

MMC Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy Launches First Aerobin Compost Harvest at MYE Villas“80 Aerobin Units to Be Set Up Across Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation

“BODUPPAL, JULY 10 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): In a major step towards scientific wet waste management and sustainable urban sanitation, the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC) on Friday organized the first community-level Aerobin Compost Harvest at MYE Villas, a gated community in Boduppall Circle. MMC Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, IAS, inaugurated the compost harvest as the chief guest. The event marked the successful completion of a pilot project implemented jointly by the Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation, Modern Architects for Rural India (MARI), and the Swarnalata Motherson Trust (SLMTT). The first batch of organic compost produced through Aerobin composters was collected and distributed to residents. Speaking on the occasion, Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy said MMC would establish 80 Aerobin composting units at 15 locations in the first phase to ensure scientific management of wet waste at its source. The proposed locations include 13 residential communities, one educational institution, and the Integrated Municipal Solid Waste Management Park at Parvathapur. He explained that the Aerobin composter converts wet waste into organic manure through a natural aerobic process without requiring electricity. The system is odor-free and prevents the breeding of flies, mosquitoes, and rodents, making it an efficient solution for gated communities, high-rise apartments, and institutions generating large quantities of wet waste. The Commissioner also suggested organizing exposure visits for community representatives to the Jawaharnagar landfill site to create greater awareness about the challenges of urban waste management. He assured full support from MMC in transforming MYE Villas into a "Net Zero Waste" residential community. MYE Villas Residents Welfare Association President Madhusudan said the community comprises over 200 households,



generating around 45–50 kilograms of wet waste daily. He expressed gratitude to MMC and MARI for selecting their colony for the state's first community-level Aerobin project. He further stated that the community treats 60,000 litres of wastewater every day and is willing to supply the surplus treated water to the municipality. He also noted that the colony maintains 25 rainwater harvesting pits. Following the success of the CSR-supported pilot project, under which the Swarnalata Motherson Trust provided the Aerobin composters, the Commissioner urged MARI to expand the initiative to economically weaker colonies as well. The programme was attended by Zonal Commissioner Radhika Gupta, IAS, Additional Commissioner Raghu Prasad, Boduppall Deputy Commissioner Shailaja, MARI Executive Director Murali, Project Manager Sudha Poleni, Venkanna, municipal officials, and residents of MYE Villas.

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Commissioner reviews nursery preparations for Van Mahotsavam

Calls for coordinated efforts to ensure large-scale plantation across the city.

Karimnagar July 10 (Correspondent): Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai on Friday inspected the Municipal Corporation's LMD nursery at Alugunur and nearby Forest Department nurseries to review preparations for the State government's Van Mahotsavam plantation programme.

During the visit, the Commissioner examined the availability of flowering, fruit-bearing, medicinal and avenue plantation saplings being raised in the nurseries. He reviewed the stock position and interacted with officials on the varieties of saplings available for the proposed plantation drive.



Mr. Desai urged Forest Department officials to provide a wide range of healthy saplings suitable for plantation during Van Mahotsavam. He directed Municipal Corporation engineering officials to ensure that adequate numbers of quality saplings are kept ready for large-scale planting across the city.

Stressing the need for coordinated efforts, the Commissioner called upon officials and staff of the Municipal Corporation and the Forest Department to work together to

make the plantation programme a success. He also instructed officials to utilise saplings raised in Forest Department nurseries for the campaign.

The Commissioner asked engineering officials to accord priority to avenue and block plantations by identifying suitable locations and completing the necessary preparatory works ahead of the programme.

