

## Political Party Representatives Must Appoint Booth-wise BLOs and Cooperate with the SIR Process: District Collector Anurag Jayanti



“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau... Indian Chronicle... May 29): District Collector Anurag Jayanti has urged representatives of political parties to appoint Booth-Level Officers (BLOs) on a booth-wise basis within their respective constituencies and to cooperate with the Special Summary Revision (SIR) process. On Friday, a meeting regarding the SIR was held with leaders of recognized political parties in the Video Conference (VC) Hall at the District Collectorate. Speaking on the occasion, the Collector stated that booth-level agents would act as official representatives for their respective political parties and would also oversee the transparency of the SIR activities. He noted that these booth-level agents would assist Booth-Level Officers (BLOs) by coordinating with voters while conducting door-to-door surveys to enumerate them. He further explained that they would aid in identifying deceased voters, voters who have relocated, duplicate entries, and eligible voters who are currently absent. He added that they

would assist in helping citizens understand the SIR procedures and would guide them on how to correctly fill out forms for voter registration, deletion, or modification. The Collector emphasized that all necessary precautionary measures would be taken to ensure that not a single eligible voter is overlooked. The Election Commission has issued directives stating that Booth Level Agents (BLAs) must work in coordination with Booth Level Officers, Electoral Registration Officers, and Assistant Electoral Registration Officers; furthermore, they are required to mandatorily attend revision meetings and training programs. The Commission also mandated that BLAs actively participate in special comprehensive revision programs aimed at enhancing the transparency and accuracy of voter lists. Consequently, the Collector advised political parties that have not yet appointed Booth Level Agents to appoint their representatives immediately. Additional District Revenue Collector Venka Reddy, JAC Chairman Mandadi Upender Reddy, leaders from various political parties, and others participated in this program.

## Arrangements should be made to celebrate Telangana State Formation Day in a grand manner:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

## PMJ robbery case: Karimnagar police secure custody of alleged mastermind

Accused Subodh Singh brought from Bihar prison on PT warrants obtained from six courts.

KARIMNAGAR May 29 (Correspondent): Karimnagar Police have taken into custody Subodh Singh, the alleged mastermind in the sensational PMJ Jewellery robbery case in which employees were allegedly shot at during a heist earlier this month.



Police Commissioner Gaush Alam said the accused was brought to Karimnagar from Purnia Jail in Bihar on transit remand warrants obtained from six different courts where cases are pending against him.

According to the police, the robbery took place on May 3 at a jewellery showroom in Karimnagar town. During the incident, armed assailants allegedly opened fire on employees before fleeing with valuables, triggering widespread concern in the region.

The Commissioner said a special police team escorted the accused from Bihar and reached Karimnagar on Thursday night. Subodh Singh was produced before the duty magistrate shortly after midnight and was subsequently remanded to judicial custody.

Police have filed a petition in a Karimnagar court seeking custody of the accused for one week to facilitate detailed interrogation and gather further information related to the case and possible accomplices.

# “Every Party Worker Must Act Like a Soldier in Protecting Voting Rights” — Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya

“““Parakala/Hanamkonda, May 29 (Indian Chronicle) : Warangal Member of Parliament Dr. Kadiyam Kavya has called upon Booth Level Agents (BLAs) to remain vigilant regarding the controversial developments occurring nationwide concerning the maintenance of voter lists, and to work like dedicated soldiers in safeguarding democratic rights. Alleging that the BJP is engaging in dangerous political machinations through voter lists, she urged party workers to firmly counter any attempt at the grassroots level to steal votes. ““On Friday, the MP attended a constituency-level awareness seminar for Booth Level Agents held at the NSR Convention Hall in Parkal, accompanied by MLA Revuri Prakash Reddy, DCC President Inagala Venkatram Reddy, and Mohammed Ayub. During the event, a detailed PowerPoint presentation was delivered, outlining the Special Summary Revision (SSR) process, voter list management, and the responsibilities associated with the booth level. ““Addressing the gathering, Dr. Kadiyam Kavya stated that every Booth Level Agent must maintain constant interaction with the public and serve as a strong representative of the party at the grassroots level. She emphasized the necessity for party workers to possess a comprehensive understanding of public issues, voter details,

