

“It is Ridiculous for Congress Leaders to Meet the CP After Seven Months”

CPM Madhira Division Secretary Madipalli Gopal Rao

“Khammam, Chintakani, May 27 (Indian chronicle): “CPM Madhira Division Secretary Madipalli Gopal Rao questioned why Congress leaders were disturbed when CPM leaders met Chief Minister Enmula Revanth Reddy and demanded the arrest of those responsible for the murder of CPM state leader and former Patharlapadu sarpanch Samineni Rama Rao, who belonged to Patharlapadu village in Chintakani mandal. “Speaking at a press conference held on Wednesday at the Veera Telangana Armed Struggle Martyrs’ Building, he said that seven months had passed since the murder of Samineni Rama Rao. “He stated that CPM leaders had only requested the Chief Minister to arrest the accused involved in Rama Rao’s murder and had never demanded the arrest of Congress leaders. In such a situation, he questioned the intention and motive behind Congress leaders meeting the Khammam CP and submitting a memorandum seeking the arrest of the accused in the same murder case. “He alleged that this clearly indicated that the Congress party had been obstructing the arrest of the killers for the past seven months. He clarified that during their meeting with the Chief Minister, they never accused Congress leaders directly of committing the murder, but only sought the arrest of the culprits. “Gopal Rao questioned why the accused had not been arrested even after seven months and demanded answers regarding who was behind the delay and who was preventing the arrests. He said that in many major incidents, robberies, and murders, police using advanced technology are able to catch culprits within 24 hours, but in this case, the accused had not been arrested even after seven months. “He demanded that the police explain why they had failed to arrest the accused and who was influencing the investigation. He accused the police and Congress leaders of colluding in the matter, alleging that this was the reason the accused in Rama Rao’s murder had not been arrested. “He further stated that some individuals accused in the murder case were now making allegations against Rama Rao’s family. Since the Congress party controls the government and police machinery, he questioned why authorities were not conducting an impartial investigation and revealing the truth instead of allowing allegations against the victim’s family. “He described it as “ridiculous” that Congress leaders were claiming innocence by undergoing polygraph tests in Con-



gress-ruled Karnataka. He stated that there was no history anywhere in the country of criminals or murderers being convicted solely through polygraph tests. “Gopal Rao said that if Chief Minister Revanth Reddy constituted a SIT (Special Investigation Team) as requested by CPM, the real accused would be caught and some people might even have to go to jail. He questioned why Congress leaders, who had remained silent for seven months, suddenly approached the CP after CPM met the Chief Minister. “He criticized Congress leaders for praising themselves as “honest” and said it was laughable. He alleged that it was Congress that indulged in “corpse politics” in the constituency. “He further questioned whether Congress was not responsible for the murders of CPM leaders in Pandillapalli and Patharlapadu villages of Chintakani mandal and in Govindapuram-L village of Bonakal mandal. “Among those present at the press conference were CPM district senior leader Chintalacheruvu Koteswara Rao, district committee member Dondapati Nageswara Rao, mandal secretary Kilaru Suresh, mandal committee members Bandham Srinivasa Rao, Tellakula Srinivasa Rao, and others.

Corruption and Illegal Activities Under the Guise of Development! Loss to Public Funds in Madhira Municipality CPM Expresses Anger Over Encroachments of Lakes and Illegal Soil Sales

“Khammam, Madhira, May 27 (Indian chronicle): “CPM Division Secretary Madupalli Gopal Rao strongly alleged that leaders of the ruling party and public representatives are causing huge losses to the government treasury in the name of development works within the limits of Madhira Municipality. He criticized that ruling party leaders, government officials, and real estate businessmen are colluding and looting public resources wherever possible. “Speaking at a party meeting held on Wednesday at the local Bodepudi building, he alleged that there is a possibility of massive corruption in the land dealings related to the proposed Sewage Treatment Plant (STP) at Ambarupeta village. He accused officials and leaders of attempting to inflate the value of low-cost lands on paper to several crores of rupees in order to misuse public funds. “He further stated that lakes within the municipality limits are being encroached upon and real estate ventures are being developed in violation of regulations, while

