

Indiramma Housing for Every Poor Family: CM Revanth Reddy

Government Launches Second Phase of 2.5 Lakh Indiramma Houses



“Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, June 1.” Permanent houses will be built so that no tribal hamlet remains with huts. Every beneficiary who receives an Indiramma House must complete the construction. The State Government is committed to providing an Indiramma House to every poor family, said Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy. On Monday, he inaugurated newly constructed Indiramma Houses at Kothaguda village under Kolam Kothari Gram Panchayat in Komaram Bheem Asifabad district, along with State Ministers Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy, Dhanasari Anasuya (Seethakka), Jupally Krishna Rao, Gaddam Vivekanand, Member of Parliament Vem Narender Reddy, Members of the Legislative Council, District Collector K. Haritha, Asifabad MLA Kova Lakshmi, and village Sarpanch Madavi Sampabai. Addressing the gathering, the Chief Minister said the government is making every effort to ensure that tribal communities receive the benefits of all welfare schemes. He stated that the development of Adilabad, a region historically considered backward, and the welfare of tribal communities remain top priorities for the government. He said that 3,500 Indiramma Houses have been allotted to each Assembly constituency, resulting in the sanction of 4.5 lakh houses across the state. In coordination with the Housing Department, the government has also earmarked 21,000 houses specifically for tribal habitations under the Integrated Tribal Development Agency (ITDA) to benefit eligible families. The Chief Minister assured that permanent houses would be constructed in every tribal hamlet and that all eligible beneficiaries would receive housing assistance. He announced the launch of the second phase of the Indiramma Housing Programme from Kothaguda, with the inauguration of one lakh houses and the implementation of the second phase covering 2.5 lakh houses. He further stated that a special initiative is being undertaken within ITDA areas to ensure that every eligible tribal family receives a house and completes its construction. Highlighting the government’s focus on women’s empowerment, he said women are being recognised as heads of households and are benefiting from several welfare programmes, including free bus travel, 200 units of free electricity, ration cards, fine rice distribution, and LPG

cylinders at ₹500. The government has also increased the loan limit for women’s self-help groups from ₹5 lakh to ₹10 lakh. Through the Indira Mahila Shakti scheme, women are being encouraged to participate in various business sectors. The government has allocated 1,000 buses to women entrepreneurs and is creating opportunities for women in the management of petrol pumps and solar power plants, thereby promoting economic empowerment. The Chief Minister urged those who have not yet received houses not to worry, assuring them that all eligible beneficiaries would be covered. He also called upon beneficiaries who have already received sanction orders to complete the construction of their houses. Emphasising the importance of education in a competitive world, he urged tribal families to ensure that their children pursue education and strive for higher achievements. He also advised women to cultivate savings habits and use their earnings wisely for future needs. State Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said the government is working tirelessly to understand and address the needs of the people. He reiterated that housing assistance would be provided to every eligible poor family and described the present administration as a government that delivers on its promises. He expressed happiness that the second phase of the Indiramma Housing Programme was launched in a remote village. State Minister Seethakka said that all eligible beneficiaries in Particularly Vulnerable Tribal Group (PVTG) habitations would be provided Indiramma Houses. She added that the government is working to ensure food, shelter, clothing, and quality education for every child. Referring to Anganwadi services, she said steps have already been taken to establish centres and directed officials to set up additional Anganwadi centres in the district based on population requirements. During the visit, the Chief Minister inaugurated Indiramma Houses belonging to Sidam Kannibai, Tekam Paggubai, and Atram Pochubai in Kothaguda village and participated in the housewarming ceremonies with their family members. He later inspected the ongoing construction of Indiramma Houses being built using shear-wall technology in the village. Implement the Fee Regulation Act AISF Khammam District President Madupalli Laxman

“Khammam, JUN01 (Indian chronicle): “Identify Unrecognized Corporate Private Schools” We will conduct raids if schools sell uniforms, stationery, and books in violation of regulations – Implement Fee Regulation Act – AISF submits a memorandum to the District Collector” AISF Khammam District President Madupalli Laxman demanded that the government identify unrecognized private corporate schools that are collecting exorbitant fees under the guise of admissions, seal such institutions, and strictly implement the Fee Regulation Act. “On Monday, under the leadership of the AISF Khammam District Committee, a memorandum was submitted to District Collector Divakar TS. Speaking on the occasion, Madupalli Laxman stated that private corporate educational institutions are admitting students without proper permissions and collecting crores of rupees from parents. “He alleged that private corporate schools across the district are charging excessive fees, while the District Education Officer is merely acting as a spectator and showing negligence in identifying and taking action against unrecognized schools. He further stated that both governments and officials are adopting a lenient attitude toward regulating private corporate educational institutions. “Laxman expressed concern that private corporate educational institutions have transformed education into a commercial commodity and are operating like marketplaces. He questioned why the District Education Officer is failing to take action against schools that are openly commercializing education. “He alleged that these institutions are burdening parents with separate charges for admissions, donations, books, uniforms, and various other fees. He pointed out that under the Right to Education (RTE) Act, private corporate schools are required to provide 25% fee concessions to students belonging to SC, ST, BC, and Minority communities, but many institutions are violating these provisions. He also demanded a 50% fee concession for the children of journalists. “Laxman further stated that so-called “International Schools” in the district are charging fees ranging from ₹1.10 lakh to ₹1.20 lakh even for Nursery, LKG, and UKG



classes. He alleged that corporate private educational institutions are exploiting parents' aspirations to provide quality education to their children and are indulging in large-scale fee exploitation. “AISF Khammam District Committee demanded that the District Collector immediately intervene, register criminal cases against the managements of corporate educational institutions that are mushrooming across the district under the name of International Schools, and ensure the strict implementation of the Fee Regulation Act. “The program was attended by AISF Khammam District Assistant Secretary Burra Manoj, district leaders Pawan, Gopi, Sai, and others.

