KARIMNAGAR May 5 (Correspondent): Karimnagar District Collector Chitra Mishra has announced that job melas will be organised once every three months across the district to enhance employment opportunities for youth.

Reviewing a mega job mela held at the Collectorate Complex on Tuesday as part of the 99-day Prajapalana Pragathi Pranalika programme, Ms. Mishra said the initiative would be expanded beyond the district headquarters to other locations to improve access for job seekers. She emphasised that both Hyderabad-based firms and local companies would be encouraged to participate to widen the employment base.

The Collector interacted with officials to assess arrangements, including participation levels, company presence and facilities provided to candidates. She commended the coordinated efforts of various departments in ensuring the smooth conduct of the event and called for similar initiatives in the coming months.

The job mela witnessed a large turnout, with about 3,000 candidates from Karimnagar and Rajanna Sircilla districts attending. Around 90 companies from sectors such as IT, non-IT, healthcare, organic products, dairy and agriculture took part in the recruitment drive.

Officials said 997 candidates were provisionally selected, while 478 were offered jobs on the spot. Appointment letters will be issued shortly.

Special arrangements, including drinking water, cooling facilities and butter-milk distribution, were made in view of the summer conditions. As many as 95 stalls and a dedicated help desk were set up to assist candidates.

TWJF Files Petition in High Court Seeking Stay on Accreditation Committee Decisions

“Hyderabad, May 05 (Indian Chronicle):”The Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) has filed a petition in the Telangana High Court on Tuesday seeking to stay the decisions taken and to be taken by the State and District Media Accreditation Committees formed for issuing media accreditation cards. TWJF State President Mamidi Somayya stated in the petition that the formation and functioning of the State Media Accreditation Committee (SMAC) and District Media Accreditation Committees (DMAC) were being carried out in violation of rules, without including representatives of the TWJF. He alleged that while Government Order (GO) 252 mandates the inclusion of representatives from four journalist unions/associations in the committees, only three unions have been included, excluding TWJF representatives. He further stated that decisions regarding accreditation cards were being made without proper representation of their union. The petition has named the I&PR Special Commissioner, Media Academy Chairman, and Public Relations Officers (DPROs) of all 33 districts as respondents. In a related petition, TWJF member and AVN TV correspondent Nambi Parvathalu also challenged Government Order RT 229 in the High Court, seeking its cancellation. He argued that the implementation of GO 229, issued in connection with the formation of accreditation committees, was not in accordance with rules. He contended that while GO 252 specifies representation from four journalist associations, GO RT 229 allows only three, thereby excluding TWJF. He also alleged that decisions taken without TWJF representation are contrary to GO 252 and requested the court to suspend GO RT 229. The petitioner has also included the I&PR Special Commissioner, Media Academy Chairman, and DPROs of all districts as respondents in the case.

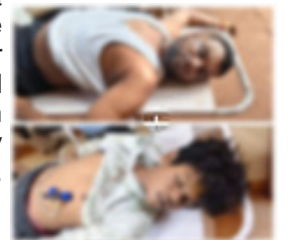

Yashoda Hospital Team Successfully Treats Critical Case of Septic Shock and Multi-Organ Dysfunction

“Khammam May 05 (Indian Chronicle):“ “A medical team from Yashoda Hospital, Malakpet successfully managed a critical case involving septic shock, multi-organ dysfunction syndrome (MODS), and acute kidney injury, said nephrology specialist Dr. Chetan Veeramaneni during a press meet held at the Khammam Press Club. He stated that Ms. Kothapalli Mangamma (51), a patient from Khammam district with a history of diabetes and hypertension, was admitted in a critical condition. She was diagnosed with community-acquired pneumonia (CAP), septic shock, and multi-organ dysfunction. The patient presented with symptoms



such as severe leg swelling, breathing difficulty, and reduced urine output, indicating sudden kidney failure. Dr. Veeramaneni explained that acute kidney injury is a life-threatening condition often associated with severe infections. When the infection progresses to septic shock, it can lead to MODS, affecting vital organs including the kidneys. Early diagnosis and timely treatment can control the condition, but delays may lead to organ failure, dialysis dependency, or even death. The medical team provided renal replacement therapy, including Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy (CRRT) using an Oxiris filter, followed by two sessions of SLED dialysis. Respiratory complications such as pneumonia and fluid accumulation around the lungs were treated with strong antibiotics. Cardiac complications, including acute decompensated heart failure, were also closely monitored and treated. Additional complications such as hematuria (blood in urine) and hemoptysis were managed successfully under specialist supervision. Doctors said that the case highlights the advanced nephrology services and diagnostic capabilities available at Yashoda Super Specialty Hospital, Malakpet. The timely identification and management of complex multi-organ complications, including kidney, heart, and lung involvement, played a key role in saving the patient's life. The hospital team noted that advanced dialysis facilities and a skilled medical team were crucial in successfully handling this emergency case.

The 'Serve Safe Food' (Serve Safe Food) training program, with the main objective of providing safe and quality food to consumers, especially students, by street vendors and school midday meal organizers in Bhuvanagiri town, was launched on Tuesday at the Bhuvanagiri Municipal Council meeting hall. This program, jointly organized by NASVI, Nestle India and FSSAI, was officially inaugurated by lighting the lamp jointly by Bhuvanagiri Municipal Chairperson Tangallapalli Srivani Ravikumar and Municipal Vice Chairperson Pothamsetty Manjula Venkateswarlu. Speaking on the occasion, Chairperson Tangallapalli Srivani Ravikumar called for giving top priority to personal hygiene in food preparation

He said that one rupee of investment in horticultural crops will bring an income of Rs. 3. Karimnagar Smart City Board clears Rs 70-crore works Calls for strict timelines; action proposed against agencies delaying projects.

KARIMNAGAR May 5 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar Smart City Special Purpose Vehicle (SPV) Board, at a meeting chaired by the Principal Secretary of the Municipal Administration and Urban Development (MA&UD) Department, on Tuesday approved a series of development works to be taken up with an outlay of ₹70 crore. The meeting was attended by the District Collector, Mayor, Municipal Commissioner, Commissioner of Police, Engineer-in-Chief, officials of the Directorate of Town and Country Planning (DTCP), and Corporation engineers. Reviewing the progress of ongoing and completed projects under the Smart City Mission, the Board deliberated on the future course of action to accelerate urban infrastructure development. It decided to dovetail the recently sanctioned ₹70 crore with surplus funds available from previously completed works to maximise resource utilisation and expand the scope of development.