Cyber Crime Awareness Seminar

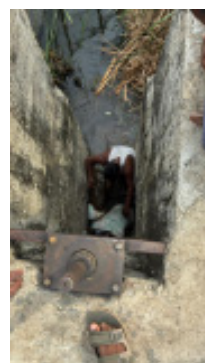


: “Khammam, May 27 (Indian chronicle): “As part of a cyber crime awareness program, Cyber Crime DSP Phaninder conducted an awareness session on Wednesday for NCC students at Sai Spoorthi College in Sathupalli. “During the session, he explained various types of cyber frauds

including IPL ticket booking frauds, courier scams, online booking frauds, delivery frauds, insurance offer scams, loan app harassment and blackmail, digital arrest scams, investment frauds, bank KYC update frauds, APK file frauds, and betting apps. He also shared important online safety tips. “He advised that anyone who becomes a victim of cyber crime should immediately call 1930 and register a complaint on the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal. He warned students not to click on suspicious links received through WhatsApp or Telegram and not to share OTPs or bank details with anyone. “The program was attended by NCC 11(T) Battalion Colonel Sanjay Kumar Bhadra, Lt. Strict action if water is released from tanks; surveillance has been arranged over the tanks

“Complaint filed with police and fisheries department officials” “Irrigation DEE Manmadharao” “Khammam, Nelakondapalli, May 27 (Indian chronicle): “Nelakondapalli Irrigation DEE Manmadharao warned that strict action would be taken against anyone releasing water from tanks for fishing activities. Complaints were received by irrigation officials regarding the diversion of water from the Mandrajupalli and Nelakondapalli Kattalamma tanks in the mandal. Following this, officials visited the tanks on Wednesday and closed the outlets that had been opened to release water. “Speaking on the occasion, he warned that



illegal diversion of tank water would not be tolerated. He said action would be taken against those violating regulations by releasing water unlawfully. He emphasized that protecting tank water is the responsibility of everyone. “He advised members of the fisheries society management committees, along with local farmers, to safeguard the water resources. He requested the public to inform officials immediately if water was being diverted illegally anywhere. “To protect the tank water, irrigation staff have been deployed for night patrols. He stated that staff are guarding the tanks day and night to prevent unauthorized release of water. “He also mentioned that complaints had been lodged with local police regarding the illegal release of water from the tanks. In addition, letters were written to fisheries department officials asking them to instruct society management members not to release water. “He warned that strict action would be taken against anyone tampering with the sluices. Irrigation JEs Naresh, Madina, and other staff members were also present.

Ready to Fight on Behalf of Workers : Former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar

“““Hanamkonda, May 27 (Indian Chronicle) : “Former Government Chief Whip and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar leveled severe criticism against the Central and State governments, alleging that their anti-labor policies are pushing the working class into severe distress. He made these remarks on Wednesday, following his participation in a meeting held with over 30 labor unions as part of the "Labor and Employee Awareness Month" programs. ““Speaking to the media, Vinay Bhaskar alleged that both governments have completely failed to resolve the issues faced by workers. He expressed deep concern that despite workers submitting numerous representations to the Labor Department, their grievances remain unresolved. ““Criticizing the labor reforms undertaken by the Central Government, he stated that the Centre repealed 29 labor laws and replaced them with four labor codes, thereby undermining the rights of workers. He alleged that the Central Government is implementing policies that are detrimental to workers, farmers, and employees. He further asserted that the governments have neglected their responsibility to provide workers with minimum wages, job security, and basic amenities. ““He noted that the primary

objective of the Labor Awareness Month programs is to create awareness among workers regarding their rights and welfare. Vinay Bhaskar alleged that both the Central and State governments are jeopardizing the livelihoods of workers. In particular, he expressed deep concern regarding the plight of auto-rickshaw workers. He stated that unfulfilled promises have pushed some of them into dire circumstances, leading even to suicides. ““Reiterating the BRS party's support for the working class, he gave an assurance that the party would continue its struggle to protect workers' rights. He credited former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao with the achievement of increasing minimum wages for workers during the BRS government's tenure. ““Vinay Bhaskar alleged that retired employees are not receiving their post-retirement benefits in a timely manner and accused the government of betraying RTC employees. He announced that a special meeting would be held on June 1st to further intensify the agitation and to bring the workers' issues to the attention of both the Central and State governments. ““He criticized the government for ignoring the issues faced by millions of gig workers. Furthermore, he warned that if the governments fail to resolve labor issues, all trade unions would unite to stage large-



scale protests. ““Responding to the suspension of an RTC driver for questioning issues related to paddy procurement, Vinay Bhaskar termed the action unjust. He alleged that the government is targeting those who raise questions. He demanded the immediate reinstatement of the suspended RTC driver. The former MLA also strongly condemned the manner in which Professor Nageshwar Rao—a prominent political analyst and former MLC—is currently being treated. He recalled that Professor Nageshwar Rao had actively participated in past labor awareness programs and had

