Collector calls for shift to alternative crops as rainfall deficit persists

Officials asked to intensify field visits, issue weather advisories and prepare farmers for possible El Niño impact.

Karimnagar July 09 (Correspondent): District Collector Chitra Mishra has directed Agriculture Department officials to encourage farmers to take up alternative crops instead of paddy in view of the deficient rainfall and the possibility of El Niño affecting the ongoing kharif season.

The Collector issued the directions after participating in a video conference chaired by Irrigation Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy, along with Ministers Tummala Nageswara Rao and Duddilla Sridhar Babu, to review the likely impact of El Niño and the preparedness of districts for the cropping season. She later held a meeting with officials of the Agriculture, Irrigation and allied departments.

Ms. Mishra instructed officials to organise awareness programmes at Rythu Vedikas and advise farmers to cultivate less water-intensive crops such as pulses, millets, oilseeds and vegetables. The adoption of alternative crops, she said, would help minimise losses if rainfall remained below normal.

Noting that a substantial extent of cultivation in the district depends on wells and borewells, the Collector said dryland crops could be raised with comparatively less water. She also directed officials to ensure uninterrupted fertiliser supply and closely monitor the online distribution of urea.

The Collector advised farmers to cultivate only the seven fine rice varieties notified by the State government to become eligible for the procurement bonus. Officials were asked to ensure that information on the notified varieties reached every farmer.

She directed the Agriculture and Irrigation departments to work in close coordination on water management and instructed agriculture officials to provide regular weather advisories, technical guidance and crop selection recommendations. The district administration would review the situation periodically at the mandal level, she said, urging farmers to follow official advisories and not be misled by rumours.

Ms. Mishra also instructed officials to prepare an effective implementation plan under the VBGRAM-G scheme to maximise employment opportunities for rural labourers.

Stones are flying out from under the wheels of fast-moving trucks and landing on commuters as chips pour stones in the name of repairing roads damaged by sand trucks. The weight of the overflowing lorries as they hurriedly dumped chippy stones on top of a road that had formed into a large mass at the corner of NTR Centre, especially in the district centre, was causing rocks to fly out from under their wheels.“Every day students, women, old people and two-wheelers are riding amidst the panic. It is extremely unfortunate that the relevant authorities, contractors and public representatives have not responded despite several injuries already. The government's stance of prioritising the transport of sand over people's lives is deeply reprehensible.“The people of Mandala are warning that if there is any loss of life due to this negligence then the entire responsibility lies with the concerned authorities, contractors and government.“People are demanding that the chip rocks on the road be removed immediately and quality road repairs carried out, sand trucks speed controlled, strict action taken against vehicles breaking regulations.“The people of Mandal have made it clear that they will not hesitate to gather the people in absentia and organize mass concerns, rastaaroko, dharna. They warned the government that it was its first responsibility to save people's lives, not react after an accident but pre-empt the danger.



MMC Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy Conducts Field Inspection in Uppal–Ramanthapur; Issues Key Directions on CC Roads, Storm Water Drains, Sanitation and Encroachment Removal

““““UPPAL, JULY 9 (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC) Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, IAS, on Thursday conducted a comprehensive field inspection in the Uppal Bhagayath and Ramanthapur Bhagayath areas. He reviewed ongoing development works, sanitation management, urban planning, revenue administration and urban biodiversity initiatives, and issued several key directions to officials of the concerned departments.“The Commissioner directed the Engineering Department to expedite the ongoing CC road construction works in the Uppal and Ramanthapur Bhagayath limits. He also instructed officials to immediately take up repairs of streetlights in Uppal Bhagayath Phase-II.“He asked officials to prepare a detailed proposal for the construction of a storm water drain from the Amberpet STP to D-Mart in Uppal Bhagayath. He also instructed them to initiate arrangements for installing a “Welcome to Uppal – MMC” gateway near the Amberpet STP.“Revenue Department officials were directed to thoroughly examine property tax assessment records and take action in accordance with the rules.“The Town Planning Department was instructed to immediately remove encroachments and illegal vehicle parking along the Devender Nagar nala, ensuring that the drain is completely cleared.“The Solid Waste Management (SWM) Department was directed to remove accumulated construction and demolition (C&D) waste from the Devender Nagar nala surroundings without delay and eliminate all garbage vulnerable points. Officials were also instructed to identify those illegally dumping waste and impose strict penalties. The Commissioner further directed the department to conduct a special meeting with tractor drivers transporting C&D waste to create awareness about the prescribed rules and regulations.“The Urban Biodiversity Department was instructed to undertake extensive plantation drives along the Devender Nagar nala road and across Uppal Bhagayath, prepare a dedicated maintenance plan and ensure continuous monitoring of the planted saplings.“The Commissioner emphasized that all departments should work in close coordination to strengthen urban development, improve sanitation, prevent urban flooding and enhance the city's green cover, while ensuring better civic services for the public.



