

## Give houses to Greater Journalists.. Irrespective of accreditation GHJ Society General Assembly Appeal to Chief Minister



“(Hyderabad Bureau.. Indian Chronicle June 03):- The General Assembly of the Greater Hyderabad Journalists Mutually Aided Co-operative Housing Society has appealed to the government to immediately provide houses to journalists in all categories as per the Working Journalists Act, irrespective of the Supreme Court verdict. The meeting demanded that all journalists in Greater Hyderabad be allotted houses immediately. Several senior journalists said that it is regrettable that the Congress government has not provided houses to journalists even after two and a half years of coming to power in the state. The Society’s General Assembly meeting was held under the chairmanship of Society President Mamidi Somaiya at the main venue of Sri Thyagaraya Gana Sabha in Chikkadapalli, Hyderabad on Wednesday. In this meeting, various resolutions were passed on the issues of journalists’ housing plots, Supreme Court verdict, government stance, etc. The meeting resolved to request Chief Minister Revanth Reddy to allocate land for the Greater Journalists Housing Society or house plots for member journalists. “The meeting requested that every eligible journalist be given a house plot regardless of accreditation card and that there should be no discrimination among journalists. The meeting resolved to allocate 200 sq. ft. of land in Future City to all categories of journalists working within Greater Hyderabad.” Society President Mamidi Somaiya said that 1350 Greater journalists who have taken membership in the society have been waiting for house plots for 18 years, and that the previous government had done immense injustice to journalists, and that at least this government should provide them with house plots. He expressed concern that about 1350 journalists in the Greater Society have been waiting for house plots for many years and many journalists have

already died without getting a plot. He said that despite several requests to Chief Minister Revanth Reddy and several ministers to provide house plots, no action has been taken to allocate the plots. He said that the government has refused to provide house plots to journalists using the Supreme Court verdict as an excuse, and that there was no decision on the houses of journalists in the state cabinet meeting held the other day, and that the Chief Minister’s speech at the Telangana state formation celebrations held yesterday did not mention the welfare of journalists and houses. He urged the Chief Minister to set aside the Supreme Court verdict and provide plots to journalist societies through alternative means. “Kodandaram announces support” MLC Professor Kodandaram, who was supposed to attend the general meeting of the society, could not attend due to unavoidable reasons. With this, he conveyed his message to the meeting over the phone. He assured that he would support the Greater Journalists Housing Society and would talk to the Chief Minister and try to provide houses to the journalists. Similarly, Rajya Sabha member M. Anil Kumar Yadav, who was supposed to come to the meeting, could not come due to urgent work. He also expressed his support for the society meeting. Earlier, society secretary Bollam Srinivas presented the report. Congress party state leader Naishidam Satyanarayana Murthy, Telangana Jana Samithi Greater BC Cell President Jaswanth, senior journalists Teegavarapu Shanti, Nagavani, society treasurer Tanniru Srinivas, directors Yerramilli Rama Rao. Rama Devi and others participated in this meeting.

At the scene, Minister Vakiti Srihari, Minister Jupally Krishna Rao, and the Collector called up and demanded that action be taken to ensure justice for the farmer. Beerla Ayilaiah, who expressed deep shock at the sight of hundreds of sheep lying dead at the accident site, later went to Devarakonda Government Hospital and visited the injured family members. He advised the medical officers to provide them with better medical services. He also visited the farmer’s body in the morgue and expressed his deepest condolences to the family members. He consoled the family members to be brave in this difficult time. On this occasion, the Telangana State Kuruma Sangam provided financial assistance of one lakh rupees to the victim’s family. He assured the victim family that the Telangana State Government and Kuruma Sangam would support them in every way. He said that they would support the children’s education. Beerla Ayilaiah said that this incident is very painful and that the government will work hard to provide necessary assistance to ensure justice for the farmer’s family.

