

Society Must Work Collectively to Eradicate Child Labour: Uppal MEO R. Rama Rao



““UPPAL, JUNE 12 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): On the occasion of World Day Against Child Labour, an awareness programme was organized at the Uppal Zilla Parishad High School under the joint aegis of AIYF and the Balasangham Uppal Constituency Committee. Uppal Mandal Education Officer (MEO) R. Rama Rao attended the event as the chief guest. During the programme, slogans such as "Childhood is meant for learning, not for carrying burdens" and "Books should be in children's hands, not tools" were raised to create awareness against child labour. Speaking on the occasion, MEO R. Rama Rao appreciated the efforts of AIYF and Balasangham representatives for organizing a socially relevant programme. He stated that child labour is a major obstacle to the country's development and social progress. Emphasizing that education is a constitutional right of every child, he said it is unfortunate that children who should be attending school are engaged in labour. He noted that employing children is not only illegal but also detrimental to their future. He stressed that the eradication of child labour requires coordinated efforts by the government, the education department,



parents, voluntary organizations and people's associations. "Rama Rao further said that government schools provide quality education along with facilities such as mid-day meals, free textbooks and uniforms, and appealed to parents to ensure that every child is enrolled in school. He added that special measures are being undertaken to bring school dropouts back into the education system. "Addressing the gathering, AIYF State General Secretary Kalluri Dharmendra and Medchal District Secretary T. Satya Prasad said that poverty, unemployment and social inequalities are among the major reasons for the persistence of child labour. They urged the government to identify child labourers, provide rehabilitation and create livelihood opportunities for their families. The programme was attended by Uppal Zilla Parishad High School Headmaster Ashok, AIYF, AISF and Balasangham leaders Chandrasekhar, Vikas, Azeem Pasha, Mahesh, Sameer, Ali, Shoaib, Salman and Bunny, along with students of the government school. Tender System Must Be Abolished to Ensure Sustainable Employment for Handloom Weavers

““Hanumakonda, June 12 (Indian Chronicle) : Telangana Pradesh Padmashali Sangham State President Kamartham Murali has urged the Telangana Government to extend the same support to the handloom sector that it provides to farmers by procuring all handloom products through TSCO, thereby safeguarding the livelihoods of thousands of weaving families across the state. "A delegation comprising handloom workers and district-level leaders from various districts, led by Kamartham Murali, met Telangana Handlooms and Textiles Minister Tummalala Nageswara Rao in Hyderabad and submitted a memorandum highlighting the challenges faced by the weaving community. "Speaking on the occasion, the delegation expressed deep concern over the severe financial distress confronting handloom workers across Telangana. They stated that the lack of continuous employment opportunities has pushed many weavers into extreme hardship, with some families facing conditions of poverty, hunger, and despair. "The representatives urged the government to immediately withdraw the existing tender-based procurement system and issue a special Government



Order (GO) to ensure uninterrupted employment for handloom workers. They emphasized that direct procurement of handloom products through TSCO would not only provide steady work to weavers but also offer much-needed economic security and stability to the sector. "The delegation explained that a robust procurement mechanism would help revive the traditional handloom industry, protect artisan livelihoods, and preserve Telangana's rich



weaving heritage. "Responding positively to the representations, Minister Tummalala Nageswara Rao assured the delegation that the concerns raised by the handloom community would be examined seriously and that efforts would be made to address the issues through appropriate measures. BRS set to return to power in Telangana

“Hanamkonda, June 12 (Indian Chronicle): Former Government Chief Whip and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar stated that he was able to win elections four times thanks to the party's blessings, divine grace, and the unwavering support of party workers. He addressed a meeting of booth-level agents from the 11th and 29th divisions of the Warangal West Assembly constituency, held on Friday at Manideep Gardens in Ramannapeta. KARIMNAGAR June 12 (Correspondent): Choppadandi MLA Medipally Satyam met representatives of Burjeel Holdings in Dubai on Friday and conveyed his gratitude to the company's chairman, Dr. Shamsheer Vayalil, for announcing a humanitarian assistance package for the families of workers affected in a recent road accident in the UAE, according to a release from the MLA's office.

The release stated that Burjeel Holdings had announced financial assistance of 10 lakh dirhams (approximately ₹2.6 crore) for the families of seven workers who died in the accident and nine others who sustained injuries.



As Dr. Vayalil was unavailable, Mr. Satyam met company representatives A. Vijay Kumar, Ahmed Bin Suleiman, M. Unnikrishnan and Dr. Pankaj Kumar Bhatt and thanked them for the support extended to the victims' families, the release said.

During the meeting, the MLA invited Dr. Vayalil and other Burjeel representatives to Hyderabad and proposed that the assistance be handed over to the beneficiaries in the presence of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, it added.

