

Minister Konda Surekha and MLA K.R. Nagaraju Inaugurate CCTV Cameras at Agricultural Market



Warangal, May 2 (Indian Chronicle) : Telangana Minister for Forests, Environment, and Endowments, Konda Surekha—accompanied by District Collector Satya Sarada Devi and Vardhannapet MLA K.R. Nagaraju—formally inaugurated the CCTV cameras installed at the Enumamula Agricultural Market on Saturday. “Speaking on the occasion, MLA K.R. Nagaraju expressed his satisfaction regarding the installation of CCTV cameras within the market premises. He noted that the fact that the Minister herself inaugurated these cameras was a welcome development. He stated that CCTV surveillance would play a pivotal role in preventing crimes and in monitoring market operations more efficiently. “Expressing concern over the rising pollution caused by the burning of chili stalks, he warned that strict action would be taken against those engaging in such activities. He pointed out that burning chili waste leads to a significant increase in air pollution, causing severe discomfort to the public. He added that, if necessary, a dedicated vehicle would be arranged to transport chili waste to designated dumping yards. “The MLA announced that a proposal would be submitted to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy requesting the sanction of a building for the Enumamula Police Station. He emphasized that the government, under the leadership of the Chief Minister, accords the highest priority to the welfare of farmers, and that the government’s primary objective is to economically empower the farming community. Noting that crop yields are high in the Ainavolu and Eeduru mandals, he stated that procurement centers are being closely monitored to ensure that paddy is purchased from farmers at the Minimum Support Price (MSP). Given the possibility of unseasonal rains, he directed officials to utilize nearby function halls and warehouses to facilitate the immediate transportation of the procured grain. “He further stated that, despite a shortage of laborers due to elections in neighboring states, appropriate measures would be taken to ensure that a sufficient workforce remains available to load the grain onto trucks. He gave an assurance that the government would purchase every single grain harvested by the farmers, and that no farmer need have any cause for concern. “Public representatives, former public representatives, Congress party leaders, party workers, and officials participated in this event.

Welfare of All Sections Is the Government's Goal: MLA K.R. Nagaraju

“(Wardhannapet/Warangal, May 2 (Indian Chronicle) : K.R. Nagaraju, MLA of Wardhannapet and a retired IPS officer, instructed officials to ensure that all eligible families receive the benefits of the welfare schemes being implemented by the State Government. A constituency-level meeting was held on Saturday as part of the ‘Prajapalana–Pragati Pranalika’ programme at Kalyana Lakshmi Function Hall near Upparapalli Cross Roads in Wardhannapet mandal. Officials briefed the gathering on various developmental and welfare initiatives undertaken by different government departments. The MLA inspected stalls set up by the departments and sought detailed information. Representatives of women Self-Help Groups also shared their views on the ongoing development and welfare activities in the constituency. Later, the MLA distributed ‘Indira Mahila Shakti’ sarees to women SHG members and handed over interest-free loan cheques to Self-Help Groups. Speaking on the occasion, Mr. Nagaraju said that constituency-level meetings are being conducted to ensure that the development and welfare schemes implemented by the people's government under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy reach the people effectively. He emphasized that governance becomes successful only with public participation. He noted that the government is giving special focus to education, healthcare, farmers' welfare, women's empowerment, and employment generation, while taking steps to effectively utilize human resources. He also mentioned the increase in diet charges for hostel students, provision of nutritious food, and enhancement of cosmetic charges. He noted that women are availing free bus travel under the Mahalakshmi scheme. He directed officials to ensure 100 percent completion of Indiramma housing in the constituency. The MLA urged parents to enroll their children in government schools, citing improved facilities. He informed that a super specialty hospital will soon be available in Warangal, and that construction of a 100-bed hospital in Wardhannapet will commence shortly. “(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle...May 2):- As per the latest guidelines issued by the government to resolve the complaints of the people in the district quickly, from now on every Monday, Revenue Division Level Public Hearing Program will be organized in the respective Revenue Divisional Officer offices, District Collector Anurag Jayanti said in a statement on Saturday. “While the concerned RDO (Revenue Divisional Officer) will act as the nodal officer for this program, the division level officers of all the departments must be present, receive the complaints of the people and take steps to resolve their problems.” He explained that every complaint received from the public must



be registered online and henceforth it will be registered (uploaded) through the CGG Prajavani portal (Center for Good Governance) instead of the NIC portal. “He said that an acknowledgement slip with a unique reference number will be given to each complainant, through which they can easily know the status of their complaint online. “He said that registration of complaints, department-wise allocation, action taken reports (ATR), interim reports, and monitoring of the status of complaints will be facilitated through this portal. He said that the officers of all departments should resolve the complaints within 30 days and upload the relevant reports on the

portal. In case of delay, the cases will be sent to the higher authorities themselves (by them). To this end, the officials should be committed to resolving the problems of the people in a transparent and effective manner. They asked the people to use the CGG Prajavani portal to register their complaints and check their status. They said that drinking water, chairs and emergency medical services should be made available to the people who come to submit applications.

Tight security in place for NEET in Karimnagar Section 144 to be enforced; police step up vigil to ensure smooth conduct.

KARIMNAGAR May 2 (Correspondent): Police Commissioner Gaush Alam, on Saturday reviewed arrangements for the smooth conduct of the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) scheduled on Sunday, and directed officials to ensure stringent security at all examination centres.



At a meeting held at Astra Convention Hall, he instructed that adequate police bandobast be deployed and continuous vigil maintained to prevent any untoward incidents or malpractice. Section 144 will be enforced in the vicinity of the centres, prohibiting assembly of persons.

The Commissioner directed that photocopy centres and internet cafés located near examination venues remain closed during the examination hours. Traffic police have been asked to regulate vehicular movement to ensure that candidates reach their centres on time and to avoid congestion in surrounding areas.

He also called for coordination with officials of the Education Department and said candidates should be permitted entry only after thorough verification, in accordance with the guidelines of the National Testing Agency.

Mr. Alam cautioned that strict action would be taken against those attempting to disrupt the examination process.

"Patients whose seizures come from one clear part of the brain that can be safely removed or disconnected. "Children whose development, schooling, and behavior are being



harmed by frequent seizures. Before surgery, a team including a neurologist, epilepsy specialist, neurosurgeon, psychologist, and radiologist carefully evaluates the patient with tests like MRI, video-EEG, and memory and language assessments. "Many patients become completely seizure-free or have far fewer seizures. They often gain confidence, independence, and better quality of life. Recovery after surgery usually takes a few weeks, and many people can return to work or school soon afterward. People can live a normal life after surgery. Medicines can be stopped completely in some people and in some people may still need medicines, but often in lower doses and fewer numbers. "However, epilepsy surgery is not a quick fix. Regular follow-up and sometimes continued medication are still needed. The decision for surgery should always be made after evaluation by a team of epilepsy specialists.