## Boy Goes Missing After Parents Mention Sending Him to Hostel



“UPPAL, JUNE 3 (INDIAN CHRONICAL): A 19-year-old youth reportedly left his home and has been missing since May 26 after his parents told him they planned to send him to a hostel, according to Uppal police. “Sub-Inspector Vinay said that Munidhar, son of Manish Randi, a resident of New Ram Colony in Chilukanagar, left his house at around 10 a.m. on May 26 without informing anyone and did not return. Family members stated that Munidhar has had a speech impediment since childhood, and they had recently told him they intended to send him to a hostel where he could receive support to improve his speech. “When the youth failed to return home, his parents searched for him among relatives and nearby areas but were unable to trace his whereabouts. Subsequently, they lodged a complaint with

the Uppal Police Station. “Police have registered a missing person case and launched an investigation. Authorities have appealed to the public to share any information regarding Munidhar’s whereabouts with the Uppal police. The police urged anyone who recognizes the person in the photograph or has seen him to come forward and assist in locating him.

## Woman Succumbs to Snakebite While Undergoing Treatment

“““Geesugonda, June 3 (Indian Chronicle): A pall of gloom descended over Ukkal village in Geesugonda mandal after a woman who had been battling for her life following a snakebite succumbed during treatment at a hospital in Warangal. “The deceased was identified as Katta Sunitha (38), wife of Katta Devender and a resident of Ukkal village. According to police officials, the incident occurred on the morning of May 30 at around 5:30 a.m., when Sunitha was engaged in routine household work. “While stepping outside her residence to place a vessel containing cooked rice, she was reportedly bitten by a snake that had been concealed among a stack of bricks near the house. Realizing the seriousness of the situation, family members and relatives immediately shifted her to the Mahatma Gandhi Memorial (MGM) Hospital, Warangal, where she was admitted for intensive medical treatment. “Despite the best efforts of the attending doctors, her condition gradually deteriorated over the following days. She ultimately succumbed to the effects of the snakebite at approximately 1:25 a.m. on Wednesday, hospital sources confirmed. “Following a complaint lodged by her husband, Katta Devender, the Geesugonda Police registered a case and initiated an investigation into the incident. “Circle Inspector D. Visweshwar stated that further inquiries are being carried out in accordance with established procedures.

## Man Addicted to Bad Habits Arrested for Vehicle Thefts

### Mobile Phones, Two-Wheelers and Auto-Rickshaw Recovered

“Indian chronicle, Secunderabad, June 3 :“The Chilkaiguda Police arrested a man involved in a series of vehicle thefts to finance his addictions and recovered four two-wheelers, one auto-rickshaw, and several mobile phones from his possession. “According to Chilkaiguda Police Station Inspector Valishetty Ramakrishna, the accused, Maikala Naveen (26), a catering worker from New Ashok Nagar, Parsigutta, had developed bad habits and became addicted to alcohol and smoking. Investigation revealed that he resorted to vehicle thefts to earn money for his addictions. “Police stated that Naveen targeted areas with less public



movement and stole vehicles parked in front of houses and along roadsides. The proceeds from the sale of the stolen vehicles were allegedly used to support his lifestyle and addictions. “The case came to light after auto driver Bijoriye Kamal Prakash, a resident of Chilkaiguda, lodged a complaint on June 2 stating that his auto-rickshaw bearing registration number TS10 UA 8087, which had been parked in front of his residence, had gone missing. “Based on the complaint, Chilkaiguda Police registered a case and formed special teams to investigate. Using CCTV footage and technical evidence, the police identified and apprehended the accused. “During interrogation, the accused confessed to committing a total of five vehicle thefts in the Chilkaiguda and Warasiguda areas. Police recovered four two-wheelers, one auto-rickshaw, and mobile phones from his possession. “The case was solved under the supervision of Rakshitha K Murthy, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Secunderabad Zone; J Narsaiah, Additional DCP; and K Shashank Reddy, ACP of Chilkaiguda Division. “Chilkaiguda Inspector V. Ramakrishna, Detective Inspector L. Madhubabu, Sub-Inspector J. Rakesh, and members of the Chilkaiguda Crime Team played a key role in apprehending the accused and successfully solving the case. “Senior police officials appreciated the officers involved in cracking the case and announced that suitable rewards would be given in recognition of their efforts.

