District Collector interacts with media representatives after distributing accreditation cards to journalists

“Khammam, June 13 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar T.S. stated that the right to vote is the most valuable right in a democracy and that the district administration's objective is to ensure that not a single eligible voter loses this right. “On Saturday, the Collector distributed approved and printed accreditation cards to journalists at the Collectorate. Earlier, he held a special interaction with media representatives and explained various issues, including the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of Electoral Rolls and the cultivation of alternative crops. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that a Special Intensive Revision of the electoral rolls is being undertaken in Telangana for the first time in 24 years. By mapping the current voter list with the 2002 electoral rolls, about 80 percent of voters in the district have been successfully linked. Around 30 percent anomalies were identified during the mapping process, and all such cases will be re-verified through field-level inspections. “He informed that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will conduct a door-to-door survey from June 25 to July 24 and collect Enumeration Forms from every voter. Even voters whose records have already been mapped must submit the Enumeration Form. He cautioned that failure to submit the form could potentially result in the loss of voting rights and urged all voters to hand over the form to their respective BLOs. “The Collector explained that anomalies may arise due to similarities in surnames, father-son names, minor age differences, discrepancies in personal details, spelling errors, changes in surnames, or other inconsistencies in voter information. “He directed BLOs to issue notices to voters whose names appear in the anomaly list and to thoroughly verify each case at the field level. Necessary documents should be collected and issues resolved appropriately. The Election Commission has instructed that the entire process be documented through photography and videography. “Voters whose records have not been mapped must submit the Enumeration Form along with any one of the 11 identity documents approved by the Election Commission. Information regarding their current residence status, whether they are living in the village, alive, deceased, or permanently migrated, will also be collected. “The Collector further clarified the document requirements based on date of birth: “Individuals born before July 1, 1987 need only submit their own identity or birth-related documents. “Those born between July 1, 1987, and December 2, 2004, must submit their own documents along with the birth or identity document of either their father or mother. “Those born after December 2, 2004, must submit their own documents along with identity or birth documents of both parents. “The Collector remarked that India's democratic system has become a model for the world and that granting equal voting rights to every citizen since Independence is one of the nation's greatest strengths. He urged citizens not to be negligent re-



garding their voting rights. “Responding to agricultural issues, he advised farmers to reduce paddy cultivation to some extent during the current season and adopt alternative crops. He particularly recommended this for tail-end canal areas and borewell-dependent villages, as rainfall is expected to be below normal this year. He requested the media to create widespread public awareness on these matters. “Media representatives, concerned officials, and others participated in the program.

Garbage Heaps Along Roadside Trouble Commuters Collector's Orders Ignored Waste Dumps Along Roads Causing Foul Smell



“Khammam Nelakondapalli June 13 Indian Chronicle:” Garbage heaps dumped along the Khammam-Kodad main road are causing severe inconvenience to commuters and spreading an unbearable stench. In Tirumalapuram village of Nelakondapalli mandal, piles of waste accumulated beside the highway have become a major concern for both travelers and local residents. “People passing through the area are forced to cover their noses due to the foul odor. Residents fear that the unhygienic conditions could lead to health problems and the spread of diseases. “The District Collector had earlier directed officials to prevent the dumping of waste along roadsides and to take action against those violating the rules. However, local authorities appear to have failed in implementing these instructions, resulting in garbage heaps continuing to line the roads. “In addition to household waste, people are reportedly dumping plastic bags and spoiled food items on the roadside, further worsening the situation. Motorists, pedestrians, and nearby residents are facing significant inconvenience due to the unhygienic environment. “Locals have urged the authorities to respond immediately, clear the garbage heaps, and strictly enforce the Collector's directives to maintain cleanliness and protect public health.

Youth Assaulted Over Old Grudge; Case Registered Against Two: CI D. Vishweshwar

“Geesugonda/Warangal, June 13 (Indian Chronicle): A youth was allegedly attacked and injured with sticks and stones over an old personal grudge in Dasru Thanda under Geesugonda mandal on Saturday. Geesugonda Circle Inspector D. Vishweshwar said that a case



has been registered against two persons in connection with the incident and an investigation is underway.”

“According to the CI, Bhukya Rajkumar (27), a resident of Harja Thanda in Geesugonda mandal, was travelling in his auto-rickshaw towards Nandanayak Thanda on Saturday morning when two individuals, identified as Halavath Raju and Halavath Bhadru of Dasru Thanda, allegedly intercepted him due to a longstanding dispute.”