TWJF Calls for Protest at Medchal Collectorate on July 13, Dharna at Information Commissioner Office on July 15

“UPPAL, JULY 9(INDIAN CHRONICLE):“As part of the statewide agitation launched by the Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) for the resolution of journalists' issues, TWJF Uppal Constituency Convener Singam Raju has called upon journalists to make the protest in front of the Medchal Collectorate on July 13 a grand success.“He urged the State Government to take proactive steps to address the long-pending issues faced by journalists. He announced that memorandums would be submitted to the District Collector on July 13, followed by a massive dharna at the State Information Commissioner's Office on July 15.“Singam Raju alleged that the State Government has been neglecting the issue of journalists' health cards. He said that the existing health cards are accepted only at NIMS Hospital and are not valid in other corporate hospitals. He demanded that the government immediately issue new health cards to all eligible journalists.“He also expressed concern over the delay in the allocation of house sites for journalists, stating that the Cabinet Sub-Committee has failed to take a decision, preventing further progress. He criticized the government for raising hopes among journalists and later disappointing them.“He further demanded the immediate distribution of accreditation cards to all eligible journalists, pointing out that delays in issuing accreditation cards have also delayed the issuance of bus passes, causing hardship to media personnel.“Singam Raju also demanded that the government increase the monthly pension for journalists to ₹10,000. Additionally, he urged the State Government to issue a Government Order (GO) providing 100% fee reimbursement for journalists' children studying in private and corporate educational institutions.

700 more CCTV cameras planned across Karimnagar Commissionerate: CP

Gaush Alam says expanded surveillance will aid crime detection and prevention; asks youth to shun drugs and online gaming addiction, highlights Rahveer Scheme for Good Samaritans.

Karimnagar July 09 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar Police Commissionerate has set a target of installing 700 more CCTV cameras across its jurisdiction to strengthen surveillance and aid crime detection and prevention,



Police Commissioner Gaush Alam said on Thursday.

The Commissioner inaugurated 21 CCTV cameras—16 at Saidabad village and five at Korapalli village in Huzurabad division—and said the initiative was aimed at bringing every village, town and other vulnerable locations under CCTV surveillance to enhance public safety and support effective policing.

Addressing an awareness programme for students, auto-rickshaw drivers and members of the public at Jammikunta later, Mr. Alam expressed concern over the increasing incidence of cybercrime and online gaming addiction among youngsters. He said excessive involvement in online gaming had resulted in financial losses and psychological distress, with some cases ending in suicides. He asked parents to closely monitor their children's online activities and create greater awareness about the risks associated with digital platforms.

The Police Commissioner also asked youth to stay away from drugs and other intoxicants and instead participate in sports and other constructive activities. He urged the public to inform the local police or dial 100 if they came across instances of drug trafficking or consumption.

Emphasising road safety, Mr. Alam said motorists should strictly adhere to traffic regulations and noted that the government provides a ₹25,000 cash incentive under the Rahveer Scheme to Good Samaritans who help road accident victims reach hospitals within the golden hour, thereby improving their chances of survival.

Earlier, the Commissioner presented mementoes to the winners of a volleyball tournament organised by the Jammikunta Town and Rural police at the Government Degree College grounds.

Huzurabad ACP Madhavi, Jammikunta Circle Inspector Ramakrishna and Jammikunta Rural Inspector Venkat were among those present.

He stated that the government is privatizing profitable public sector undertakings, burdening the public, and conspiring to fundamentally alter the Indian Constitution under the guise of 'Manuvad' ideology. To oppose these conspiracies, a nationwide "Jail Bhara" (Fill the Jails) protest is being organized on August 10, inspired by the spirit of the historic Quit India Movement.
