CM Came and Left... What Did Uppal Gain? – BJP’s Public Protest Led by Former MLA NVSS Prabhakar

“UPPAL, JUNE 10 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): Alleging that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy failed to give any concrete assurance on the long-pending issues faced by the people of Uppal during his visit for the foundation stone laying ceremony of the new Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation building, the BJP organized a “Praja Poru Deeksha” (People’s Protest) under the leadership of former Uppal MLA NVSS Prabhakar at the Dr. B.R. Ambedkar statue on Uppal Ring Road.” “Addressing the gathering, Prabhakar criticized the Chief Minister for ignoring several long-standing demands of the people of Uppal. Bus Terminal reflected the government's neglect.” “He said newly developed colonies are facing acute drinking water supply problems, but the government has not taken any steps to address them. He also accused the government of failing to allocate funds for the development of internal roads. Collector Reviews Revival of School Closed for a Decade

“Efforts Underway to Restore Long-Closed Government School

“Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, June 10: District Collector K. Haritha directed Education Department officials to examine the feasibility of renovating and reopening a government school building that has remained closed for the past ten years. “On Wednesday, the Collector visited the Mandal Parishad Primary School at Kapu Wada in Ward No. 13 of Kagaznagar town along with Education Department officials after learning that the school had been lying unused for a decade. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said the government is implementing several initiatives to strengthen the education system and reviewed the possibilities of restoring the school for public use. She instructed officials to assess the required repairs and infrastructure facilities and take



necessary steps towards reopening the institution. “Mandal Education Officer Vasala Prabhakar and other officials participated in the inspection.

DEVELOPMENT IS MISSION FOR PM MODI

“ Hyderabad, June 10 : Telangana BJP State President N Ramchander Rao today described 12-year regime of Narendra Modi as “golden rule” who has created a new record by serving as the longest-serving elected Prime Minister in the history of democratic India, as the true testament to the country's progress.” Addressing a press conference here on the completion of 12 years of governance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, he stated that PM Modi has successfully completed 4,399 highest working days as the Prime Minister of the country, creating a new history as the only Indian leader to hold the office for the longest period while being directly elected by the people.” In the history of this country, Prime Minister Narendra Modi stands as the leader who has served the longest as a consecutively elected Prime Minister, he said and reminded that although Jawaharlal Nehru served as Prime Minister for a long duration, he assumed office under the circumstances following independence, But Narendra Modi, who has been directly elected by the people for three consecutive terms, has already completed 12 year. “ Rao expressed absolute confidence that for the past 12 years, the BJP's central government has successfully moved forward with three supreme goals of "Jan Vishwas, Vikas, Jan Kalyan" (People's Trust, Development, Public Welfare), and with three years still remaining for the current government, it is certain that Narendra Modi will return as the Prime Minister of the country once again.” State BJP chief Rao congratulated Prime Minister Narendra Modi on becoming India's longest-serving elected Prime Minister. This historic milestone is not merely a reflection of the Prime Minister's long tenure, but a powerful testament to the trust, faith and aspirations of 140 crore Indians, he said.”

He criticized that even though the Congress party ruled the country for a long time after independence, the laws, education system, and administrative structure designed by the British continued unchanged even after they left. He noted that during the UPA-1 and UPA-2 governments that ruled before Modi, the country witnessed numerous scams and severe corruption, which people have not yet forgotten. However, he clarified that the most important achievement of Modi during these twelve years was liberating the country from a colonial mindset. As part of this, old laws like the IPC, CrPC, and the Evidence Act were repealed to introduce new laws like the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) along with the New National Education Policy, Rao explained.” Rao further stated that several reforms were introduced in the judiciary alongside the establishment of commercial courts, and the entire credit for this goes to Narendra Modi. He expressed happiness that with a strong "India First" foreign policy, India's prestige on the global stage and self-confidence among the youth have been elevated; while there was once a culture of gifting replicas of the Taj Mahal to foreign delegates, today a new India has been unveiled by presenting the Bhagavad Gita as a symbol of Indian culture and spirituality.”

Giving details of achievements, he said India has achieved remarkable growth in economics and infrastructure development. He informed that prior to 2014, only about Rs 2 lakh crore was spent on the country's infrastructure, whereas currently, this expenditure has increased nearly six fold to reach Rs 12.2 lakh crore. Similarly, foreign exchange reserves have also grown massively, he said.” Through the implementation of GST (One Nation – One Market) which simplified the taxation system, GST collections crossed a staggering Rs 22 lakh crore in the 2024-25 financial year. With an increase in the number of honest taxpayers, direct tax collections and government revenue have also seen a massive rise.”

He explained that a digital revolution was brought about to reach every citizen through technology. While India ranked 142nd in the Ease of Doing Business rankings in 2014, it has now reached the 63rd position. Under the Pradhan Mantri Gramin Digital Saksharta Abhiyaan, digital literacy was provided to around 6 crore people in rural areas over the past years, and through the BharatNet project, optical fiber connectivity has been provided to 2.14 lakh gram panchayats across the nation.”

