Priority to Eligible Telangana Candidates for Judgeship in Telangana High Court Sought; Memorandum Submitted to Union Law Minister



“Khammam, July 17 Indian Chronicle: “Representatives of the Telangana Junior Advocates Association (TJAA), Federation of Legal Professionals, and Indian Mala Lawyers Association submitted a memorandum to Union Minister for Law and Justice Arjun Ram Meghwal, raising several key demands concerning the welfare of advocates and judicial appointments in Telangana. “The delegation included TJAA President Adv. Jakkula Vamsi Krishna, Federation of Legal Professionals President Adv. Talluri Dileep Chowdary, and Indian Mala Lawyers Association Secretary Sri Marri Prakash Rao. “Key Demands “Priority should be given to eligible and meritorious advocates and judicial officers belonging to Telangana in appointments as judges of the Telangana High Court. “Ensure adequate representation for BCs, SCs, STs, Minorities, and Women in judicial appointments. “Increase the monthly stipend under the Telangana Administration of Justice Training Scheme for junior advocates from ₹1,000 to ₹12,000. “Extend the training period under the scheme from three years to five years. “Introduce a centrally sponsored Junior Advocates Stipend Scheme across the country. “Launch a “Prime Minister Advocates Welfare Scheme” with an allocation of ₹500 crore for each state, providing health insurance, pension, accident insurance, financial assistance for junior advocates, and other welfare benefits. “Appoint Central Government Notaries in Telangana. “Speaking on the occasion, Adv. Jakkula Vamsi Krishna said that one of the primary objectives behind the formation of Telangana was to ensure equitable opportunities for the people of the state in all sectors. Division-Level Meeting Held for Fertilizer and Seed Dealers

“Manthani Peddapalli District, July 17 (Indian chronicle) : A division-level meeting of all fertilizer and seed dealers was conducted today under the supervision of the Agriculture Department. Mandal Agriculture Officers B. Ramakrishna



(Kamanpur), K. Srikanth (Ramagiri), Dr. D. Navya (Manthani), and all dealers from the division participated in the meeting.” “Addressing the gathering, Assistant Director of Agriculture (ADA) Anjani Mishra instructed all dealers not to sell fertilizers at inflated prices, especially in view of the possible impact of the El Niño conditions on farmers. She warned that strict legal action would be taken against any dealer found overcharging farmers.” “She further directed dealers to update the details of paddy seed purchasers on the online portal regularly and ensure the availability of seeds for rainfed crops such as green gram (moong), red gram (pigeon pea), and black gram (urd).” “The ADA also reiterated that the herbicide Paraquat is banned and instructed dealers not to sell it under any circumstances. She warned that legal action would be initiated against anyone violating the ban.” “In view of the prevailing drought-like conditions, farmers were advised to avoid cultivating paddy and instead opt for rainfed crops to minimize risks and ensure better crop sustainability.

Dryland Crops Are the Better Option: Agricultural Officer M. Radha

“Khammam Nelakondapalli, July 17 Indian Chronicle: “Considering the prevailing weather conditions, farmers should prefer cultivating dryland crops, said Nelakondapalli Mandal Agricultural Officer M. Radha.” “On Friday, awareness meetings were organized for farmers in the villages of Bodulabanda, Kattukacharam, Guvvalagudem, Rayagudem, Nachepalli, and Chennaram. Addressing the gatherings, M. Radha advised farmers to plan crop cultivation according to weather forecasts.” “She noted that rainfall has been significantly below normal and groundwater levels are rapidly declining. In view of the limited water availability, she urged farmers to avoid paddy cultivation and instead opt for dryland crops.” “She encouraged farmers to make use of the current opportunity by cultivating crops such as green gram (moong), red gram (pigeon pea), black gram (urad), sesame, fox-tail millet, and sorghum, which require comparatively less water.” “She further appealed to farmers to adopt suitable alternative crops in the present situation to reduce the risk of crop losses.” “The programme was attended by Bodulabanda Sarpanch Kattakola Nagarjuna, Agricultural Extension Officers B. Sirisha, Shiva, Srikanth, and Eswari, along with farmer representatives and others.