and government welfare schemes. ““She noted that maintaining accuracy in voter lists has become a significant challenge due to frequent migration, changes in residence, reliance on rented accommodation, and job-related transfers. Under these circumstances, she stated that the SIR process holds immense importance. ““Referring to the fact that the SIR process is being conducted in 2026—for the first time since 2002—the MP urged party leaders and booth agents to undertake this exercise with the utmost responsibility and seriousness. She called for special attention to be paid to house mapping, the identification of new voters, the updating of changed voter details, and the verification of suspicious registrations. ““In light of allegations that changes are being made to voter lists in certain states under the guise of the SIR process, Dr. Kavya cautioned leaders to closely monitor developments in those regions. She stressed the need for Telangana to remain vigilant to prevent such situations from arising. Referring to the struggle being waged by Congress leader Rahul Gandhi against electoral irregularities, she remarked, ““We must safeguard our vote. Every BLA (Booth Level Agent) must act like a soldier. ““She directed booth-level agents and BLOs to jointly undertake a door-to-door campaign over



the coming three months. She stated that the primary objective must be to ensure voting rights for every eligible citizen, and emphasized that an accurate voter list serves as the first step toward electoral victory. She informed that division-wise in-charges have already been appointed. She directed party leaders to conduct extensive meetings in the coming days with booth-level

conveners, agents, and key leaders. ““Subsequently, Dr. Kadiyam Kavya unveiled the “Brief Information Handbook for Booth-Level Agents,” which was prepared under her guidance, and distributed copies to the BLAs and division in-charges. ““Congress public representatives, former public representatives, division presidents, party leaders, booth presidents, and party workers participated in this event.

He asked the details about how many staff are working in the

PHC and whether all the doctors and staff working are attending their duties regularly. He warned that strict action will be taken against those who show negligence towards their duties. ““The Collector inspected the facilities provided to the patients in the hospital and asked the medical officials about the arrangements required to provide better services. He personally inquired about the health condition of the patients currently undergoing treatment at the hospital and inquired about the medical services being provided to them. He asked how many deliveries were done in PHCs this month and how many deliveries were registered in private hospitals. He suggested that the medical staff should work to increase the number of deliveries in government hospitals. He said that quality medical services should be provided to pregnant women and the public should increase their confidence in government hospitals. ““He asked how NCD (Non-Communicable Diseases) patients are being tracked. He suggested that those suffering from chronic diseases like sugar and BP should be followed up continuously. ““He said that a review will be conducted on the performance of PHCs every month, in which the performance of the staff will be rated. He said that the responsibility of always providing better medical services to the people lies with the medical staff. He said that efforts should be made to ensure that every patient coming to government hospitals gets quality services. District Medical Officer Manohar, doctors, staff and concerned officials participated in this program.



# Congress reviews voter revision exercise, calls for vigilance on SIR process

## Leaders urge cadre to strengthen booth-level network and ensure no eligible voter is left out.

KARIMNAGAR May 29 (Correspondent): The Congress party on Friday conducted separate review meetings on the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls, voter mapping and the appointment and training of BLA-2 agents, with party leaders calling upon cadre to remain vigilant and strengthen the organisation at the grassroots level.

The meetings were held at the District Congress office under the leadership of Choppadandi MLA and Karimnagar District Congress Committee president Medipalli Satyam and Karimnagar Corporation Congress president Anjan Kumar as part of the Sanghatan Srujan Abhayan.

Former MLA and Karimnagar Parliament PCC coordinator Kuna Srisailam Goud attended the meetings and reviewed the ongoing voter revision exercise in the district. Directions were issued to mandal, town and division Congress presidents, affiliated wings and party workers on booth-level strengthening, voter awareness and organisational coordination.

Addressing the gathering, Mr. Satyam alleged that the impact of the SIR exercise would be more pronounced in urban areas such as Karimnagar and Hyderabad due to migration of voters from different regions. He urged party workers to actively participate in the revision process and ensure that eligible voters were neither excluded nor overlooked during enrolment.