He expressed happiness that through the Jan Dhan – Aadhaar – Mobile (JAM) trinity, more than Rs. 50 lakh crore has been deposited directly into the bank accounts of the poor under the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system without any middlemen. He also reminded that Modi gave special priority to the development of the Northeastern states, visiting the region as many as 83 times.” He stated that the Modi government is leading the country toward "Atmanirbhar" (self-reliance) in all sectors. Under the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, investments of around Rs 20 lakh crore are being registered by March 2026, creating 12 lakh new jobs for the country's youth. In the electronics manufacturing sector, production was valued at around Rs 1.9 lakh crore in 2014, which grew sixfold to Rs 11.3 lakh crore by 2024-25.” “Development is mission” was only aim of the NDA government led by PM Modi since 2014, he asserted.

Haritha urged childless couples and relatives wishing to adopt children to follow the legal procedures prescribed by the Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA). She warned that adoptions through intermediaries or unauthorized channels are illegal and may create difficulties for both children and families.” The Collector was speaking at a programme organized by the Women and Child Welfare Department and the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU), where she handed over an adoption



order to Durgam Lingaiah and Renuka of Chintaguda village in Kagaznagar mandal after the completion of a legal relative adoption process.” She said every child deserves a safe family environment and noted that legal adoption safeguards children's rights, including inheritance, identity, education, and welfare benefits. She also cautioned that illegal adoptions could expose children to risks such as trafficking and exploitation.” The Collector advised prospective adoptive parents to approach the District Child Protection Unit for guidance on the legal adoption process and reiterated the administration's commitment to child welfare and protection.” District Welfare Officer Swaroopa Rani, District Child Protection Officer Mahesh, and other officials attended the programme.

INDIA BECOME GLOBAL HUB: BJP

“ Hyderabad, June 10 : Laud- ing the performance of the NDA govern- ment led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, BJP State President N Ramchander Rao said India has wit- nessed a transformative journey of good governance, development, national se- curity, welfare delivery, infrastructure growth and rising global stature.”

Addressing a press conference here , Rao said India become “Global Hub” in semiconductor manufacturing. He said central government has approved 12 semiconductor projects with an invest- ment of about Rs1.64 lakh crore, thereby enabling India to emerge as a global hub in semiconductor manufac- turing, bringing days where “Made in India” chips will power the world.” He mentioned that several states, in- cluding Telangana were playing a key role in this area. In the mobile phone manufacturing sector, there were only two units prior to 2014, making the coun- try 90 per cent dependent on imports. However, today nearly 300 mobile manu- facturing units have become operational in the country, he said.” In the de- fense sector, defense imports have de- creased and exports have increased by establishing two defense industrial cor- ridors, and currently, 65 per cent of In- dian defense equipment consists of in- digenous products, Rao said.” He further stated that Defense production, which stood at Rs 46,429 crore in 2014- 15, reached to Rs 1.54 lakh crore by 2024-25, and efforts are also underway for manufacturing fighter jets similar to the Rafale. “ Through the Startup India and Standup India initiatives, 2.06 lakh startups have been registered in the country, leading to the creation of over 120 unicorn companies. As part of en- vironmental protection, a non-fossil fuel power generation capacity of 283.46 GW is being developed. He also noted that Viksit Bharat does not mean economic development alone but also the preser- vation of cultural and spiritual heritage, pointing out that over Rs 8,000 crore has been spent under the PRASHAD scheme to develop numerous temples and pilgrimage sites across the nation. “ He praised PM Modi for introducing a new work culture of working 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and bringing strict discipline into the performance of cen- tral ministers.” Detailing development in agriculture sector, Rao stated that the Modi government has achieved historic progress in the agricultural, dairy, and transport sectors.” Food grain production in the country has registered a record growth of 71 per cent, thereby increasing farmers’ income. Schemes like the Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi, irrigation projects, and micro-irri- gation have greatly benefited farmers, bringing 109 lakh hectares of agricultural

land nationwide under micro-irrigation since 2015.” He proudly declared that from a time when India had to im- port wheat and milk powder from America under the PL-480 scheme, to- day India stands as the largest milk-pro- ducing country in the world as Milk pro- duction increased by 69.4 per cent over the last decade.”

In the railway sector, modernization has been pro- gressing rapidly since 2015 and 99.6 per cent of lines that were once narrow gauge have been converted to broad gauge, with the remaining 0.4 per cent left solely due to the special conditions of hilly and forested terrains, he said.” Giving details of modernisation projects in the railways, he mentioned that cur- rently, over 164 Vande Bharat trains are running successfully across the coun- try and world-class multi-modal connec- tivity initiatives like the RRTS have com- menced. Bringing revolutionary changes to the urban transport system, a metro rail network of over 1,095 kilometers has been made operational nationwide. “ In the welfare sector, over 12 crore toi- lets have been constructed nationwide under the Swachh Bharat Mission, household drinking water connections have been provided to over 16 crore people under the Jal Jeevan Mission, and 100 per cent electrification has been completed in the country through schemes like the Saubhagya Yojana, leaving no village without electricity, he said.”