stood in solidarity with the workers regarding their issues. Vinay Bhaskar assured that Professor Nageshwar Rao would receive the full support of the BRS party. ““Several trade union leaders participated in this event, including BRTU Convener Nayini Ravi; Painters' Union President Rajarapu Raju; Sirikonda Bhikshapathi; and LPCC Workers' Union leaders Kalva Sudarshan, Bhashaboyina Tirupati, Ramachari, MD Ismail, Esampalli Sanjeeva, Sridhar Reddy, Jayaram, Sudhakar Reddy, Raghuvveer Reddy, Rama, among others.

Gurukul Schools Must Be Fully Prepared for the Upcoming Academic Year: Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka



“Every seat in Gurukul schools must be filled; there is no room for negligence. “Special studies should be conducted on schools where seats remain vacant, and problems must be resolved. “A district officer should be appointed as in-charge for every residential school. “Doctors should examine students' health conditions every month. “Textbooks and uniforms must be provided to students on time. “Action plans should be prepared for installing solar panels in Gurukul schools operating in their own buildings. “Deputy CM Bhatti Vikramarka reviewed Gurukul and welfare residential educational institutions. ““Khammam, May 27 (Indian chronicle). ““Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka instructed officials concerned to ensure that Gurukul schools are fully prepared for the upcoming academic year. “On Wednesday, at the Collectorate, Deputy CM Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka, along with District Collector Divakar TS, Additional Collector Dr. P. Srija, Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt, and other officials, reviewed the functioning of Gurukul and welfare residential educational institutions. “Speaking on the occasion, the Deputy CM stated that officials should focus on increasing admissions in Gurukul schools every year in the district. He directed authorities to conduct special studies on residential schools where seats remain unfilled, identify the reasons, and resolve the issues immediately. “As the new academic year is set to begin on June 12, he said all residential educational institutions must be fully ready. Necessary repairs and infrastructure works should be completed during the summer itself. “He instructed that diet charges and menu details must be prominently displayed in every residential school. A district officer should be appointed as in-charge for

each Gurukul institution, and they should visit schools every month and submit reports. District officials must regularly inspect schools and record inspection reports without fail. Doctors should also examine students' health conditions every month. “Officials were directed to submit a comprehensive report on Gurukul schools functioning in rented buildings. Necessary repairs should be carried out continuously. He also instructed that construction works of the five Young India Integrated School buildings currently under progress should be expedited. “He asked officials to prepare an advance plan detailing how many SC, ST, BC, and Minority Gurukul institutions are operating in rented buildings and how many can be shifted once the Young India schools are completed. “Regional coordinators were instructed to inspect all schools within the next 12 days as per the checklist and submit a comprehensive report. He emphasized that providing textbooks and uniforms to students on time for the upcoming academic year should be treated as a top priority. “The Deputy CM stated that the government is giving utmost priority to education and spending substantial funds, leaving no room for negligence. He said the government is regularly paying staff salaries, diet charges, and rents. Since repair funds are also being released, officials should work in coordination to ensure works progress rapidly at the ground level. “He mentioned that a large number of bills related to Amma Adarsha School Committees had been cleared. He further stated that DMFT funds would also be utilized for payment of education department works bills. “As educational institutions are receiving free electricity, he directed officials to prepare an action plan for installing solar panels in Gurukul schools functioning in their own buildings. “Regional coordinators of Gurukul institutions, SE NPDC Srinivas, education department officials, and officials from various departments participated in the meeting. “Issued by the District Public Relations Officer's Office, Khammam.

Jawaharlal Nehru's Services to the Nation Are Ever Memorable: DCC President Inagala Venkatram Reddy

