## BC–A Communities Must Awaken : Ambati Sudhakar

“Narsampet/Warangal, May 18 (Indian Chronicle) : Ambati Sudhakar, Treasurer of the Telangana BC–A Rights Protection Committee and President of the Telangana Gangaputra Youth Association, urged the government to ensure justice for the Gangaputra community in education and employment, and to accord them priority membership rights in local water bodies. “He was speaking at a solidarity meeting organized under the leadership of Gangaputra Association President Gunti Sanjeev, focused on safeguarding the rights of the Gangaputra community. Sudhakar highlighted the multiple challenges faced by Gangaputras in



pursuing their traditional occupation of fishing. He noted that families who have depended on fishing for generations are now being denied membership in local tanks and water bodies, jeopardizing their livelihood. “He demanded that the government grant rightful membership and usage rights over fishing tanks to the Gangaputra community. “Sudhakar also expressed concern over recent attempts to include other communities in the BC–A category.

He cautioned that such moves could threaten the very survival of existing BC–A communities. If numerically larger and economically stronger communities are added to the category, he warned, already marginalized groups like the Gangaputras could be pushed further behind in access to education and employment opportunities. “He appealed to the government to ensure accurate enumeration and proper recognition of the Gangaputra community in population records. He further requested that economically advanced communities should not be included in the BC–A category. Sudhakar stated that, if necessary, they are prepared to stage a protest at Indira Park to press their demands. “Among those present at the meeting were Erraboyina Kishan, Jijula Sagar, Medaraboyina Satyanarayana, Ankala Sudarshan, Ankala Mallikarjun, and Poosa Yakambaram, among others.

# District Political Affairs Committee reviews procurement, voter roll revision in Karimnagar

## Minister asks leaders to coordinate with officials to address farmers' and public issues.



KARIMNAGAR May 18 (Correspondent): The District Political Affairs Committee (PAC) of the Congress party reviewed paddy procurement, Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, appointment of booth-level agents and summer drinking water supply at a meeting held at the District Congress Committee office in Karimnagar on Monday.

State Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnampaluri Prabhakar, Government Whip and Vemulawada MLA Adi Srinivas, Choppadandi MLA and DCC president Dr. Medipally Satyam, Manakondur MLA Kavvampally Satyanarayana and other senior leaders attended the meeting.

Addressing the gathering, Mr. Prabhakar said party leaders should coordinate with officials to ensure that farmers did not face inconvenience during paddy procurement operations. He asked leaders to monitor procurement centres to ensure that deductions were not made in the name of quality variations and called for measures to prevent exploitation by rice millers and intermediaries.

He also said issues arising out of shortage of lorries under the GPS-based transportation system should be brought to the notice of the authorities concerned.

On the Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls, the Minister asked constituency in-charges and coordinators to remain vigilant and create awareness among voters regarding the revision process. He appealed to people to safeguard their voting rights during the exercise.

The meeting also discussed the appointment of BLA-2s (Booth Level Agents) in villages across the district in accordance with PCC directions. Leaders were asked to assist voters during the voter mapping process and submit the details of appointed agents through the DCC to the district administration.

Reviewing the drinking water situation in view of the summer season, Mr. Prabhakar said steps were being taken to ensure uninterrupted supply in rural and urban areas. Congress leaders, corporators and sarpanches were asked to coordinate with officials and address local drinking water issues promptly.

Corporation Congress president Vaidyula Anjan Kumar urged the party leadership to provide opportunities in nominated and organisational posts to leaders and workers who had been associated with the party for several years.

Former MLAs Arepalli Mohan and Koduru Satyanarayana Goud, PCC general secretary Rehmath Hussain and several other leaders participated in the meeting.

