“Khammam/Singareni, June 16 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar T.S. emphasized that every school-age child should be enrolled in school through the effective implementation of the “Badi Bata” enrollment drive, ensuring that no child is deprived of education. “On Tuesday, the Collector conducted a surprise inspection of the Government High School, Primary School, and Anganwadi Centre in Viswanathapalli village of Singareni Mandal. He reviewed school administration, student attendance, infrastructure facilities, implementation of the Mid-Day Meal Scheme, and sanitation standards. “The Collector also examined the distribution process of free textbooks and uniforms provided by the government and directed officials to ensure that all benefits reach every student on time. “Speaking on the occasion, Divakar T.S. stated that the Badi Bata programme should be implemented effectively by identifying every school-age child and enrolling them in schools. He stressed that special attention must be given to ensuring that no student remains out of school. Officials were instructed to identify dropout students and facilitate their return to education. “He further directed teachers to maintain punctuality, discharge their responsibilities diligently, and provide quality education to students. “During the inspection, the Collector reviewed the school kitchen and the implementation of the Mid-Day Meal Scheme. He noted that Anganwadi centres play a crucial role in the holistic development of children and directed officials to ensure the delivery of quality services. “He further instructed authorities to maintain cleanliness in and around schools and Anganwadi centres and to undertake sanitation activities regularly. ## Police Commissioner Gaush Alam warns of stringent action against school transport violators.

KARIMNAGAR June 16 (Correspondent): Karimnagar Police Commissioner Gaush Alam has warned of stringent action against operators and drivers of school transport vehicles found violating road safety norms and provisions of the Motor Vehicles Act.

Speaking during a special inspection drive conducted jointly by the Karimnagar Police Commissionerate and the Road Transport Authority (RTA), Mr. Alam said the safety of schoolchildren was a shared responsibility and that any compromise on safety standards would not be tolerated.

As part of the drive, officials seized 17 school buses lacking valid fitness certificates and 50 auto rickshaws engaged in transporting students. Cases were registered against 64 vehicles for operating without mandatory documents such as registration certificates, permits and insurance coverage.



The authorities also initiated action against 13 drivers for not wearing the prescribed uniform, one vehicle for operating without a number plate and nine vehicles for overloading. In all, violations were detected in 87 vehicles.

Mr. Alam stressed that all school transport vehicles must possess valid fitness certificates and statutory documents. He cautioned drivers against over speeding, using mobile phones while driving and operating vehicles under the influence of alcohol, warning that such violations would attract strict legal action.

Assistant Commissioners of Police Yadagiriswamy and Venkataswamy, Motor Vehicle Inspector G. Kavitha, Traffic Inspector Anjaiah and other officials participated in the inspection drive.

## Settlement is the Best Path: Make Use of the National Lok Adalat

Efforts should be made to resolve as many of these cases as possible through amicable settlement during the National Lok Adalat, he said. “The meeting was attended by Y. ## People Should Receive Better Healthcare Services in Government Hospitals: District Collector Divakar TS

Doctors and Staff Must Perform Their Duties Responsibly and with Punctuality  
New Hospital Facility to Enhance Healthcare Services for the Public  
District Collector Inspects Government Area Hospital in Wyra and Reviews Progress of New Hospital Construction

“Khammam/Wyra, June 16 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar TS stated that doctors and healthcare staff should remain available at government health centers and ensure quality medical services are provided to the public. “On Tuesday, the District Collector toured the Wyra Assembly constituency and conducted a surprise inspection of the Government Area Hospital in Wyra town. During his visit, he inspected the casualty ward, labour room, emergency ward, OP room, laboratory, available medical facilities, services being provided to patients, medicine stocks, and staff attendance. He also interacted with patients and enquired about the quality of healthcare services being delivered. “The Collector reviewed medical services, staff performance, daily case records, important registers, monthly reports, availability of medicines, and cleanliness of the hospital premises. He instructed medical officials to take necessary measures to further improve the quality of healthcare services. “Speaking on the occasion, District Collector Divakar TS said that if doctors and staff remain available on time and provide quality treatment, more patients would prefer government hospitals. He emphasized the need to encourage normal deliveries and advised against unnecessary C-section surgeries. “While inspecting case sheets in the wards, he enquired about the availability of essential medicines and directed officials to maintain adequate stocks of all necessary drugs. He also instructed hospital authorities to keep the premises clean and ensure a comfortable environment for patients. “Earlier, the Collector visited the site of the newly constructed 100-bed Government Area Hospital being built at an estimated cost of ₹37.50 crore in Wyra mandal headquarters. He reviewed the progress of construction works and directed officials to complete all priority works quickly while maintaining high quality standards. He also instructed the district administration to provide necessary coordination and support for the timely completion of the project. “The Collector stated that the government is giving the highest priority to the development of the healthcare sector. He said that providing quality and improved healthcare services to both urban and rural populations remains one of the government's key objectives. “He stressed that there should be no compromise on construction quality and directed officials to adhere to quality standards at every stage of the project. He further advised them to ensure the availability of required resources and complete the works within the stipulated timeframe without delays through proper planning. “District Medical and Health Services Officer (DCHS) Dr. Rajasekhar Goud, other concerned officials, medical staff, and department personnel accompanied the Collector during the visit. “Issued by: District Public Relations Officer's Office, Khammam