If Dalits are not given due priority, serious damage will be done - preventive measures should be taken:
- Former Bhuvanagiri Municipal Chairman Barre Jahangir



“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Indian Chronicle.. July 10):- Former Bhuvanagiri Municipal Chairman Barre Jahangir has appealed to TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud to give a fair share to Dalits, tribals and minorities in the PACS Chairman and nominated posts. “Former Bhuvanagiri Municipal Chairman Barre Jahangir has expressed his concern that the Dalit, tribal and minority social groups, who have supported the Congress party for decades to form the government in the state, are not getting due priority in the party. He made a public appeal to Telangana Pradesh Congress Committee (TPCC) President Bomma Mahesh Kumar Goud in this regard.” He said that it is extremely sad that not a single Dalit was given a chance in the posts of Chairman of Primary Agricultural Cooperative Credit Societies (PACS) recently announced in two assembly constituencies of Yadadri-Bhuvanagiri district, and that local Dalits were not given a chance in the trustees of Yadadri Lakshmi Narasimha Swamy Temple. He said that there is a need to provide adequate representation to Dalits, who have the largest population in the state, in government nominated posts and party posts. “Although the Dalit community has been the backbone of the Congress party for decades, after coming to power, Barre Jahangir expressed his concern that they are not getting proper recognition and opportunities. He said that it is not right to set aside Dalit leaders who are eligible and capable of contesting general seats except for constitutionally reserved seats in local bodies, citing their financial conditions and other reasons. There is already a discussion that Dalits have been severely wronged in the appointments of Mandal Congress Committee and Block Congress Committee presidents, and now the same situation is being repeated in the posts of PACS chairman, which has led to deep dissatisfaction among Dalit social groups. He warned that if such deci-

sions continue, there is a risk of the Dalit communities, which are the traditional vote bank of the Congress party, gradually moving away. “He demanded that a policy be implemented across the state to provide representation to Dalits, tribals and minorities in government nominated positions according to their population ratio. If it is not possible to implement reservations at the government level, at least at the party level, TPCC President Mahesh Kumar Goud should formulate a clear reservation policy and demonstrate social justice in practice.” Barre Jahangir appealed to the Congress party to provide appropriate participation to Dalits not only in words but also in the distribution of positions in order to maintain the belief that it is committed to social justice.

(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Indian Chronicle.. July 10)-- to solve the problems in government schools, , SFI District Secretary Lavudiya Raju and AISF District Secretary Uppala Shantikumar demanded the government to immediately release the reimbursement of scholarship fees of ten thousand crores in the state and to bring a fee control law in the state. Bandh of educational institutions under the leadership of left-wing student unions, a bandh of all educational institutions was organized in the district center, after which a rally was organized from the government junior college to Prince Chowrasta. Secretary Uppala Shanti Kumar said that even a month has passed since the start of government schools, but the books have not been received in full, not a single uniform has been provided to the students, and it has become difficult to provide quality meals to the students as the funds have not been increased according to the increased prices. The state government should immediately withdraw the meals provided by organizations like Akshayapatra, ISKCON and Manna, allocate adequate funds for the mid-day meal scheme and take steps to ensure that the students get quality food. In the district, the buildings built 45 years ago have reached the dilapidated systems. If it rains during the rainy season, there is a possibility of an accident. It is not right to allocate, private and corporate educational institutions have turned education into a business. Books, notebooks, belts, ties, shoes, socks and other items are forcibly bought on the students. Fees of lakhs of rupees are being collected from the nursery level by adding attractive names to the schools. The state's fees control law should be brought, and similarly, the proposal to cut down about 27,000 government schools in the state into 4,000 schools is at risk of damaging the public education system. Government schools are being closed and private educational institutions are being opened on the other hand, we want to establish new government schools on the basis of population without reducing the number of schools, strengthen the existing schools, district education officials to inspect government schools, increase funds for mid-day meal scheme, Akshaya Patra. It should be handed over to women's groups and not to ISKCON and MANNA organizations. Vacant posts of teacher, MEO, teacher should be filled. A fee control law should be made to prevent the education business of private and corporate educational institutions. Pending scholarships and fee reimbursement should be released. G.O No: 7,8,9 should be cancelled. Mid-day meal scheme should be started immediately and allocated funds for inter colleges. We demand to construct their own buildings for hostels and gurukulas running in rented buildings, and SFI District Vice President Eerla in this program. Residents of Arjun Heights Apartment urge HMWSSB ED Pankaja to resolve drinking water problem in Sai Baba Colony

