“---Former Chief Whip Reviews Special Intensive Revision (SIR) Process on Ground” Hanumakonda, June 25 (Indian Chronicle): Former Government Chief Whip and former Warangal West MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar stated that the right to vote is one of the most valuable rights in a democratic system and that the voter is the true custodian of democracy. Karimnagar June 25 (Correspondent): SUDA Chairman Komatireddy Narendra Reddy on Thursday supervised the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls in the 47th Division of Karimnagar and stressed the need for ensuring that no eligible voter is left out of the electoral process.

Lives Must Be Lost Before Action Is Taken?

“Sarpanch Expresses Anger Over Negligence of Power Department Officials”
Khammam Nelakondapalli, June 25 Indian Chronicle: “Mangapuram Thanda Sarpanch Dheeravath Ashokarani has questioned whether electricity department officials respond only after lives are lost. Addressing a press conference in the village on Thursday regarding persistent power-related issues, she alleged that officials have been neglecting serious problems affecting residents. “She stated that the Gram Panchayat had paid the required demand drafts nearly four months ago for the installation of a transformer at the village nursery, but the issue remains unresolved to this day. She also expressed concern over damaged electricity poles in the village, which she said have become hazardous, yet no repair works have been undertaken. “According to the Sarpanch, several electric wires are hanging dangerously low, posing a serious threat to the lives of villagers and farmers. Despite repeated complaints, officials have failed to take appropriate action, she alleged. “Ashokarani accused electricity department officials of ignoring concerns raised by elected public representatives and acting negligently. She questioned whether authorities would respond only after an unfortunate loss of life occurs. “She warned that the electricity-related problems in the village have reached a dangerous level and announced that a formal complaint regarding the alleged negligence of power department officials would be submitted to Telangana Revenue, Housing and Information Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy and the District Collector. “Dheeravath Radhakrishna Murthy, Vice-Chairman of the Cheruvumadharam Fishermen Cooperative Society, was also present at the press conference.

TGNPDCL CMD Reviews Infrastructure Works in Kagaznagar, Stresses Safety and Reliable Supply

“Indian Chronicle, Kagaznagar, June 25: TGNPDCL Chairman and Managing Director (CMD) Karnati Varun Reddy, IAS, conducted an extensive tour of the Kagaznagar Division in Komaram Bheem Asifabad district on Thursday to review ongoing power infrastructure projects and issue directions for improving electricity supply across the region. “During the visit, the CMD said the Corporation's primary objective is to strengthen electricity infrastructure to ensure quality, reliable, and uninterrupted power supply while meeting future demand. “He inspected the 20-km interlinking transmission line between Dahegaon in Kagaznagar Division and Kannepalli in Bellampalli Division. He stated that the line would be commissioned within a week, enabling an alternative power supply to Dahegaon, Penchikalpet, and surrounding areas. The project is expected to ensure uninterrupted electricity even during technical faults, heavy rains, and strong winds. “Later, Mr. Varun Reddy visited the 33/11 KV substations at Bejjur, Dahegaon, Koutala, and Sirpur (T), where he appreciated officials for the quality of Repair and Maintenance (R&M) works. “Interacting with field staff, the CMD emphasized that employee safety must remain the highest priority. He instructed personnel not to und... using prescribed safety equipment and direct... (LCs) only through the LC App. He warned that field operations would not be tolerated. “He also... minute for Safety,” urging every employee to spe... measures before commencing work. He said... significantly reduce electrical accidents, protect employees' lives, and improve the overall safety of power operations. “The CMD instructed officials to immediately rectify hazardous power lines, replace or straighten leaning electricity poles, increase the height of low transformer structures, and install intermediate poles wherever loose conductors pose a risk. “He further reviewed the ongoing installation of approximately 19 km of covered conductors between Vempalli and Peddabanda and Sarasala and Elkappalli in forest areas. He explained that covered conductors would help prevent power interruptions caused by trees falling on electricity lines during adverse weather conditions. “Mr. Varun Reddy also directed officials to complete the 20-km interlinking line between Bejjur and Karjavalli within a week and bring it into service without delay. “Reiterating the Corporation's commitment, the CMD said, “Providing consumers with quality and uninterrupted electricity remains our foremost priority. We are strengthening power infrastructure across the region to deliver better and more reliable services. “The programme was attended by Kagaznagar Divisional Engineer C. Nagaraju, Deputy Executive Engineer (Technical) Sudhakar, Executive Engineer (Civil) Srinivas, Assistant Divisional Engineers, Assistant Engineers, and other engineering officials and staff.