# BJP Kisan Morcha Submits Memorandum to Khammam Collector; Demands PD Act Against Fake Seed Traders

“Khammam, June 16 Indian Chronicle:“ In view of the commencement of the Kharif season, the BJP Kisan Morcha submitted a memorandum to Khammam District Collector Divakar on Tuesday, demanding strict action against the fake seed racket and ensuring the availability of quality seeds and fertilizers to farmers. The leaders also urged the Congress government to immediately fulfill the promises made to the farming community. “Speaking on the occasion, BJP Khammam District President Nelluri Koteswara Rao and BJP Kisan Morcha State Vice President Chilukuri Ramesh expressed serious concern over the growing menace of fake seeds in the state and called upon the government to take immediate steps to curb the problem. “The leaders informed the Collector that Khammam is predominantly an agriculture-based district, with nearly 5.5 to 6 lakh acres expected to be cultivated during the current Kharif season. They noted that cotton is cultivated on approximately 2.5 lakh acres, requiring nearly 5 to 6 lakh seed packets. Paddy cultivation covers around 1.5 to 2 lakh acres, necessitating thousands of quintals of fine-variety seeds, while chilli, maize, and other crops are grown on over 2 lakh acres. “Considering the large cultivation area, they requested the administration to ensure adequate seed stocks at Primary Agricultural Cooperative Societies (PACS) and licensed dealers so that no farmer is forced to stand in long queues for seeds. “The BJP leaders alleged that the “Jilugu” seeds supplied through government societies were of poor quality, with a germination rate of only around 25 percent. They urged the government to provide quality seeds, including those used for green manure crops. “They further accused certain private dealers and seed companies of misleading farmers and selling counterfeit seeds for cotton, chilli, and paddy cultivation. As a result, many farmers invest heavily, suffer crop failures, fall into debt, and in some cases are driven to suicide. They pointed out that fake cotton and chilli seed syndicates continue to cheat innocent farmers every year. “To tackle the menace, they demanded the formation of special task force teams involving both the Agriculture and Police Departments. They also called for stringent action, including the registration of cases under the Preventive Detention (PD) Act against dealers involved in the sale of fake seeds. “The leaders suggested conducting extensive awareness campaigns through Agricultural

Extension Officers (AEOs) at the village level, advising farmers not to purchase seeds from unauthorized persons or without proper receipts, even if offered at lower prices. “The memorandum also sought the immediate supply of subsidized seeds and fertilizers, including urea, without shortages. The BJP leaders demanded the release of pending Rythu Bharosa assistance from the previous Rabi season and the current Kharif season into farmers’ bank accounts without delay. “They further urged the government to waive farm loans up to ₹2 lakh, including bank loans exceeding that amount under eligible categories, provide ₹12,000 annually to agricultural laborers, implement crop insurance effectively, and clear pending payments and bonus amounts for procured maize and paddy. “Warning the government, Nelluri Koteswara Rao and Chilukuri Ramesh stated that if the Congress government fails to implement the promises made to farmers, the farming community and the public would unite and teach it an appropriate lesson. “Among those who participated in submitting the memorandum were BJP State Executive Member Rudra Pradeep, senior leader Mandadapu Subba Rao, Kisan Morcha district leader Narukula Venkateswarlu, BJP district vice presidents Ravi Rathod, Nakarikanti Veerabhadram, Maruthi Veerabhadra Prasad, district treasurer Gautham Lakshminarayana, Boyinapalli Shekhar, R.S. ## Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt Calls for High-Standard Policing to Meet Emerging Challenges

