While clutching a motor pipe in the well and screaming for help, Rega Narasimharavu Alias Babu (40) of Church Petah who knew about it tried to get down into the well with the aid of rope and rescue. “However under unforeseen circumstances Narasimharavu also drowned, and later Baddi Ramesh Saitama drowned. The Venkatapuram Police has registered a case and is investigating the incident as per the complaint made by Baddi Nagesh, brother of the deceased. # Salary Deductions Under the Name of Employees' Health Scheme (EHS): DTF Mandal President Angoth Bhadrappa

“----Demands Immediate Refund of Amounts Deducted from Employees' Accounts” Chennaraopeta/Warangal, May 31 (Indian Chronicle) : The Chennaraopeta Mandal unit of the Democratic Teachers Federation (DTF) has expressed deep concern over the deduction of 1.5 percent from the May salaries of government employees, teachers, and pensioners under the Employees' Health Scheme (EHS). In particular, the federation voiced alarm over the fact that these deductions were made without finalizing operational guidelines or issuing an official Government Order (GO). “In a statement released on Sunday, DTF Mandal President Angoth Bhadrappa and General Secretary Ravula Umashankar stated that the Employees' Health Care Trust has not yet finalized the modalities for implementing this health scheme. “They pointed out that the government has neither announced a list of empanelled hospitals nor provided any clarity regarding the medical services covered under this scheme. Furthermore, no clear guidelines have been issued concerning the deductions applicable to employees, pensioners, or their spouses. “DTF leaders criticized the Finance Department for imposing salary deductions without consulting employee unions and before establishing a transparent framework for the scheme. They asserted that this action is arbitrary and is causing anxiety among employees and teachers. They noted that, despite the directive requiring employees to upload their health card details online by May 31, the frequent changes and amendments occurring throughout this process have created confusion among beneficiaries. “Demanding immediate corrective measures, DTF leaders urged the government to refrain from imposing any deductions until comprehensive guidelines and operational procedures for the EHS are officially released. They further requested officials to promptly refund the amounts already deducted from the accounts of employees, teachers, and pensioners.
