

Congress demands fresh NEET-UG exam, alleges large-scale irregularities.

KARIMNAGAR June 23 (Correspondent): The Congress on Tuesday alleged large-scale irregularities in the conduct of the NEET-UG 2026 examination and demanded its cancellation and re-conduct under a transparent mechanism, accusing the NDA government at the Centre of compromising the future of lakhs of students.

Addressing a press conference at the District Congress Committee (DCC) office here, Karimnagar Corporation Congress president Vaidyula Anjan Kumar said alleged paper leaks, the controversy surrounding grace marks, and reports of multiple candidates securing perfect scores from the same examination centres had undermined the credibility of the examination process.

Stating that nearly 24 lakh students across the country had appeared for the medical entrance test, Mr. Anjan Kumar alleged that the National Testing Agency (NTA) had failed to ensure a fair and transparent examination. He said students from economically weaker and middle-class families, who had spent years preparing for the examination, were the worst affected by the alleged irregularities.

Demanding immediate action, he called for the cancellation of NEET-UG 2026 and the conduct of a fresh examination. He also sought a CBI inquiry into the alleged paper leak under the supervision of a sitting Supreme Court judge, the restructuring of the examination system, compensation for affected students, and the resignation of the Union Education Minister.

The Congress leader said the State government would continue to support students seeking justice and would take all necessary steps to safeguard the interests of aspirants from Telangana.

Criticising the BJP and the BRS, he alleged that both parties had failed to protect the integrity of educational and recruitment examinations. Referring to the TSPSC paper leak controversy, he said the BRS lacked the moral authority to comment on the NEET issue.

Following the press conference, Mr. Anjan Kumar chaired an emergency meeting of the Corporation Congress Committee to review preparations for the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls. He stressed the need for greater awareness among party workers and said at least five Congress work-



ers in every booth should be familiar with the SIR process.

He said one leader would be assigned to oversee every 10 divisions and monitor the progress of the revision exercise while assisting booth-

level agents in addressing technical and operational issues.

Corporators Ganta Kalyani Srinivas, Kanthar Jagan Reddy and Akula Nandini Uday, along with several Congress leaders and party workers, attended the meeting.

Municipal Corporation launches drive against road, footpath encroachments Focus on busy commercial stretches to improve pedestrian safety and traffic flow.

KARIMNAGAR June 23 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar Municipal Corporation on Tuesday launched a special drive to remove encroachments on roads and footpaths across the city, aiming to improve pedestrian safety and ease traffic congestion.

Town Planning and Disaster Response Force (DRF) officials, with the assistance of the Traffic Police, carried out the enforcement drive at several key locations, including Collector's Camp Office Road, weekly Market Road and Rajiv Chowk Road, which witness heavy vehicular and pedestrian movement.

During the operation, officials removed temporary structures, roadside extensions, pushcarts and commercial establishments that had encroached upon public roads and footpaths. The authorities said such encroachments were obstructing the free movement of pedestrians and motorists and contributing to traffic bottlenecks.

Town Planning officials warned traders and vendors against occupying public spaces for business activities, stating that action would be initiated under the provisions of the Municipal Act against violators.

The officials said the special drive would continue across the city to ensure roads and footpaths remain free from encroachments and accessible to the public.

Lyadella Raju's Death Was Natural; Sudden Cardiac Arrest Caused His Demise: Parkal ACP C.H. Satish Babu

Mystery surrounding the death resolved through scientific and medical evidence; Special Investigation Team confirms no foul play involved