“He reviewed the progress of various ongoing development programmes in the region during a meeting held on Monday, along with Additional Collectors Dr. P. Srija and P. Srinivas Reddy, examining department-wise progress and issuing several instructions.” (Khammam May 18 (Indian Chronicle)). “The Collector stated that detailed reports must be prepared and submitted on Dalit Bandhu units sanctioned under saturation mode in Chinthakani mandal, including units that have been grounded, sick units, successfully functioning units, and diverted units. “He noted that ₹5 crore has been sanctioned for tourism development at Jamalapuram, where tenders and agreements have been completed, and directed that lake development works be finished by August 31. “On women empowerment, he stressed achieving bank linkage targets for self-help groups (SHGs) without fail. He instructed officials to prepare monthly estimates of eligible groups for new loans and set monthly targets. ## Bandari Lakshma Reddy Participates in Medchal-Malkajgiri District Review Meeting

“Medchal-Malkajgiri, May 18 (Indian Chronicle): Bandari Lakshma Reddy participated in the district-level review meeting held at the Medchal-Malkajgiri Collectorate under the chairmanship of District Collector Manu Chowdhary, IAS, and in the presence of District In-charge Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu. “Speaking on the occasion, the MLA stated that the Uppal Government Hospital lacks minimum basic facilities and alleged that DMHO Uma Gowri is not paying adequate attention to the issues. He said that due to the shortage of beds, patients are being forced to sleep on the floor. In response, the District Collector assured that he would soon visit and inspect the hospital personally. “The MLA also urged officials to ensure that there is no shortage of teachers in schools under the Uppal



constituency. “He said that several key public issues and development-related matters concerning the Uppal constituency were brought to the government’s attention during the meeting. He requested the government to undertake road widening works at Habsiguda X Road to reduce traffic congestion. He pointed out that the bottleneck issue on the route from Nacharam towards Habsiguda has been causing severe traffic problems and requested coordination with IICT authorities for the required land acquisition. “Further, he appealed for the allocation of suitable government land either in Uppal Bhagayat or within the Uppal Assembly constituency limits for the establishment of a Government Degree College. “The MLA also demanded that 50 percent of Double Bedroom houses in the Uppal Assembly constituency be allotted to local residents. “He further stated that the closure of the Uppal Ring Road due to the construction works of the Bandari Rajireddy Corridor (Uppal-Narapally Corridor) has been causing severe inconvenience to the public. He urged the government to repair alternative roads and provide smoother transportation facilities for commuters.

sized continuous monitoring of underground drainage (UGD) pipeline works in municipal areas and speedy completion of land acquisition for the STP. “The Collector directed the formation of zone-wise special teams to monitor progress of works. He asked for a detailed report on the proposed retaining wall along both sides of the Wyra River and instructed proper planning for integrated mandal office complexes in Bonakal, Errupalem, and Madhira, including video conference halls, meeting rooms, and record rooms. “He noted that ₹14 crore proposals had been submitted for tourism development at Wyra Reservoir, of which ₹5 crore has been sanctioned, and directed that designs be finalized within 15 days. “Regarding the proposed old-age home in Madhira, he instructed officials to ensure it is equipped with full infrastructure, including drinking water, toilets, and a kitchen. “He also stated that proposals for establishing an agricultural market committee in Tallada requiring 10 acres of land are under consideration, and instructed plans to create an additional storage capacity of one lakh metric tonnes in the district. “He suggested steps for setting up a petrol bunk in Venkatapuram village. “Additional Collector Dr. P. Srija said that several development works are underway in the municipality, including UGD works, stormwater management projects, rehabilitation of street vendors, and retaining wall construction. “Revenue Divisional Officer Srinivas and other departmental officials participated in the review meeting.

## Appeal Submitted to Collector to Provide Indiramma Houses to Eligible Poor Families “Former ZPTC Member Dondapati Ramesh

“KHAMMAM, 18 MAY (INDIAN CHRONICLE) : “CPI District Executive Member and former ZPTC member Dondapati Ramesh, along with CPI district leader Tammishetti Venkateswarlu, submitted a representation to the Khammam District Collector on Monday, requesting that Indiramma houses be allotted to eligible poor families in the district. “Speaking on the occasion, they stated that many poor families living under temporary sheds are eagerly waiting with hope to



receive houses under the Indiramma housing scheme. However, the delay in allotting houses to them is causing severe hardship, they explained to the Collector. “They expressed disappointment that even in Chinna Gopathi village of Konijerla mandal, which was identified as a pilot project area, eligible beneficiaries were not provided with Indiramma houses. “They recalled that during the undivided Andhra Pradesh government under former Chief Minister Y.S. Rajasekhara Reddy in 2005, houses under the Indiramma scheme were provided to families without political discrimination. They alleged that the present Telangana government’s implementation of the Indiramma housing scheme lacks sincerity, saying that “what is spoken is different from what is actually done.” “They urged the government to implement the scheme in a transparent and non-political manner. With the onset of rains and storms, poor families without proper housing are likely to face serious difficulties, they said, demanding that Indiramma houses be immediately sanctioned to all eligible beneficiaries. “Among those who met the Collector were CPI mandal leaders Derangula Lakshmaiah, Tammishetti Upender, village Deputy Sarpanch Tammishetti Vijaya, Derangula Dinesh, Tammishetti Venkataratnam, and others.

