

Dispute Over Work Allocation Among Carpenters Reaches Police Station Carpenters Stage Protest Outside Police Station



“Khammam Nelakondapalli, June 4 (Indian chronicle):“A dispute over work allocation between two groups of carpenters escalated into a major confrontation and eventually reached the police station in Nelakondapalli mandal. Alleging unfair treatment by the police, local carpenters staged a protest in front of the police station and raised slogans against the police administration.“According to reports, the incident took place in Chennaram village of Nelakondapalli mandal. On June 1, a group of carpenters from Kodad town in Suryapet district was engaged in carpentry work in the village.“After learning about the work being carried out by outsiders, local carpenters visited the site and questioned the Kodad workers, alleging that they were undertaking the work in violation of local norms and agreements. This led to a heated argument between the two groups, which soon esca-

lated into shouting, verbal altercations, and pushing and shoving.“During the confrontation, tools and materials belonging to the Kodad carpenters were reportedly taken away by local workers.“Following the incident, Murali, the owner of the house where the work was being carried out, lodged a complaint with the local police station.“Subsequently, union leaders and local carpenters gathered at the police station. They alleged that the police were acting in favor of the Kodad carpenters and the house owner while treating the local carpenters unfairly. In protest, they staged a dharna outside the police station and raised slogans against the police.“The protesting carpenters warned that they would continue their agitation until justice was delivered.“Meanwhile, a local carpenter identified as Vijay filed a separate complaint at the police station, alleging that Murali had abused him by referring to his caste. As a result, both parties lodged counter-complaints, and police are investigating the matter.“Further inquiry into the incident is underway.

District Collector Reviews Applications Received at Sathupalli Revenue Sadassu

“Khammam Sathupalli, June 4 (Indian chronicle):” “District Collector Divakara TS has directed officials to give top priority to the speedy, transparent, and rule-based resolution of all eligible applications received from the public during the Revenue Sadassu. “A special review meeting was held on Thursday at the Sathupalli Tahsildar office regarding the applications received during the Revenue Sadassu conducted under the supervision of Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy. The meeting was attended by the District Collector, Additional Collector P. Srinivasa Reddy, Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav, and officials from concerned departments. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector instructed officials to scrutinize each application carefully based on eligibility criteria and ensure immediate resolution of issues that fall within the purview of rules. Additional Collector calls for stronger enforcement of tobacco control law

Stresses inter-departmental coordination to make Karimnagar a tobacco-free district.

KARIMNAGAR June 4 (Correspondent): District Additional Collector Dr. Ashwini Tanaji on Thursday stressed the need for coordinated efforts among government departments to ensure effective implementation of the Cigarettes and Other Tobacco Products Act (COTPA), 2003, and to move towards making Karimnagar a tobacco-free district.

Speaking at a meeting of the District Level Coordination Committee (DLCC) held at the Collectorate conference hall, Dr. Tanaji said tobacco consumption continued to pose a serious public health challenge, contributing to diseases such as cancer, cardiovascular ailments and stroke. He called upon all departments to work in tandem to curb tobacco use and strengthen enforcement of the law.

During the meeting, officials were briefed on key provisions of the COTPA Act. These included the prohibition of smoking in public places such as bus stands, railway stations, offices, hospitals, educational institutions and hotels under Section 4, with violators liable for penalties.



The meeting also highlighted restrictions on direct and indirect advertisements of tobacco products under Section 5 and the ban on the sale of tobacco products to minors under Section 6(a).

Officials were informed that the sale of cigarettes, gutka and other tobacco products within 100 yards of educational institutions is prohibited under Section 6(b), and action can be taken against establishments violating the norms.

The mandatory requirement of pictorial health warnings covering 85% of tobacco product packaging under Section 7 was also explained.

Dr. Tanaji said the Revenue, Police, Municipal and Education Departments should work in close coordination to ensure strict enforcement of the law. He suggested conducting regular joint task force drives and directed health workers, including ANMs and ASHAs, to intensify awareness campaigns in villages on the harmful effects of tobacco consumption.

NCD Programme Officer Dr. Viplava Sri, NCD Coordinator Pochayya, district-level officers from various departments and officials of the Medical and Health Department participated in the meeting.

BRS AND CONG DECEIVED PEOPLE OF TELANGANA

Hyderabad, June 4 : BJP State President N Ramchander Rao today said Telangana movement did not belong to any single political party. It was a collective, unified struggle fought by Joint Action Committees (JACs), students, lawyers, employees, and the general public.

He was speaking at the "Meet the Press" programme organized by Press Club of Hyderabad here. Press Club President S Vijay Kumar Reddy, Secretary Ramesh Varikuppala and senior journalist Uma Sudhir were on the dais.

Rao emphasized that attributing the credit for achieving Telangana state to a single political party was nothing but a blatant distortion of history. The BJP supported the formation of Telangana based on its core principle that smaller states pave the way for better and more efficient governance.

He said Telangana state was the ultimate result of the martyrdom of over 1,200 students and youth. Their immense sacrifices can never be forgotten, he said and expressed concern that even after the formation of the state, Telangana freedom fighters and movement activists have still not received their due recognition or complete respect.

Accusing ruling Congress party and BRS of failing to fulfill desires of the people after separate Telangana state, BJP state chief alleged that a decade after statehood, the expectations of the people regarding Water, Funds, and Employment remain unfulfilled. Both the BRS and Congress governments must introspect on how much they have actually delivered. The movement's goals will only be realized when the youth receive proper jobs and opportunities.