Fish Auction Held at Muthapuram Tank; Vasu Secures Rights for Rs 2.5 Lakh

Don't deprive small traders of their livelihood in the name of road widening: BJP

“Parkal, July 17 (Indian Chronicle): BJP leaders have urged officials to halt the eviction of small traders—who have been earning their livelihood in Parkal town for decades—unless proper rehabilitation is provided. To this effect, they submitted a representation to the Parkal Municipal Commissioner on Friday. “Speaking on the occasion, the leaders noted that local businesses had already suffered severe setbacks after Parkal failed to secure district status during the district reorganization process. They expressed concern that evicting small traders for road widening without making alternative arrangements would plunge many families into deeper financial distress. “They demanded that adequate rehabilitation be provided to every affected trader before road widening works commence. They emphasized that the government must allocate alternative commercial spaces to the traders and ensure the security of their livelihoods before initiating the project. “The BJP leaders warned that if any injustice is meted out to the affected traders, the party's Parkal town unit would stand by them and stage democratic protests to resolve their grievances. “BJP Parkal Town President Gajjala Niranjan and Hanamkonda District General Secretaries R.P. participated in the event. Don't Turn Kakatiya University into a Political Platform; Support Its Development: MLA Nayini

“Hanumakonda, July 17 (Indian Chronicle): Warangal West MLA Nayini Rajender Reddy appealed to all stakeholders not to turn Kakatiya University into a political platform but to work collectively towards transforming it into a centre of academic excellence for the benefit of students. He alleged that certain groups were provoking students for political gains and attempting to obstruct the university's development. The MLA made these remarks while speaking to the media during his visit to Kakatiya University on Friday. “He said that in the past, public representatives and officials had held several review meetings on the issues facing the university, prepared a comprehensive Detailed Project Report (DPR), and brought it to the attention of the Chief Minister. He added that during Chief Minister Revanth Reddy's visit to Warangal, the development of Kakatiya University was discussed as a priority. “The MLA urged students, faculty members, and officials to objectively assess the condition of the university over the past decade and compare it with the changes initiated after the Congress government assumed office. He alleged that those who had earlier misled the public through false campaigns and politically motivated protests were now creating obstacles to the university's development. “Referring to the proposed Integrated School, Nayini Rajender Reddy said that some groups were deliberately creating controversy around the project. He questioned why student organisations had not objected when land was allotted within the university campus for a substation, a bank, a police station, and other government departments, but were opposing a project that would directly benefit the university. “He further questioned why development works approved by the Executive Council (EC) were being obstructed. He pointed out that while issues such as irregularities in the university mess and recurring problems in the canteens had not attracted similar protests, development initiatives were being opposed for political reasons. He also alleged that delays in securing funds and implementing development projects were due to the negligence of the Vice-Chancellor, adding that important issues such as the regularisation of teaching and non-teaching staff were still pending. “The MLA accused certain student organisations affiliated with the BRS and BJP of pursuing political agendas instead of addressing the genuine concerns of students. Although efforts had been made to resolve issues through discussions with all student organisations, some groups were deliberately refusing to cooperate, he said. “Criticising the BRS over the Mamunoor Airport project, Nayini Rajender Reddy said the party had no moral right to claim credit. He alleged that despite being in power for ten years, the



previous government failed to secure the necessary approvals, technical clearances, and implementation of the project. He stated that it was only after the Congress government came to power that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy took the initiative to engage with the Central Government and revive the long-pending airport project. Claiming credit now, he said, reflected political opportunism. “The MLA warned that if officials continued to act irresponsibly, legal action should be taken against them and, if necessary, he would lead a public movement on behalf of the people. He also suggested that Kakatiya University should have a public representatives' monitoring mechanism similar to the one in place at Osmania University. Reiterating the Congress government's commitment, he said the objective was to develop Kakatiya University into a centre of knowledge and learning rather than a political arena. “Later, Nayini Rajender Reddy felicitated Pulla Srinivas, who recently assumed charge as Joint Director, and Peddamalla Srinivas, who took charge as Head of the Department, and congratulated them on their new responsibilities.

