

Farmers should purchase Yasangi paddy without any hassle: State Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy



“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...May 4):- State Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy said that farmers should purchase Yasangi paddy without any hassle. On Monday, Ministers Ponnamm Prabhakar, Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, Vakiti Srihari, Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Adluri Laxman Kumar, State Chief Secretary Ramakrishna Rao, Civil Supplies Commissioner Stephen Ravindra, and Transport Commissioner Ilambarthi reviewed the video conference held from the State Secretariat in Hyderabad with the Collectors, Additional Collectors, and Civil Supplies Department officials of all districts. District Collector Anurag Jayanthi and Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy participated in this video conference. Speaking on the occasion, the Minister said that protective measures should be taken at the procurement centers as the state is receiving untimely rains. He said that adequate tarpaulin covers should be available at the procurement centers. Farmers should keep their grain piles at higher altitudes as there is a lot of rain in a short period of time. Farmers should take precautions to prevent tarpaulin covers from blowing away in the wind. “The officials should inform the farmers of the warnings of the Meteorological Department. Steps should be taken to ensure that drinking water, shamiana, and ORS packets are available to the farmers

without any problems at the purchase centers. Humidifiers and automatic paddy cleaners should be made available. The purchased grain should be transported to the allocated rice mills. There should be no delay anywhere. Adjustments should be made to prevent shortage of porters and vehicles. Village and mandal level officials should supervise each purchase center. 80% of the grain purchase should be completed by the end of May. After this VC, District Collector Anurag Jayanthi spoke to the concerned officials.. They should ensure that there are enough gunny bags in all the purchase centers, as well as inform the details of the grain purchase for that day, and immediately enter the details of the grain purchase in the OPMS. “They should monitor the speedy import of the purchased grain.” In case of untimely rains, early steps should be taken to prevent the paddy from getting wet, and the village, mandal and district level officials should remain alert and monitor the smooth procurement of Yasangi paddy until the paddy procurement process is completed. “District Rural Development Officer Nagi Reddy, Civil Supply Manager Harikrishna, District Civil Supplies Officer Roja Rani, Transport Officer Sai Krishna, concerned officials, and others participated in this video conference.

20 grievances received at Karimnagar civic body; officials warned against pendency.

KARIMNAGAR May 4 (Correspondent): Commissioner Praful Desai on Monday directed officials to ensure prompt disposal of petitions received through the Prajavani programme, with no scope for pendency.

The Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) has urged District Collector T.S. Divakar to conduct a thorough inquiry into alleged irregularities in the appointment of media accreditation committee members and the issuance of accreditation cards for 2026–28 in Khammam district.

““Khammam May 04 Indian Chronicle: “A delegation led by district president Nanabala Ramakrishna and general secretary Arvapalli Nagesh met the



Collector and submitted a representation highlighting their concerns. “They alleged that there was a lack of transparency in the appointment of the accreditation committee and in the scrutiny of applications. According to them, proper representation was not given to all journalist unions, and preference was reportedly given to members of a single union. They also claimed that the committee formation process was carried out secretly without prior official notice, raising suspicions among journalist circles. “Further, the delegation pointed out that ineligible applications were allegedly approved during the online verification process across the district. They stated that key requirements outlined in Government Order (GO) No. 252—such as publication credibility, circulation data, organizational approvals, appointment letters, experience certificates, and salary slips—were not properly verified before issuing accreditation cards. “They also expressed concern that the verification process was conducted superficially, and individuals

lacking proper field experience and understanding of the media sector were being considered eligible. This, they warned, could lead to injustice for genuine working journalists. “The federation requested the Collector to conduct a comprehensive inquiry, review all irregular approvals, and ensure that only eligible and genuine journalists receive accreditation cards. They also demanded



that all journalist associations be given fair representation in future accreditation committees. “They urged the authorities to treat the matter as urgent and take necessary steps to ensure transparency, fairness, and equal opportunity in the media accreditation process. “Among those present were TWJF leaders including president Nanabala Ramakrishna, general secretary Arvapalli Nagesh, treasurer Vemulakonda Ramesh, vice presidents Kandaraboina Nagakrishna and Mamidala Kiran, district secretary of TBJA Kasoju Sridhar, Videographers Association joint secretary Karunakar Sudagani, city president Gantela Kumar, TBJA city president Elugoti Venkat, assistant secretary Chinnamshetty Rambabu, Press Club president Anthoti Srinivas, and others.

