## Illegal Constructions Trigger Uproar in Bala Chittari Nagar; Allegations of Corruption Against Town Planning Officials

“— Blow to Government Revenue as Residential Permits Allegedly Used for Commercial Buildings in Boduppall Circle” “BODUPPAL , JUNE 20 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Illegal construction activities in the Boduppall Circle limits of the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation have once again become a topic of public concern. Allegations have surfaced that several large commercial structures are being constructed near the main road at Bala Chittari Nagar, adjacent to a church in Bolligudem, despite obtaining permissions only for residential buildings. “According to local residents, buildings sanctioned for residential purposes are allegedly being developed for commercial use, resulting in the evasion of fees and taxes that should otherwise accrue to the government. They expressed concern that the practice is causing significant revenue losses to the state exchequer. Residents questioned why the Town Planning Department has reportedly failed to conduct



inspections or initiate action despite the large-scale commercial constructions being carried out along the main road. The lack of intervention by the authorities has raised suspicions among locals, who are asking whether the inaction is due to negligence or other reasons. “People in the area alleged that a situation has emerged where obtaining any form of permission is being used as a pretext to undertake construction activities beyond the approved plans. They pointed out that converting residential approvals into commercial developments is a violation of urban planning regulations and demanded a comprehensive inquiry into the matter, along with stringent action against those responsible. “Local residents have urged the authorities to immediately intervene, take action against those violating building norms, and also investigate the role of officials allegedly involved in the controversy.

# Farmers Face Severe Hardships Under Congress Rule: Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar

## Former Chief Whip alleges Congress government failed to fulfill promises made to farmers

“Hanamkonda, June 20 (Indian Chronicle):“Former Government Chief Whip and former MLA of Warangal West constituency, Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar, alleged that people from all sections of society are facing severe hardships under the Congress government, with farmers particularly struggling amidst a financial crisis. Speaking at a press conference held on Saturday at the Bharat Rashtira Samithi (BRS) party office in Balasamudram, he stated that government policies are pushing many farmers into financial distress and despair. “Vinay Bhaskar recalled that during the era of the united Andhra Pradesh state, farmers suffered greatly due to shortages of fertilizers and seeds, prolonged power cuts, and the lack of adequate support systems. In contrast, he noted that under the ten-year rule led by BRS President K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), farmers received unprecedented support through key schemes such as Rythu Bandhu, 24-hour free electricity, massive irrigation projects, and Mission Kakatiya—initiatives that trans-



formed the face of agriculture in Telangana. “Criticizing the Congress party for coming to power on the back of “420 promises” and six guarantees, he alleged that the government has failed to fulfill the promises made to farmers over the past two and a half years. He lashed out at the government, stating that it had failed not only to procure crops effectively but also to implement the promised crop bonus scheme. Vinay Bhaskar noted that BRS Working President K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) has been consistently raising farmers' issues through the party's 'Rythu Sangrama Sabhas' (farmers' struggle meetings) and public outreach programs. “KTR to Participate in a Training Program on June 22” “Former MLA Aruri Ramesh announced that KTR would attend a one-day training program as the chief guest at Satya Sai Gardens in Madikonda on June 22. The event is being organized for booth-level agents (BLAs), membership enrollment coordinators, and social media representatives from the Wardhannapet Assembly constituency. Ramesh alleged that the Congress government has failed to fulfill several key promises made to farmers and is undermining welfare schemes such as Rythu Bandhu, Rythu Bima, and bonus payments. Highlighting the achievements of the previous BRS administration, he noted that Telangana had made significant progress in sectors like irrigation, infrastructure, and agricultural support. He also recalled that 'Mission Kakatiya' had facilitated the rejuvenation of approximately 42,000 irrigation tanks across the state. State Cabinet Taking Anti-Farmer Decisions: Nagurla Venkateshwarlu “Nagurla Venkateshwarlu, former Chairman of the Farmers' Loan Waiver Commission, criticized the recent decisions taken by the state cabinet, terming them anti-farmer. He emphasized that under KCR's ten-year tenure, Telangana emerged as one of the leading agricultural states in the country, supported by extensive irrigation systems and farmer-centric welfare schemes. “He praised KCR for providing direct investment support to farmers through timely financial assistance deposited directly into their bank accounts during the months of June and December. Reaffirming the party's commitment to the farming community, Venkateshwarlu stated that the BRS would continue its struggle to safeguard the interests and rights of farmers. “He also expressed support for MLC Pochampally Srinivas Reddy, noting his active efforts toward women's welfare and social development through personal initiative and financial backing. Venkateshwarlu condemned the politically motivated allegations leveled against the MLC. He urged public representatives to focus on serving the people rather than engaging in baseless criticism. “BRS leaders, public representatives, party activists, and media representatives attended the press conference.

