Security measures should be taken on National Highway-65 before the monsoon season:: District Collector Prateek Jain

“District Collector Prateek Jain and District SP Paritosh Pankaj inspected the road construction work between Sangareddy-Patancheru. “District Collector Prateek Jain and District SP Paritosh Pankaj inspected the progress of the ongoing road expansion and construction work on National Highway-65 from Sangareddy to Patancheru on Friday at the field level along with the officials of the relevant departments. They made a comprehensive inspection of the road construction work, water logging points, drainage system, relocation of electricity poles, shifting of water pipelines, sanitation management and other issues and made several suggestions to the officials. “Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector directed the officials to take precautionary measures so that the people do not face any problems during the monsoon season in view of the ongoing road construction work. He advised them to work with a plan in advance, keeping in mind the problems faced last year. “In addition to making temporary security arrangements at black spots where there is a possibility of accidents, slabs should be installed and



closed on the drainages on the roadside. He advised the National Highways authorities to immediately shift water pipelines where necessary and take measures to prevent water from accumulating anywhere. “The Collector ordered the electricity department officials to immediately move the electricity poles that are across the road expansion works and said that the shifting work of utilities should be expedited. He also instructed the revenue officials to pay compensation to the owners of residential buildings affected by the road expansion and complete the removal process as soon as possible. “The Collector ordered that special attention should be paid to sanitation management in the areas surrounding the National Highway and that municipal officials should undertake continuous monitoring to ensure that garbage does not accumulate anywhere on either side of the road. Pay Attention to Uppal Traffic Woes: BRS Leader Nerdham Bhaskar Goud

““UPPAL, JUNE 5 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): Senior BRS leader and former State Secretary Nerdham Bhaskar Goud has urged authorities to take immediate measures to address the worsening traffic congestion in the Uppal constituency. “On Friday, he submitted a memorandum to Traffic Circle Inspector Nagaraju regarding the hardships being faced by commuters following the closure of the National Highway stretch at Uppal Ring Road. “Speaking on the occasion, Bhaskar Goud expressed concern that the Warangal Flyover project, which commenced in 2018, remains incomplete even after several years, causing severe inconvenience to residents. Ebola Scare in the City Suspected Cases Rise to Three in Two Days

““Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 05: “Suspected Ebola virus cases have created concern in the city. In addition to a foreign national already undergoing treatment at Gandhi Hospital, two more suspected patients were shifted from Apollo Hospitals to Gandhi Hospital. All three patients are currently receiving treatment under the supervision of doctors in a special isolation ward established on the seventh floor of the hospital’s main building. “According to preliminary investigations by officials, all three individuals reportedly arrived in Hyderabad on the same international flight. Blood samples have been collected and sent to a laboratory for testing, and the results are awaited. Doctors stated that confirmation of the virus may take approximately 48 hours,



and until then, the cases will continue to be treated as suspected Ebola cases. “Authorities also revealed that they are closely monitoring the health condition of other passengers who traveled on the same flight. Doctors at Gandhi Hospital emphasized that all necessary precautionary measures have been put in place to prevent any possible spread of the virus and urged the public not to panic unnecessarily. “Medical officials reiterated that the cases will remain classified as suspected Ebola cases until laboratory test results are received. The hospital has been designated as a nodal center for handling suspected Ebola cases, and a dedicated isolation ward has been set up on the seventh floor of the main building for treatment purposes, according to Dr. Sunil Kumar. “Dr. Sunil Kumar stated that the medical staff is fully prepared to handle any situation and reassured the public that there is no need for fear or panic. Authorities are currently awaiting the laboratory test results to determine the final diagnosis.

*Minimum Wage Hike a Sham, Say Labour Leaders

“Wanaparthi correspondent June 5, (India Chronicle):“Telangana State Minimum Wages Board member M.D. Yousuf alleged that the minimum wage hike announced by the Chief Minister Revanth Reddy-led government is merely an eyewash and fails to address the real needs of workers. “He was speaking as the chief guest at a district-level seminar on *‘Minimum Wages and the Living Conditions of Workers’”, organized by the Telangana Medical Contract Workers Union (AITUC) at the Government General Hospital in Wanaparthi on Friday. The seminar was presided over by P. Suresh, State Secretary of the Telangana Medical Contract Workers Union. “Addressing the gathering, M.D. Yousuf stated that the Telangana State Minimum Wages Board had conducted extensive studies and unanimously recommended increasing the minimum wage for lower-category work-



ers from ₹20,250 up to ₹28,000 across three categories. However, he criticized the government for ignoring these recommendations and implementing what he termed an unscientific wage revision that does not ensure economic, social, or health security for workers. He demanded that the government make public the recommendations submitted by the Board and amend GO No. 6 to raise the minimum wage to ₹26,000. “Speaking on the occasion, M.

Narasimha, State General Secretary of the Telangana Medical Contract Employees and Workers Union (AITUC), said that the economic policies being pursued by the Central and State Governments are adversely affecting workers' welfare. He pointed out that hospital sanitation workers, security personnel, patient care workers, and supervisors have not received the wage revisions due under tender guidelines for over four years. “He demanded the regularization of contract workers who render invaluable services, including maintaining hospital hygiene and caring for patients. Narasimha urged the government to immediately increase hospital workers' minimum wages to ₹26,000, warning that workers would be left with no option but to launch a strike if their demands were ignored. He also criticized the reduction of bed capacity at Vipanagandla Hospital and called upon workers to unite and intensify their struggle for wage enhancement and labour rights. “Among those present were State Secretary P. Civil society groups seek TPCC intervention on SIR exercise

Delegation led by Mohammad Abdul Mujeeb urges six-month extension, cites public difficulties in compliance.

KARIMNAGAR June 5 (Correspondent): A delegation led by Mohammad Abdul Mujeeb met Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) president Mahesh Kumar Goud in Karimnagar on Friday and submitted a representation highlighting concerns over the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise.

Representing ASEEM and ADALAH (Access to Justice Network), the delegation drew attention to difficulties being faced by citizens in furnishing the required documents and information as part of the exercise. They said the process had created confusion and anxiety among several sections of the public, particularly those who were not adequately prepared with the necessary records.



The delegation urged the TPCC chief to take up the matter with the Election Commission of India (ECI) and seek immediate measures to address the concerns raised by affected citizens.

It also requested Mr. Goud to write to the ECI

seeking a six-month extension of the SIR exercise, contending that there was no immediate urgency to complete the process and that additional time would enable people to comply with the documentation requirements without undue hardship.

Mr. Goud assured the delegation that he would examine the issues seriously and take up the matter with the Election Commission.
