Attack on Tribal Communities is Highly Condemnable; Strict Action Must Be Taken Against the Culprits : Peddy Sudarshan Reddy

-Former MLA Visits and Consoles Injured Tribal Families of Ippal Thanda

IPPAL THANDA/NARSAMET, JUNE 21 (Indian Chronicle): Former MLA Peddy Sudarshan Reddy visited and consoled tribal residents of Ippal Thanda who were allegedly injured in an attack by Congress leaders. He enquired about their health condition and extended his support to the affected families. Speaking on the occasion, Sudarshan Reddy strongly condemned the alleged attack on tribal villagers who were attempting to raise their concerns regarding the proposed construction of an electricity substation at a site traditionally used for celebrating the Sheetala Bhavani Festival, a revered cultural and spiritual event of the tribal community. He stated that the villagers and Thanda elders had merely sought an opportunity to discuss the issue with the local MLA, but were instead subjected to what he described as an unjustified attack by Congress leaders. He remarked that any action perceived as disregarding tribal traditions and cultural sentiments amounts to an insult to the tribal community. The former MLA alleged that the incident occurred with the encouragement of local Congress leadership and criticized what he termed the filing of cases against the injured victims themselves. He further accused the police of harassing the affected tribal families rather than ensuring justice. Sudarshan Reddy emphasized that development initiatives should be carried out in a peaceful and democratic manner, respecting the sentiments and concerns of local communities, rather than being driven by political vendettas. He alleged that attempts were being made to create divisions among villages and tribal settlements, thereby disturbing social harmony. Three Students Miss NEET Exam Due to Two-Minute Delay “Entry Denied Under Rules; Students Return Disappointed

“UPPAL , JUNE 21 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Three students who arrived with hopes of appearing for the National Eligibility-cum-Entrance Test (NEET), a nationwide medical entrance examination, were denied entry after reaching the examination centre just two minutes past the stipulated reporting time in Uppal. The incident occurred at the NEET examination centre set up at Central University-2 in Uppal. According to officials, the students reached the centre after the deadline



had expired, and as per the examination guidelines, they were not allowed to enter. Authorities stated that candidates are required to report well before the prescribed time and that the delay on the part of the students and their parents resulted in them missing the examination. Consequently, the three aspirants had to return without writing the test despite preparing for it throughout the year. One of the students had reportedly undergone two years of long-term coaching and was forced to leave without taking the examination. Parents expressed deep anguish over their children losing the opportunity because of a delay of just two minutes. However, officials clarified that under the strict rules governing national-level examinations, no candidate can be permitted to enter the examination hall after the cut-off time under any circumstances. The incident has once again highlighted the importance of students and parents reaching examination centres well in advance. The fact that a mere two-minute delay affected the future prospects of three students has become a topic of discussion locally.

Illegal Moneylenders Arrested for Harassment and Usury

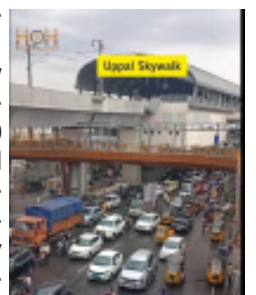
