WJI's Uncompromising Fight for Journalists' Rights: Ravikanti Srinivas

WJI Gains Further Strength with the Induction of Senior Journalists

““““Hanumakonda, June 19 (Indian Chronicle): The Working Journalists of India (WJI) is committed to an uncompromising struggle for journalists' welfare, protection of rights, professional development, and social security, asserted Ravikanti Srinivas, State General Secretary of WJI. “Addressing the Joint District Organizational Meeting of WJI held on Friday at Veda Banquet Hall on Hunter Road in Hanumakonda, Srinivas emphasized that safeguarding the interests of journalists remains the organization's foremost mission. On the occasion, senior journalists Gunti Vidyasagar, Nampally Namboodripad, M.D. Shamsuddin, and Sridhar from Mulugu district, along with several media professionals from various journalists' associations, resigned from their previous organizations and joined WJI. “Speaking at the meeting, Ravikanti Srinivas expressed concern over the implementation of G.O. 252, which governs the accreditation process for journalists in Telangana. He alleged that repeated amendments introduced to the G.O.



under various pressures had created confusion and inconsistencies in the accreditation system across the state. “He pointed out that while legal proceedings concerning the G.O. are ongoing in courts, accreditations are reportedly being issued in several districts contrary to established guidelines. He demanded that every journalist who fulfills the prescribed qualifications, management recommendations, and government norms should be granted accreditation without any form of discrimination. “Srinivas also voiced concern over the prolonged delay in the allotment of house sites for journalists in several districts. He urged the government to intervene immediately and provide a permanent solution to the issue. Referring to the railway travel concessions withdrawn during the COVID-19 pandemic, he criticized the Central Government for not restoring the facility and called for its immediate reinstatement. “WJI State Vice President Tadooru



Karunakar stated that a leadership vacuum has emerged in Telangana's journalists' movement. He alleged that certain organizations, which should be working for the welfare of journalists, have become increasingly focused on personal interests. In such circumstances, he said, WJI is emerging as a strong and credible alternative platform for the journalistic fraternity. “State Secretary Nara Subrahmanyeswara Rao highlighted WJI's initiatives to identify and encourage journalistic talent from the grassroots to the state level through special awards and recognition programs. NALA Conversion Process Stalled Across Telangana Must Be Resumed Immediately: M. Narasaiah, Working President of Telangana Real Estate Association

"HYDERABAD, JUNE 19 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): M. Narasaiah, Working President of the Telangana Real Estate Association, has demanded that the state government immediately resume the NALA conversion process, which has reportedly come to a standstill across all 33 districts of Telangana over the past ten days. "He alleged that following the revision of land values announced by the state government on June 5, the NALA conversion process has been halted at various levels. Narasaiah expressed concern that the government's decision could adversely affect revenue collections and create difficulties for those engaged in the real estate sector. He stated that NALA conversion is a crucial prerequisite for obtaining DTCP and HMDA layout approvals. However, applicants visiting Tahsildar offices are reportedly finding only an "Under Construction" status on the portal, with no transactions being processed. "Narasaiah urged Revenue Department officials to immediately address any technical issues if they exist, or clarify whether the government has officially suspended NALA conversions. He warned that if the situation persists, hundreds of property registrations across the state could be affected, resulting in a decline in government revenue. He further cautioned that if authorities fail to respond promptly, the association would launch protests in front of Tahsildar offices across Telangana.



Sundar Raj Extends Support to Mamnoor Mandal Movement-- Demands 70% Employment Reservation for Local Residents

"Mamnoor/Warangal, June 19 (Indian Chronicle): The relay hunger strike being conducted under the aegis of an all-party forum, demanding the formation of Mamnoor as a separate Revenue Mandal, entered its 14th consecutive day on Friday. Former Chairman of the Kakatiya Urban Development Authority (KUDA) and OBC Chairman, S. Sundar Raj Yadav, participated in the protest camp and expressed his solidarity with the ongoing movement. "Addressing the gathering, Sundar Raj Yadav stated that nearly 1,900 acres of fertile agricultural land belonging to farmers of Mamnoor village had been acquired by the Central and State Governments almost a century ago. Since then, the affected farming families have been deprived of their primary source of livelihood and compelled to lead their lives as daily wage labourers, he observed. "He pointed out that the absence of cultivable land has left many local youths unemployed, forcing them to depend on daily wage work for survival. As a result, the economic condition of the village has deteriorated significantly,