The accused reportedly dragged Rajkumar out of the vehicle, verbally abused him, and launched a physical assault. During the attack, Halavath Raju allegedly struck the victim forcefully on the back with a stick, while Halavath Bhadru reportedly hit him on the face and near his right eye with a stone, causing serious injuries. The victim also suffered profuse bleeding from his nose as a result of the assault. “Based on a complaint lodged by Bhukya Rajkumar, Geesugonda Police registered a case and initiated further investigation into the incident, CI Vishweshwar added.

Wyra Police Crack Down on Illegal Sand Transportation

Strict Action Against Sand Mafia Involved in Organized Crime

Wyra Police Initiate Steps to Open History Sheets Against Habitual Offenders

Khammam, June 13 Indian Chronicle: Taking a firm stand against the illegal sand mafia engaged in organized criminal activities, the Wyra Police have once again intensified their crackdown on the unlawful transportation and trade of sand, a natural resource belonging to the government. Authorities stated that such activities not only generate illegal profits for offenders but also cause significant losses to government revenue. “During vehicle inspections conducted on Friday within the limits of the Wyra Police Station, police intercepted a group transporting approximately 25 tonnes of sand illegally from the Donabanda Reach in Kanchikacherla Mandal of NTR District, Andhra Pradesh, without any valid government permissions, mining permits, transport challans, or e-way bills.” The police arrested Challamalla Venkateswara Rao, his son Challamalla Sumanth Kumar, both residents of Khammam, and lorry driver Kondeti Upender in connection with the case. Authorities seized an Ashok Leyland lorry used for transporting the sand, a Mahindra Thar used as an escort vehicle, and a tipper vehicle allegedly used for sand sales operations. “During the investigation, the accused reportedly admitted to purchasing sand at lower prices in Andhra Pradesh and selling it at higher prices in Khammam and other parts of Telangana to earn illegal profits.” A review of the accused persons' criminal records revealed that Challamalla Sumanth Kumar has been involved in 12 criminal cases, with convictions reportedly recorded in several of them. Investigators also found that Challamalla Venkateswara Rao has a total of four criminal cases registered against him, including the present case. Police further identified their alleged involvement in previous offences related to illegal sand transportation, theft, and cheating. “History Sheets and Enhanced Surveillance” Police officials stated that stringent measures will be taken against habitual offenders, including: “Opening History Sheets against repeat offenders.” Maintaining continuous surveillance over their activities. “Opening Rowdy Sheets, if required.” Monitoring and tracking repeat criminal behavior. “Strong Warning from Wyra Police” The Wyra Police issued a stern warning that individuals involved in illegal sand mining, transportation, storage, purchase, sale, or those assisting such activities as intermediaries, vehicle owners, or drivers, will face



strict legal action. “Police emphasized that activities causing loss to government revenue and environmental damage will not be tolerated under any circumstances. Apart from registering criminal cases, authorities will continue to seize vehicles involved in such offences, open history sheets against offenders, and keep repeat violators under special surveillance.” The police also appealed to the public to actively support law enforcement by reporting any information regarding illegal sand transportation or trading activities. “Wyra Police issue a clear warning to the illegal sand mafia: those who defy the law will face severe punishment. Illegal sand transportation in any form will not be tolerated.” — Sarangapani Sadula ACP, Wyra Division, Khammam

RTC Bus Collides with Two-Wheeler; Two Sustain Severe Injuries – CI D. Visweswar

“Geesugonda/Warangal, June 13 (Indian Chronicle): Two individuals sustained severe injuries after an RTC bus, driven at high speed and negligently, collided with their two-wheeler within the Geesugonda police station limits. Geesugonda CI D. Visweswar stated that a case has been registered and an investigation initiated based on a complaint lodged by the victims' family members.”



According to the CI, Lakkars Ravinder (48) from Enumamula (SR Nagar), Warangal district, and Modam Naveen from Rangasaipeta were returning on a TVS XL vehicle (TG 24 A 3995) after completing work in Dharmaram village on the afternoon of June 12. While they were crossing the road at the divider opposite Sudhakar Wines in Dharmaram—intending to head towards Warangal—a TGRTC bus (TG 36 U 6556) from the Narsampet depot, speeding from Narsampet towards Hanamkonda, struck their vehicle with great force. “In the accident, Lakkars Ravinder suffered severe injuries to his head, chest, and arms, while Modam Naveen sustained severe injuries to his legs and arms. Locals responded immediately after the accident and shifted both of them to MGM Hospital via a 108 ambulance. Subsequently, acting on medical advice, Naveen was shifted to Guardian Hospital for treatment.”