## Anjaneyulu Sagar Urges Speedy Completion of Cemetery Works

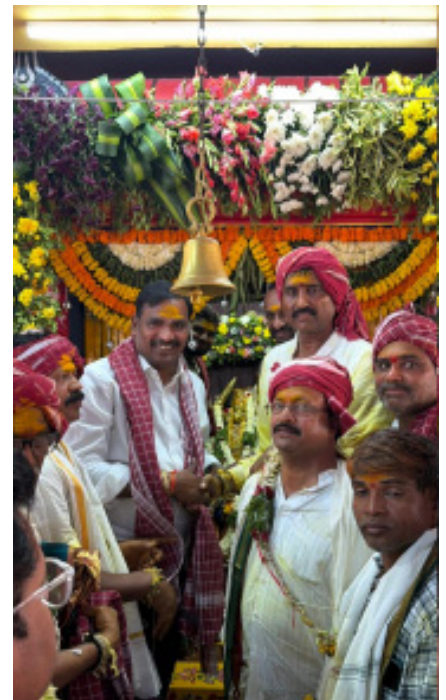

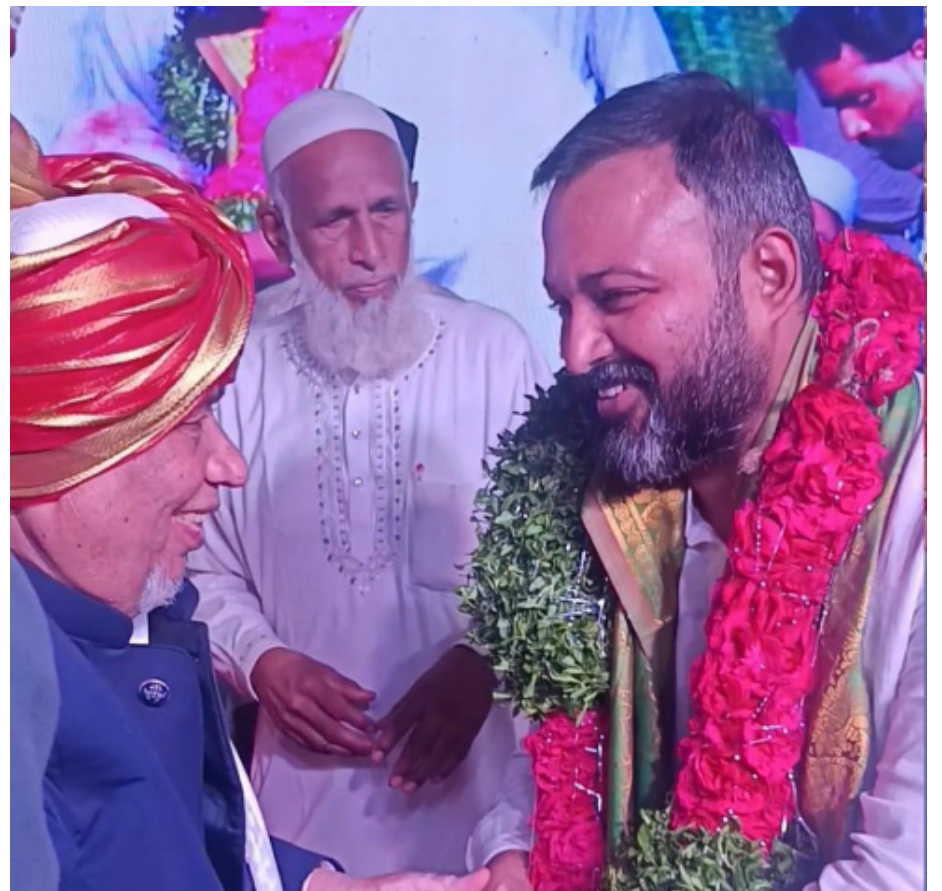
