

## Municipal Commissioner inspects dump yard, calls for faster bio mining operations Directs officials to curb smoke emissions and strengthen fire safety measures.

KARIMNAGAR May 30 (Correspondent): Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai on Saturday inspected the dump yard located along the bypass road as part of efforts to improve sanitation and solid waste management in the city.

Accompanied by officials from the Engineering and Sanitation Departments, Mr. Desai reviewed the ongoing biomining operations being undertaken to clear legacy waste accumulated at the site. He examined the progress of the work and sought details on the quantity of waste processed and the current stage of the bio mining project.

The Commissioner directed officials and the contractor's representatives to expedite the bio mining process and ensure its timely completion. He emphasised the need for accelerating waste remediation measures to mitigate environmental concerns and improve waste management practices.

During the visit, Mr. Desai also inspected areas within the dump yard where smoke and minor fires had been reported due to the accumulation of gases generated from decomposing waste. He instructed staff to take immediate steps to contain the smoke and prevent inconvenience to residents living in nearby colonies

The Commissioner further directed officials to maintain continuous surveillance of the site and strictly adhere to fire safety protocols to prevent any untoward incidents.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Desai said the Municipal Corporation was committed to making the city cleaner and more environmentally sustainable. He noted that the bio mining initiative was being implemented on a priority basis to provide a long-term solution to waste disposal issues and reduce the impact of the



dump yard on surrounding habitations.

He expressed confidence that the site would be fully reclaimed and the problems faced by local residents would be resolved in the near future.

## Severe Fiber Deficiency Found Among Indians -Aashirvaad Happy Tummy Report

“Hyderabad, May 30 (Indian Chronicle) : On the occasion of World Digestive Health Day, Aashirvaad Happy Tummy released its latest findings on India’s digestive health landscape, according to a statement issued in Hyderabad on Saturday by Anuj Rastogi, Chief Executive of the ITC Staples Business Unit. Speaking on the report, Rastogi said the study revealed a significant gap in fiber consumption among Indians. According to the research, which surveyed around 650,000 participants, seven out of every ten Indians do not consume the recommended daily amount of dietary fiber. The report found that the problem is even more pronounced among women. It also highlighted that only one in four people consumes multigrain foods on a daily basis, while nearly 40 percent of respondents eat fruits only occasionally. In addition, the study identified lifestyle factors affecting digestive health, including lack of physical activity, inadequate water intake, insufficient sleep, and stress. The report noted that nearly 60 percent of participants do not engage in regular exercise. Rastogi emphasized the need for greater public awareness about the importance of fiber consumption and said that healthier dietary choices can lead to significant improvements in digestive health and overall well-being.

## Commissioner stresses vigilance to maintain law and order

### Directs police to register migrant workers, update CCTNS records promptly and keep watch on habitual offenders.

KARIMNAGAR May 30 (Correspondent): Police Commissioner Gaush Alam has directed officers across the Karimnagar Commissionerate to remain vigilant and focus on maintaining law and order while strengthening crime prevention measures.

Reviewing police station functioning, digital record maintenance and field-level policing through a video conference with senior officers on Saturday, the Commissioner stressed the need for greater monitoring of migrant workers, timely updating of crime records and strict surveillance on habitual offenders.



Expressing concern over the incomplete registration of migrant workers, Mr. Alam said that while nearly 1,000 Nepali nationals were employed in various sectors within the Commissionerate limits, details of only 169 persons had been recorded so far. He instructed police stations to collect and maintain complete particulars of all workers from other States and countries, including copies of their identity documents. Employers were also asked to share details of migrant

labourers engaged by them.

The Commissioner emphasised the importance of regularly updating the Crime and Criminal Tracking Network and Systems (CCTNS) portal, stating that future investigations, case tracking and record verification would largely depend on the digital platform. He warned that delays in uploading case details would not be tolerated.

Mr. Alam also directed officers to maintain continuous surveillance on rowdy-sheeters, history-sheeters and other anti-social elements. Preventive measures should be taken to ensure that their activities do not disturb public peace, he said.

On the management of police station malkhanas, the Commissioner instructed officials to ensure proper documentation and secure custody of seized property and case-related materials. The storage facilities should be maintained in a transparent and systematic manner, he added.

ACP (CCRB) Srinivas G., Inspector Sarilal, Communication Inspector Praveen and other police personnel participated in the review meeting.

Despite these alarming occurrences, it is deeply regrettable that the municipal administration and officials continue to feign ignorance—failing to declare an emergency, convene urgent meetings to address these critical issues, or engage in meaningful discussions



regarding matters of genuine public urgency. Although the Supreme Court recently issued directives regarding stray dogs, the authorities in our Bhuvanagiri town have yet to take action. Consequently, the BRS leaders issued a stern warning: if immediate steps are not taken to capture the stray dogs and monkeys across all 35 wards of Bhuvanagiri town, they will lay siege to the Municipal Office. Furthermore, regarding the long-standing allegations of massive corruption within the MEPMA department of the Bhuvanagiri Municipality, the administration has—to this day—failed to provide the public with any details. They have neither issued a public statement (via newspapers or other media) disclosing the extent of the corruption nor informed the public about what disciplinary actions, if any, have been taken against the implicated officials and Resource Persons (RPs). The BRS leaders demanded the immediate suspension of the corrupt officials, declaring that if this demand is not met, the party will launch a vigorous agitation in the days to come.