He expressed confidence that the Congress would retain power in Telangana under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, citing the implementation of welfare schemes and farmer-centric programmes by the State government.

Highlighting measures taken by the government, Mr. Satyam said the State had implemented farm loan waivers for a majority of farmers with loans up to ₹2 lakh, provided a bonus for fine variety paddy and expanded welfare initiatives including Indiramma housing, free bus travel for women and free electricity for eligible households.

He criticised the previous BRS government for allegedly pushing the State into financial distress and accused the Opposition of spreading misinformation against the Congress through social media campaigns.

Calling for internal unity, he urged party leaders and workers to avoid public criticism of one another and focus on strengthening the organisation ahead

of future elections.

Mr. Kuna Srisailam Goud said senior Congress leaders had asked party cadre and the public to remain alert about the SIR process. Alleging that attempts were being made to remove Congress-supporting voters from electoral rolls, he stressed the need for greater public awareness and booth-level monitoring.

He advised party workers not to leave the responsibility entirely to BLA-2 agents and suggested that at least five party members from every booth actively monitor voter mapping and enrolment activities.

Mr. Anjan Kumar said the appointment of BLA-2 agents within the Karimnagar Corporation limits had been completed and training sessions for them would be organised shortly. He said the party was continuously monitoring the electoral revision process being undertaken by election officials in the city.

Several Congress leaders, corporators, market committee chairpersons, sarpanches, councillors and party workers attended the meetings.



## Dangerous Dividers Becoming a Threat to Lives



“Bowenpally. may. 29 (Indian Chronicle):“The negligence of officials in completing development works on time is putting the lives of people at risk. A clear example of this can be seen at the Center Point junction in Boinpally, under the Cantonment Board limits.“The Center Point crossroads witnesses heavy vehicular traffic every day. A few years ago, road dividers were installed for about 50 meters from Center Point to Anand Collection to regulate traffic movement. However, over time, many of these dividers were shifted to other areas as per requirements. In the process, several dividers were damaged after being hit by vehicles, and currently only four or five remain in the middle of the road in a dilapidated condition.“As vehicles continue to move through the busy junction, speeding motorists often fail to notice these damaged dividers and end up colliding with them, leading to accidents. The situation becomes even more dangerous during nighttime, with accidents occurring frequently. Even a slight loss of control could result in motorists losing their lives.“Locals say that despite informing the authorities about the issue, no action has been taken so far. Vehicle owners and residents are now urging the authorities and traffic police to respond immediately and resolve the problem before a major tragedy occurs.

# Every Voter's Details Must Be Thoroughly Verified: District Collector Divakar TS "SIR Programme Should Be Conducted Transparently and Impartially"

BLOs Must Visit Every Household for Complete Verification "Field-Level Inquiry Must Be Conducted on Every Claim and Objection Before Preparing Draft Electoral Rolls" Continuous Coordination Should Be Maintained with Political Parties "District Collector Reviews SIR Programme with Officials" Khammam, May 29 (Indian chronicle): "District Collector Divakar TS stated that every voter's details should be thoroughly verified at the field level through the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) programme and that the mapping process should be expedited further. "On Friday, the District Collector, along with Additional Collector P. Sreeja and Municipal Corporation Commissioner Abhishek Agastya, reviewed the progress of voter list Special Intensive Revision (SIR) activities with officials at the Collectorate. Mandal-wise mapping details were examined and several instructions were issued. "Speaking on the occasion, the Collector emphasized that the voter list revision programme must be conducted meticulously without any errors. He instructed officials to continuously monitor the work of Booth Level Officers (BLOs) involved in the SIR mapping process and ensure completion within the prescribed targets. He stressed the importance of accurate field verification, proper data entry, and transparency in the process. "The Collector directed officials to ensure 100 percent mapping of voters in all mandals, corporations, and municipalities covered under the SIR programme. "He stated that the Special Intensive Revision process would be conducted from June 24 to July 25. Applications received through

