reddy demanded that the government immediately announce an ex-gratia payment of Rs 25 lakhs to support the deceased's family. ““He noted that farmers are being forced to spend days and nights—often for months on end—at procurement centers alongside their produce, waiting for weighing slots and gunny bags, and are enduring immense suffering amidst scorching temperatures hovering around 45°C. Sudarshan Reddy added that Venkateshwarlu had been making repeated trips for nearly a month—visiting the Alamkhanipet center to get his paddy weighed and the Kapulakanaparthi center to sell his maize—and argued that this prolonged mental stress ultimately led to the fatal heart attack. Sudharshan Reddy criticized officials for failing to take action, despite repeated protests, sit-ins, and road blockades staged by farmers and opposition parties regarding delays in procurement. He alleged that the failure to increase the number of procurement centers in proportion to the cultivated area and crop yield has subjected farmers to severe hardships. ““He attributed these incidents to factors such as corruption and irregularities within procurement centers, a lack of coordination in grain transportation and warehouse storage, and the negligence of officials. He further stated that the government's failure to expand procurement facilities—even in the face of unseasonal rains—is further exacerbating the plight of farmers. ““Noting that maize procurement has remained incomplete for nearly two months and that delays in paddy procurement persist, he remarked that farmers are encountering obstacles at every stage—from seeds, electricity, and fertilizers to irrigation and crop marketing. Asserting that this clearly constitutes an administrative failure, Sudharshan Reddy—on behalf of the BRS party—urged the government to respond immediately by increasing the number of procurement centers and ensuring the swift transportation of farmers' produce.
