

Do not let even a single acre wither this Kharif season; stand by farmers with Devadula water: MLA Kadiyam Srihari

“Hanamkonda, June 30 (Indian Chronicle): Amidst drought-like conditions, Station Ghanpur MLA Kadiyam Srihari directed officials to work in coordination to ensure that every farmer in the erstwhile Warangal district receives irrigation water through the Devadula Lift Irrigation Scheme. He emphasized the need for proactive measures to prevent even a single acre of crop from withering during the Kharif season. “He participated in a review meeting held with officials from Hanamkonda and Mulugu districts at the Irrigation Department Chief Engineer's office in Chintagattu, Hanamkonda. During the meeting, he comprehensively reviewed the current drought situation, irrigation water supply via the Devadula scheme, reservoir management, and preparedness for the Kharif season. “Kadiyam Srihari noted that the lack of expected rainfall in June has adversely affected rain-fed agriculture. He stressed that supplying irrigation water through the Devadula and Godavari Lift Irrigation Schemes is crucial

to prevent farmers from facing hardships. Recalling the pivotal role played by the Godavari Lift Irrigation Scheme in achieving record crop yields in Jangaon district during the previous Rabi season, he instructed officials to adopt a similar proactive planning approach for water distribution during this Kharif season. He directed that the motors for Phases I, II, and III of the Devadula Lift Irrigation Scheme be operated continuously for one month starting July 1 to ensure water supply to the reservoirs. He also instructed that water be released through canals to the ayacut lands from July 15 and that reservoirs, tanks, and ponds be filled to their maximum possible capacity. “The MLA advised officials to implement a robust plan to ensure water reaches every part of the ayacut area, to strengthen field-level monitoring, and to continuously review the situation. He urged them to effectively utilize available resources, technical capabilities, and personnel to over-



come the challenges posed by drought conditions. “Reiterating that protecting farmers' crops during the Kharif season is the government's top priority, he called

upon officials to work in coordination to ensure that irrigation water from the Devadula project reaches every farmer's field.

KUDA Land Auction Must Be Cancelled

Ready to Take Oath at Bhadrakali Temple: Marri Yadav Reddy Hanamkonda, June 30 (Indian Chronicle): Former KUDA Chairman Marri Yadav Reddy challenged Congress leaders to prove their integrity over the recent Kakatiya Urban Development Authority (KUDA) land auction, alleging large-scale irregularities and demanding that the auction be cancelled. "Addressing the media along with BRS leaders on Tuesday at the KUDA auction site behind the Press Club in Balasamudram, Marri Yadav Reddy said the two-acre and 27-gunta land parcel auctioned by KUDA on June 21 had caused a loss of nearly 50 crore to the authority. He alleged that land with a market value of around ₹1.5 lakh per square yard was auctioned for only ₹66,000 to ₹69,000 per square yard, indicating the existence of a syndicate behind the bidding process. "He said the BRS had raised allegations of corruption in the auction, but instead of responding to those charges, those holding responsible positions resorted to making personal remarks against him and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar. "Throwing an open challenge, Marri Yadav Reddy said he was ready to take an oath before Goddess Bhadrakali after a ritual bath if corruption had indeed taken place in the auction. He challenged Congress leaders to do the same if they believed the auction had been conducted honestly, asking them to accept the challenge on Friday and prove their integrity. "He further alleged that prospective bidders were threatened using the name of MLA Nayani Rajender Reddy and were discouraged from participating in the auction. He questioned whether bidders had been asked to negotiate directly with the MLA and alleged that the reduced auction prices had resulted in a loss of nearly ₹50 crore to KUDA. He demanded immediate cancellation of the auction and called for either a judicial commission or a CBI inquiry into the matter. "Marri Yadav Reddy said the BRS was not opposed to development but wanted government land to be utilised for public welfare. He suggested constructing an integrated school or a commercial complex that would generate regular revenue instead of transferring valuable public land to influential individuals for private benefit. "Referring to criticism by Hanamkonda District Congress Committee President and KUDA Chairman Inagala Venkatram Reddy, Marri Yadav Reddy questioned his political credibility, stating that he had never been elected as an MLA, unlike four-time MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar. He alleged that Venkatram Reddy