“Geesugonda, June 23 (Indian Chronicle) : Special Investigating Officer (SIO) and Parkal Division Assistant Commissioner of Police (ACP) Ch. Satish Babu announced the conclusion of the investigation into the suspicious death of Lyadella Raju (alias 'Love' Raju) from Geesugonda village. He officially confirmed that the death was natural, resulting from a sudden heart attack. “Speaking at a press conference at the Geesugonda Police Station on Tuesday, ACP Satish Babu stated that the comprehensive investigation revealed Raju's death was caused by a sudden heart attack and not by any criminal act. “The case was registered under Section 194 of the BNSS (Crime No. 337/2025) and investigated from all angles. The inquiry involved a thorough examination of the scene, the interrogation process, a post-mortem examination, forensic analysis by the 'Clues' team, deployment of a dog squad, fingerprint analysis, scrutiny of CCTV footage, examination of Call Data Records (CDR) and WhatsApp chats, and the questioning of suspects. Acting on the orders of the Warangal Police Commissioner, ACP Ch. Satish Babu was appointed as the Special Investigating Officer (SIO) to conduct an in-depth investigation into the case. “Based on Forensic Science Laboratory (FSL) reports, histopathology tests, and the final opinion of experts from the Department of Forensic Medicine at Kakatiya Medical College, no fatal external or internal injuries were found on the body. Furthermore, no traces of poisonous substances were detected. “Medical experts clarified that certain marks observed on the body were post-mortem marks—caused by ant bites and thorns from an acacia tree—rather than injuries resulting from a physical assault. “Based on histopathological findings and expert medical opinion, investigating officers concluded that Layadella Raju died solely due to a sudden heart attack. “The ACP stated that all suspicions raised by the deceased's family members and others were thoroughly examined. Evidence regarding murder or any other criminal activity was not found in witness statements, medical evidence, scientific reports, or any other investigative findings. After a thorough evaluation of all evidence, forensic reports, medical opinions, FSL reports, and witness statements, the investigation conclusively determined that Layadella Raju, alias 'Love' Raju, died a natural death due to a sudden heart attack. Consequently, Crime No. 337/2025 was closed and classified as a case of natural death. “Mamnoor ACP Venkatesh, Geesugonda Inspector Visweswar, Sub-Inspectors Anil Kumar and Kumar, along with other personnel from the Geesugonda Police Station, attended this media briefing.

Task Force seizes illegal sand stockpiles in Kothapalli 75 tractor-loads of sand confiscated; one vehicle transporting sand illegally intercepted.

KARIMNAGAR June 23 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar police intensified their drive against illegal sand mining and transportation by seizing three unauthorised sand stockpiles and intercepting a tractor involved in illegal sand transport during a special operation in Kothapalli mandal on Tuesday.

Acting on the directions of Police Commissioner Gaush Alam, Task Force personnel conducted surprise inspections in Bavupeta village and detected three large sand dumps allegedly stored without permission. Officials estimated the quantity of seized sand at around 75 tractor-loads, comprising stockpiles equivalent to 50, 15 and 10 tractor-loads.

The seized sand was handed over to the Kothapalli police for further legal proceedings.

In another case, a tractor found transporting sand in violation of mining and transport regulations was seized within the jurisdiction of the Rural Police Station and handed over to the local police for action.

Police Commissioner Gaush Alam said the Commissionerate had adopted a zero-tolerance approach towards illegal sand mining, storage and transportation. He warned that stringent action would be taken against those violating government norms under the relevant provisions of mining and other applicable laws.

The Commissioner added that continuous surveillance and enforcement drives were being carried out across the Commissionerate limits to curb illegal sand-related activities and safeguard public resources.



Vaira Area Hospital Exists Only on Paper, Alleges BJP District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao

“Wyra, June 22 Indian Chronicle:” Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) Khammam District President, Nelluri Koteswara Rao, strongly criticized the functioning of the 100-bed Area Hospital in Wyra, alleging that the government's promise of providing corporate-level healthcare to rural poor has remained only on paper. “During an inspection of the under-construction hospital building and the existing hospital premises along with party leaders on Monday, Koteswara Rao expressed serious concern over the poor healthcare facilities, delays in construction, and alleged negligence by the government and officials. “He stated that although the government had upgraded the Vaira Primary Health Centre into a 100-bed Area Hospital through orders issued in October 2023, allocating ₹37.50 crore and sanctioning 98 medical staff posts, the benefits have not reached the people. According to him, the hospital lacks even basic facilities such as printers for issuing medical reports and essential diagnostic equipment. “Koteswara Rao pointed out that critical healthcare infrastructure, including an operation theatre for emergency Caesarean deliveries and incubators for newborn babies, is absent. He cited the case of a patient, Bodepalli Narayana, who was unable to obtain a printed copy of his HbA1c test report because the hospital reportedly does not have a printer or photocopy machine. He also alleged that medical staff behaved rudely when the patient requested the report. “The BJP leader further alleged that the old hospital building is in a dilapidated condition, with damaged roofs and inadequate sanitation facilities. He said that toilets are poorly maintained and have become so neglected that plants have reportedly grown inside them. Women patients, he added, are facing severe inconvenience due to the lack of proper restroom facilities. “He criticized the authorities for failing to install even a basic name board for the hospital and alleged that disputes between hospital and PHC staff over furniture and equipment reflect the government's failure to provide adequate resources. “Expressing concern over the slow pace of construction of the new hospital building near the TSWRS school in Vaira, Koteswara Rao alleged that the work is being carried out



with poor quality standards and without proper supervision. He also claimed that many of the sanctioned posts remain vacant and that inadequate staffing and irregular attendance by existing employees are forcing poor patients to seek treatment at private hospitals, often leading them into debt. “Demanding immediate action, he urged the government to accelerate construction work, ensure quality standards, provide all necessary medical equipment, and fill vacant staff positions. He warned that the BJP would launch large-scale protests if the government continues to neglect the healthcare needs of rural residents. “Among those who participated in the inspection were district vice presidents Ravi Rathod and Bandaru Naresh, Kisan Morcha district president Sarukula Venkateswarlu, general secretary Venky Yadav, Vaira town president Manubolu Venkata Krishna, Chinta Nippu Ramarao, Sandhya, and other party leaders.

Demand to Scrap VBG Ramji Scheme: CPI Alleges Anti-Poor Policies of Centre

“Khammam, June 23 Indian Chronicle:” CPI Khammam District Secretary Dandi Suresh demanded the immediate withdrawal of the Viksit Bharat Guarantee for Rozgar and Ajeevika Mission (VBG Ramji) scheme, alleging that it would adversely affect employment opportunities for rural poor workers. “Addressing a protest organized in front of the Collectorate by the Telangana Agricultural Workers Union following a call from the Bharatiya Khet Mazdoor Union, Suresh said that the Centre had altered the existing Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS) by introducing several new conditions that could reduce employment opportunities in rural areas. “The protesters demanded the restoration of MGNREGS in its original form, an increase in the number of workdays, and a daily wage of ₹700 to ensure a decent livelihood for workers. “Speaking at the protest, Suresh accused the Narendra Modi-led government of pursuing anti-poor policies. He alleged that instead of strengthening welfare schemes for the poor, the government was weakening existing programmes. He said that the newly introduced scheme, scheduled for implementation from July 1, would undermine employment opportunities and impose burdensome conditions on rural workers. “He also demanded the withdrawal of the requirement for workers to take photographs twice during work attendance and called for the continuation of MGNREGS without changes. “Suresh further alleged that while the Centre previously bore 90 percent of the scheme’s expenditure and states contributed 10 percent, the revised arrangement would increase the states’ share to 40 percent, shifting a greater financial burden onto state governments. “Criticizing the Centre over rising fuel prices, he said increases in diesel, petrol and cooking gas prices had led to a rise in the cost of essential commodities, making life difficult for common people. “He also accused the Telangana government of failing to implement several promises, including the sanction of new pensions, financial assistance of ₹2,500 per month for women, enhancement of pensions, farm loan waivers, Rythu Bharosa benefits and crop insurance. “Suresh alleged that



the state government was acting harshly toward poor families living in huts on government land and called for a more humane approach. “He asserted that the CPI and allied organizations would continue their struggle for the protection of rural employment guarantees and the resolution of public issues. “The protest was attended by CPI State Committee member Yerrababu, Agricultural Workers Union district leaders Tati Venkateswara Rao and Siddineni Karnakumar, CPI district executive members Shingu Narsimha Rao, Adinarayana, Midikanti Chinna Venkata Reddy, Enugu Gandhi, Yangala Anand Rao, and several leaders of mass organizations including Tati Nirmala, Pagilla Veerabhadram, Satyanarayana, Veerababu, Sudhakar, Gopala Rao, Mahesh, Eshwaramma, and Ranjan Bi. “Following the protest, the demonstrators submitted a memorandum containing their demands to Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S..