Priority Sought for Telangana Lawyers in High Court Judge Appointments

Telangana Advocates Submit Memorandum to Union Law Minister



“Hyderabad, July 17 (Indian Chronicle): Representatives of the Telangana Junior Advocates Association(TJAA), the Federation of Legal Professionals(FOLP), and the Indian Mala Lawyers Association(IMLA) have urged the Union Minister of State(Independent Charge) for Law and Justice, Arjun Ram Meghwal, to give priority to qualified and meritorious advocates from Telangana in appointments to the Telangana High Court. A delegation led by TJAA President Advocate Jakkula Vamsi Krishna, along with FOLP President Advocate Talluri Dileep Chowdary and IMLA representative Advocate Marri Prakash Rao, met the Union Minister in New Delhi and submitted a memorandum highlighting several key demands. The advocates urged the Centre to ensure social justice in the recommendation and appointment of High Court judges by providing adequate representation to qualified candidates belonging to OBC, SC, ST, minority communities, and women. They stated that one of the primary objectives behind the formation of Telangana was to ensure rights, opportunities, and fair representation for local people. Providing deserving advocates from Telangana with opportunities to serve as High Court judges, they said, would further strengthen public confidence in the judicial system. The delegation also requested the Central Government to establish a ₹500-crore Advocates' Welfare Corpus Fund for the welfare of lawyers across the country, provide health insurance cards to all advocates, and implement a stipend scheme for young advocates to ensure financial security during the initial years of legal practice. According to the representatives, Union Law Minister Arjun Ram Meghwal assured them that the issues raised in the memorandum would be examined.

Land Re-Survey Must Be Conducted Transparently and Comprehensively: Khammam Collector Divakar T.S



...Khammam/Tirumalayapalem, July 17 Indian Chronicle: "Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S. has directed officials to conduct the state's prestigious Land Re-Survey programme in a comprehensive, transparent, and rule-based manner. He stressed that land boundaries must be identified only in the presence of the concerned landowners and farmers to prevent future disputes. "During his visit to the Palair Assembly constituency on Saturday, the Collector inspected the ongoing land re-survey works at Kakaravai village in Tirumalayapalem mandal. He interacted directly with farmers, sought their feedback on the survey process, patiently listened to their concerns, and clarified their doubts on the spot. "Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. instructed officials to ensure that every pattadar's land is surveyed in the presence of the respective landowners and that boundaries are accurately demarcated. He emphasized that every detail should be recorded strictly according to government rules to avoid future land-related disputes and that there should be no scope for errors during the survey process. "The Collector said it is the responsibility of officials to create complete awareness among the public about the land re-survey programme. He directed them to promptly address every query raised by villagers, build confidence among farmers, regularly update land records, and adopt modern technological standards to ensure quality and accuracy in the survey. "He further instructed Revenue and Survey Department officials to work in close coordination to successfully implement the programme, stating that the state government's primary objective is to provide transparent, efficient, and farmer-friendly land services. Every farmer, he said, should receive accurate and reliable land records. "Later, the Collector also inspected the Sitarama Project tunnel construction works at Beerole in Tirumalayapalem mandal. "The inspection was attended by RDO Srinivas, Tahsildar Wilson, Irrigation DE Ramesh Reddy, Deputy Tahsildar Sudheer, Survey Department officials, Revenue staff, and other officials.