All-party farmers’ union leaders submit a memorandum to the District Collector

““Khammam, Karepalli, May 4 Indian Chronicle: All-party farmers’ union leaders have demanded immediate compensation and support for farmers whose crops were severely damaged due to untimely rains accompanied by heavy winds. On this occasion, the All-Party Farmers’ Union leaders—Dondapati



Ramesh, V. Prakash, Bontu Rambabu, Aavula Venkateshwarlu, Nageswara Rao, Banka Mallayya, Duggi Krishna, and SK Meera—under their leadership submitted a memorandum to the District Collector, urging relief for farmers affected by the heavy unseasonal rains and strong winds. They stated that maize and other crops have suffered heavy losses. Across Khammam district, farmers who invested borrowed money over thousands of acres saw their standing maize crop, ready for harvest, completely damaged due to rains, causing huge financial losses. They alleged that while the government has failed to ensure Minimum Support Price (MSP) for crops, procurement centers were not set up in a timely manner across the district. Even where procurement centers were established, delays in purchasing maize and transportation through lorries further increased farmers’ losses. “They said that in Singareni mandal alone, 41 gram panchayats have left maize farmers in distress, and demanded that all affected farmers across the district be compensated. They also demanded that procurement centers be equipped with drinking water, tents, medical kits, and gunny bags, and that procurement operations be accelerated. “Farmers’ union leaders SK Qasim, M. Giri, M. Suresh, P. Mohan Rao, and others participated in the programme.

Procurement of paddy at PPCs must be expedited, says Uttam Kumar Reddy

13.32 lakh metric tonnes procured so far; officials told to ensure swift lifting amid unseasonal rains.

KARIMNAGAR May 4 (Correspondent): Civil Supplies Minister on Monday directed officials to expedite procurement of paddy at Paddy Procurement Centres (PPCs) across the State, stressing the need for seamless logistics and timely support to farmers.

Chairing a video conference from Hyderabad, he reviewed procurement operations with Ministers Vakati Srihari, Ponnam Prabhakar, Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Adluri Laxman Kumar and Duddilla Sridhar Babu. Chitra Mishra participated from the Collectorate in Karimnagar.



Officials informed the meeting that 21.34 lakh metric tonnes of paddy had arrived at PPCs, of which 13.32 lakh metric tonnes had been procured so far. The Minister instructed that procurement be taken up without delay and that adequate arrangements be made for labour and transportation.

In view of recent unseasonal rains, he directed that moisture-affected paddy be procured immediately and transported to boiled rice mills. He also called for continuous dissemination of weather alerts to farmers and for keeping sufficient tarpaulins ready at procurement centres.

Basic amenities, including drinking water, ORS packets and shaded areas, should be ensured at all PPCs, he said, adding that procurement activity should be intensified during morning and evening hours. Farmers were cautioned against taking shelter near electric poles and large trees during lightning and rain.

Following the video conference, Ms. Mishra reviewed district-level arrangements with officials and emphasised the need to further accelerate procurement through IKP and PACS-run centres. She instructed that procured paddy be lifted promptly to designated rice mills and that transportation bottlenecks be avoided.

The Collector also directed officials to upload farmers' sale details online without delay and ensure there were no pending dues under Custom Milled Rice (CMR). She stressed regular communication of weather updates to farmers and asked field-level officials to closely monitor procurement centres.

