# Land Re-Survey Must Be Taken Up on Top Priority Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy

Directed officials to complete the re-survey in three phases by March 2027  
Speed up disposal of Sadabainama applications“Revenue Minister reviews progress with District Collectors through video conference



“KHAMMAM, 11 JULY (INDIAN CHRONICLE):“Telangana Revenue, Housing, and Information & Public Relations Minister Ponguleti Srinivasa Reddy directed officials to accord the highest priority to the statewide Land Re-Survey for the effective implementation of the Bhu Bharati Act. He stated that the government's primary objective is to provide complete security and legal protection to farmers' land holdings.“On Saturday, the Minister conducted a video conference from the Khammam District Collectorate with District Collectors across the state to review the progress of the Land Re-Survey, implementation of the Bhu Bharati Act, disposal of Sadabainama applications, construction of Indiramma houses, distribution of 2BHK houses, and supply of school uniforms to students. Revenue Special Chief Secretary D.S. Lokesh Kumar participated from Hyderabad, while Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S. joined the review meeting from Khammam.“Addressing the officials, the Minister said that after the formation of the present government, the Dharani portal was abolished and replaced with the Bhu Bharati Act. However, he acknowledged that although the Act has been in

force for the past 15 months, it has not yet fully met public expectations. Based on recommendations from experts, the government decided to undertake a comprehensive land re-survey, as it is essential for the successful implementation of the Act.“He noted that a pilot re-survey conducted in five villages covering 413 locations without proper survey maps had resolved nearly 95% of land-related disputes. He also recalled that Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy distributed new Pattadar Passbooks to farmers of Mulugumadu village on Friday.“Three-Phase Completion by March 2027“The Minister stated that the government aims to complete the statewide land re-survey in three phases by March 2027. Monthly video conferences will be held to monitor progress. As part of the first phase, 70 villages in each district have been selected for the re-survey.“He instructed officials to utilize the services of trained licensed surveyors in coordination with regular survey staff. However, he clarified that no assurance had been given regarding government employment or regularization for licensed surveyors. Surveyors engaged in the re-survey will receive ₹50 per acre, along with an additional ₹10 per acre towards transportation and other expenses, making a total of ₹60 per acre. He also directed officials to cancel the licences of surveyors who fail to report for duty within the stipulated time.“Review of Rejected Sadabainama Applications“The Minister observed that although the government had provided an opportunity under the Bhu Bharati Act to resolve 9.26 lakh pending Sadabainama applications from the Dharani period and addressed related High Court issues, a large number of applications were reportedly being rejected.“He instructed officials to identify the reasons for rejection, issue notices wherever required under the rules, and dispose of applications promptly. Referring to the recent Praja Darbar held in the Palair Assembly constituency, where 6,500 revenue-related grievances were received, he expressed confidence that nearly 98% of these issues could be permanently resolved through the land re-survey.“The Minister also directed officials to immediately resolve issues where entire survey numbers had been included in the 22A prohibited property list, even though only a portion of the land had been acquired for government purposes.“Priority to Families Living in Huts“The Minister instructed officials to expedite the completion of the first phase of Indiramma housing and warned that action would be taken against officials wherever construction had not commenced despite the release of funds.“He directed that pending 2BHK houses be handed over to beneficiaries in their present condition, with funds for the remaining works to be released subsequently. He also instructed officials to immediately complete the selection of beneficiaries for the second phase of Indiramma housing, giving top priority to families living in huts.“Further, he asked officials to ensure there is no shortage of sand and gravel for construction works. The Education Department was also directed to ensure that every student in government schools receives at least one set of school uniforms by August 15.

## Special Help Desk Opened to Address Difficulties in Filling Enumeration Forms

### One-Day Dharna at Jantar Mantar.

“Khammam District President and Secretary: “Nanabala Ramakrishna Yadav, Arvapalli Nagesh. “KHAMMAM, 11 JULY (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “The Telangana Working Journalists Federation (TWJF) has announced a "Telangana Journalists Chalo Parliament" programme on July 27, demanding that the Central Government immediately address long-pending issues concerning journalists. “Speaking to the media on Saturday, TWJF Khammam District President Nanabala Ramakrishna Yadav and District General Secretary Arvapalli Nagesh said the protest is being organized following a call from the state committee, led by State President Mamidi Somayya and General Secretary Tanneeru Srinivas. “As the



Parliament's Monsoon Session begins on July 20, the federation has decided to intensify its efforts to secure the fulfillment of several long-pending demands of journalists. A one-day dharna will be held at Jantar Mantar, New Delhi, near Parliament, on July 27. “Following the protest, representatives of the federation will meet Union Ministers and Members of Parliament to submit memorandums outlining their demands. “Journalists and TWJF leaders from all districts of Telangana are expected to participate in the programme. In addition, leaders of the Indian Federation of Working Journalists (IFWJ) from

Delhi, Uttar Pradesh, and other states will also join the protest. “The federation highlighted that the 50% railway fare concession previously provided to accredited journalists across the country for nearly 15 years was suspended during the COVID-19 pandemic and has not yet been restored. As a result, journalists continue to face financial difficulties while travelling. The federation demanded the immediate restoration of the railway concession scheme. “TWJF also urged the Central Government to establish a National Media Commission in place of the existing Press Council of India, considering the rapid expansion of electronic and digital media. “The federation further demanded the introduction of a National Pension Scheme for retired journalists, noting that while some state governments provide pensions, there is no uniform national pension policy for journalists. “Expressing concern over increasing attacks, murders, and false criminal cases against journalists in several states, the federation called for the enactment of a Journalists' Protection Act through Parliament. It also sought comprehensive legal recognition for the electronic and digital media sectors. “The TWJF appealed to journalists across Telangana to participate in large numbers in the "Chalo Parliament" programme on July 27 and make it a success.

## Complete the Sitarama Project at the Earliest: CPI Appeals to the Chief Minister.



“KHAMMAM, 11 JULY (INDIAN CHRONICLE): “The Khammam District Committee of the Communist Party of India (CPI) submitted a memorandum to Telangana Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, urging the government to expedite the completion of the Sitarama Irrigation Project, which is the primary lifeline for irrigation in the erstwhile Khammam district. “The CPI stated that the project was launched to provide irrigation to 2.5 lakh acres of new ayacut and to stabilize irrigation for 4.5 lakh acres existing ayacut in Khammam district. However, due to inadequate allocation of funds, the construction has been facing significant delays. “The party pointed out that the previous BRS government had spent around ₹9,000 crore on the project before the Congress government came to power.