pushing several families into financial hardship. "Referring to the proposed airport project at Mamnoor, he urged the government to ensure justice for the families that had sacrificed their lands for public purposes. He demanded that at least 70 percent of the employment opportunities generated by the airport project be reserved for local residents, particularly for members of the affected families, in accordance with their educational qualifications and eligibility. "Emphasizing the need to safeguard the identity and future development prospects of Mamnoor, Sundar Raj Yadav called upon the government to immediately declare the village as a Revenue Mandal headquarters. He reiterated that the relay hunger strike would continue until the long-pending demand is fulfilled. No. 42 by selling textbooks printed with the schools' names within their premises, Osmania University Students JAC State Co-Convenor Varkala Shiva Kishore Goud questioned why the Mandal Education Officer (MEO) has failed to initiate action against such institutions. “Speaking on the issue, Shiva Kishore Goud said that G.O. No. 42 clearly lays down various rules and regulations relating to fees, textbooks, school uniforms, ties, belts and other related items. He pointed out that the order explicitly prohibits private and corporate schools from selling textbooks and other materials bearing the institution's name within the school premises. “However, he alleged that several private and corporate schools are disregarding these guidelines and



are collecting thousands of rupees from parents in the name of fees. He demanded that the State Government enact and implement a fee regulation law to control arbitrary fee collections by educational institutions. “Shiva Kishore Goud further urged the Medchal district education authorities to conduct immediate inspections in all schools across the district and take stringent action against institutions found violating the prescribed norms.

He allegedly convinced the management that he could provide specialized training programs for students and sent forged documents, including fake Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs),

to gain their trust. “Believing the offer to be genuine, the institution transferred ₹10 lakh to the accused. After realizing they had been deceived, a complaint was lodged with the Cyber Crime Police. “During the investigation, police identified and arrested the accused, D. Ravi Kiran (26), the account holder linked to the fraudulent transactions, in Hyderabad. He was produced before the Khammam Cyber Crime Court and subsequently remanded to judicial custody. “Police officials stated that the investigation is still ongoing and further details may emerge as the case progresses. “The Police Commissioner appreciated the efforts of the investigation team, including Cyber Crime DSP Phaninder, CI Bhukya Ravi Kumar, SIs Ranjith Kumar and Vijay Kumar, and constables Krishna Rao and Nageswara Rao, along with other Cyber Crime Police Station staff members, for their crucial role in solving the case.



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Special Intensive Revision of Electoral Rolls Must Be Conducted Successfully: Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy

“Khammam, June 19 Indian Chronicle: Telangana Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) Sudarshan Reddy has directed officials to ensure the successful implementation of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls without any errors. “Reviewing the voter list revision programme through a video conference from Hyderabad on Friday, the CEO interacted with District Collectors, Additional Collectors, and Electoral Registration Officers (EROs) across the state. “Speaking on the occasion, Sudarshan Reddy stated that as part of the Special Intensive Revision programme, Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will distribute Enumeration Forms to every household from June 25 to July 24 and collect the duly filled forms from voters. He emphasized that BLOs would play a crucial role in the revision process. “He instructed officials to undertake mapping and unmapping exercises in urban areas and maintain proper records, including photographs and meeting minutes of interactions conducted with Booth Level Officers and Booth Level Agents (BLAs). “The CEO informed that the Enumeration Forms would be printed in local languages and uploaded to the designated portal after collection. District Collectors and EROs were advised to frequently visit field locations and closely monitor the revision process. “He stressed the importance of creating public awareness through media regarding the voter list revision programme and directed officials to update details of unmapped voters through the designated update option. Rationalization of polling stations is scheduled to be completed by July 24. “According to the election schedule, the draft electoral rolls will be published on July 31. Claims and objections will be accepted from July 31 to August 30, while their disposal will continue until September 28. The final electoral rolls will be published on October 1. “The CEO also directed officials to conduct meetings with representatives of recognized political parties and maintain proper records of such meetings. As part of polling station rationalization, officials were instructed to ensure that no polling station has more than 1,200 voters. “He further emphasized the need for widespread publicity regarding Booth Level Officers and special training for BLOs on the registration of elderly, sick, and differently-abled voters. Measures should also be taken to ensure that members of the same family are assigned to the same polling station wherever possible. “Officials were advised to respond promptly to negative or misleading reports appearing in media and social media and take necessary steps to prevent misinformation. “Participating in the video conference, Khammam District Collector Divakar TS stated that awareness meetings had already been conducted with representatives of recognized political parties in the district. Training programmes for Booth Level Officers and Booth Level Agents have also been organized. “The Collector said extensive publicity regarding the Special Intensive Revision programme is being carried out through banners, hoardings, and electronic media. AIKS Demands Withdrawal of State Government Decision

Govinda Rao urged the state government to reconsider its procurement policy and formulate a plan to ensure the purchase of the entire agricultural produce from farmers. “He also demanded that payments for procured maize be credited to farmers' bank accounts without delay and called for stricter action against the sale of spurious seeds. Furthermore, he said that farmers would welcome the timely disbursement of the Rythu Bharosa financial assistance scheme.
