“Rythu Ashirvada Sabha’ to be Held on June 30 in Chinthakani Mandal” Minister Inspects Arrangements for the Farmers’ Blessing Meeting” Khammam, June 28 Indian Chronicle: “Telangana Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy stated that since coming to power, the people’s government has been taking bold decisions and extending strong support to farmers across the state. “On Sunday, the Minister inspected preparations for the “Rythu Ashirvada Sabha” (Farmers’ Blessing Meeting) scheduled to be held on June 30 at Jagannathapuram village in Chinthakani Mandal, Khammam district. Telangana Chief Minister Anumula Revanth Reddy will attend the event as the chief guest. The Minister conducted a field-level review along with Agriculture Department Secretary K. Surendra Mohan, Commissioner Gopi, Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S., Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt, public representatives, and senior officials. “The Minister inspected the meeting venue, helipad, and parking facilities and directed officials to ensure top-quality arrangements, including German hangars, security measures, and traffic management, so that the event proceeds smoothly even in the event of heavy rainfall. “Speaking on the occasion, Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy said that although heavy rains are forecast during the monsoon season, the government has made all alternative arrangements and is confident that the Farmers’ Blessing Meeting will be a grand success. He said a large number of farmers are expected to participate and that the event symbolizes the priority being given to farmers’ welfare by the people’s government. “The Minister said the government has fulfilled every promise made during the last two and a half years and has established itself as a farmer-friendly administration. Under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, the government took bold decisions to procure rain-soaked paddy, ensuring that farmers did not suffer losses. Payments for the procured grain were credited directly into farmers’ bank accounts within a week, demonstrating the government’s commitment to the farming community. “He further stated that with the coordination of Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao and Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka, along with local public representatives and officials, the Farmers’ Blessing Meeting will be conducted as a landmark event in the state’s history. “Highlighting the government’s welfare initiatives, the Minister said that under the vision of “Indiramma Rajyam,” several programs are being implemented for the welfare of farmers, women, youth, and the poor. SC, ST Sub-Plan Funds Being Diverted: Mohammed Maulana

““Khammam, June 28 Indian Chronicle:““ CPI State Control Commission Chairman Mohammed Maulana alleged that SC and ST Sub-Plan funds in the state are being diverted, causing significant losses to tribal communities. He said



that although allocations are being made in the budget, the funds are not being properly utilized, resulting in a situation where figures look impressive on paper but implementation remains poor. ““Maulana was speaking as the chief guest at an extended meeting of the Telangana

Girijana Samakhya held on Sunday at the CPI office in Khammam under the chairmanship of Banoth Rambabu. He stated that despite crores of rupees being allocated every year in the name of tribal welfare, the diversion of funds has deprived tribal regions of meaningful development. ““He recalled that the Congress government had promised land titles for every acre of cultivated podu land. However, he alleged that lands cultivated by tribal farmers for decades are now being taken away from them. He accused the Forest and Revenue Departments of harassing tribal communities and demanded that the government fulfill its promise by granting land titles to all cultivated podu lands. Otherwise, he warned, tribals would be mobilized for protests. ““Maulana also said that the Indira Jalaprabha scheme, introduced to facilitate borewells and electricity connections in podu lands, is not being implemented effectively. He called for extensive campaigning to ensure a large turnout of activists from Khammam district for the Telangana Girijana Samakhya State Conference being held in Palvancho. ““He further demanded that the state government extend the Rythu Bharosa scheme to podu lands and implement welfare programmes through the ITDA. Women Self-Help Groups to Get Rice Mills in Telangana: Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

