

Hotels Dumping Food Waste in Open Areas Will Be Sealed: MMC Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy



“UPPAL, JULY 15 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Malakajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC) Commissioner T. Vinay Krishna Reddy, IAS, has warned that hotels disposing of food waste in open places or transporting it to cattle and pig farms in violation of government regulations will face stringent action, including sealing of their establishments if necessary. “On Wednesday, the Commissioner conducted surprise inspections at Suprabhat Hotel, Amaravathi Hotel near Habsiguda Crossroads, and nearby areas on Road No. 1. During the inspection, hotel staff informed him that leftover food waste was being handed over to operators of cattle and pig farms. “The Commissioner subsequently inspected a nearby cattle farm, where he found food waste collected from hotels being stored openly. Expressing serious concern, he said such practices pose a significant threat to public health and



contribute to foul odour, environmental pollution, and the spread of diseases. “He directed all hotels and restaurants to install in-situ biogas plants for scientific management of wet food waste or ensure that such waste is transported only to authorised waste processing facilities. “The Commissioner made it clear that hotels violating government norms by dumping food waste in open areas or supplying it to cattle and pig farms would face strict legal action, and their establishments would be sealed if required. “He urged all hotels, restaurants, and commercial establishments to fulfil their social responsibility by strictly adhering to government regulations on scientific solid waste management, thereby protecting public health and helping maintain a clean and hygienic city.

"1. 11 KV Habsiguda Feeder" Power supply will remain interrupted from 10:00 AM to 12:30 PM on the feeder emanating from the 33/11 KV NGRI Substation. "Affected Areas: New Foundland, Vikrampur, Nandanavanam Colony, Kakatiya Nagar Street No. 3, and the surrounding areas from the main road opposite the NGRI Substation up to Navkar Gold." "2. 11 KV Snehapuri Feeder" Power supply will remain interrupted from 2:30 PM to 5:00 PM on the feeder emanating from the 33/11 KV IICT Substation. "Affected Areas: Snehapuri, Srinagar Colony, VSTP Colony, Bhavani Nagar Streets No. 3, 4 and 5, and the stretch on Nacharam Main Road from the Battery Transformer (near HDFC Bank) up to Habsiguda Masjid." TGSCPDCL AE (Operations) V. Ganesh appealed to consumers in the affected areas to make necessary arrangements in advance to avoid inconvenience during the scheduled power shutdown.

He noted that the primary objectives of this program are to ensure voting rights for every eligible citizen, remove ineligible entries, and create an accurate, transparent, and error-free voter list.He informed us that the door-to-door enumeration process in the district is underway from June 25 to July 24. He mentioned that the distribution of enumeration forms at all polling stations has already been completed; currently, booth-level officers are visiting households to collect the filled-out forms and are rapidly proceeding with the digitization process.He revealed that as of July 15, out of a total of 996,198 voters in the district, 544,047 have submitted their enumeration forms, representing 54.61 percent of the total electorate. He added that the progress of form collection and digitization is being monitored on an hourly basis by the district election officer, electoral registration officers, and assistant electoral registration

VIJAYENDER REDDY Extends Support to School Correspondents Under the United Schools Protection Force Banner

“““UPPAL,KISHOR VADDEPALLI,JULY 15 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Private school managements in the Uppal area have expressed serious concern over recent incidents in which unidentified individuals allegedly entered school premises using fake identity cards while posing as members of private unions. According to the managements, these individuals intimidated staff members and



allegedly demanded money unlawfully.School authorities stated that such incidents have created fear among children aged 3 to 15 years, disrupting the academic environment and causing mental stress to both students and teachers.In response to these concerns, a delegation of private school correspondents, led by Vijayender Reddy, met Deputy Commissioner of Police Suresh Kumar and Assistant Commissioner of Police Venkata Reddy in Uppal and submitted a representation highlighting the issues faced by educational institutions.Following the meeting, the police issued several important guidelines. They clarified that no representatives of any student organization or other group would be permitted to enter school premises without prior authorization. Rama Rao has urged all eligible tuberculosis (TB) patients in Khammam district to avail the benefits of the Nikshay Poshan Yojana (NPY), a Central Government scheme implemented under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP). “The scheme provides financial assistance to TB patients to ensure they receive adequate nutrition during their treatment. An amount of ₹1,000 per month is credited directly to the beneficiary's bank account through the Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) system. As per government guidelines, patients receive ₹3,000 at the time of diagnosis and another ₹3,000 after completing 84 days of treatment, totaling ₹6,000. “Progress Report (2025–2026)“Achievements



in 2025: During 2025, the Central Government released ₹17 lakh for Khammam district. Financial assistance of ₹6,000 each was provided to 283 registered TB patients, helping them maintain proper nutrition, adhere to treatment, and recover faster. “Progress in 2026: For the current year (2026), the district has received ₹39.54 lakh, the highest allocation so far. “At present, 460 eligible TB patients have been identified, and the process of transferring funds to their bank accounts is expected to be completed by the end of this month. “In addition, proposals have been sent to the State TB Office seeking approval to release ₹3,000 each to 211 patients and ₹6,000 each to 324 patients. The funds will be transferred immediately after

approval. “Verification is also underway for 189 newly identified eligible TB patients, who will receive financial assistance once the process is completed. “DM&HO's Appeal“The District Medical and Health Department has appealed to all TB patients undergoing treatment in government or private hospitals across Khammam district to ensure their details are registered on the Nikshay Portal. “Patients are requested to submit their Aadhaar card and bank passbook details to local health workers or the nearest government health centre so that the financial assistance can be credited directly to their bank accounts. “Dr. D. Rama Rao called upon the public to extend their cooperation in making Khammam a TB-free district and encouraged TB patients to utilize the nutritional support scheme to improve their health and complete their treatment successfully.

Indiramma house construction work should be accelerated: Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanthi

“Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Indian Chronicle July 15):- District Collector Anurag Jayanthi has instructed the concerned officials to expedite the construction work of Indiramma houses being undertaken in the district and complete it within the stipulated time.