School Enrollment Drive Should Achieve Target; Teacher Training from July 20

...Khammam Nelakondapalli, July 17 Indian Chronicle: "Nelakondapalli Mandal Education Officer (MEO) B. Chalapathi Rao has urged school authorities to achieve the government's target under the Badi Bata (School Enrollment Drive) programme. "Addressing a meeting of government primary school headmasters at the Mandal Educational Resource Centre (MRC) on Friday, he said the mandal has been assigned a target of enrolling 3,090 students. So far, 2,892 students have been enrolled, achieving 94% of the target. "He called upon all headmasters and teachers to work in coordination to surpass the government's 100% enrollment target. Special focus should be given to schools that have achieved less



than 50% of their enrollment target, and an action plan has been prepared for this purpose. "The MEO expressed confidence that the mandal would achieve full enrollment and emerge as a model in the district. "He also announced that teacher training programmes will commence from July 20. The training will be conducted in two batches, with each batch undergoing three days of training. "Government school headmasters including Koteswara Rao, G. Nageswara Rao, Rama Rao, and others attended the meeting.

Auto driver commits suicide due to debt burden; Government must support the bereaved family... BRTU, NTAU

...Hanamkonda, July 17 (Indian Chronicle): BRTU District President Gone Yuvaraju and Nava Telangana Auto Union District President Kandikonda Srinivas have urged the state government to provide immediate financial assistance to the family of an auto driver who reportedly committed suicide due to mounting debt.



Following the death of Puppala Devender, an auto driver from Ayodhya Nagar village, union leaders paid tribute by garlanding his portrait on Friday and expressed their deepest condolences to the bereaved family. "Speaking on the occasion, they alleged that the state government's 'Mahalakshmi Scheme' has severely impacted the livelihoods of auto drivers, forcing many to incur debts to meet family expenses. They noted that many drivers are resorting to suicide as they are unable to repay these debts. They criticized the government, stating that over 800 auto drivers have committed suicide since the Congress government came to power and that government policies are responsible for this situation. "The leaders also pointed out that the promised livelihood allowance for auto drivers has not yet been implemented. They demanded that the government announce an

ex-gratia (compensation) of ₹10 lakh and provide immediate financial aid to the family of the deceased, Puppala Devender. "Tokala Karunakar, Madipeddi Ramesh, Chi. Raju, G. Ramesh, M. Raju, Devender, and N. participated in the event. Somla, J. Srinivas, N. Kumar, Sambaiah, and others participated.

Farmers Should Shift to Alternative Crops Due to El Niño Impact: Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S.

“Adopt short-duration crops based on available water resources to minimize losses” Collector visits Pocharam village in Kusumanchi mandal to create awareness among farmers on El Niño impact



“Khammam/Kusumanchi, July 17 Indian Chronicle: “Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S. has advised farmers to shift towards short-duration and alternative crops based on the availability of water resources, as El Niño condi-

tions are likely to result in below-normal rainfall. “As part of an awareness initiative, the Collector visited agricultural fields in Pocharam village of Kusumanchi mandal under the Palair Assembly constituency to interact directly with farmers and address their concerns over the prevailing dry conditions. He urged them to opt for alternative crops instead of paddy to reduce the risk of crop losses. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said farmers should assess the water availability in their borewells before deciding on cultivation. Since the district has received significantly lower rainfall from June until now, pressure on groundwater resources is expected to increase. Therefore, farmers should reduce the area under water-intensive crops and instead cultivate short-duration crops requiring less irrigation. “He noted that the El Niño phenomenon may lead to deficient rainfall and advised farmers to prefer rainfed and drought-tolerant crops over paddy. As reservoir water levels remain low, the district administration is conducting awareness programmes to prevent farmers from suffering losses due to paddy cultivation. “The Collector also clarified that there is no shortage of urea in the district and sufficient stocks are available. Seeds for alternative dryland crops are readily available, and farmers should make full use of them. “He further advised farmers to adopt short-duration, drought-resistant crop varieties suitable for delayed monsoon conditions. Farmers should strictly follow the recommendations of Agriculture Department officials and embrace scientific farming practices instead of relying solely on traditional cultivation methods. “Emphasizing efficient water management, the Collector called upon farmers to conserve every drop of water and explore cultivation of vegetables and other high-income crops that require less water and offer better returns within a shorter period. “The programme was attended by Kusumanchi Tahsildar D. Saidulu, Mandal Agriculture Officer R. Vani, other officials, and local farmers.