Senior officials, including RDO Maheshwar, District Civil Supplies Officer Narsinga Rao, DM (Civil Supplies) Rajinikanth, DRDO Sridhar and DCO Ramanujachari, were present.

Cabinet gives green signal to revised estimates of Buggavagu check dam project

“Minister Tummala expresses gratitude to CM Revanth and the Cabinet

A new era for Kamepalli and Raghunathapalem mandals “Raghunathapalem mandal to turn fertile with Buggavagu left flood canal” Cabinet approves revised proposal worth ₹88.42 crore “Minister Tummala’s determination ensures irrigation security for Khammam farmers” Khammam, May 4 Indian Chronicle: “The state Cabinet today approved the revised estimates for the Buggavagu Left Flood Canal works, a project that will strengthen the irrigation sector in Khammam district. On this occasion, Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao expressed his gratitude to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and the Cabinet. With the implementation of this project, a new phase of agricultural development is set to begin in Kamepalli and Raghunathapalem mandals. “The Cabinet has approved the revised administrative sanction of ₹88.42 crore for the construction of the left flood canal, branch canals, and associated civil works from the Buggavagu dam. Although the initial estimate was ₹39.21 crore, the cost increased due to technical modifications in the design and modernization of the project. According to the revised estimates,



₹53.29 crore is allocated for works, ₹21.23 crore for taxes, ₹10.71 crore for land acquisition, and ₹3.19 crore for other expenses. With the implementation of this project, 31 tanks across 13 villages in Kamepalli and Raghunathapalem mandals will be filled with floodwaters, enabling stabilization of an ayacut area of about

2,866 acres. This will ensure reliable year-round irrigation for farmers, boosting agricultural productivity and income growth. “Earlier, due to land acquisition issues and farmer objections, the works had been stalled. Following the special initiative of Minister Tummala, key design changes were introduced. Instead of an open canal system, a gravity-based underground pipeline (gravity main) system was adopted, reducing land acquisition requirements from 232 acres to just 51 acres. This has enabled smoother implementation without major inconvenience to farmers. “Through this canal, 23 tanks in Kamepalli mandal and 8 tanks in Raghunathapalem mandal will be filled with floodwater, ensuring irrigation supply. At present, tanks in Raghunathapalem mandal receive irrigation water through the Manchikonda lift irrigation scheme, which incurs significant electricity costs for lifting water. Once the Buggavagu Left Canal is completed, water will be supplied through a gravity system, eliminating electricity usage and resulting in substantial savings for the government. “With this project, the region is set to become fertile, as tanks in both mandals and those under the lift irrigation scheme will be filled. This will lead to increased cropping intensity, crop diversification, and improved livelihoods and economic conditions of farmers. Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao played a key role in the implementation of this project. With Cabinet approval, the works are expected to accelerate, marking a significant step towards strengthening irrigation resources in Khammam district and transforming Raghunathapalem mandal into a fertile agricultural hub.

He said the party was founded in Kolkata (West Bengal) with the slogan "Nation first, party next, individual last."He stated that the Jana Sangh boldly opposed the first cabinet of Prime Minister Jawaharlal Nehru with the ideal of "one constitution, one prime minister, one flag."Fight against Didi's rule and NDA expansion"He alleged that the BJP is fighting against the "anarchic rule and hooliganism" of Mamata Banerjee in West Bengal. He claimed that BJP is the only party opposing illegal Bangladesh immigrants and protecting the state."He said the BJP, which once started with just three seats, is now nearing power in West Bengal. He alleged that despite having ministers for finance, agriculture, and revenue, none have even visited the affected farmers.He warned that if the government fails to act, it will face consequences. He demanded that the state government immediately procure the soaked paddy and maize within 48 hours on a war footing."Call for Modi rally"He said that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the saffron flag will rise in Telangana in the coming days.He mentioned that despite attempts to disrupt the press meet by switching off ACs and fans and leaving the venue in darkness, their spirit remains unshaken.He appealed to party workers and the public to attend the massive public meeting of PM Modi scheduled for September 10 at 4 PM at Parade Grounds, Secunderabad, saying people should gather "like an ant army."