“UPPAL, JULY 10 (Indian Chronicle): Residents of Arjun Heights Apartment in Sai Baba Colony, Uppal, submitted a representation to Hyderabad Metropolitan Water Supply and Sewerage Board (HMWSSB) Executive Director S. Pankaja on Friday, seeking a permanent solution to the severe drinking water shortage that has persisted for the past four years. “Speaking on the occasion, Arjun Heights Apartment Association President Mandava Srisailam said the apartment residents had paid nearly ₹5 lakh towards a water connection, but the authorities provided only a temporary and inadequate connection, leaving residents to struggle for potable water ever since. “He explained that the apartment has 20 families, which are entitled to receive around 4 lakh litres of drinking water per month (20,000 litres per family). However, the apartment receives only 50,000 to 1 lakh litres per month, causing severe hardship to all residents. “Srisailam stated that the shortage is not limited to summer but continues even during the monsoon and winter seasons. He pointed out that although a separate pipeline had been laid for the apartment, it was installed improperly with several bends in a “Z” shape, affecting water flow. He also alleged that additional connections were later given to other consumers from the same pipeline,



further reducing the water supply to their apartment. “He urged the HMWSSB authorities to immediately inspect the issue, lay a new pipeline properly, and ensure an adequate drinking water supply to the residents. “The association also informed the Executive Director that representations had earlier been submitted to local Corporator Rajitha Parameshwar Reddy, General Manager Santosh Kumar, the Deputy General Manager, and the Assistant Engineer, but the issue remains unresolved. Among those present were Association General Secretary Randheer Reddy, Treasurer Sridhar, committee members Santosh, Ramana, Vishal, Kasetti Sudhakar, Eswar, Naveen, Srinivas, Sunil, and women members Mandava Satyalakshmi, Sravanti, Vidya, along with other residents.

Karimnagar steps up SIR digitisation drive after ECI sets July 24 deadline

Additional Collector reviews district's progress after ECI video conference; officials told to expedite collection and digitisation of enumeration forms.

Karimnagar July 10 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar district administration has intensified efforts to complete the digitisation of enumeration forms under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR)-2026 following the Election Commission of India's direction to achieve 100% digitisation by July 24.

Reviewing the progress of the SIR programme through a video conference with District Collectors from New Delhi on Friday, Election Commission of India senior officer Dr. Pawan Kumar Sharma instructed district administrations to accord the highest priority to the exercise and ensure that the remaining digitisation work is completed within the stipulated timeframe.

Dr. Sharma observed that only 22% of the enumeration forms had been digitised across Telangana so far and directed officials to achieve an average of 8% digitisation every day to meet the deadline. He asked Collectors to monitor the performance of Booth Level Officers (BLOs) closely by contacting at least five BLOs every day and to provide additional support to those lagging behind. He also instructed officials to complete the distribution of pending enumeration forms, ensure that every form distributed is collected from voters and digitised, and prepare proposals for additional polling stations in areas with more than 1,200 electors, wherever required.



State Chief Electoral Officer Sudarshan Reddy, who participated in the review from Hyderabad, said 99.6% of the enumeration forms had been distributed to voters across the State, while 21.94% had been digitised. He directed all districts to achieve at least 50% digitisation before the next review meeting and asked Electoral Registration Officers to conduct regular BLO-wise reviews.

Additional Collector Ashwini Tanaji Wakade, Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai and Huzurabad Revenue Divisional Officer Jala Kumari participated in the video conference from the Karimnagar Collectorate.

Following the review, Ms. Wakade and Mr. Desai held a meeting with district officials and instructed them to expedite the distribution, collection and digitisation of enumeration forms to ensure completion within the stipulated deadline. They directed officials to review the progress of BLOs on a daily basis, pay special attention to those yet to begin digitisation and deploy additional personnel wherever necessary to achieve the targets.

