Collector warns of strict action against illegal sex determination tests

Officials asked to intensify inspections under PCPNDT Act; awareness campaigns stressed to curb female foeticide.

KARIMNAGAR May 19 (Correspondent): District Collector Chitra Mishra on Tuesday directed officials to take stringent action against scanning centres involved in prenatal sex determination tests, stating that such practices were punishable under the law.

Chairing a review meeting of the District-Level Multi-Member Appropriate Authority at the Karimnagar Collectorate on the implementation of the Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PCPNDT) Act, the Collector instructed officials to strengthen monitoring and conduct frequent inspections of scanning centres across the district.

District Principal Judge Shivakumar, Deputy Commissioner of Police Venkata Ramana, District Medical and Health Officer Venkataramana, medical officers and representatives of voluntary organisations participated in the meeting.

Ms. Mishra said hospitals and diagnostic centres violating the provisions of the PCPNDT Act should face strict legal action. She called upon medical teams to carry out regular inspections and enhance surveillance with the assistance of the police department wherever required.

The Collector emphasised the importance of creating awareness among the public about the provisions of the Act and urged officials of the Health, Police and Women Welfare Departments to work in coordination with voluntary organisations to prevent illegal sex determination practices.

Mr. Shivakumar said sustained awareness was necessary to eradicate female foeticide and reduce discrimination against girl children. He stressed the need for effective implementation of the PCPNDT Act to safeguard the



rights of women and girl children.

He pointed out that violations of the Act could invite imprisonment ranging from three to five years and fines between ₹10,000 and ₹50,000.

PCPNDT Programme Officer Sana, along with Prakruthi, Prashanthi, Bhuvana, NGO representatives and medical officers, were also present.

Collector Divakar Reviews Public Darbar Petitions at Nelakondapalli

Collector Diwakar TS Calls for Expansion of Green Energy Usage

“Khammam, May 19 Indian chronicle:

““District Collector Diwakar TS has directed electricity department officials to significantly expand the use of green energy in the district. “He reviewed the progress of electricity department works with officials from TGNPDCL and TG REDCO at the Collectorate. “The Collector emphasized that full-scale electricity facilities should be ensured in tribal villages in particular. He suggested exploring the installation of solar panels wherever necessary and instructed that 100% electricity connectivity should be provided to all remaining habitations and households in the district. “He also advised officials to personally inspect anganwadi centres and schools to ensure electricity connections are in place. He noted that electrification works are still pending in 52 anganwadi centres in the district and stressed that these should be completed at the earliest. “Underground Power Lines



and Infrastructure Development“Collector Diwakar TS instructed that underground electricity cable works must be executed with high quality. He suggested dividing every 100 meters into a block so that maintenance and repairs can be easily identified in the future. “He pointed out that overhead cables and internet lines on electricity poles are causing disruptions and called for coordinated action among departments. He instructed that a coordination meeting should be held with cable and internet service providers in Madhira town regarding underground cabling works, and the feasibility of shifting all utility lines underground should be examined. “He also directed that clear markers should be installed to prevent damage to underground power lines during future municipal, drinking water, and other departmental works. He suggested studying the feasibility of allocating dedicated underground compartments for utility services. “Substations and Solar Energy Projects“The Collector instructed officials to upgrade substation infrastructure in line with growing power demand in the district. He asked for immediate resolution of land-related issues for substation construction and directed that all works should be completed within the stipulated deadlines. “He also suggested taking up land acquisition where suitable land is not available and ensuring that estimates are prepared and submitted quickly. “Under the Indira Mahila Shakti scheme, two one-megawatt solar projects are being constructed in Khammam district, of which one has already been completed and the second is expected to be finished by the end of this month. “Model Solar Villages Initiative“The Collector stated that 27 villages in Khammam district have been selected under the Model Solar Village scheme, including 22 villages in Bonakal mandal. “Under the Griha Jyothi scheme, 2 kW solar systems are being installed in beneficiary households, with each system generating around 240 units of electricity. The surplus power can be sold to the grid, enabling households to earn ₹300 to ₹400 per month along with free electricity benefits. “He instructed that solar panel installations across 9,418 structures—including households and government buildings—should be completed within the next two months. He also directed officials to install solar pump sets for 4,371 farmers across the 27 villages. “The Collector urged officials to create widespread public awareness about TG REDCO schemes and further promote green energy usage in the district. “Officials including TGNPDCL SE Srinivasa Chari, Technical DE Baburao, DEs Ramarao, Nageswara Rao, Ramesh, Bhadr Power, Srinivasa Rao, REDCO GM Ajay, and other departmental staff attended the meeting.