## CPI Stages Dharna in Front of RDO Office Against Officials' High-Handedness in the Name of SIR

“Khammam June 20 Indian Chronicle:”The Communist Party of India (CPI) organized a protest dharna in front of the Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO) office in Khammam, alleging that officials are harassing people under the pretext of the SIR process and denying them their rights. Addressing the gathering, CPI State Committee Member Mohammed Salam accused the Central Government of using the SIR mechanism as part of a larger plan to suppress the voting rights of minorities, Scheduled Castes (SCs), Scheduled Tribes (STs), and Backward Classes (BCs). He alleged that the process is being used to remove voters from electoral rolls and tighten political control over the electorate. The protesters demanded the immediate issuance of caste certificates, residence certificates, and other identification documents without unnecessary conditions. They urged officials not to create hardships for citizens seeking essential certificates and government



services. Mohammed Salam strongly criticized what he described as the government's divisive and self-serving policies, alleging that communal politics and bureaucratic hurdles are being used to trouble ordinary people. He further claimed that citizens applying online for certificates are being forced to make repeated visits to government offices and are often subjected to unofficial payments at various levels of the revenue administration. He alleged that revenue

offices have become centers of corruption, where middlemen and influential individuals exploit applicants. According to Salam, people are being charged unofficial fees even for online services and are forced to spend time and money running between MeeSeva centers and government offices. The CPI leader demanded that the government establish a transparent verification mechanism, allowing elected local representatives such as corporators, councillors, and sarpanches to certify local residents when required. He also called for strict action against corruption and irregularities in revenue offices and urged authorities to ensure that citizens are not harassed while obtaining government documents. Cotton (short staple) MSP rose from ₹3,700 to ₹8,268. Prices of pulses such as green gram, black gram, and red gram also witnessed substantial increases. The speakers said these hikes reflect the Centre's commitment to improving farmers' incomes and strengthening the agricultural sector. They also praised measures aimed at reducing farmers' financial burden. Referring to the PM-Kisan Samman Nidhi scheme, leaders said financial assistance is being transferred directly into farmers' bank accounts, eliminating middlemen. Addressing fertilizer subsidies, they pointed out that despite global conflicts and inflationary pressures, the price of a urea bag has been maintained at ₹266.50. They further stated that the Centre is providing a subsidy of about ₹1,665 on a 50-kg DAP fertilizer bag, adding that without such support, market prices could have crossed ₹4,000, placing a heavy burden on farmers. The speakers credited India's strong foreign policy and forward-looking planning for ensuring uninterrupted fertilizer supplies and preventing shortages across the country. KARIMNAGAR June 20 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar police have put in place elaborate security arrangements for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET) scheduled to be conducted on Sunday across seven examination centres in the commissionerate limits.



Reviewing the security arrangements at a meeting with police officers at Astra Convention Hall on Saturday, Police Commissioner Gautham Alam said that nearly 3,000 candidates were expected to appear for the examination and directed officials to ensure its smooth, transparent and incident-free conduct.

The Commissioner instructed officers to deploy adequate police personnel at all examination centres and maintain strict vigilance to prevent any untoward incidents. He said Section 144 would be enforced in the vicinity of the examination centres, prohibiting the assembly of five or more persons.

As part of precautionary measures, photocopy centres and internet cafés located near the examination venues have been directed to remain closed during the examination period. Candidates will be allowed entry only after undergoing a two-level screening process in accordance with the guidelines of the National Testing Agency (NTA), in coordination with education department officials.

The traffic police have also been asked to make special arrangements to facilitate the timely movement of candidates and prevent congestion around examination centres. Mr. Alam cautioned that any attempt to disrupt the examination or indulge in malpractice would invite stringent legal action. He stressed that ensuring a fair and peaceful examination was a collective responsibility as the test plays a crucial role in shaping the academic future of students.