Cyberabad Cyber Crime Police Arrest Two Accused in Visa Extension Fraud Case – Rs9.60 Lakh Cash Seized

. "Serilingampalli zone: The Cyber Crime Police Station, Cyberabad, has successfully detected a Visa Extension Fraud case in which the accused cheated victims by falsely promising long-term visa extension services and dishonestly collected money without providing the promised services. FIR No.: 2698/2025 "Sections: 318(4) BNS & 66-D of the IT Act, 2000 "Accused Arrested: "A1. Arjun Reddy (38 Years) – Native of Guntur, Andhra Pradesh. He is the Mastermind who induced victims with false promises and collected money. A2. Anjaiah Reddy (45 Years) – Native of Narasaraopet, Palnadu District, Andhra Pradesh. He allowed his bank account to be used for receiving the cheated amounts. "Brief Facts of the Case: The complainant alleged that the accused promised to secure a long-term visa extension for her daughter and assured a refund in case of failure. Trusting these



assurances, she transferred money in multiple transactions to bank accounts specified by the accused. "After receiving the amounts, the accused continued to give false updates, collected personal documents under the guise of visa processing, and later demanded additional payments. Subsequently, they stopped responding and failed to provide any proof of visa processing or refund the money. "During enquiry, it was found that the accused had similarly cheated several other victims. Based on the complaint lodged with Cyber Crime Police Station, Cyberabad, a case was registered. The victim sustained a loss of ₹9,60,000/-. "Modus Operandi: Contacted victims through acquaintances

and social media. Lured them with false promises of long-term visa extension services. Collected money in the name of visa processing fees. Continued to provide fake updates and demanded additional payments. Neither processed the visa nor refunded the money. "Investigation & Arrest : Based on human intelligence, technical analysis, CDR analysis, beneficiary bank account verification, and mobile location tracking, Cyberabad Cyber Crime Police identified and apprehended both the accused after completing due legal formalities. "Property Seized : Cash – ₹9,60,000/- recovered from the main accused. "Public Advisory : Verify the credentials of any individual or agency offering visa or immigration services. Never transfer money based solely on assurances received through social media, WhatsApp, or telephone calls. Insist on proper receipts and documentary proof before making payments. Report cyber fraud immediately by calling 1930 or through the National Cyber Crime Reporting Portal (www.cybercrime.gov.in). "Appreciation: T. Sai Manohar, Dy. Commissioner of Police, Cyber Crimes, Cyberabad, appreciated the investigation team led by Raghavender for their prompt and professional investigation, which led to the arrest of both accused and recovery of the entire cheated amount. He also commended Shri Ravinderreddy, Assistant Commissioner of Police, Cyber Crimes, for his close supervision, effective monitoring, and guidance throughout the investigation, which significantly contributed to the successful detection of the case.

SETL to Acquire 51% Stake in GScale Energy

"Hyderabad, June 25 (Indian Chronicle) : Standard Engineering Technology Limited (SETL) will acquire up to a 51 percent majority stake in GScale Energy Private Limited as part of its strategic entry into the Artificial Intelligence (AI) data center engineering sector, according to a statement issued on Thursday by SETL Managing Director Nageswara Rao Kandula. He said the company plans to invest about ₹190 crore in the first phase of the acquisition and around ₹500 crore under its overall expansion plan. Kandula noted that extending SETL's engineering expertise from the pharmaceutical and chemical sectors to AI data center infrastructure is a natural next step in the company's growth strategy. Youth urged to stay away from drugs as awareness week gathers momentum in Karimnagar

Police Commissioner Gaush Alam calls for greater vigilance and self-discipline among students.



Karimnagar June 25 (Correspondent): Police Commissioner Gaush Alam on Thursday urged students and youth to stay away from drugs and other harmful addictions, describing substance abuse as one of the most serious social challenges confronting society.