\*\*\*\*Khammam, June 16 Indian Chronicle:\*\*\*\*Khammam Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt emphasized the need for police personnel to focus on maintaining the highest standards of policing in response to changing circumstances and emerging challenges.\*\*\*\*A crime review meeting with officers of the Khammam Rural Division was held at the Police Commissioner's Office on Tuesday.\*\*\*\*Addressing the officers, the Commissioner stressed that Station House Officers (SHOs) should conduct regular field visits and ensure effective ground-level supervision to control crime. He called for greater accountability in the discharge of duties and directed officers to curb negligence, procedural violations, and other undesirable practices within the police force.\*\*\*\*The Commissioner also instructed officials to organize awareness programs at the grassroots level to combat cybercrime and prevent the spread of narcotic substances that are adversely affecting the future of young people.\*\*\*\*With the onset of the monsoon and Kharif cultivation season, Commissioner Sunil Dutt noted that farmers are actively purchasing seeds for crop cultivation. He urged the Agriculture, Revenue, and Police Departments to work in coordination to prevent farmers from falling victim to counterfeit seeds, which often result in significant financial losses for those who depend on agriculture for their livelihood.\*\*\*\*The Commissioner further directed officials to take stringent measures to curb the illegal transportation of sand from Andhra Pradesh into Telangana. He called for strengthened visible policing along district borders and at check posts to completely eliminate illegal sand smuggling. June 16):- The Standing Estate Committee held a high-level meeting on the development of infrastructure and progress of new projects at AIIMS Bibinagar campus. Bhuvanagiri Member of Parliament (MP) Chamala Kiran Kumar Reddy and AIIMS Bibinagar Executive Director Professor Amita Agarwal were specially present at this meeting. Several key proposals were discussed extensively in this meeting and approved for the development of AIIMS and providing better facilities to patients.” AIIMS Bibinagar participated in the first Standing Estate Committee meeting and discussed in detail various key issues related to the development of AIIMS Bibinagar towards further strengthening medical services and medical education in Telangana. A review was conducted on the progress of the ongoing Phase-1 construction works under the auspices of NCC and HITES, their completion dates, HMDA connectivity, TSRTC public transport facilities, and necessary permissions from fire services. The need to expedite these works was mentioned. It was suggested that priority should be given to issues such as making special medical services available to recognized journalists and their families, and establishing an access road from Kodamadugu village to reduce the travel time for patients and emergency services. Similarly, proposals such as construction of Vishram Sadan, establishment of Rural Health Training Center, efficient use of existing infrastructure, and strengthening of the Dentistry Department were discussed extensively. It was felt that these issues would be crucial towards providing better medical services to the people. It was clarified in the meeting that AIIMS Bibinagar should be more accessible to the people of Telangana and that all projects should be completed within the stipulated time frame and become a center for best medical services, medical education and

## LRS Applications to Be Cleared in Mission Mode, Says Collector

Chitra Mishra directs officials to issue proceedings to all fee-paying applicants without delay; calls for monsoon preparedness and intensified sanitation measures.

KARIMNAGAR June 16 (Correspondent): District Collector Chitra Mishra on Tuesday directed officials to expedite the disposal of applications filed under the Layout Regularisation Scheme (LRS) and ensure that proceedings are issued without delay to all applicants who have paid the prescribed fees.

Reviewing the progress of LRS implementation at a meeting with Municipal Commissioners and officials of the Revenue, Town Planning and Irrigation Departments at the Collectorate Conference Hall, Ms. Mishra said the exercise should be completed in “mission mode” and instructed officials to eliminate procedural delays.

The Collector reviewed the number of applications received, disposed of and pending across urban local bodies. She asked officials to identify the reasons for pendency and resolve them on priority. Emphasising the need for speedy disposal, she directed authorities to ensure that every eligible applicant who has paid the requisite fee receives the proceedings at the earliest.

Ms. Mishra also instructed officials to undertake extensive awareness campaigns to inform the public about the benefits and procedures of the LRS scheme. Stating that she would conduct weekly reviews of the programme, she called for concerted efforts to achieve 100% disposal of eligible applications.

Turning to monsoon preparedness, the Collector directed Municipal Commissioners and departmental officials to remain on high alert ahead of the rainy season. She instructed them to keep sanitation vehicles, fogging machines, oil balls and other essential equipment ready for deployment.

She further asked officials to keep disaster management teams prepared to respond to emergencies and take preventive measures to minimise public inconvenience during heavy rainfall. A special action plan should be formulated to prevent seasonal diseases, she said, while stressing the need to intensify sanitation drives across municipalities.

The Collector also directed municipal authorities to undertake continuous field-level monitoring to ensure that civic services remain uninterrupted during the monsoon season.

Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Ashwini Tanaji Wakade, Municipal Commissioner Pratul Desai, and officials from the Revenue, Town Planning and Irrigation Departments attended the meeting.