was making baseless accusations only to please MLA Nayani Rajender Reddy and warned him against making what he described as irresponsible remarks. He also said that the transfer of funds between government departments was a routine administrative process and accused Venkatram Reddy of speaking without adequate knowledge of governance. "He reiterated that instead of making allegations against the opposition, Congress leaders should accept the challenge, take the oath at the Bhadrakali Temple, order an inquiry into the auction, and cancel the auction if irregularities were established. He claimed that the BRS was prepared to produce evidence regarding alleged threats and inducements made to bidders. "Former Corporator Jorika Ramesh also alleged that the KUDA auction was conducted at prices far below the prevailing market value and demanded that the auction be cancelled. He said the BRS supported development but opposed the alleged misuse of valuable government land. "Former Minority Commission member Darshan Singh, former Deputy Mayor Sirajuddin, senior leaders Narlagiri Ramesh, Nayeemuddin, Ramamurthy, Ramesh, Krishna, and Venu, former corporators Udatala Sarangapani, Mekala Babu Rao, Soda Kiran, and Sanku Narsinga Rao, along with Pushpa, Sadanth, Ramchander, Shekhar, Khalil, Ismail, Rajesh, Takkallapalli Vinil Rao, Shyam Reddy, Dr. Kanjarla Manoj Kumar, Feroz, SK Mahmood, Ghouse Khan, Koteshwar Rao, and other BRS leaders participated in the programme.

Surgical Crisis in Government Hospitals TGMSITC payment dues halt supplies; patients suffer at Osmania, Gandhi and Niloufer Hospitals

“Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 30:”“A severe shortage of surgical supplies has reportedly hit major government hospitals across Telangana, causing serious hardship to poor patients who depend on free treatment. The disruption is said to have been caused by pending payments to suppliers by the Telangana Government Medical Services and Infrastructure Development Corporation (TGMSITC), resulting in the suspension of the supply of nearly 80 per cent of essential surgical items.”Leading government hospitals, including Osmania General Hospital, Gandhi Hospital, Niloufer Hospital, Nayapul Maternity Hospital, Sultan Bazar Maternity Hospital, Koti ENT Hospital and Sarojini Devi Eye Hospital, are reportedly facing shortages of essential consumables such as IV cannulas, syringes, catheters, feeding tubes, surgical gloves, plaster materials, bandages, X-ray and CT scan films, surgical blades, sutures and laboratory disposables.”The situation is said to be more critical in super-specialty departments. Essential items required for life-saving surgeries—including heart valves and oxygenators for cardiothoracic procedures, DJ stents and guidewires for urology, bone plates and screws for orthopaedic surgeries, spinal implants and neuro shunts for neurosurgery, anaesthesia consumables, and dialysis materials for nephrology—are reportedly unavailable, affecting patient care.”As a result, several surgeries are allegedly being postponed, while in many cases patients’ families are being asked to purchase costly surgical materials from private medical stores, placing a heavy financial burden on economically weaker sections.”Although hospital authorities have maintained that there is no shortage of medicines, the reported non-availability of essential surgical consumables has emerged as a major concern. Patients and their attendants have urged the State Government and the Health Department to immediately clear the pending TGMSITC dues, restore the supply of surgical materials, and ensure uninterrupted treatment in government hospitals.

CM announces fresh Rythu Bharosa assistance; Collector joins live telecast

District-level screening held at Kothapalli as Chief Minister reiterates government's focus on farmers' welfare.

Srija and Trainee Collector Paras Kumar, conducted a review meeting at the Collectorate on Tuesday with officials of the Social Welfare, Tribal Welfare, BC Welfare, and Minority Welfare departments, as well as Residential Care Officers (RCOs), to assess hostel management, infrastructure, and student welfare. “During the meeting, the Collector instructed officials to ensure the availability of essential facilities such as safe drinking water, electricity, toilets, dormitories, furniture, kitchens, dining halls, and security arrangements in all hostels. Considering the ongoing monsoon season, he emphasized the need to inspect hostel buildings and undertake immediate repairs wherever required. “He directed officials to conduct surprise inspections of hostels, identify deficiencies promptly, and submit reports. Welfare department officials were instructed to address issues without delay to ensure that students do not face any inconvenience. “The Collector also stressed the importance of coordinating with the Electricity Department to implement measures that would help government educational institutions achieve zero electricity bills. He further instructed officials to construct soak pits to prevent problems related to kitchen waste, toilet waste, and wastewater management. “Referring to the successful improvements made in schools under the “Amma Adarsha Pathashala” programme, he asked officials to submit proposals for funds required for hostel repairs. He directed each welfare department to identify one hostel in poor condition in every Assembly constituency and submit proposals for funds to comprehensively renovate and upgrade those facilities. “As the monsoon season continues, the Collector called for all necessary precautionary measures, including the installation of wire mesh on doors and windows, repair of toilets, and steps to prevent water stagnation. “On food safety, he stated that there should be no scope for food poisoning incidents anywhere in the district and warned that strict action would be taken if any such incident occurs. “The Collector also instructed officials to map hostels located near the Young India Integrated School. After the completion of the admission process in welfare hostels, applications received through grievance mechanisms for admissions and transfers should be considered against available vacant seats, he said. “District BC and Social Welfare Officer G. Jyothi, Tribal Welfare Deputy Director Vijayalakshmi, District Minority Welfare Officer Mujahid, RCOs of various departments, Electricity Department AO K. Sridhar, and other officials attended the meeting.

