Sweepers Facing Labor Exploitation, Says AITUC Leader

“““Khammam June 06 (Indian chronicle): ““Sweepers working in government schools are being subjected to labor exploitation, alleged AITUC State Secretary Shingu Narsimha Rao. He stated that more than 50,000 sweepers are employed in various schools across the state, but they have neither official recognition nor access to minimum wages.”“Speaking at a district-level meeting of sweepers held on Sunday at Giri Prasad Bhavan, under the chairmanship of S.K. Ghose, Narsimha Rao said that even after the formation of the Congress government, there has been no effort to recognize sweepers. He noted that during the previous government's tenure, sweepers working in government schools were identified as service personnel, but their labor still did not receive proper recognition.”“He alleged that sweepers are being paid very low wages while being made to perform excessive work. According to him, salaries are being disbursed through joint accounts opened in the name of “Amma Adarsha Committees,” and deductions are being made from their already meager wages for items such as brooms and other cleaning materials.”“Narsimha Rao demanded that sweepers be paid a minimum monthly wage of ₹26,000 and that the wages be deposited directly into their personal bank accounts. He warned that if the government fails to respond positively to the issues faced by sweepers, the union will launch protests.”“The meeting was attended by labor women's district in-charge C.H. Seetha Mahalakshmi and sweepers' union leaders L. Meera, Pulla Rao, Deva, Annapurna, Sirisha, and Rani, among others.

Infrastructure Expansion to Meet Rising Power Demand: Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka



“Khammam, June 07 (Indian chronicle):” Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka stated that the Telangana government is continuously expanding power infrastructure to meet growing electricity demand and drive the state's development. He emphasized that despite a significant rise in power consumption, there are no power cuts anywhere in the state. “The Deputy Chief Minister, along with Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao and District Collector Divakar T.S., inaugurated a newly constructed 33/11 KV power substation built by Northern Power Distribution Company of Telangana (TGNPDCL) at Pakabanda in Khammam on Sunday. “After inspecting the control room and modern equipment at the substation, Bhatti Vikramarka said the facility has been built with advanced technology and can be operated directly from the control room. He noted that although power demand in Khammam district has increased substantially, quality electricity is being supplied without interruptions to agriculture, industries, households, and other sectors. “He said Telangana's peak power demand has increased from 15,000 MW in 2023 to 18,548 MW at present. With projects such as the Musi River Rejuvenation Project, Future City, industrial expansion, Pharma City, data centers, and agricultural growth, electricity requirements are expected to rise further in the coming years. “To meet future needs, the government is focusing on renewable energy and aims to generate 20,000 MW of green energy by 2030. He announced plans to develop 85 villages across the state as fully solar-powered villages and said solar-based electricity usage is already being promoted in Bonakal Mandal. “The Deputy Chief Minister also revealed that under the Indira Gari Jal Vikas Scheme, the government is preparing plans to install solar-powered pump sets covering nearly six lakh acres of tribal farmland. “He reiterated the government's vision of transforming Telangana into a three-trillion-dollar economy by 2047 and said strengthening the power sector is a key component of that goal. Despite an

increase of nearly 3,500 MW in power demand over the past two and a half years, the state has managed to avoid imposing power cuts, he added. “Bhatti Vikramarka said Telangana continues to provide uninterrupted electricity even as several regions across the country face power shortages. Considering the rapid growth of Khammam city, the government is ready to establish additional substations wherever required and will promptly approve proposals based on local needs. “He assured that quality free power supply to farmers would continue. The state government is currently providing subsidies of around ₹1,150 crore every month for nearly 30 lakh agricultural pump sets. To improve services further, the government is taking steps toward establishing a dedicated power distribution company for farmers. “The Deputy Chief Minister urged farmers not to believe misinformation regarding free electricity. He also instructed officials to focus on the maintenance of power lines and poles in villages and to promptly repair loose wires to prevent accidents. “Highlighting employee welfare, he said the state government has introduced special measures for electricity department workers, including an accident insurance cover of ₹1 crore, a benefit he described as unique in the country. “Speaking on the occasion, Agriculture Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao directed officials to strengthen substations, transmission lines, and distribution systems in line with Khammam's rapid urban expansion. He also called for faster relocation of electricity poles that are obstructing development projects. “District Collector Divakar T.S. stated that electricity infrastructure is being planned with the next 30 years of demand in mind and announced that land allocation for five additional substations in Khammam city would be completed within a week. “Several officials, public representatives, and dignitaries attended the inauguration ceremony.

No Negligence in Voter List Revision Process: Tahsildar Ram Prasad

Ram Prasad has instructed officials that there should be no negligence in the implementation of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls and emphasized that every eligible voter must be included in the voter list. Addressing an awareness meeting for Booth Level Officers (BLOs) at the mandal headquarters on Sunday, the Tahsildar explained the objectives and procedures of the SIR programme. Later, he conducted a field inspection of the ongoing revision process at Rajeswarapuram village. Child labour complaint leads to inspection at A-One Chicken Centre in Karimnagar

Two Town Inspector Srujan Reddy joins child welfare officials in inspection; employer warned against engaging minors.