According to the release, each bereaved family would receive one lakh dirhams (around ₹26 lakh)



as financial assistance. Three of the seven deceased workers were from Jagtial district. The aid package would also cover medical treatment and rehabilitation for the injured workers and educational support for children from the affected families.

The MLA was accompanied by Telangana Government NRI Advisory Committee member Kottala Satyam Goud and several Telangana community representatives based in Dubai.

The release further stated that Mr. Satyam visited the Indian Consulate in Dubai and requested officials to expedite the repatriation of the mortal remains of the deceased. He also visited Rashid Hospital and met workers undergoing treatment.

The visit was coordinated by members of the Telangana diaspora and representatives of the Telangana NRI Advisory Committee, according to the release.

Those Who Failed to Deliver Development Have No Right to Speak About It: MLA Nayini Rajender Reddy Foundation Stone Laid for Rs 1.25 Crore Development Works

“Kazipet/Hanamkonda, June 12 (Indian Chronicle): Warangal West MLA Nayini Rajender Reddy asserted that the Congress government can confidently present its development initiatives and welfare achievements before the people, while questioning what tangible progress was made by those who remained in power for a decade. “On Friday, the MLA laid the foundation stone for CC roads and CC drainage works worth ₹1.25 crore in Diesel Colony and Imperial Colony under Division 47. “Addressing the gathering, Nayini Rajender Reddy alleged that the previous rulers had completely neglected the basic needs of the people. He remarked that it was ironic for those who failed to deliver development and ignored public grievances to now speak about progress and governance. Such leaders, he said, have no moral authority to lecture others on development. “Emphasizing that the comprehensive development of the Warangal West constituency remains a key priority of the Congress government, the MLA stated that development works worth over ₹6 crore have been undertaken and completed in Division 47 alone within just two-and-a-half years. He noted that the government has been giving top priority to strengthening civic infrastructure, including roads, drainage networks, drinking water facilities, and street lighting. “He further observed that the people of Kazipet are clearly witnessing the transformation of the area and can easily compare its present state with the condition it was in under the previous administration. Development activities are progressing rapidly across all colonies, and the government remains committed to providing quality infrastructure and improving public amenities, he said. “Later, while addressing a meeting of party leaders, Nayini Rajender Reddy issued directions aimed at strengthening the party organization at the grassroots level. BRA LEADER KRISHANK QUESTIONS GOVERNMENT OVER LAND CONTROVERSY

“BOWENPALLY/JUNE 12/ (INDIAN CHRONICLE)““How did government land become private property within a single year?” This was the sharp question raised by BRS leader Manne Krishank regarding the management of government lands in the Secunderabad Cantonment constituency. “Demanding answers for the public from the local MLA and concerned officials, Krishank questioned how land that had been vacant for numerous years suddenly ended up in the hands of private individuals. On Friday, Krishank inspected the disputed land under Survey Number 157/1 in Bowenpally and held a press conference with police permission. During the media briefing, he raised several critical points: “Failure to Protect Land: Krishank noted that the late former Cantonment MLA, Sayanna, worked dedicatedly to protect government lands during his tenure. He criticized the current leadership, asking why the same commitment and initiative are completely missing now. “The Indiramma Housing Promise: He questioned Revenue Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, who had previously announced that 6,000 Indiramma houses would be constructed in the Cantonment. Krishank asked why this specific land was not utilized for the housing project. “Demand for Clarity: The BRS leader demanded that the government clarify whether the allocation of the Bowenpally land to private individuals was legal or illegal. “Inaction of Local Leadership: Krishank cornered the local MLA, Sri Ganesh, questioning why the Cantonment Board has not responded, why the MRO and RDO have not been questioned, and why the government has failed to take legal action to protect the property. “Krishank pointed out that even after two years, the promised Indiramma houses have not been completed, and people do not even know where they are being built. He reminded the public that Minister Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy had promised these houses to secure votes during the last elections. “To back his claims, Krishank showed photographs to the media of local MLA Sri Ganesh sub-



mitting a memorandum to Ministers Ponguleti Srinivas Reddy, Seethakka, and Chief Minister's Advisor Vem Narendar Reddy. “The Memorandum: In that memorandum, MLA Sri Ganesh had explicitly requested the ministers to allocate this specific 8-acre government land near the Bowenpally Market Yard to construct 6,000 Indiramma houses. Showing the photos, Krishank confirmed, “This is the exact same piece of land. ““Serious Allegations and Future Course of Action“Why the Silence? Krishank questioned why the local MLA is maintaining total silence instead of challenging the private takeover in court. He stated that while they have no personal interest in private disputes, they are fighting solely for the poor who were promised housing on this very site. He alleged that whenever the MLA is questioned on crucial issues, he avoids giving a direct answer and instead gets others (who failed to get official posts) to hold press meets to delay the matter. Krishank demanded to know what the MLA, the Tahsildar, and the District Collector are doing while private individuals encroach upon government land and build boundary walls. Krishank declared that government lands must belong to the poor. He warned that the issue would be taken up with the BRS party high command to launch a full-scale public agitation if immediate clarity and justice are not provided by MLA Sri Ganesh and the government.