## State BJP Asks Revanth Reddy: Who Is Really Prostrating Before Donald Trump?

“Hyderabad, June 16: Launching a scathing attack on the Telangana government, the State BJP on Monday strongly criticised Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy's decision to rename a road in Hyderabad as ‘Donald Trump Avenue’, questioning the Congress party's repeated attempts to score political points through contradictory narratives. “State BJP Chief Spokesperson and Media In-charge N.V. Subash asked, “Who is really prostrating before the US President — Prime Minister Narendra Modi or Revanth Reddy and the Congress party dynasts?” “He said the Congress has a long history of displaying subservience towards global powers, recalling instances during previous Congress-led governments when national interests were allegedly compromised to appease foreign leaders. “Subash also accused Congress of selectively glorifying historical figures while neglecting genuine freedom fighters. He pointed out that several prominent roads in the national capital were named after Mughal rulers and colonial-era personalities, exposing what he termed the party's distorted historical priorities. “Drawing a parallel with a popular Telugu proverb, he said, “Andani draksha pullana” — literally meaning ‘the unreachable grapes are sour’ — perfectly describes the Congress party's behaviour. “Whenever it loses elections, suffers political setbacks or faces adverse judicial outcomes, the Congress conveniently blames constitutional institutions such as the Election Commission and even the Supreme Court, instead of introspecting on its own failures,” he said. “Subash asserted that under BJP governments, both former Prime Minister Atal Bihari Vajpayee and Prime Minister Narendra Modi upheld India's national interests without yielding to external pressures. “It is the BJP leadership that has elevated Bharat's global stature, unlike the colonial mindset that has long defined Congress politics,” he said. “Taking a swipe at Congress, he alleged that the party inherited the Mughal and British-era ‘divide and rule’ mentality by perpetuating caste, religious and vote-bank politics. “Subash said growing public resentment against the “arrogant and disconnected governance” of the Revanth Reddy government would inevitably translate into a decisive verdict against the Congress in the next electoral battle cycle. “The people of Telangana are watching closely and are prepared to administer a fitting political response at the appropriate time,” he added.

## National Vaccination Day (Pulse Polio) program on June 28 should be made a success:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle... June 16):- National Vaccination Day (Pulse Polio) program on June 28 should be made a success – said District Collector Anurag Jayanti.” “On Tuesday, a meeting of the District Task Force Committee was held in VC Hall under the chairmanship of District Collector Anurag Jayanti regarding the organization of National Vaccination Day. Speaking on the occasion, the District Collector said that the Central and State governments are ambitiously organizing the Pulse Polio program every year to maintain the polio-free status achieved by India in 2014. Yadadri said that the pulse polio program will be organized in Bhuvanagiri district on June 28, 2026 (Sunday). He said that the target has been set to administer Oral Polio Vaccine (OPV) drops to about 57,000 children aged 0 to 5 years in the district. For this, special arrangements have been made by identifying 647 polio booths, 19 transit points and 42 high-risk areas across the district. He said that the vaccination program will be organized in all polio booths from 7.00 am to 5.00 pm on June 28, 2026. Similarly, on June 29 and 30, 2026, he directed the medical and health department staff to conduct a door-to-door survey and follow-up program and provide polio drops to every child who has not been vaccinated at the booths. He advised them to take special measures in every village, ward, thanda, tribal area, migrant workers' residential areas, brick kilns, construction sites, railway stations, bus stands, etc. in the district so that not a single child is left behind.” “Stating that coordination of all departments is of utmost importance in making the Pulse Polio program a success, he directed the Zilla Parishad CEO, District Rural Development Officer, District Education Officer, District Panchayat Officer, officials of various welfare departments, representatives of TGSPDCL, TGSRTC, IMA, representatives of NGOs, private and educational institutions to provide full cooperation.” “The Collector appealed to the people that every parent should administer Pulse Polio drops even if their children have received complete vaccinations.” “Awareness on Stop Diarrhoea Program: A review of the “Stop Diarrhoea” program was also held as part of this meeting. It was said that this special program is being organized from June 16 to July 31, 2026 to reduce the morbidity and mortality due to diarrhea in children under five years of age.” “As part of this program, 2 ORS packets and 14 zinc tablets will be distributed free of cost to every household with children under five years of age through ASHA workers and ANMs. He also said that special ORS-Zinc corners have been set up in government hospitals, primary health centers and Anganwadi centers. Instructions to be followed by people to prevent diarrhea: Always eat only freshly cooked and hot food.” “\* Drink only boiled and cooled or purified water.” “\* Wash hands with soap before eating and after using the toilet.” “\* During diarrhea and vomiting, fluids such as ORS solution, buttermilk, and coconut water should be given to prevent dehydration.” “\* The nearest government health center should be contacted immediately if diarrhea symptoms appear.” “The District Collector ordered that all departments should work together to successfully implement the Pulse Polio and Stop Diarrhoea programs in the district and protect the health of every child.” “The meeting was attended by District Medical and Health Officer Dr. M. Manohar, District Immunization Officer, Dr. Ramakrishna, district level officers, medical officers, officers of various departments and other concerned officers.