“Khammam Nelakondapalli, June 28 Indian Chronicle:“Telangana Revenue, Housing, Information and Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy announced that the state government is planning to provide rice mills to women's self-help groups as part of its initiative to make women financially prosperous and self-reliant. “The minister made these remarks while laying foundation stones for several development works in Appalanarasimhapuram, Rajarampeta and Koratlagudem villages of Nelakondapalli mandal on Sunday. “Addressing public meetings, he said the government is committed to empowering women economically and aims to create wealth-generating opportunities for them. As part of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's vision, the government is preparing to launch the rice mill scheme through a women's self-help group in Nelakondapalli, making it the first such initiative in the state. “The minister noted that the government has already provided RTC buses and petrol bunks to women's groups and extended loans worth ₹63,000 crore to self-help groups across Telangana. He said both development and welfare programmes are progressing rapidly in the state. “Highlighting the government's support to farmers, Srinivasa Reddy said that every grain produced by farmers, including moisture-affected paddy, is being procured and payments are being credited directly to farmers' accounts within a week. He added that several unprecedented welfare schemes are being implemented for the farming community. “On housing, the minister stated that after the ongoing phase, the government will sanction Indiramma houses in the second, third and fourth phases to all eligible beneficiaries. “Considering the impact of the El Niño phenomenon, he advised farmers to focus on rain-fed crops and utilize water resources judiciously. “Later, at a Pulse Polio centre set up by Rajarampeta Gram Panchayat under the leadership of Sarpanch Rayapudi Rama Rao, the minister administered polio drops to children and formally launched the immunization programme. “MLAs Koram Kanakaiah, Jare Adinarayana, along with district officials and Congress leaders, participated in the programme.



What Is CM Revanth Reddy's Response to Khammam's Problems? Farmers Betrayed, Common People Suffering BJP District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao Slams Government Failures Ahead of CM's Visit



“Khammam, June 28 Indian Chronicle:“Ahead of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's visit to Khammam district, BJP Khammam District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao has demanded clear answers on several pressing issues affecting the district. In a press statement released on Sunday, he highlighted eleven major concerns and accused the state government of failing in key sectors ranging from agriculture to women's safety. “Koteswara Rao alleged that the agricultural sector in Khammam is facing a severe crisis. Farmers are reportedly forced to wait for long periods at procurement centers due to the lack of adequate storage facilities for paddy and maize. He also criticized the government's handling of the Sitarama Project, stating that although 80 percent of the ₹19,000-crore irrigation project has been completed, the remaining works have been neglected. Despite the presence of influential ministers from the district, the project remains unfinished, causing hardship to farmers, he said. “He further demanded an inquiry into the allotment of 72 acres of land in the Buggapadu Mega Food Park in Sathupalli. According to him, land with a market value exceeding ₹50 lakh per acre was allotted to a private company from Andhra Pradesh for just ₹21 lakh per acre, allegedly with the support of a local minister. “The BJP leader also accused the government of failing to address urban infrastructure and flood management issues. He pointed out that recurring floods in the Munneru River continue to threaten Khammam city, affecting colonies such as Bokkalagadda and Saradhi Nagar. Although nearly ₹1,000 crore was reportedly sanctioned for constructing protective retaining walls along the river, progress remains extremely slow, he alleged. “He criticized delays in underground drainage projects proposed for the rapidly growing towns of Khammam and Madhira, claiming that thousands of crores allocated for the projects remain only on paper. Encroachments on drainage canals have worsened traffic congestion, while interruptions in Mission Bhagiratha water supply and pump failures have forced residents to struggle for drinking water during summer. “Koteswara Rao also expressed concern over industrial and environmental issues. He alleged that pollution from the Singareni Jalaga Vengala Rao and Kistaram opencast coal mines near Sathupalli has adversely affected around 5,000 families. Toxic substances such as chromium and arsenic are reportedly contaminating groundwater, while blasting operations have caused cracks in nearby houses. He noted that despite penalties imposed by the

National Green Tribunal, the government has failed to take effective corrective measures. “The BJP leader further stated that more than half of the granite factories in the undivided Khammam district have shut down due to international market pressures and rising raw material costs. He called for strict action regarding an alleged ₹100-crore tax evasion scam linked to e-way bills in the granite sector. “Highlighting concerns in social welfare and education, he claimed that 22 out of 24 BC Gurukul schools and hostels in the district continue to operate from rented buildings lacking basic facilities. Due to insufficient mess charges, students are allegedly being served poor-quality food, leading to incidents of food poisoning. “He also alleged that authorities demolished houses belonging to poor families in Velugumatla on the outskirts of Khammam under heavy police security, suggesting the involvement of powerful political and real-estate interests. “Finally, Koteswara Rao referred to the recent alleged attempted sexual assault of a 12-year-old girl in Khammam city, claiming that the incident reflects the deteriorating law-and-order situation and failure to ensure women's safety in the district. “He demanded that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy provide clear assurances and concrete solutions on all these issues during his visit to Khammam.

Pulse Polio Drive Successful in Nelakondapalli