Forms 6, 7, and 8 should be verified promptly, and details of deceased voters must be confirmed for removal from the rolls. Information regarding transferred and deceased voters should be properly verified and records updated accordingly. "The Collector appealed to political party representatives to cooperate in ensuring that all voters participate in the special revision programme and provide accurate information for the preparation of an error-free voter list. "He instructed BLOs to carry out door-to-door distribution and collection of enumeration forms. Voters were also informed that they could register and update their details through the Election Commission's online services. "Officials were directed to effectively implement the process of including all eligible voters and removing ineligible voters after proper field verification. The Collector noted that the SIR programme would help remove duplicate entries, permanently migrated voters, and deceased voters from the electoral rolls. "From June 25 to July 24, Booth Level Officers have been instructed to visit every household and thoroughly verify voter details. The Collector stressed that the door-to-door survey must be conducted in a foolproof manner and every eligible voter identified and included in the rolls. He also directed officials to carefully scrutinize every detail before preparing the draft voter list. "He instructed that all members of a family should preferably be placed under the same polling station jurisdiction. If the number of voters exceeds 1,200 in any polling station, proposals for establishing new polling stations should be prepared. Adequate availability of enumeration forms with



every BLO must also be ensured. "The Collector further directed officials to conduct training programmes so that every BLO gains complete understanding of SIR rules, procedures, field verification methods, and form management. Necessary arrangements for training should be completed on time. "The draft electoral rolls will be published on July 31. After publication, objections, new claims, and applications received from the public should be verified at the field level before any decision is taken. He instructed officials not to neglect any complaint and to conduct proper field inquiries for every application. "Objections and claims will be accepted from July 31 to August 30, while the resolution process will continue until September 28. The final electoral rolls are

scheduled to be published on October 1. "Earlier on Friday, the State Chief Electoral Officer C. Sudarshan Reddy conducted a high-level video conference from Hyderabad to review the implementation, training, and other aspects of the SIR-2026 process with District Collectors and election officials. Training sessions for District Election Officers, Electoral Registration Officers, Assistant Electoral Registration Officers, BLOs, and supervisors were also conducted through video conference. District Collector Divakar TS participated in the conference from the Khammam Collectorate. "SDC Rajeshwari, Election Superintendent Raju, Khammam Urban Tahsildar Jayachander, Ansari, and officials from various departments participated in the programme.

## MLA Sriganesh distributes loan cheques worth Rs 2.07 crore and sarees to girls in Cantonment

He warned that strict action would be taken against rice millers if they act against government regulations, and instructed officials to bring any such violations to his notice immediately.”“He advised the officials to transport only quality-checked paddy to the rice mills and reiterated that no "cutting" (weight deduction) should be allowed under any circumstances. Furthermore, he ordered that 100% of the tab entries related to the procured paddy must be completed promptly.”“The Collector specified that paddy procurement at all procurement centers must be completed and the centers should be closed by June 2.”“The review meeting was attended by DRDO Kalindini, DCO Srimala, APMs, APOs, and other concerned department officials.

## Tension at IKP Office Over Alleged Misconduct by APM Gramadeepikas Stage Protest at Office Gate in Nelakondapalli

“Khammam, Nelakondapalli, May 29 (Indian chronicle):“Tension prevailed at the Mandal Mother Teresa (IKP) office in Nelakondapalli on Friday after Gramadeepikas staged a protest alleging that IKP APM K. Surender used abusive language against them.”“According to reports, the Gramadeepikas, who have been continuing their indefinite strike, received information that the local IKP APM had made objectionable remarks about them at the office. Following this, a group of Gramadeepikas reached the IKP office and questioned the APM over the



alleged comments.”“APM K. Surender denied making any insulting remarks against anyone. However, the Gramadeepikas confronted him, leading to a heated argument between both sides. The situation turned tense as office staff reportedly began recording videos from the windows, further angering the protesters.”“Amid shouting and heated exchanges, the atmosphere at the office became highly charged. The Gramadeepikas staged a dharna at the main gate of the office demanding an explanation.”“Speaking on the occasion, APM K. Surender stated that he had not made any such remarks. However, he added that if anyone felt hurt by his words, he was ready to apologize. Following his statement, the protesters withdrew their agitation.”“Later, District Leader of the Gramadeepika Association Rajaputra Parvathibai stated that their protests would continue until their demands and issues were resolved.