Mekala Keerthi Harsha Kiran Inspects Ashok Nagar

“Demands Immediate Clearance of Waste and Closure of Hazardous Man-hole“ Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 12:“ Mekala Keerthi Harsha Kiran, along with division leaders, visited Ashok Nagar in Boudhanagar Division on Friday. Ruling Party Shielding Soil Mafia; Are Officials Being Attacked for Doing Their Duty? : Peddi Sudarshan Reddy

“---What Hope Is There for Common Citizens If Even Government Officials Are Not Safe?

“---Public Resources Being Plundered for the Self-Interest of a Select Few, Alleges Former MLA

“Narsampet/Warangal, June 12 (Indian Chronicle): Former MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy strongly condemned the alleged attack on Revenue Department officials who were attempting to enforce regulations related to illegal soil excavation and transportation in the Narsampet constituency. Addressing a press conference attended by print and electronic media representatives on Friday, he accused the ruling Congress Party of patronizing large-scale illegal soil mining activities. “Speaking on the occasion, Sudarshan Reddy alleged that a soil and murram mafia was operating freely in the constituency under the protection of ruling party leaders. He further claimed that these illegal activities were being carried out under the watch of local MLA Donthi Madhava Reddy. “The former MLA alleged that certain Congress leaders had obtained permissions from the Irrigation and Revenue Departments and were using them to conduct large-scale soil excavation operations. He demanded that the MLA disclose to the public how many permissions had been issued, in which locations they were granted, and

the quantity of soil transported under those approvals. “Accusing the ruling party of exploiting public resources and natural wealth for the benefit of a few individuals, S u d a r s h a n Reddy said that attacks on officials merely for insisting on compliance with



regulations were a blot on democratic governance. He described the government's silence on such incidents as unfortunate and questioned why officials performing their lawful duties were not being protected. “Demanding a comprehensive inquiry into the role of officials who sanctioned excavation permissions, he called for stringent action against all those responsible for alleged irregularities. He claimed that the illegal soil trade was causing substantial losses to the state exchequer and urged higher authorities to take immediate notice of the matter. “Sudarshan Reddy further alleged that law and order in the Narsampet constituency had deteriorated significantly. He claimed that pressure from political leaders had created a situation in which officials from the Police, Revenue, and Irrigation Departments were being compelled to cooperate with the alleged soil mafia. “If government officials themselves are denied protection under the present administration, one can only imagine the plight of ordinary citizens,” he remarked. “Questioning the legality of certain permissions, he asked how the Irrigation Department could grant excavation approvals in areas that allegedly fall under the jurisdiction of the Forest Department, citing Rangayya Cheruvu as an example. According to him, the situation in which one department files complaints against another is a clear reflection of administrative failure. “Referring to the Greenfield Highway project in Nekkonda Mandal, he alleged that there was a huge disparity between the quantity of soil actually required and the quantity for which permissions had been granted. Such irregular approvals, he said, were resulting in significant losses to government revenue. “The former MLA also alleged that canal soil was being illegally transported even from agency villages and expressed suspicion that officials from multiple departments might be benefiting from the alleged racket. “Expressing confidence that the BRS would return to power in Telangana, Sudarshan Reddy warned that those who misuse authority and engage in irregularities would be held accountable before the law. He also demanded a thorough investigation into allegations that police escorts were being provided to vehicles involved in illegal soil transportation. “The press conference was attended by constituency coordinators, town party presidents, former public representatives, councillors, district-level leaders, representatives of women's and youth wings, ward presidents, and several party workers.

“Mulugu/ Venkatapuram. Indian Chronicle June 12” A tragic incident took place on Friday near the village of patraapuram, in the mandal of Venkatapuram. Locals say unidentified people set fire to bamboo stakes next to power lines in the village suburbs. This caused the electric wires to melt and snap, falling on the ground from the heat of the fire. “Four baby geese died on the spot when they were hit by a power line that fell to the ground as they went for their feed.” The owners of the dead buffaloes identified Sadhanapalli Batukamma from Vengalarpeta village, Sadhanapalli Chittibabu, Porichetti Chanti from Teikalaboru village and Karam Chinni from Patrapuram village. “Local residents immediately informed power department officials of the incident. The aggrieved farmers lamented that the value of each dead buffalo was up to around Rs 50,000 with a total loss of about Rs 2 lakh. “The aggrieved farmers want the government and power department's top officials to immediately respond and provide them with appropriate compensation so that they can get justice. The villagers are demanding a comprehensive

investigation into the incident and action against those responsible.