One-Cent Land Encroachment Can Be Reclaimed: Dheeravath Pushpavathi

“Cattle Being Tied on Village Road; Authorities Ignored Complaints” Representation Submitted to District Collector and DPO “Khammam Nelakondapalli, June 23 Indian Chronicle:” Dheeravath Pushpavathi stated that if even a one-cent piece of land has been encroached upon beyond legal boundaries, authorities can conduct a field-level inquiry and reclaim it. She made these remarks while addressing a press conference held at Mangapuram Thanda in Nelakondapalli mandal on Tuesday. “She said that her family is constructing a compound wall around their agricultural land, but some villagers are falsely accusing them of encroaching on the village road. Pushpavathi clarified that they have not occupied even an inch of public land.” She alleged that a few villagers are tying around ten cattle on the village road, causing inconvenience to her family. According to her, false allegations are being made against them because they questioned the practice of tying cattle on the roadway. “Pushpavathi expressed disappointment that despite submitting complaints to mandal and village-level officials regarding the issue, no action has been taken. She noted that a CC road was constructed in the village at a cost of ₹3 lakh, but some individuals are misusing it by tying their cattle there.” She urged authorities to conduct a field-level inquiry into the matter and stated that if a road genuinely needs to be laid through her land, she is willing to provide the required space. She emphasized that her family has never intended to cause harm or inconvenience to anyone. “Demanding action against those who are obstructing the road by tying cattle on it, Pushpavathi said that she has submitted representations to the District Collector and the District Panchayat Officer (DPO) seeking intervention.

Karimnagar urged to set benchmark in electoral roll revision

Collector seeks cooperation of political parties, officials and citizens for SIR exercise.

KARIMNAGAR June 23 (Correspondent): District Collector Chitra Mishra has called upon political parties, public representatives, officials and citizens to extend full cooperation for the successful implementation of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) programme and the preparation of a transparent and error-free electoral roll in Karimnagar district.

Addressing a meeting with representatives of political parties on Tuesday, Ms. Mishra said the district should emerge as a model in the State in the conduct of the electoral roll revision exercise. She noted that the programme was being implemented strictly in accordance with the guidelines of the Election Commission of India.



As part of the exercise, Booth Level Officers (BLOs) will undertake door-to-door visits from June 25 to July 24 and distribute enumeration forms to voters. She urged Booth Level Agents (BLAs) and political party representatives to cooperate with officials to ensure that all eligible voters are enrolled and no eligible elector is left out of the rolls.

The Collector said polling station rationalisation would be taken up on July 24, followed by the publication of the draft electoral roll on July 31. Claims and objections would be accepted from July 31 to August 30, while their disposal would be completed by September 28. The final electoral roll is scheduled to be published on October 1, 2026.

Ms. Mishra said enumeration forms would be delivered to every voter during the house-to-house survey. Political parties were requested to help identify eligible voters whose names may have been omitted from the rolls and facilitate their enrolment.

She said BLOs, BLA supervisors and special officers would work extensively in the field for a month and added that adequate training and awareness would be provided to field-level functionaries regarding the SIR programme.

Stating that there was no scope for misconceptions regarding the exercise, the Collector said its primary objective was to ensure the inclusion of all eligible voters while preventing the enrolment of ineligible persons. She also proposed involving public representatives as well as NSS and NCC volunteers in awareness and outreach activities.

Officials were instructed to conduct extensive awareness campaigns in both rural and urban areas. Voters were advised to use Form-8 for corrections and modifications in voter details and Form-6 for fresh enrolment.

Additional Collector (Revenue) Srinivas Reddy, Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai, DRO Swamy, RDOs Sharmila and Jalakumari, and representatives of various political parties attended the meeting.