CI D. Visweswar stated that a case has been registered at the Geesugonda Police Station based on a complaint filed by Lakkars Akhil—son of Lakkars Ravinder—regarding the incident, and that the investigation is underway.

Parents Urged to Make Use of Government Schools

Private Educational Institutions' Illusion in Villages Government Vigilance and Strict Action Needed Against Fee Exploitation Corporate "Dream Selling" Deceiving Hardworking Parents



“Khammam June 13 Indian Chronicle: “Some private and corporate educational institutions are turning the innocence of poor and middle-class families in rural areas into a business opportunity. These institutions are targeting parents of talented students who perform well in government schools and colleges, using attractive marketing tactics to lure them into costly admissions. “By showcasing photographs of colorful multi-story buildings, air-conditioned classrooms, and high-tech facilities in urban campuses, educational businesses make unrealistic promises to rural parents. They claim that students who join their institutions will become IAS officers or secure lucrative software jobs, creating false hopes and influencing parents' decisions. “Believing that such institutions will guarantee a bright future for their children, many parents are falling into debt traps. These institutions often exploit the aspirations and vulnerabilities of families who are willing to make sacrifices for their children's education. “Fee Exploitation in the Name of Education “Once admission is secured, many parents discover the reality. Educational institutions collect hefty amounts through donations, admission fees, tuition fees, AC charges, books, uniforms, and transportation costs. The total financial burden often becomes unbearable for ordinary families. “Ignoring government regulations and fee-control guidelines, some institutions continue to increase fees arbitrarily. Bright students from villages are brought into corporate-style academic environments where intense pressure is placed on them to produce ranks and results, often at the cost of their mental well-being. “Rather than focusing on holistic education and character development, some institutions allegedly use students primarily to enhance their brand value and reputation. As a result, many families struggle to pay fees midway through the academic year. “Public Demands to the Government and Education Department “Concerned citizens have urged the government and education authorities to take immediate



action against unfair practices in the education sector. “Special Monitoring Teams “Authorities should form dedicated teams to monitor rural areas and take action against agents of private schools and colleges who engage in misleading admission campaigns. Criminal cases should be registered against those found involved in fraudulent practices. “Fee Regulation Enforcement “The government should strictly implement fee-regulation orders and guidelines. Every private school and college should publicly display its fee structure on notice boards to ensure transparency. “Inspections and Closure of Violators “Education department officials should conduct surprise inspections of institutions operating without proper permissions or charging excessive fees. Institutions found violating regulations should face strict action, including closure if necessary. “Awareness in Rural Areas “The government should create awareness among rural communities about the quality facilities and free education available in government schools and junior colleges, helping parents make informed decisions. “Appeal to Parents “Do not be misled by impressive buildings and glamorous advertisements. Education comes not from infrastructure alone, but from a student's hard work and the quality of teaching. Do not fall into debt by believing unrealistic promises made by corporate educational institutions. Trust your children's abilities and potential. “Education is not a business—it is a fundamental right. Several educationists and intellectuals have expressed concern that commercializing education is placing an unfair burden on rural families. They have called upon the government to take stringent action against institutions that exploit parents and students for profit.

DGP C.V. Anand Reviews Rain-Affected Areas, Directs Police to Remain on High Alert



“Serilingampalli zone : In view of the heavy rains that lashed Hyderabad and several other parts of Telangana, Director General of Police (DGP) C. V. Victims Seek Justice, Allege Assault and Police Inaction in Khammam

“Khammam, June 13 Indian Chronicle:“ “A family residing in Pakabanda Bazaar, Khammam, has appealed for justice, alleging that they were physically assaulted by their neighbors and that police have failed to act on their complaint. “Addressing a press conference at the Khammam Press Club on Friday, victims Ramu Perumal and Ramu Sudha said they migrated from Tamil Nadu and have been living in Khammam for the past 40 years. The family earns its livelihood by preparing and selling food items. “According to them, they have been operating their food business without causing inconvenience to nearby residents, maintaining a chimney and smoke outlet at a height of about 40 feet. However, they alleged that a neighboring family, which constructed a house adjacent to their property around three years ago, began objecting to the smoke outlet and repeatedly harassed them. “The victims claimed that the neighbor, a retired Revenue Department employee, along with his son, allegedly demanded that they either sell their house and vacate the area or pay ₹15,000 per month. When the family refused, they alleged that the neighbor’s son, reportedly associated with an electronic media organization, along with several others, forcibly entered their house and assaulted them. “They further alleged that women in the family were also attacked and stated that the entire incident was captured on CCTV cameras. “The family said they lodged a complaint with the One Town Police Station, but alleged that no action has been taken so far. They also accused municipal officials of imposing fines on their business without justification and claimed they were being subjected to continued harassment. “Appealing to the authorities, the victims demanded action against those responsible for the alleged assault as well as against officials who, they claim, failed to respond to their complaint. They urged the administration to ensure their safety and deliver justice. “The allegations made by the family have not been independently verified, and the response of the accused individuals and the police was not immediately available.