## Rs 79 Lakh Worth of Dry Ganja Seized; Suspended CISF Constable Arrested

“Indian Chronicles | Secunderabad | June 3, 2026” In a joint operation, the Hyderabad City Police Commissioner’s Task Force (Jubilee Hills Zone Team) and SR Nagar Police seized 158 kilograms of dry ganja worth approximately ₹79 lakh and arrested a person allegedly involved in interstate narcotics trafficking. “According to police, the accused, Panagoodu Sivakrishna (39), is currently residing in Thiruvananthapuram district of Kerala and is a native of Mothugudem village in Alluri Sitharama Raju District. He joined the Central Industrial Security Force as a constable in 2009 and later served on deputation with the National Disaster Response Force. However, he was suspended from service in 2025 following his involvement in an NDPS case. “Acting on credible information, Task Force officials conducted a raid near Nature Cure Hospital in SR Nagar on Tuesday night and apprehended the accused. Police seized 158 kg of dry ganja, a Chevrolet Sail car, and three smartphones from his possession. The total value of the seized property is estimated at around ₹79 lakh. “During the investigation, police found



that the accused allegedly procured ganja in bulk from cultivators in Odisha and supplied it to drug peddlers operating in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Maharashtra. Officials stated that financial difficulties and mounting debts had reportedly driven him into the illegal drug trade. “Investigators further revealed that the accused allegedly misused his position as a CISF constable while transporting narcotics. During vehicle inspections at checkpoints, he reportedly displayed his CISF identity card to avoid thorough checks and mislead law enforcement personnel. “Police also stated that Sivakrishna had previously been arrested and imprisoned in connection with an NDPS case registered in 2025 under the jurisdiction of Dummugudem Police Station in Bhadradi Kothagudem District. Despite being suspended from service following that case, he allegedly continued his involvement in ganja trafficking. “Speaking on the occasion, Gaikwad Vaibhav Raghunath, Deputy Commissioner of Police, Hyderabad City Commissioner’s Task Force, expressed concern over the growing menace of narcotic substances, stating that drug abuse severely impacts the future of youth and disrupts families. He warned that drug consumption can lead to serious health issues, job loss, and criminal records, and urged citizens to remain vigilant and immediately report any suspicious drug-related activities to the police. “The DCP commended Ch. Yadender, D. Raviraj, their teams, and the SR Nagar Police personnel for successfully executing the operation.

## 120 vehicles seized for number plate violations Traffic police warn motorists against flouting registration norms.

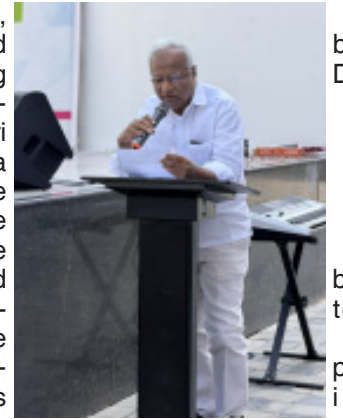
KARIMNAGAR June 3 (Correspondent): Traffic police in Karimnagar seized 120 vehicles during a special enforcement drive against motorists operating vehicles without proper registration number plates. The inspections were conducted on the directions of Police Commissioner Gaush Alam. Traffic police personnel, led by Inspectors Sanjeev and Anjaiah, carried out checks at various locations in the town, focusing primarily on two-wheelers being driven without number plates or with improperly displayed registration numbers. According to Traffic ACP Yadagirismwamy, the vehicles were temporarily seized and penalties were imposed under the provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act. The vehicle owners were later counselled at the police station on the importance of complying with traffic regulations. Mr. Yadagirismwamy said that riding vehicles without number plates not only violates traffic rules but also



hampers law enforcement efforts in identifying vehicles involved in offences and accidents. He warned that stringent action would be taken against repeat offenders. The ACP said that special drives would continue across the town as part of efforts to improve road safety and ensure strict adherence to traffic norms.