KARIMNAGAR June 7 (Correspondent): A joint team of child welfare and police officials inspected A-One Chicken Centre in Karimnagar town following a complaint received through Child Helpline 1098 alleging the employment of a minor.

According to officials, the information was brought to the notice of the authorities by Child Helpline 1098 Coordinator Sampath. Acting on the complaint, a team led by Two Town Inspector of Police Srujan Reddy, along with District Child Protection Officer Parveen, Child Helpline Case Worker Sundaragiri Sai Kiran Goud, police personnel and members of the task force, visited the establishment under the directions of the District Welfare Officer.



During the inspection, the officials counselled the owner and informed him that employing children is a punishable offence under the law. They directed him to ensure that the child was enrolled in school and issued a warning against engaging minors in work.

Inspector Srujan Reddy cautioned the management against employing minors and said legal action would be initiated in cases of repeated violations. The officials also appealed to the public to report instances of child labour and violations of children's rights through Child Helpline 1098 to facilitate timely intervention and action.

KARIMNAGAR June 7 (Correspondent): Karimnagar Municipal Corporation Commissioner Praful Desai has been selected to participate in a prestigious capacity-building programme on governance and field administration at the Lal Bahadur Shastri National Academy of Administration (LBSNAA), Mussoorie, in Uttarakhand.

The week-long programme, titled “Good Governance for Field Administration”, will be conducted from June 8 to June 13. 12 kg of Ganja Seized in Warangal Two Women Arrested

“Warangal, June 7 (Indian Chronicle): As part of special measures to curb drug abuse within the Warangal Police Commissionerate limits, Matwada police seized a large quantity of ganja (cannabis). Two women were arrested in connection with the incident.” “According to the police, on Sunday, personnel from the Matwada police station were conducting routine patrols when they spotted two women moving suspiciously with two suitcases near the 'Edu Morilu' (Seven Cul-



verts) junction on Hunter Road, Warangal. When the police approached, the women attempted to flee but were chased down, apprehended, and questioned.” “During questioning, they identified themselves as Triveni Ramanath Ghodke (26) and Anjali Ram Sathe (25). Both are natives of Pune city in Maharashtra.” “Subsequently, official witnesses (panchas) and the 'Clues Team' were summoned to the scene. A search conducted legally in the presence of the witnesses revealed 12 kg of dried ganja, stored in six packets across the two suitcases.” “Each packet was examined individually and weighed on a digital scale; with each packet weighing approximately two kilograms, the

total quantity of ganja was confirmed to be 12 kg. The police seized the contraband, registered a case against the accused under relevant laws, and initiated an investigation. The police stated that the Warangal Police Commissionerate is focusing specifically on the trafficking and sale of narcotics and is taking strict action against those involved in such illegal activities.

Door-to-Door Verification by BLOs Made Mandatory

District Collector Divakar T.S. Conducts Surprise Inspection of SIR Process in Kotapadu Village and Khammam City



“Khammam, June 07 Indian Chronicle:” “District Collector Divakar T.S. has directed Booth Level Officers (BLOs) to carry out mandatory door-to-door verification to rectify anomalies identified during the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) mapping of electoral rolls. “On Sunday, the Collector toured Khammam Assembly constituency and conducted a surprise inspection of the SIR mapping process in Kotapadu village of Raghunathapalem mandal. Later, accompanied by Additional Collector P. Srinivasa Reddy and Municipal Corporation Commissioner Abhishek Agastya, he visited Pandurangapuram in Khammam city, interacting directly with residents and gathering feedback on voter-related issues. “The Collector instructed officials to ensure meticulous field-level verification of voter details under the Special Summary Revision programme and to accelerate the mapping process while maintaining accuracy. “Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. emphasized that the Special Summary Revision of electoral rolls must be conducted transparently and without errors. He directed officials to continuously monitor the performance of BLOs engaged in the SIR mapping process and ensure timely completion of assigned targets. “He stated that voters registered in the 2002 SIR electoral rolls, along with their descendants and family members, are being mapped with the current electoral rolls at every polling station. Any anomalies identified during this process should be rectified immediately, he said. “The Collector instructed officials to resolve all voter list anomalies by June 10 and to intensify awareness efforts at the grassroots level. He advised officials to accurately map voters using the voter identity details of parents, grandparents, and other family



members wherever necessary. “He reiterated that door-to-door verification by BLOs is essential for correcting anomalies and directed supervisors and officials to closely monitor the process. “The Special Intensive Revision of electoral rolls will be conducted from June 25 to July 24. During this period, officials have been instructed to verify and remove duplicate and deceased voters from the rolls. CM Revanth Reddy Lays Foundation Stones for Development Works Worth Rs 1,511 Crore in Uppal Bhagayath Layout Alleges Union Minister Kishan Reddy is Blocking Hyderabad Metro Expansion