Land Losers Seek Compensation in Square Yards for Railway Doubling Project

“Khammam,Karepalli, May 19 Indian chronicle:““Displaced residents of Singareni village submitted a representation to Singareni Gram Panchayat Sarpanch Medari Veera Pratap (Tony) on Tuesday, demanding compensation in square yards for house sites being acquired under the railway doubling project, as announced earlier. “Speaking on the occasion, the affected residents said that house sites in Ward No. 2 of Singareni village are being acquired as part of the railway doubling works. They stated that compensation of Rs. 6,300 per square yard had been announced for the acquired land. “They explained that in some cases only the land attached to the houses was acquired, while in others entire houses were affected. The residents pointed out that these lands have been used as house sites for nearly 70 years and argued that justice would be served only if compensation is paid on a per-square-yard basis. “The affected families requested the Sarpanch to ensure fair compensation and justice for all those who are losing their house sites. “Responding positively, Sarpanch Medari Veera Pratap assured them that the issue would be brought to the attention of the MLA and that efforts would be made to secure justice for the affected families. “Among those who submitted the representation were Shadik Ali, Tummalapalli Koteswara Rao, Paritala Ravi, Pasha, and others.”



Pension Beneficiaries Must Register Names with Aadhaar

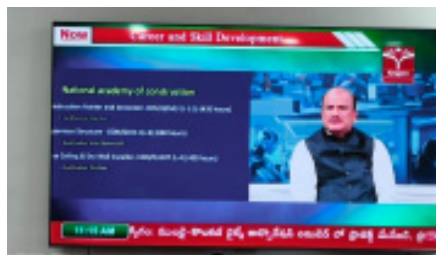
“Khammam, Enkooor May 19 Indian chronicle: “Enkooor Major Gram Panchayat Secretary Dharavath Krishna has informed that beneficiaries of Asara pensions, disability pensions, and other government pensions under the Major Gram Panchayat limits must register their details at the Enkooor Gram Panchayat office by submitting their Aadhaar cards. “He stated that pension beneficiaries should visit the Gram Panchayat office with their Aadhaar cards, where their photographs will be uploaded through a mobile application and their details will be updated online. The verification process began on the 15th of this month and will continue until June 5. “He urged pensioners to make use of this opportunity and said that officials would visit the homes of those unable to come to the Gram Panchayat office if they provide prior information. He also warned that pensions of those who fail to complete Aadhaar verification may be stopped. “The secretary requested all pension beneficiaries to cooperate with the verification process. “Verification Drive to Prevent Bogus Pensions “According to reliable information, more than one lakh bogus pensions are reportedly being withdrawn every month across the state. In some cases, family members allegedly continue withdrawing pension amounts through ATM cards even after the death of the beneficiary, without applying for death certificates. “To prevent such fraudulent withdrawals, the government has



initiated this verification process to identify genuine beneficiaries and finalize the authentic pension list for submission to higher authorities. “There are also reports that around two lakh new pensions may be sanctioned on the occasion of Telangana State Formation Day on June 2, after the completion of the verification process.

Police Raid Illegal Chemical Manufacturing Unit ; Large Quantity of Materials Seized

“Geesugonda, May 19 (Indian Chronicle) : “Police raided an unauthorized unit operating within the Geesugonda limits on Tuesday for illegally manufacturing and selling acid, phenyl, and bleaching powder without requisite permissions, and seized a substantial quantity of chemicals and manufacturing materials. “Acting on credible information, Head Constable Singarapu Prabhakar, along with staff, conducted an inspection at “Sri Sai Industries” located in Keerthi Nagar, where illegal chemical production was reportedly underway. During the raid, the owner attempted to flee but was apprehended and questioned on the spot. “During interrogation, the accused, Badam Satish (60), a resident of Warangal, admitted to procuring raw materials from Hyderabad and manufacturing acid, phenyl, and bleaching powder without any government licenses, and supplying them to local grocery stores. “Police seized 1,000 litres of pure acid, 40 litres of pure phenyl, 600 acid bottles, 612 bottles labeled “Pure Clean” phenyl, 700 kg of limestone powder, 80 kg of bleaching powder, packets of various sizes, 5,000 “Acid Clean” labels, and 12 sacks of empty “Bleach & Clean” covers. The total market value of the seized material is estimated at ₹1,28,340. “A case has been registered and further investigation is underway, said the Geesugonda Inspector D. Visweshwar.