““District Collector reviews development works at Collectorate““Khammam, May 04 Indian Chronicle:““District Collector Diwakar TS has directed officials to speed up priority development works in the district. On Monday, at the Collectorate meeting hall, the District Collector reviewed the progress of various priority development works in Khammam district along with concerned officials. During the review, Collector Diwakar TS instructed that proposals for the renovation of the structure near Illandu Road under Khammam Municipal Corporation and the establishment of a fruit market should be prepared in a timely manner. He also directed that the construction of the fruit market compound wall be completed at the earliest. He further stated that proposals for the construction of the Zilla Parishad Guest House should be submitted and efforts made to secure sanction of funds. Regarding Shilparamam, he noted that 9 acres of land have already been allocated, and an additional 3 acres and 21 guntas are required, instructing officials to take immediate action. He emphasized completing the Medical College construction works within the stipulated time and prioritizing land acquisition for irrigation projects. For underground drainage works, he instructed that the main sewage pipeline works be expedited. Out of a total 8.5 km pipeline, 7.7 km has already been completed, and the remaining work should be finished within 15 days. He also directed that precautions be taken to ensure there is no mixing with Mission Bhagiratha water supply. He stated that STP (Sewage Treatment Plant) works at Dhamsalapuram should be initiated soon. Land has already been allotted for the Haritha Hotel, and necessary steps should be taken to commence construction immediately. He instructed that pending works under double-bedroom housing should be completed and handed over to beneficiaries, and construction of Indiramma houses should be accelerated. Regarding Package-9 of the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project, he noted that there are some land acquisition issues and directed officials to resolve them quickly through discussions with locals, involving the Tahsildar and Sub-Collector. The meeting was attended by Kalluru Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav, concerned district officials, RDO Srinivas, and others.

He further stated that proposals for the construction of the Zilla Parishad Guest House should be submitted and efforts made to secure sanction of funds. Regarding Shilparamam, he noted that 9 acres of land have already been allocated, and an additional 3 acres and 21 guntas are required, instructing officials to take immediate action. He emphasized completing the Medical College construction works within the stipulated time and prioritizing land acquisition for irrigation projects. For underground drainage works, he instructed that the main sewage pipeline works be expedited. Out of a total 8.5 km pipeline, 7.7 km has already been completed, and the remaining work should be finished within 15 days. He also directed that precautions be taken to ensure there is no mixing with Mission Bhagiratha water supply. He stated that STP (Sewage Treatment Plant) works at Dhamsalapuram should be initiated soon. Land has already been allotted for the Haritha Hotel, and necessary steps should be taken to commence construction immediately. He instructed that pending works under double-bedroom housing should be completed and handed over to beneficiaries, and construction of Indiramma houses should be accelerated. Regarding Package-9 of the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project, he noted that there are some land acquisition issues and directed officials to resolve them quickly through discussions with locals, involving the Tahsildar and Sub-Collector. The meeting was attended by Kalluru Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav, concerned district officials, RDO Srinivas, and others.

As the only company to have successfully secured and maintained MRTP authorizations for heated tobacco products in the U.S., we are confident that our science-based alternatives can help adult smokers transition away from combustible cigarettes," said Stacey Kennedy, CEO, PMI U.S. "This decision from the FDA reflects both the rigorous scientific foundation supporting IQOS and our ongoing commit-

The IQOS 2.4 system was the first heated tobacco product authorized via the FDA's MRTP process in 2020 as "appropriate for the promotion of public health," following its authorization through the premarket tobacco product application (PMTA) process in 2019. The IQOS 3 system secured MRTP authorization in 2022, following premarket authorization in 2020. The FDA continues to review PMTAs for IQOS ILUMA and given its strong application and demonstrated track record converting legal age smokers to a better alternative, PMI believes the application warrants expeditious FDA action.