## 96% of paddy procurement completed in Karimnagar district

236 procurement centres closed; remaining operations likely to conclude by June 6.

KARIMNAGAR June 3 (Correspondent): The Yasangi paddy procurement drive in Karimnagar district is nearing completion, with 96% of the total arrivals already procured and payments worth ₹628 crore disbursed to farmers, according to District Collector Ms. Chitra Mishra.



In a statement issued on Wednesday, the Collector said farmers had brought 3,32,098 metric tonnes of paddy for sale at 317 procurement centres established across the district. Of this, 3,18,959 metric tonnes had been procured by government agencies.

With procurement completed in several areas, authorities have closed 236 procurement centres. Efforts are under way to complete procurement at the remaining 81 centres by June 6, and the entire exercise is expected to conclude within the next three days.

The Collector said all procurement centres in Huzurabad, Jammikunta, Veenavanka and Illantakunta mandals of Huzurabad constituency, and in Manakondur and Shankarapatnam mandals of Manakondur constituency, had been closed following completion of procurement operations. In Choppadandi constituency, procurement activities in all mandals are likely to be completed within three days.

Of the total quantity procured, 3,16,926 metric tonnes have already been transported to rice mills, accounting for 95% of the transportation process. Only 13,139 metric tonnes remain to be procured, and officials have been instructed to complete the process within the stipulated timeframe.

The district administration has also intensified monitoring of transportation and payment processes to ensure that the remaining procurement operations are completed smoothly, the Collector added.

He instructed them to create awareness among farmers in a simple and understandable manner regarding the availability of irrigation water.”Officials from the Agriculture, Horticulture, Irrigation, and other concerned departments attended the meeting.

## Cancel the Urea App, Reduce Complex Fertilizer Prices, Deposit Rythu Bharosa Funds in Full: Farmers' Association

He said farmers are facing numerous difficulties in obtaining urea through the app. “The Khammam District Executive Committee meeting of the Telangana State Farmers' Association was held on Wednesday at Giriprasad Bhavan under the chairmanship of Midikanti Venkata Reddy. Addressing the meeting, Hemanth Rao said that adequate stocks of chemical fertilizers should be made available based on the estimates of agriculture officials, keeping the upcoming Kharif season in view. “He stated that farmers faced severe difficulties last year and that the government must ensure that such a situation does not recur this year. As the Central Government has reduced fertilizer allocations, he suggested that the state government make alternative arrangements. “Hemanth Rao said that unless the prices of complex fertilizers are reduced, farmers will face an increased financial burden, as cultivation costs have already risen significantly. He accused the government of adopting a delaying approach regarding the Rythu Bharosa scheme and demanded the immediate



release of pending Rythu Bharosa funds for farmers owning more than two acres for the Yasangi season. He also called for the prompt disbursement of assistance for the upcoming monsoon season. “He alleged that the government had failed in the procurement of agricultural produce this year, particularly maize and paddy. With the Mulakshira Karthe period approaching, he demanded that the maize and paddy lying at procurement centers be weighed and transported immediately and that payments be deposited into farmers' bank accounts without delay. “He further stated that the government had failed to fulfill its promises regarding the farm loan waiver scheme. In view of recurring natural calamities, he demanded the implementation of a crop insurance scheme from the current season itself and called for strict measures to prevent the sale of counterfeit seeds and pesticides. “Hemanth Rao announced that the Farmers' Association would organize a district collectorate siege protest on the 8th of this month to demand solutions to farmers' issues.