The aspirations of Telangana's youth, who fought tirelessly for jobs remain completely unfulfilled, he alleged. Raising the slogan of Water (Neellu), Funds (Nidhulu), and Employment (Niyamakaalu) of BRS, he said the previous BRS government completely failed in managing job recruitment and the current Congress government was walking down the exact same path. Both governments have severely disappointed the youth by failing to implement a proper Job Calendar, he alleged.

Raking up the escalating financial mismanagement and state's debt, BJP chief said the general public was raising serious doubts and questioning the state's financial management.

He said it was unfortunate that the state government itself has to express anxiety over Telangana's current financial situation as Revanth Reddy's cabinet had to pass a special resolution just to ensure employees' salaries are paid on the 1st of every month. This itself was proof of a deep economic crisis. It highlights a terrible reality where, until now, salaries were not even being paid on time.

The Congress government owes about Rs 20,000 crores in pending dues to contractors, which speaks volumes about the state's financial health. In addition, student fee reimbursement arrears have accumulated to a staggering Rs 10,000 crores, causing widespread anxiety, he pointed out.

On the issue of water sharing with neighbouring states Rao alleged that both previous BRS and the current Congress governments have done an injustice to the state regarding Water, Funds, and Employment. Telangana has faced severe injustice regarding its share of Krishna River waters. Successive state governments have failed to efficiently protect the state's legal rights and adopted a compromising attitude. The state handled the utilization of Godavari waters without any clear or cohesive policy. Mega irrigation projects built at a cost of over Rs 1 lakh crore have failed to deliver the expected benefits to farmers.

He alleged that over the last 12 years, state governments lacked a transparent policy on water resource management. The absence of long-term planning for drinking and irrigation water requirements has severely harmed Telangana. He said both previous BRS and present Congress governments have failed to stop Telangana's rightful share of Krishna water from being diverted to other states. It was highly unfortunate that Telangana's water rights were bartered away for petty political gains.

Detailing the central government's support for the development of Telangana, state BJP chief said the NDA government has extended financial assistance and development support worth about Rs 13 lakh crores to Telangana during last 12 years.

He further stated that the Union Cabinet has recently approved Rs 7,597 crores for the expansion of two major National Highways. This involves constructing 190 kilometers of 4-lane national highways, drastically strengthening Telangana's connectivity. The Center was actively working to provide superior road connectivity to Armoor, Jagtial, Mancherial, and Karimnagar, with an ultimate goal to connect all 32 districts of Telangana via National Highways.

Taking Back Assigned Lands Given to Dalits is Unjust

Former Minister Motkupalli Narasimhulu Expresses Concern Submits Memorandum to National SC Commission Director

“Indian Chronicle / Secunderabad, June 4: “Former Minister and Founder President of Madiga Mahashakti, Motkupalli Narasimhulu, expressed deep concern over what he described as the forcible acquisition of assigned lands belonging to Dalits by the government, alleging that it has caused grave injustice to marginalized communities. On Thursday, he submitted a memorandum to the



Director of the National Commission for Scheduled Castes at the CGO Towers in Kavadiyuda. “Speaking on the occasion, Narasimhulu said that the lands originally assigned to Dalits were often barren, rocky, and unsuitable for cultivation. He noted that the beneficiaries had worked tirelessly over the years to make the lands cultivable and

productive. “However, he alleged that with land values increasing significantly, the government was now taking back these lands to benefit influential contractors and large landowners. He criticized the move as unfair and detrimental to the livelihood of Dalit families. “Referring to a recent visit to Bandaravirala village, Narasimhulu stated that 135 acres of land belonging to 72 Dalit families had been acquired by the government. Although a Government Order (GO) had reportedly sanctioned ₹10 crore as compensation, he claimed that not a single rupee had been paid to the affected families so far. “He asserted that if land is required for development projects, the government should purchase private lands rather than acquire assigned lands that serve as the primary source of livelihood for Dalits. He urged the National Commission for Scheduled Castes to conduct a thorough inquiry into the matter and ensure justice for the affected families. “Narasimhulu further appealed to the Commission to take necessary measures to safeguard the land rights of Dalits and prevent similar incidents in the future.

Sudanese National Suspected of Ebola Infection

“Undergoing Treatment in Isolation Ward at Gandhi Hospital” “Indian Chronicle / Secunderabad, June 4: “The Health Department has been put on alert after a foreign national who arrived at Hyderabad’s Rajiv Gandhi International Airport from Sudan exhibited symptoms consistent with the Ebola virus. “The individual, identified as Mohammed, a Sudanese citizen, was shifted to Gandhi Hospital and admitted to a special isolation ward, where he is currently receiving treatment under close medical supervision. “Doctors collected blood samples from the patient and



sent them for testing to the Centre for Cellular and Molecular Biology laboratory located in Habsiguda, Hyderabad. Based on the preliminary test results, the samples may be forwarded to a national-level virology laboratory in Pune for further confirmation, if required. “Hospital authorities stated that all necessary precaution-

ary measures have been initiated, treating the case as a suspected Ebola infection. The patient’s condition is being continuously monitored by medical experts. “Officials clarified that confirmation regarding whether the patient is infected with the Ebola virus will be possible only after laboratory test results are received. Meanwhile, Health Department officials are closely monitoring the situation and have undertaken all necessary preventive and containment measures.

B.Tech Student Killed After Being Hit by RTC Bus
