“Wardhannapet/Parvathagiri, July 12 (Indian Chronicle): Wardhannapet MLA and retired IPS officer K.R. BJP DEMNDS GOVT TO INCREASE MONTHLY HONORARIUM OF MID-DAY MEAL WORERS AS PROMISED

“Hyderabad, July 12 : Telangana State BJP President N Ramchander Rao today said in a bid to increase literacy rate, the central government introduced the highly prestigious Mid-Day Meal Scheme to ensure that underprivileged students studying in government schools across Telangana do not drop out due to financial constraints.” Rao attended the protest organized by the Mid-Day Meal Workers and Agencies Association at Indira Park Dharna Chowk in Hyderabad and expressed his full solidarity with the workers. He demanded that the state government immediately resolve the genuine demands of the 54,000 mid-day meal workers who are performing a sacred duty by feeding children.” BJP state chief criticized the congress government, noting it was unfortunate that despite coming to power by promising a monthly honorarium of Rs.10,000 to mid-day meal workers in its last election manifesto, it has failed to keep its word even after two and a half years in office. He expressed grief that workers are falling into debt because funds are still being released based on rates from a decade ago even as the prices of essential commodities, vegetables, and eggs are skyrocketing in the market. He lashed out at the government for not releasing even the current meager wage of Rs.3,000 on time and keeping it pending.” Rao demanded that the Rs.10,000 wage, which Chief Minister Revanth Reddy promised to increase since the day he took the oath, be credited immediately into the bank accounts of the workers along with all pending arrears.” He assured that he would personally write a letter to the Chief Minister on behalf of the BJP urging him to stand by the workers and fulfill their demands. On this occasion, he reassured the workers that no one needs to lose hope in this struggle, as the BJP would always stand by them to achieve their rights.

Man Arrested for Transporting Seven Wild Boars; Case Registered Under Wildlife Protection Act



“Khammam, Nelakondapalli, July 12 (Indian Chronicle): “A man was arrested for allegedly transporting seven wild boars illegally to Cheruvumadharam village in Nelakondapalli mandal for slaughter and sale of meat. Acting on a tip-off, local police reached the spot, detained the accused, and handed him over to the Forest Department for further action.” According to officials, the accused, identified as P. Nagaraju of Chilukuru in Suryapet district, transported the wild boars in a DCM vehicle from Medak during the early hours of Sunday. He allegedly brought the animals to Cheruvumadharam with the intention of slaughtering them and selling the meat. “Before police arrived, two of the wild boars had already been killed and preparations were underway to butcher them. On receiving information, Nelakondapalli Sub-Inspector P. Srinivasa Reddy rushed to the spot and took Nagaraju into custody.” Forest Department Deputy Ranger K. V. Rama Rao and Section Officer P. Daniel later inspected the site. The officials seized the accused, the DCM vehicle, the two dead wild boars, and the five surviving animals. “The carcasses of the two dead wild boars were sent to the Animal Husbandry Department for post-mortem examination and were later disposed of in accordance with official procedures. The five surviving wild boars were released into the Velugumatla forest. “A case has been registered against Nagaraju under the Wildlife Protection Act, and he has been remanded to judicial custody.

“Major Boost for Restoration of Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu

“HABSIGUDA, JULY 12 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): A ceremonial event was held to mark the commencement of restoration works for Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu, a vital water body serving the residents of Habsiguda and Ramanthapur divisions. The prestigious restoration project, being undertaken at an estimated cost of ₹19 crore, is expected to give the lake a new lease of life while significantly contributing to environmental conservation, improving groundwater levels, and enhancing the quality of life for people living in the surrounding areas. Speaking on the occasion, MLA Bandari Lakshma Reddy said that the restoration and protection of lakes have been given top priority as part of the overall development of the Uppal constituency. He stated that once the restoration is completed, the lake's water storage capacity will increase, groundwater levels will improve, and the project will play a key role in maintaining ecological balance. He further said that the lake surroundings would be beautified with greenery and public amenities, making it an attractive recreational destination for city residents. The MLA stressed that preserving neglected lakes and protecting them for future generations is a shared responsibility of society. Lakshma Reddy also reiterated his commitment to the comprehensive development of the constituency by improving infrastructure, drinking water supply, roads, drainage, education, and healthcare facilities. He expressed confidence that after the completion of the ₹19-crore restoration project, Ramanthapur Pedda Cheruvu would emerge as a model urban lake, attracting visitors while providing a healthy and pleasant environment for local residents. Congress Government Has Completely Failed to Provide Irrigation Water to Farmers: Former MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy



“Warangal/Khanapur, July 12 (Indian Chronicle): Former Narsampet MLA Peddi Sudarshan Reddy strongly criticized the Congress government during a media conference organized by the BRS Mandal Committee at Khanapur mandal headquarters on Sunday. “Speaking on the occasion, he alleged that the Congress party came to power by spreading misinformation about the Kaleshwaram Project. He criticized Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for using “rowdy and street language” against opposition leaders, stating that making inappropriate remarks against those demanding irrigation water for farmers was against democratic values. He further alleged that the Chief Minister was insulting retired engineers and intellectuals. “Peddi Sudarshan Reddy said that during the previous BRS government under K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR), when he served as MLA, several irrigation projects, including the Ramappa–Pakala and Ramappa–Rangayya Cheruvu projects, were brought into operation for the benefit of farmers in the Narsampet constituency. He claimed that these projects have the capacity to provide irrigation to thousands of acres with the press of a button, but accused the present Congress government and local MLA Donthi Madhava Reddy of failing to supply even nursery water to farmers. “He stated that despite scientists warning well in advance about the likely impact of El Niño, neither the state government nor the local MLA had taken any precautionary measures to ensure irrigation water for farmers. He recalled that during the previous BRS government, water was released for nurseries even when the Pakala Project had only 13 feet of water storage. He attributed this to the government's thorough understanding of project management and irrigation planning. “The former MLA alleged that although nearly one lakh cusecs of water were available in the Godavari River near the Devadula Project and Sammakka Barrage, the government's negligence had pushed farmers into drought-like conditions. He questioned why the motors at the Pakala Project had not been operated despite Ramappa Tank currently holding 26 feet of water. He also demanded an explanation as to why the motors were not started before May 31 and why sufficient water was not stored in the Pakala and Rangayya Cheruvu projects despite prior knowledge of the El Niño conditions. “He accused the local MLA of lacking any commitment to providing irrigation water to the constituency and alleged that no review meetings had been conducted regarding the irrigation projects. He further remarked that the MLA had not even visited the projects and lacked basic knowledge of how the pumping systems function. “Peddi Sudarshan Reddy said it was unfortunate that irrigation projects built with hundreds of crores of rupees were not being effectively utilized during drought conditions, calling it evidence of the MLA's inefficiency. He asserted that during the previous BRS regime, the irrigation infrastructure had been developed to ensure that Narsampet would not face drought even if other parts of Telangana did. He also accused leaders involved in the “sand mafia” of neglecting irrigation issues affecting farmers. “Demanding that the motors of the Pakala and Rangayya Cheruvu projects be switched on immediately, he warned that if irrigation water was not supplied by the following day, farmers would launch direct protests against the Congress government, the local MLA, and the officials concerned. He alleged that the government was deliberately delaying the operation of the motors to prevent the BRS from receiving credit. With the nursery sowing season nearing its end, he urged the local MLA to wake up from his “deep slumber” and take immediate steps to ensure justice for farmers. “Former ODCMS Chairman, the Mandal Party President, former MPP, former ZPTC members, mandal party leaders, cluster in-charges, sarpanches, former sarpanches, MPTCs, former MPTCs, village party presidents, leaders of affiliated organizations, and other senior party leaders participated in the programme.

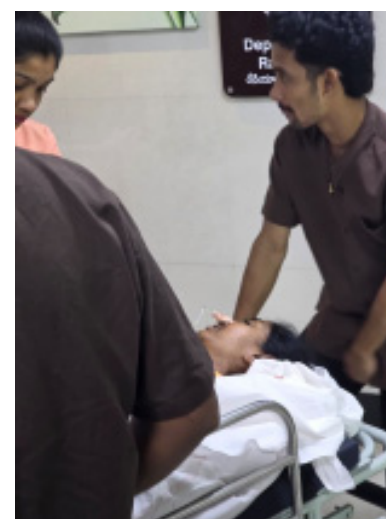