Cases Registered Under the City Police Act Against Youths for Reckless Behavior on Roads at Midnight

Cases have been registered against them under the City Police Act, and they have been taken into custody, according to Balakrishna. “The Inspector stated that on the previous night, a group of youths gathered at ZP Center in Khammam and rode motorcycles on public roads while triple-riding, performing stunts, making repeated rounds, creating loud noise with modified silencers, and causing inconvenience to pedestrians and motorists. They also burst firecrackers, creating panic among the public. “Cases were registered against seven youths under the City Police Act, and five motorcycles were seized. The police further stated that additional individuals involved are being identified through CCTV footage, and more cases will be registered against them. “The Inspector warned that people who organize birthday parties or other celebrations and create public nuisance by drinking and disturbing the peace on city roads during late-night hours will also face legal action. “He added that if students and young people become involved in criminal cases, it could negatively affect their future prospects, including eligibility for private and government jobs. 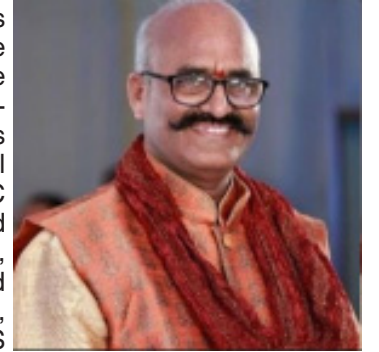
The Joy of Having a Home...! Indiramma Housewarming Ceremonies

Employees' Contribution to EHS Scheme Should Be Withdrawn : Telangana State JAC

““Hyderabad, June 01 (Indian Chronicle): The Telangana Employees, Teachers, Workers and Pensioners State Joint Struggle Committee(JAC) has strongly opposed the State Government's decision to deduct a 1.5% contribution from employees under the Employees Health Scheme(EHS). Addressing a state-level JAC meeting held in Hyderabad on Monday, JAC Chairman Tirugatham Prabhakar, Convener Syed Shaukat Ali, and Co-Conveners S.Devender, Bathula Muralidhar Goud, and T.Harikishan said that a majority of employees, teachers, workers, and pensioners are against the proposed EHS contribution. They criticized the government for deciding to deduct 1.5% of employees' salaries without holding comprehensive consultations with stakeholders. The leaders described the move as a mistake and urged the government to reconsider its decision. The JAC leaders also announced the revival of the Telangana Joint Struggle Committee, which was originally formed in 2006. They said discussions would soon be held with like-minded associations to constitute a broader and more representative executive body. The committee appealed to Chief Minister A.Revanth Reddy not to adopt a hasty approach in implementing the EHS and to respect the sentiments of employees by withdrawing the decision to deduct the 1.5% contribution from their salaries.

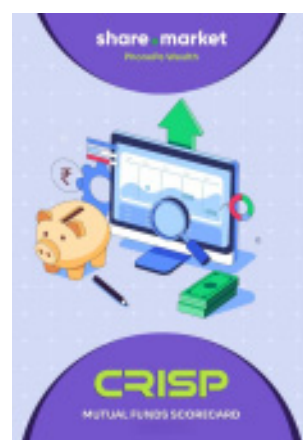

ShareMarket's CRISP Mutual Fund Scorecard Highlights the Need for 'Market Timing' in Small Cap Funds

Hyderabad: ShareMarket by PhonePe released the CRISP Mutual Fund Scorecard for the quarter ending March 2026. The latest report questions the long-held "Small-Cap Alpha" belief that small-cap funds offer higher returns over the long term. Moreover, the margin of outperformance may not sufficiently compensate for the disproportionately higher risks involved. The Risk-Reward Paradox The insights have been drawn from the analysis of 20 years of historical data between the Nifty Small Cap 250 TR Index and the Nifty 100 TR Index. While the common perception is that small caps are the primary engine for portfolio growth, the data highlights a different reality - "The Yield Gap: The Nifty Small

Cap 250 Index delivered an annualized return of 12.54% versus 11.72% for the Nifty 100 TRI resulting in an outperformance of just 0.82%. The Volatility Risk: To earn that extra 0.82%, investors endured an annualized volatility of 28.81%, compared to 21.06% for large cap, alongside significantly higher maximum drawdowns. Cyclical and Tactical Investing The scorecard emphasizes that small-cap performance is highly cyclical, thriving in bullish phases (like 2014-2017) and struggling during corrections (like 2018-2020). Over 3-year periods, small-cap outperformance ranged from a staggering +20.52% during bull runs to a dismal -17.16% during market corrections. Nilesh D Naik, Head of PhonePe Mutual Funds opined on the report saying, "Contrary to popular belief, a simple buy-and-hold strategy in small caps may not optimally compensate for the risk. The latest CRISP MF Scorecard suggests a



strong negative correlation between past 3-year outperformance and future 3-year outperformance vs the large caps, favoring a tactical approach based on relative valuations. "Way Forward for Investors" After the time correction over the last couple of years, the performance gap between small and large caps has narrowed. With valuations returning to more reasonable levels compared to previous peaks, the report suggests a potential 12-to-18-month window for aggressive investors to consider tactical entries into the small-cap space.