Minorities Protest Demanding Return of Land Allocated for Shadi Khana

“Hanamkonda, July 17 (Indian Chronicle): Minority leaders and local residents staged a protest on Friday, demanding the return of land that had previously been allocated for the construction of a Shadi Khana (wedding hall) opposite the Numaish Mosque in Hanamkonda. The protesters sat on the main road and raised slogans against the government. “They alleged that the Congress government had taken back the land originally allotted to their community. Police detained the protesting minority leaders and shifted them to the Hanamkonda police station, where they continued their protest. “Reacting to the incident, former Government Chief Whip and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar condemned the arrest of the protesters. He termed it unjust to arrest minority members who were fighting for land legally allocated to them. He spoke to the Hanamkonda ACP over the phone and demanded their immediate release. “Subsequently, lawyers from the BRS legal cell arrived at the police station and provided legal assistance to the detained protesters. The police later released them. “After their release, the minority leaders declared that they would continue their struggle until the land allocated for the Shadi Khana was handed back to the minority community. Create Extensive Awareness Among Farmers on Alternative Crops: District Collector Divakar T.S

“Officials asked to reduce paddy cultivation in view of El Niño conditions “Increase vegetable cultivation to meet local demand “

Each AEO should encourage cultivation of vegetables, pulses, and millets on at least 50 acres

“Khammam, July 17 – Indian Chronicle “District Collector Divakar T.S. has directed Agriculture Department officials to create widespread awareness among farmers on the cultivation of alternative crops in view of the prevailing drought-like conditions during the current agricultural season. “The Collector issued these directions while reviewing alternative crop cultivation with officials from the Agriculture, Horticulture, Fisheries, and other allied departments at a meeting held in the Collectorate on Friday. “Addressing the officials, the Collector said that rainfall during the current season has been below normal, groundwater levels are steadily declining, and water storage in tanks is also inadequate. Under these circumstances, he instructed officials not to encourage water-intensive crops such as paddy and cotton, but instead to conduct extensive field-level awareness programmes to motivate farmers to shift towards suitable alternative crops. “He directed officials to prepare a Mandal-wise action plan to reduce the area under paddy cultivation by at least 25 percent compared to last year and promote alternative crops. He emphasized that every official should work responsibly to achieve this target. “The Collector also instructed officials to prepare a comprehensive plan assessing Khammam city's daily vegetable requirement, the regions currently supplying vegetables, and the extent to which local farmers can meet the demand. “He called for special measures to significantly increase the area under vegetable cultivation across the district and encouraged farmers to take up crops requiring less water. Officials were also instructed to identify crops that are less susceptible to monkey menace and advise farmers accordingly, besides ensuring the timely availability of quality seeds. “The Collector directed every Agricultural Extension Officer (AEO) to prepare an action plan to encourage farmers within their jurisdiction to cultivate vegetables, pulses, and millets on at least 50 acres, thereby achieving the prescribed targets. “He also instructed officials to prepare and submit a comprehensive report on the extent of cultivation under canal irrigation and borewells in each Mandal, along with the current status of groundwater availability. This information should be disseminated to farmers at the village level so they can make informed decisions on crop selection based on water availability. “The Collector advised that even farmers with their own borewells should take up paddy cultivation only if they are confident of having sufficient water throughout the crop season. Otherwise, they should be informed about the risk of crop failure due to water scarcity during the later stages of cultivation. “He further directed officials to continuously monitor fertilizer stocks across the district and ensure that fertilizers are supplied to farmers in adequate quantities and on time. Officials were instructed to review stock positions regularly, prevent shortages, and coordinate effectively to ensure uninterrupted availability of fertilizers to every farmer in the district. “The meeting was attended by District Agriculture Officer D. Pullaiah, District Animal Husbandry Officer Dr. B. Purandhar, DCO Gangadhar, Horticulture Officer Anita, officials from the Fisheries Department, Agriculture and Horticulture Divisions, Mandal-level officers, and other concerned officials.