BRS Voter Application Drive Continues Successfully for Third Day in Chilukanagar Division

“Where Are the Food Safety Officials?

Why Are There No Inspections?

“Despite having a mobile food testing vehicle, lab technician, and driver, services remain virtually absent, critics allege. Residents urge the District Collector to intervene as the number of hotels, tea stalls, tiffin centers, biryani outlets, and food businesses continues to grow without visible monitoring. “Khammam, July 10 Indian Chronicle: “As Khammam district continues to expand with new residential colonies and a growing number of hotels, tiffin centers, tea stalls, fast-food outlets, biryani points, bakeries, pickle manufacturing units, sweet shops, and street food vendors, concerns are mounting over the apparent lack of food safety inspections. “Citizens allege that the Food Safety Department, entrusted with protecting public health, is largely absent from the field despite the rapid growth of food businesses. “The Central Government has provided a Mobile Food Testing Laboratory, along with modern testing equipment, a laboratory technician, and a dedicated driver to enable on-the-spot testing of food samples, identify unsafe food products, and safeguard public health. “However, residents are questioning whether this mobile laboratory is being effectively utilized in Khammam district. They ask where the vehicle is operating, how many inspections have been conducted, how many food samples have been collected, and how many

cases have been registered against violators. “With hundreds of hotels, eateries, tea stalls, street food vendors, chicken centers, biryani outlets, bakeries, sweet shops, and food manufacturing units operating across the district, experts emphasize the need for continuous monitoring, particularly during periods when food spoilage, contaminated water, and the use of substandard cooking oil pose increased health risks. “People are



raising concerns over whether the food they consume is safe, whether cooking oils meet prescribed standards, whether expired ingredients are being used, whether artificial colors and harmful chemicals are added to food, and whether hygiene standards are being maintained. Despite these concerns, residents claim that regular inspections are not visible. “Experts point out that the objective of food safety laws is not merely to impose penalties but to ensure that consumers receive safe and hygienic food. This requires food safety officials to conduct regular field inspections, create public awareness, and initiate legal action wherever necessary. “Medical professionals warn that food adulteration can lead to food poisoning, gastrointestinal illnesses, and serious health complications, particularly among children, senior citizens, and pregnant women. They stress that effective surveillance is essential to prevent such risks. “Residents also question whether the government resources provided for public health protection—including the mobile testing vehicle, staff, and equipment funded through taxpayers' money—are being utilized efficiently. They are demanding greater transparency regarding the functioning of the Food Safety Department. “Social organizations have urged the authorities to make public the details of food safety inspections conducted in the district, the number of food samples collected and tested, laboratory results, cases registered, and penalties imposed on violators. “Citizens have appealed to the District Administration to review the performance of the Food Safety Department and, if necessary, launch a district-wide special inspection drive to ensure that there is no negligence in safeguarding public health. “Questions Being Raised by the Public “Where is the Central Government-provided Mobile Food Testing Vehicle currently operating? “How many inspections were conducted in the district during the past year? “How many food samples were collected and tested? “How many cases were registered against those selling adulterated or unsafe food? “What action has been taken against establishments violating food safety regulations? “Is the food safety enforcement system functioning effectively at the ground level? “Residents have urged the District Collector to give special attention to these issues and ensure that an effective food safety monitoring mechanism is in place to protect public health.

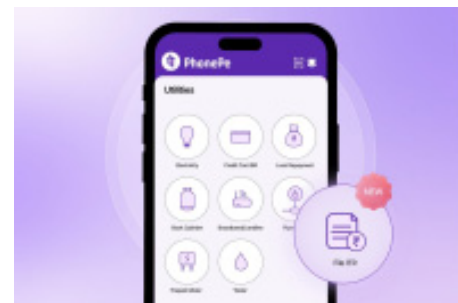