"He stated that at a time when many nations doubted whether democracy could survive in newly independent India, Nehru laid the foundation for a strong parliamentary system and established India as the world's largest democracy. During a period marked by global political tensions and wars, Nehru adopted the policy of Non-Alignment instead of siding with any superpower and introduced the Panchsheel principles for global peace, he added. "Inagala Venkatram Reddy remarked that Nehru dedicated his life to the welfare and future of children, which is why he came to be affectionately known as "Chacha Nehru." He emphasized that Nehru was not merely a Congress leader but a statesman who elevated India's prestige on the international stage. "Stating that the foundations laid by Nehru continue to drive India's development even today, he criticised attempts by certain sections to distort history and diminish Nehru's legacy. However, he asserted that no one could erase Nehru's place from India's history or from the hearts of the people. Expedite the Grain Procurement Process: Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau – Indian Chronicle – May 27): District Collector Anurag Jayanti emphasized the need to expedite the grain procurement process. On Wednesday, the District Collector visited and inspected the PACS grain procurement center located at the Turkapalli Mandal headquarters, as well as the IKP grain procurement center in Datthaipalli village within the Turkapalli Mandal. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector inquired with officials regarding the total quantity of grain procured thus far and the amount currently remaining in stock. He instructed officials to procure the grain brought by farmers without any delay and to take immediate measures to transport the weighed grain to the mills. He questioned the officials to ensure that a sufficient number of lorries were available to match the volume of grain weighed on a daily basis. He issued orders to the officials to weigh and dispatch at least 4 to 5 lorry-loads of grain to the mills every day. He further advised that the transportation process be carried out continuously to prevent the accumulation of grain stocks at the procurement centers. The Collector stated that even if any grain has been dampened due to rains, it must be procured in accordance with government regulations, ensuring that farmers are not subjected to any difficulties. He directed officials from the concerned departments to work in coordination to ensure that farmers do not face any hurdles during the process of selling their grain. “Officials from the relevant departments participated in this program.



Victims' dharna demanding justice for the victims of the road widening project from Nalgonda intersection to Hyderabad intersection

Will Procure Every Single Grain; Farmers Need Not Panic: Minister Gaddam Vivekanand

“Mancherial/ Jaipur, May 27 (INDIAN CHRONICLE) “State Minister for Labour, Employment, Training, Factories, Mines, and Geology, Gaddam Vivekanand, emphasized that the state government is deeply committed to farmer welfare and will ensure hassle-free grain procurement across all centers. On Wednesday, the Minister, along with Mancherial District Collector Kumar Deepak, Jaipur ACP Venkateshwarlu, and Mandal Tahsildar Vanaja Reddy, visited the paddy procurement center at Tekumatla village in Jaipur mandal to inspect the ongoing operations. “Speaking on the occasion, the Minister stated that the government is implementing numerous farmer-centric initiatives, ensuring that quality grain is procured as per regulations and payments are directly credited to the farmers' bank accounts. He noted that unlike previous years where the yield was around 25 quintals per acre, this season has seen an impressive output of 28 to 32 quintals per acre. He targetted to complete the district's total procurement goal of 1.70 lakh metric tonnes by June 4, well ahead of the usual June 6 timeline. “To support farmers and prevent stock damage, two new ware-

houses are being set up in Peddapalli. Addressing the shortage of laborers caused by the ongoing elections in West Bengal, the Minister said local laborers have been deployed to expedite the loading and unloading processes. Additionally, Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) has agreed to provide trucks, and 10 sand trucks have also been repurposed to ensure smooth transportation. Criticizing opposition elements for attempting to instigate protests among farmers for political mileage, the Minister urged everyone to rise above party lines for the sake of farmers. He assured that even in areas where harvesting was delayed, every grain would be purchased. He also highlighted other welfare schemes being successfully delivered to the public, including the Indiramma Housing scheme, a ₹500 bonus for fine-variety paddy, and the Gruha Jyothi scheme. “Funds to be Credited Within 48 Hours: District Collector Kumar Deepak “District Collector Kumar Deepak stated that out of the 51,000 metric tonnes procurement target handled by certain departments, 36,000 metric tonnes have already been successfully procured. Two additional warehouses equipped with adequate la-



bor have been secured in Peddapalli and Karimnagar to safely store the grains against unexpected seasonal rains. He added that the Sumukha warehouse in Jaipur has a storage capacity of 35,000 metric tonnes, supported by 50 laborers, ensuring swift operations at both rice mills and storage centers. “The Collector further informed that 62% of the tab entries have been completed, and the amounts are being credited to the respective farmers' bank accounts within 48 hours. The administration is working efficiently to wrap up the entire paddy procurement process within the next

three days. Regarding maize, out of the 8,700 metric tonnes target, 3,000 metric tonnes are yet to be procured. “Prior to the main briefing, the District Collector along with the Mandal Tahsildar visited the procurement center at Tekumatla, Balaji Warehouse, Shetphalli Procurement Center, Varalakshmi Rice Mill in Indaram, and Sumukha Warehouse to personally review the procurement, storage, and transport logistics, issuing necessary directives to the officials. “The inspection was attended by respective department officials and local public representatives.