““UPPAL, JUNE 7(INDIAN CHRONICAL): Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy on Saturday laid foundation stones for development projects worth ₹1,511 crore in Uppal Bhagayath Layout and accused Union Minister G. Kishan Reddy of obstructing the expansion of the Hyderabad Metro Rail project at the Centre. “Addressing a public gathering after the foundation-laying ceremony, the Chief Minister said that despite the State Government submitting proposals for Metro expansion, the Central Government has not granted approval. He alleged that Kishan Reddy was preventing the project from moving forward in New Delhi and challenged him to explain why approvals for Metro expansion were being delayed. “Revanth Reddy stated that regardless of political affiliations, his priority remains serving the people. He also criticized the BJP for opposing the proposed Musi River rejuvenation project while praising similar riverfront development initiatives elsewhere in the country. “Gujarat developed the Sabarmati Riverfront, Delhi has undertaken the Yamuna Riverfront project, and Uttar Pradesh claims success in cleaning the Ganga. However, when Telangana seeks to rejuvenate the Musi River, the project faces opposition,” he said. “The Chief Minister warned that the State Government’s approach would change after June 15 and raised questions regarding the delay in Metro expansion approvals, procurement of the State’s entire paddy output, funding for the Regional Ring Road (RRR), and obstacles to the Musi rejuvenation project. He urged political parties not to politicize development initiatives. “Highlighting Hyderabad’s rapid urban growth, Revanth Reddy noted that nearly 13.4 million people reside within

the Outer Ring Road limits, making infrastructure development a major challenge. He defended the decision to divide the Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation

(GHMC) into three administrative units, stating that it was done for governance efficiency rather than political gain. He also announced that a municipal office would be established in Uppal to improve public services. “Recalling his political journey, the Chief Minister said the people of Malkajgiri had played a key role in reviving his political career. He added that while he could not accomplish several developmental goals as a Member of Parliament due to lack of cooperation from the Centre, he is now committed to developing the Malkajgiri region as Chief Minister. “The projects for which foundation stones were laid include the construction of the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation building, a 100-bed Area Hospital in Uppal, and alternative roads around the AOC Centre. The Chief Minister also launched the CURE-1 Mobile App, which enables citizens to pay property tax, electricity bills, and water bills through a single platform. “The event was attended by Uppal MLA Bandari Lakshma Reddy, Ministers Duddilla Sridhar Babu and Damodar Rajanarasimha, Government Advisor V. Hanumantha Rao, Rajya Sabha MPs V. Narender Reddy and Anil Kumar Yadav, Bhongir MP Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy, Government Whip Addanki Dayakar, legislators, party leaders, and senior government officials.



Police recover firearms in PMJ jewellery dacoity case Another accused arrested in Bihar; investigators seek further custody of suspects over alleged non-cooperation.



KARIMNAGAR June 7 (Correspondent): The investigation into the high-profile PMJ Jewellery Shop dacoity case gathered momentum with the recovery of two firearms and a mobile phone allegedly linked to the crime, while police also arrested another key accused in Bihar, Karimnagar Police Commissioner Gaush

Alam said on Sunday.

Three prime accused — Subodh Singh, Raghunath Karmakar alias Jagira Singh, and Ravish Kumar alias Pradyuman — were interrogated in police custody for four days following court orders. The custody period lasted from June 3 to June 7.

According to the Commissioner, investigators recovered two pistols allegedly used in the offence after accused Raghunath Karmakar and Ravish Kumar led police to a location near the Velichala bypass road, where the weapons had been concealed in bushes.

Police also recovered a Vivo mobile phone believed to be connected to the crime from a forested area near Maddunoor village while tracing the route allegedly used by the accused to escape towards Dharmapuri.

Mr. Alam said that although the interrogation yielded some leads, the accused had not fully cooperated with investigators. They were allegedly withholding information regarding the whereabouts of the stolen gold and diamond jewellery, the identities of persons involved in its disposal, and financial transactions linked to the loot.

Investigators found discrepancies in the statements made by the accused regarding the concealment and movement of the stolen property. In particular, one of the accused reportedly retracted an earlier claim that the valuables had been hidden in a forest area, leading police to conclude that efforts were being made to divert the investigation.

In view of the developments, police plan to move the court seeking further custody of the accused for additional interrogation.

Meanwhile, a special police team arrested Amar Singh alias Pahilwan alias Amarendra Kumar Singh, identified as Accused No. 10 in the case, from Salimpur in Bihar’s Patna district on June 4. After securing a transit warrant from a local court, the team is bringing him to Karimnagar for further legal proceedings.

The Commissioner said efforts were continuing to trace and apprehend the remaining absconding accused, and search operations had been intensified across multiple locations. “[9:29 PM, 6/7/2026] +91 93907 69610: End