## Government Whip MLA Beerla Ayilaiah's cycle yatra in protest against the increase in petrol and diesel prices

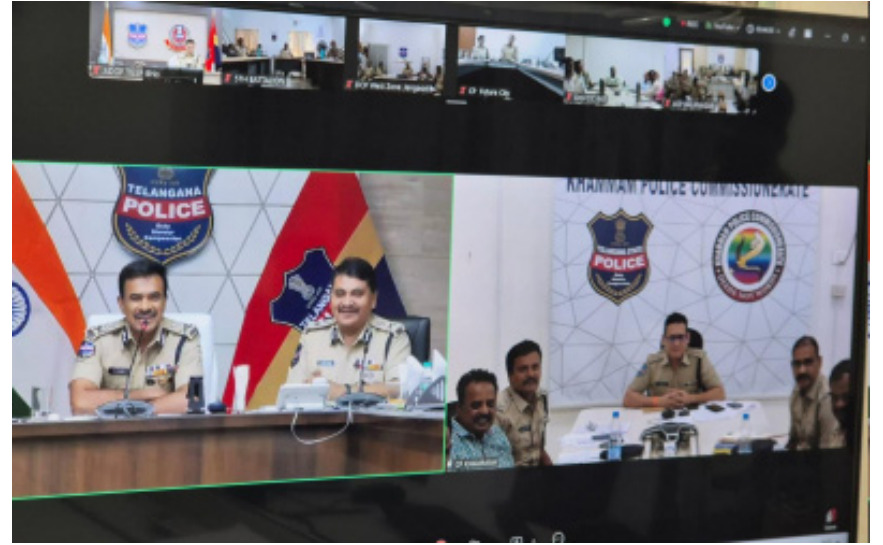


Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district to Turkapalli mandal center in protest against the increase in petrol and diesel prices. This yatra was organized to urge the central government to reduce the increasing fuel burden on the people. On this occasion, the MLA visited the grain purchase centers in Turkapalli village via Mallapur, Dattaipalli and Venkatapuram villages under Yadagirigutta mandal. He examined the high stock of grain in the purchase centers, the problem of lorries and the difficulties faced by farmers. He said that no negligence should be shown in the grain procurement process and action should be taken against the officials if any grain is found in any grain procurement center till June 2nd. MLA Beerla Ayilaiah ordered the officials to ensure that farmers do not face any problems. He suggested that lorries should be arranged immediately and steps should be taken to transport the grain to the godowns. He also clarified to the officials that the porters should be shifted from other areas to Turkapalli mandal and the grain loading work should be expedited. He said that the purchase process should be completed quickly without farmers facing any problems. Later, the MLA, who went to Venkatapuram village from Dattaayipalli, found that there were leaks in four to five places in the Mission Bhagiratha main pipeline there. He immediately spoke to Telangana State Minister Smt. Seethakka on the phone and explained the seriousness of the problem. He asked them to immediately give orders for repair work to prevent the people from facing drinking water problems and to stop the wastage of water. Responding to this, Minister Seethakka garu immediately issued orders to the officials and assured that steps would be taken to resolve the issue. Similarly, during the visit, people brought various problems in their villages to the attention of MLA Beerla Ayilaiah, who immediately spoke to the concerned officials on the phone and suggested that the problems be resolved quickly. He stated that if drug consumption is not curbed under the present circumstances, the future of the youth will be severely affected.”“He directed police officers to monitor the habits and activities of students in residential educational institutions, government hostels, and private hostels. Special surveillance should be established to prevent the supply of drugs and narcotic substances around educational institutions. He also emphasized the need to create public awareness about the harmful consequences of drug abuse and to work in coordination for its effective control.”“The DGP observed that cyber crimes are increasing much faster than conventional theft cases. He noted that cyber criminals are exploiting evolving technologies to swindle thousands of crores of rupees from the public. In this context, he advised police officers to actively participate in cybercrime awareness programs and educate people about cyber safety.”“To prevent road accidents, reduce loss of life, improve road safety, and ensure smooth traffic movement, he stressed the need for strict implementation of traffic management measures.”“Giving the highest priority to the safety of women and children, he said that special units such as She Teams and Bharosa Centres should continue to work actively to curb issues such as sexual harassment, domestic violence, and cyber crimes.”“He also directed police personnel to strengthen visible policing through night patrolling, cordon-and-search operations, and extensive vehicle checks.”“The DGP stated that transparency is of utmost importance for the police system that safeguards law and order in society, as it helps build public trust in the institution.”“He further



emphasized that the police machinery must remain constantly vigilant to ensure a crime-free society and the strict enforcement of laws.”“On this occasion, Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt briefed the meeting on various related issues.
