Gandhi Hospital Successfully Performs Rare Laparoscopic Adrenal Tumor Surgery

Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 6: Gandhi Hospital and Medical College successfully performed a highly complex laparoscopic (keyhole) adrenal gland surgery, giving a new lease of life to 27-year-old S. Lavanya from Chityal village of Makthal Mandal, Mahabubnagar district. The patient had been suffering from severe hypertension for the past two



years, which remained uncontrolled despite taking three different blood pressure medications. Following extensive medical investigations, doctors diagnosed her with Pheochromocytoma, a rare adrenal gland tumor that releases excessive stress hormones into the body, causing sudden and unpredictable spikes in blood pressure. The condition is extremely rare, affecting only about 2 to 8 people per million annually. Gandhi Hospital is among the few government medical institutions in the country capable of performing such complex surgeries and has successfully treated 10 similar cases over the past five years. These procedures are considered highly challenging and risky, as blood pressure can rise to life-threatening levels within seconds dur-

ing surgery, potentially causing severe damage to the heart and other vital organs. Successful management requires meticulous pre-operative blood pressure control for weeks, constant vigilance by anesthesiology specialists during surgery, and intensive post-operative monitoring. The successful surgery was made possible through the coordinated efforts of Dr. Ravichander and the Urology team, Dr. Vijay Shekhar and the Endocrinology team, Dr. Muralidhar and the Anesthesiology team, and Dr. Srihari and the Radiology team. The hospital also acknowledged the dedicated contribution of the Operation Theatre staff, Resident Medical Officers (RMOs), and the administrative leadership headed by Superintendent Dr. Vani and Deputy Superintendent Dr. Sunil Kumar. Hospital authorities stated that this achievement reflects the Telangana Government's commitment to providing world-class multidisciplinary healthcare services to economically disadvantaged patients through the public healthcare system.

Police Advise Farmers to Exercise Caution While Purchasing Seeds and Pesticides Geesugonda, June 6 (Indian Chronicle): In view of the commencement of the Kharif season, Geesugonda Circle Inspector D. Vishweshwar has urged farmers to exercise utmost caution while purchasing seeds, fertilizers, and pesticides. He warned that counterfeit seeds, substandard pesticides, and unauthorized vendors could cause significant financial losses to farmers. In a statement issued on Saturday, the CI advised farmers to purchase agricultural inputs only from licensed dealers and authorized outlets. He stressed the importance of obtaining and preserving bills and receipts for every purchase. Farmers were also urged to verify manufacturing dates, expiry dates, batch numbers, and quality certifications before buying any product. Clear Pending Bills for Surgical and Diagnostic Supplies: TCHSA

Twin Cities Hospitals Suppliers Association Writes to State Government

“Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 06:”The Twin Cities Hospitals Suppliers Association (TCHSA), which supplies surgical and diagnostic materials to government hospitals across the state, has urged the State Health Minister to immediately release pending dues amounting to several crores of rupees. In a letter addressed to the minister, association representatives detailed their demands and highlighted the financial difficulties faced by suppliers. “The association stated that although the government had decided to increase the monthly allocation for the purchase of surgical supplies and drugs by an additional ₹50 crore, taking the total allocation to ₹100 crore, the Telangana Medical Services and Infrastructure Development Corporation (TGMSIDC) released only ₹50 crore in May, exclusively for medicines and oxygen supplies. “According to the association, payments for surgical and diagnostic bills from government hospitals have remained pending since 2022, while dues from TGMSIDC have been accumulating since 2024. They pointed out that for the financial years 2024–25 and 2025–26, funds equivalent to only three

quarters were released instead of the budget allocations meant for eight quarters. “The association revealed that pending dues currently include ₹128 crore from TGMSIDC, ₹7 crore from Gandhi Hospital, ₹7 crore from Niloufer Hospital, and ₹4.5 crore from Osmania General Hospital, among other outstanding payments from government healthcare institutions. In addition, payments under the Aarogyasri scheme remain pending, including ₹18 crore from Osmania Hospital, ₹9 crore from Gandhi Hospital, and ₹5 crore from Niloufer Hospital. “The suppliers further alleged that despite providing transplantation-related surgical disposables to Gandhi Hospital and Osmania Hospital, which performed India’s first intestinal transplant surgeries, no payments have been made for the past one and a half years. They also noted that while Letters of Credit (LOCs) are being issued to hospitals under the Chief Minister’s Relief Fund, their bills continue to remain unpaid. “Expressing concern, the association said that continuing the supply of surgical and diagnos-



tic products has become increasingly difficult due to the mounting arrears. As a result, poor patients are being forced to purchase essential medical items from private medical stores at higher prices. They warned that if the situation persists, even basic healthcare services in government hospitals could face disruptions. “The association appealed to

the Health Minister to intervene immediately and take steps to clear the pending dues. Copies of the letter were also sent to the Chief Minister, senior officials of the Finance and Health Departments, the Director of Medical Education (DME), the CEO of Aarogyasri, and superintendents of government hospitals, according to Association President Ramachandram.

Coveting Patta Land... A Dalit Woman's Fight for Justice

Have land grabbers set their sights on a Dalit woman's property
Woman appeals to officials, citing a threat to her and her family's lives

“(Narsampet/Warangal, June 6 (Indian Chronicle): A Dalit woman from Narsampet has alleged that certain influential individuals are attempting to encroach upon land legally allotted to her by the government. Expressing her anguish before the media on Saturday, she urged officials to ensure justice and provide protection.“According to Arepalli Padma, a resident of the 10th Ward in Narsampet town, the government granted her a permanent patta (land title) for 29 guntas of land (Survey No. 702/21) in 1992. She built a house there and has been living on the site with her family for the past 33 years.“Padma alleged that for some time now, certain individuals have been trying to encroach upon the vacant portion of her land. She stated that a man named Maisi Shobhan Babu has repeatedly trespassed onto her property and attempted to seize it, forcing her to lodge multiple complaints with the police.“She further alleged that while her family was leveling the land and undertaking construction work, some individuals arrived and attempted to intimidate and attack them. During the police inquiry, Shobhan Babu reportedly claimed ownership of the land based on certain documents. However, Padma clarified that the documents produced by them did not pertain to her property. She stated that false documents were created citing survey number 700/2 instead of the correct survey number 702/2 for her land, resulting in constant harassment. Focus on drainage, sanitation and housing needs as part of 99-day action plan.

KARIMNAGAR June 6 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar Municipal Corporation (KMC) on Saturday organised a Special Ward Sabha covering several divisions of the city as part of the State government's Praja Palana-Pragathi Pranalika programme, with civic infrastructure, sanitation and welfare schemes emerging as key areas of discussion.

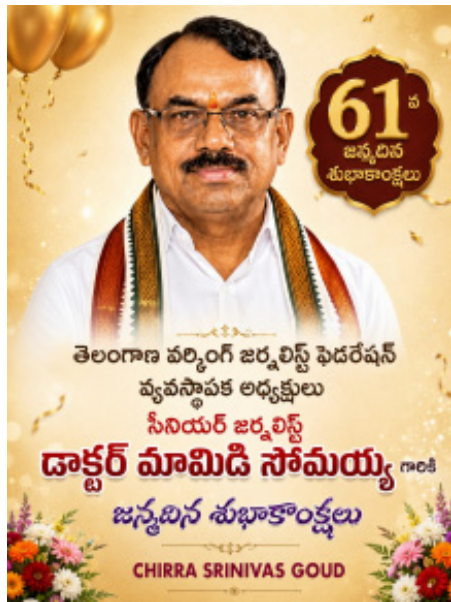