Urea Distribution to Farmers Made Transparent Through Urea App: District Collector Divakar T.S

Adequate Urea Stocks Available in the District; No Shortage for Kharif Crop Cultivation

Collector Inspects Fertilizer Godowns and Sales Centers in Chinthakani Mandal

“Khammam, June 30 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar T.S. has assured farmers that sufficient urea stocks are available across Khammam district and there is no shortage of fertilizers for the ongoing Kharif season. “The Collector stated that the district administration is closely monitoring fertilizer stocks to ensure the availability of urea at all cooperative society godowns and sales points. A total of 18,832.34 metric tonnes of urea has been received in the district and, along with previous stock, the total available quantity stands at 24,903.7 metric tonnes. Of this, 6,071.13 metric tonnes has been sold so far. “On Tuesday, the Collector conducted a surprise inspection of fertilizer warehouses and sales centers of the Nagulavancha Primary Agricultural Cooperative Credit Society in Chinthakani Mandal. He examined the stocks of urea and other fertilizers, verified stock registers, and reviewed the quantities received, distributed, and pending for supply. He also interacted with Agriculture Department officials to assess stock management and distribution. “The Collector personally checked the functioning of the Urea Booking App on farmers’ mobile phones and explained its benefits to them. “Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. said that adequate fertilizer stocks are available to meet the requirements of farmers during the Kharif season and urged them not to worry about the availability of urea. He noted that the Urea Booking App being implemented in Telangana has also been adopted by other states for fertilizer distribution and has proven effective without causing inconvenience to farmers. He recalled that the system was successfully implemented during the previous Rabi season. “The Collector emphasized that the booking app helps prevent diversion of fertilizers and ensures transparent and systematic distribution of urea. He advised farmers not to be misled by misconceptions regarding the app, adding that stock details of both the district and individual mandals can be accessed through the application. “He also stressed the need to create awareness among farmers about the benefits of Nano Urea as an alternative fertilizer. Farmers were encouraged to use Nano Urea on a trial basis and evaluate its results themselves. However, he warned fertilizer dealers against forcing farmers to purchase Nano Urea or any other products. Strict action will be taken against those who compel farmers to buy products other than the fertilizers they require, he said. “The Collector further advised farmers to use fertilizers and pesticides only in recommended quantities and to follow the guidance



of agricultural scientists and department officials for better crop management. “District Agriculture Officer Pullaiah, District Cooperative Officer Gangadhar, Chinthakani Tahsildar Kilari Babji, MPDO Srinivasa Rao, Agriculture Department officials, and others participated in the inspection.

Inter-State Robbery Gang Busted; Three Arrested in Hyderabad

“Indian Chronicle, Secunderabad, June 30: “The Chilkalguda Police have arrested three alleged members of an inter-State robbery gang, including its alleged kingpin Darla Nehemya alias “Bruce Lee”, in connection with a robbery reported in Bhoiguda. A juvenile in conflict with law was also apprehended in the case. “According to the police, the victim, C. Raj Kumar, a labourer from Jawahar Nagar in Musheerabad, was allegedly intercepted by four persons near Flora Hotel in Bhoiguda on June 22. The accused reportedly assaulted him, robbed him of



his Redmi A3X mobile phone and ₹6,000 in cash, and later abandoned him near the Alagadda Bavi railway underpass. “Following the complaint, the Chilkalguda Crime Team launched an investigation under the supervision of Secunderabad Zone DCP Rakshita Krishnamurthy, IPS. Based on CCTV footage and technical evidence, the police identified and arrested the

accused. “Police said the prime accused, Darla Nehemya (30), a native of Hubballi in Karnataka, has a criminal record involving more than 65 cases registered in Telangana, Andhra Pradesh and Karnataka, including cases of murder, attempt to murder, robbery and house burglary. Investigators alleged that he recruited associates while lodged in Chanchalguda Central Prison and formed a gang after his release earlier this month. “The other arrested accused have been identified as Dara Ashwanth (27) and Nithin Francis alias Babloo (22). Police also apprehended a juvenile allegedly involved in the offences. “During the operation, the police recovered the victim’s mobile phone, a Honda Activa scooter and ₹2.25 lakh in cash allegedly linked to a house burglary in Meerpeta. The accused were produced before a court in Secunderabad and remanded to judicial custody, while the juvenile was produced before the Juvenile Justice Board. “Commending the investigating team led by Chilkalguda SHO V. Ramakrishna and Detective Inspector L. Madhubabu, Secunderabad Zone DCP Rakshita Krishnamurthy said the city police would continue to adopt a zero-tolerance approach towards organised property crimes. She cautioned that habitual offenders would face stringent legal action, including proceedings under the Preventive Detention (PD) Act, wherever warranted.