Addressing a district-level awareness programme organised as part of the fourth day of the Anti-Drug Awareness Week, Mr. Alam said young people should channel academic stress into sports and physical activities instead of resorting to narcotic substances.

The awareness campaign, organised by the Karimnagar Police Commissionerate in coordination with the Excise Department, the Women and Child Welfare Department and other government agencies, began with a two-kilometre rally from the Collectorate to the Police Parade Ground. Students from various educational institutions, including nursing and medical colleges, participated in large numbers, raising anti-drug slogans and spreading awareness among the public.

Street plays, awareness songs and cultural performances staged by students highlighted the harmful effects of drug abuse on individuals, families and society. A special awareness seminar was later held at the Astra Convention Hall in the Commissionerate premises, where posters released by the Telangana Eagle Force were unveiled and a short film on drug abuse was screened.

Mr. Alam said the police were taking stringent measures to make Karimnagar a drug-free district. He noted that raids had recently been conducted on 99 pan shops located within 100 metres of educational institutions, leading to the registration of 52 cases for violations of regulations.

He said 'Conscious Clubs' had been established in educational institutions across the Commissionerate limits to promote awareness among students. Emphasising the slogan "Say No to Drugs, Say Yes to Life", he warned that the consumption and sale of drugs and ganja were punishable offences under the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act.

SUDA Chairman Komatireddy Narendra Reddy, who attended the programme, said self-discipline among youth was crucial in combating the menace of drug abuse and achieving life goals.

Prizes and certificates were distributed to winners of essay-writing and drawing competitions conducted as part of the awareness week. Yathalakunta Tunnel Works Must Be Completed by First Week of August: Collector Divakar T.S

“Khammam, June 25 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar T.S. has directed officials to complete the construction and lining works of the Yathalakunta Tunnel, a crucial component of the Sitarama Lift Irrigation Project, by the first week of August to ensure the timely supply of Godavari waters to farmers. “On Thursday, Collector Divakar T.S., along with Bhadradi Kothagudem District Collector Ankit, inspected the ongoing tunnel works in Sathupalli mandal. The collectors walked inside the tunnel to review construction progress, lining works, safety measures, and quality control standards. They later held a review meeting with senior irrigation officials and representatives of the construction agency.”



Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. said that completion of the Yathalakunta Tunnel would enable Godavari waters to reach the Sathupalli Trunk Canal, providing irrigation to thousands of acres in the Sathupalli constituency. He stated that once the tunnel is completed, water supply to Rudrakshapalli, Bethupalli, and the NTR Main Canal would become easier. “The Collector noted that the government's objective is to divert Godavari waters to the Wyrva Project through the Rajiv Link Canal, ensuring adequate irrigation for ayacut farmers. He said the Sitarama Project would significantly boost agricultural development in both

Khammam and Bhadradi Kothagudem districts. “According to the Collector, completion of the Yathalakunta Tunnel will bring irrigation facilities to an additional one lakh acres in the erstwhile Khammam district. This will help farmers cultivate more land, improve agricultural productivity, and increase farm incomes. “He appreciated the dedication of irrigation officials and construction personnel working on the project and instructed them to accelerate the remaining lining works on a war footing. Additional machinery and workforce should be deployed from both ends of the tunnel to expedite completion, he said. “The Collector also directed officials to immediately bring any technical, administrative, or operational issues to the notice of higher authorities and ensure that the project is completed within the stipulated timeframe. He emphasized that all departments must work in coordination so that Godavari waters reach Bethupalli Tank and the Sathupalli ayacut areas by the next monsoon season. “Bhadradi Kothagudem District Collector Ankit also instructed officials to intensify efforts and complete the works before August. He stressed that there should be no compromise on quality and that all prescribed technical and engineering standards must be strictly followed. “He further advised officials to take precautionary measures to ensure uninterrupted water flow during construction and to plan works keeping monsoon conditions in mind. “The inspection was attended by Tunnel and Safety Secretary Colonel Parikshit Mehra, Chief Engineer S. Srinivas Reddy, Executive Engineer B. Krishna, engineering staff, representatives of the construction company, and officials from various departments.