Students from Underprivileged Sections Demand Establishment of a Typewriting & Shorthand Examination Centre in Khammam City

“Technical Education Department's Negligence Towards Typewriting & Shorthand Examination Centre for Poor Students Pursuing Vocational Courses.” “Board of Technical Education Causing Mental Distress to Students by Shifting the Examination Centre to Madhira, 60 km Away.” “Technical Education Department Ignoring Recommendation Letter Issued by a Minister Based on Students' Request.” “KHAMMAM, 13 JUNE (INDIAN CHRONICLE):” “Around 20 Typewriting and Shorthand Institutes recognized by the Telangana State Technical Education Department are functioning in Khammam city, providing vocational training to students from economically weaker and underprivileged sections. These institutes not only support the livelihoods of their operators but also help students secure employment in government, private, and self-employment sectors.” “The Technical Education Department conducts Typewriting and Shorthand examinations once every six months. However, the examination centre, which had been functioning in Khammam for several years, was shifted to the Government Polytechnic College at Madhira, located about 60 kilometres away. The department justified the move by stating that examinations should be conducted only in Gov-



ernment Polytechnic Colleges and claimed that Khammam city does not have such a college.” “Institute faculty members, students, and parents have expressed



concern over the rigid attitude of the Technical Education Department. They question how Khammam, a major hub that hosts numerous state and central government competitive examinations, can be considered unsuitable for conducting Typewriting and Shorthand examinations for poor and underprivileged students.” “After being informed about the issue, local ministers promptly issued recommendation letters to the Technical Education Department, considering the future prospects of the students. However, the department allegedly ignored these recommendations, causing disappointment and mental distress among students.” “Demanding justice, students, along with institute instructors, staged a protest at various institutes on Saturday. They appealed to min-

isters and government officials to show compassion and establish a Typewriting and Shorthand Examination Centre in Khammam city, stating that the course serves as an important vocational skill and a source of livelihood for many students.

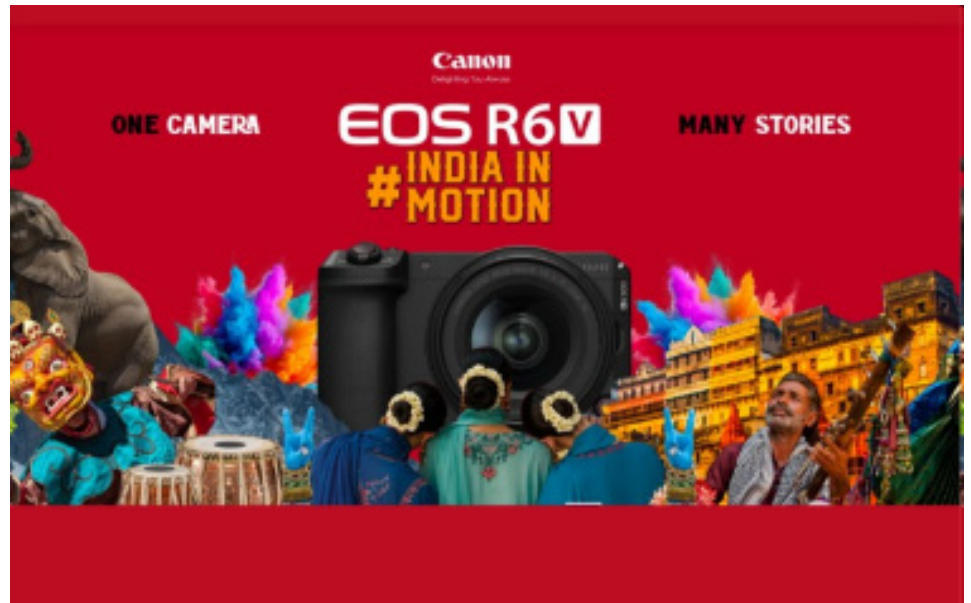