Full-Scale Road Widening Must Be Undertaken : Former MLA Kondeti Sridhar

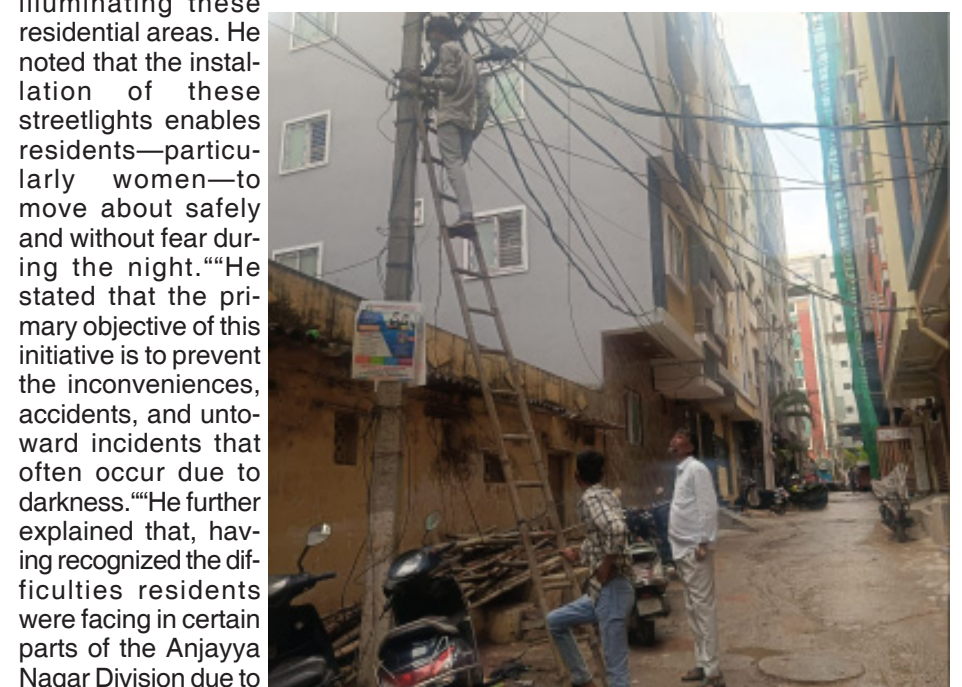

Banning a pesticide will not stop farmer suicides. Need science-based approach to address the root cause

“““““Hyderabad: “““““The Government reviews the sale of crop-protection products Paraquat Dichloride and Carbosulfan, following a restriction in Telangana and concern over poisoning deaths, CropLife India urges that any decision must be guided by a clear understanding of what actually drives farmer suicides, and by a realistic view of what a ban would mean for farmers already under severe strain. A restriction removes the means, but it does not remove the root cause. In fact, restricting a product may deepen the distress that drives a farmer to take his or her life. “The evidence is well documented. The drivers identified across the scientific literature are consistent, including debt, crop failure, the absence of alternative livelihoods, and the inability to repay loans when the harvest fails. For instance, a 2024 qualitative study of farmer suicides in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh, published in the Indian Journal of Community Medicine, concluded that the main causes are economic rather than related to the mental health of farmers, identifying debt and the resulting debt-trap as the central driver. Another study, by



the International Institute for Environment and Development, analysing data from 2014-15 to 2020-21 across five high-burden states, found that farmer suicides rise and fall with rainfall – at a 5% rainfall deviation the average was about 810 farmer suicides a year, rising to a projected 1,188 in a year of 25% rainfall deficit. The same study found that where guaranteed employment and social protection were available, suicide numbers stayed lower even after crop failure. Taken together, the evidence makes clear that suicide is the symptom of a deeper crisis, and that restrictions on vital crop-protection products may only exacerbate it. The Government has, over the years, steadily strengthened the safety net for farmers through income support, crop insurance, institutional credit and rural employment guarantees, and CropLife India urges all stakeholders, industry included, to build on this foundation and double down to empower the farmer against the distress at the heart of the crisis. “““““The timing makes this especially urgent. CropLife India urges the Government to take into consideration the needs at the farm, especially as the kharif sowing season begins, when farmers have already planned and committed to their inputs for the year. Disrupting affordable, established weed and pest control mid-season would raise costs and add to the financial pressure on farmers at the very moment they can least absorb it, the same pressure the evidence identifies as the real driver of these tragedies.”