Giving utmost priority to national security, Rao said the govern- ment responded immediately to the Pulwama terror attack by executing the Balakot airstrikes, and saved crore of lives during incidents like Pahalgam as well as during the Corona pandemic.” He reminded that despite fuel shortages, rationing systems, and high inflation faced by many countries globally, the government managed the situation effi- ciently by safeguarding the domestic supply chain even when oil prices soared in the international market.”

On the issue of development of Telangana state, Rao clarified that the ruling BJP government at the Centre has focused specially on the development of Telangana without any discrimination, providing funds, projects, and welfare schemes worth lakhs of crores of ru- pees. Prior to 2014, during the UPA pe- riod, the central tax devolution to states was only 32per cent, and Narendra Modi, who was the Chief Minister of Gujarat at the time, had demanded a higher share for the states. After becoming the Prime Minister, he increased the tax devolution to 42 per cent in accordance with the recommendations of the 14th Finance Commission, and currently, a 41 per cent tax devolution to the states continues following the transition of Jammu and Kashmir into a Union Terri-

tory after the abrogation of Article 370.” In addition to this, combining the Fi- nance Commission recommendations and allocations to local bodies, nearly 49 per cent of central resources are reaching the states, which he described as the highest transfer of resources to states in the country’s history. “ He stated that Telangana received substan- tial funds from the Centre in the form of tax devolution, grants, and special as- sistance, with over one lakh crore ru- pees provided as Grants-in-Aid from 2014 to 2024. Under the Special Assis- tance for Capital Investment, Telangana received Rs 358 crore in 2020-21, which increased nearly tenfold to reach ? Rs 4,209 crore by 2025-26.”

BJP state chief revealed that Telangana re- ceived massive priority in the railway sector; while a railway budget of only Rs 258 crore was allocated to Telangana in 2014-15, it increased to Rs 5,336 crore in 2024-25. Vande Bharat trains are running successfully on routes such as Secunderabad – Visakhapatnam, Secunderabad – Tirupati, and Hyderabad – Bengaluru. “

Under the Gati Shakti Multi-Modal Cargo Terminals, over 50 locations have been identified in Telangana, some of which have al- ready become operational, and while the Hyderabad Metro project covers 69 ki- lometers, plans are also being finalized for the second phase of expansion. The construction and doubling of new rail- way tracks are progressing rapidly in Telangana, and currently, 100 per cent of the railway lines in Telangana are elec- trified. He stated that over 40 railway stations are being developed under the Amrit Bharat Station Scheme, and after 2014, 437 railway flyovers and over a hundred railway bridges have been con- structed in Telangana. He added that in January 2025, Prime Minister Narendra Modi virtually launched several devel- opment works, including projects like new railway stations and the Kacheguda Coaching Terminal.”

Rao ex- plained that the Centre has also given top priority to Telangana in the road, aviation, education, and medical sec- tors. Under the UDAN scheme, 22 new flight routes have been launched from Hyderabad, and the length of national highways in Telangana has increased significantly in the road transport sec- tor. Stating that better connectivity is being provided to the state through the Bharatmala project and economic cor- ridors, he noted that projects like the Hyderabad – Bengaluru Economic Cor- ridor, Surat – Chennai Economic Cor- ridor, and Hyderabad – Visakhapatnam Corridor are contributing immensely to the development of Telangana. In the educational sector, new Navodaya Vidyalayas have been sanctioned in dis-

tricts such as Jagtial, Nizamabad, Bhadradri Kothagudem, Medak, Sangareddy, and Medchal Malkajgiri, thereby expanding educational facilities, and new FM radio services have been launched in broadcasting and media sector.” Explaining various central gov- ernment project in Telangana, Rao also spoke at length about the implementa- tion of the central government’s major welfare schemes and beneficiary details in Telangana. “

He stated that 1.32 crore accounts have been opened in the state under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana, 92.4 lakh people are benefiting under the Pradhan Mantri Jeevan Jyoti Bima Yojana, and 1.92 crore people are benefiting under the Pradhan Mantri Suraksha Bima Yojana. Loans worth over ?86,600 crore have been distributed in Telangana under the Pradhan Mantri Mudra Yojana, and 26.9 lakh people have enrolled as members under the Atal Pension Yojana. “ Financial assistance was provided to street vendors under the PM SVANidhi scheme, through which a staggering 7.61 lakh people benefited in Telangana alone, and he proudly declared that Telangana stands as one of the states with the highest number of beneficiaries in the country. “

The reports should also identify factors positively and adversely affecting farmers, she said.

The Collector said issues affecting agricultural development should be brought to the notice of the district administration for prompt resolution. She also instructed District Agriculture Officer Bhagyalakshmi to organise a special training programme for Agricultural Extension Officers (AEOs) to enhance their understanding of modern farming practices and emerging agricultural technologies.

Speaking at the meeting, Ms. Bhagyalakshmi said awareness programmes were being conducted to educate farmers on crop diversification and alternative cultivation methods in view of the likely impact of El Niño conditions.