## The revision of minimum wages announced by the Telangana government lacks scientific basis:- CITU State Vice President J. Mallikarjun

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...May 29):- The revision of minimum wages announced by the Telangana government recently lacks scientific basis and these amendments are not in line with the increased prices but are meant to cheat the workers, said Comrade J. Mallikarjun, State Vice President of the Centre of Indian Trade Unions (CITU). He was the chief guest on the second day of the CITU district political training classes being held at the "Thirandasu Gopi Meeting Hall" in the Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district center and addressed the topic of CITU formation. On this occasion, J. Mallikarjun said that the workers have fought many battles for the revision of minimum wages for the last fourteen years. He said that the wage revision rules released by the government after a long wait are a slap in the face to the workers. He was angry that the wages were revised unilaterally for the interests of the employers instead of taking into account the food, accommodation, education and medical expenses of a



family as per the recommendations of the 15th Indian Labour Conference (ILC) and the Supreme Court verdicts. “He said that it is regrettable that the government does not have the slightest idea that the minimum wage given to the working people in Telangana, which claims to be the richest state in the country, should be respectable. He criticized that this will legalize the exploitation of labor by lakhs of workers in industries. Speaking about the labor movement in the country,

Comrade Bhupal, State Vice President of CITU, said that workers play a significant role in the development of the country and criticized the governments for not caring about the workers who are the creators of wealth and for thinking that the employers are the creators of wealth. He said that the government should immediately review the minimum wages and increase the minimum wage to Rs. layers are reportedly peeling off, causing concern among the residents.“The colony residents criticized the contractor for ignoring public issues and acting irresponsibly. They urged officials to immediately inspect the works and take strict action against the contractor for failing to follow quality standards. ## Are the Poor Ignored While Lands Are Handed Over to the Rich? "CPI Warns of Agitation if NSP Encroachments Are Not Removed

“Khammam, May 29 (Indian chronicle): “CPI District Secretary Dandi Suresh questioned why revenue and police officials forcibly removed huts built by poor families on NSP canal bunds while remaining silent when wealthy individuals allegedly encroach on the same lands. He demanded to know whether the law was being applied differently for the poor and the rich and urged officials to clarify their stand immediately. “On Friday, a CPI team visited encroached areas of NSP lands in Khammam. The team inspected places where authorities had earlier removed huts of poor families, claiming that green belts would be developed there. However, they found that large-scale constructions were now taking place in those areas. “Suresh alleged that several officials, retired government employees, and political leaders were among those involved in the encroachments. He criticized political leaders who had previously approached courts and ensured the



removal of poor people's huts from the NSP canal bunds, but were now allegedly occupying the same lands and constructing sheds themselves. “He stated that officials had confirmed the Nagarjuna Sagar canal under NSP Major-2 has a width of 66 feet, but encroachments had begun in front of the Ashtalakshmi Temple in the 12th Division and were spreading unchecked along the Gollagudem Road. According to him, some individuals had already completed their constructions, while others removed government-installed fencing and erected their own fencing to occupy the land. “Suresh alleged that some political leaders were encouraging these encroachments and claimed that a few people had even changed political parties solely to occupy lands. He criticized authorities for failing to establish the promised green belt after removing the huts of poor families and for ignoring the ongoing encroachments. “He warned that if the encroachments were not removed immediately, poor people would once again occupy the lands and build houses there. Suresh demanded that public representatives and officials recognize that certain members of the ruling party were allegedly supporting these encroachments and take appropriate action. “The inspection team included CPI District Assistant Secretary Jammula Jitender Reddy, State Committee member Yerrababu, District Executive Member Enugu Gandhi, and CPI leaders Upender, Narasimha Rao, Saidulu, Maduri Srinu, and others.
