MIM trying to hijack SIR exercise in Hyderabad, alleges Congress leader Waliullah Sameer

Congress leader urges ECI inquiry into alleged political interference in Hyderabad SIR process.

“Hyderabad, July 1: Congress senior leader Mohammed Waliullah Sameer on Wednesday alleged that the All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) was trying to hijack the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR) exercise in Hyderabad by interfering with the official process meant to be carried out only by authorised election staff. “Sameer, who is the Congress Incharge for Hyderabad Lok Sabha constituency and former president of the Hyderabad District Congress Committee, said several complaints had been received from different parts of Hyderabad that SIR-related forms and voter information were allegedly being handled, distributed or collected by unauthorised persons, including individuals reportedly associated with AIMIM. “He said the Election Commission of India had clearly instructed Booth Level Officers (BLOs) to personally visit households, hand over enumeration forms to electors, guide them in filling the forms and ensure that the entire exercise remained under the direct supervision of the authorised election machinery. However, he alleged that this procedure was not being followed uniformly in several localities. “Sameer said complaints indicated that BLOs were not conducting proper door-to-door visits in some areas and were instead asking voters to visit schools, community halls, function halls, private premises or other local points to collect or submit forms. He said such a practice defeated the purpose of household-level verification and caused hardship to senior citizens, women, persons with disabilities, working people and others who may not be able to visit such locations during fixed hours. “He alleged that an emerging pattern was visible in several areas where persons reportedly linked to AIMIM were handling or controlling SIR-related forms and directing voters to party-linked persons or locations. “This has created a serious apprehension that the official SIR process is being politically influenced and, in effect, hijacked by unauthorised political elements in certain areas,” he said. “Sameer said the SIR process involved sensitive details such as voter identity, addresses, family information and other electoral data. Any unauthorised access to such material, he

said, could undermine public confidence in the revision process and may result in genuine voters being left out, wrongly marked, pressured, misled or discouraged from participating. “He said the role of Booth Level Agents of political parties was limited to assisting the verification process as permitted under Election Commission guidelines. BLAs, he said, could not replace BLOs, take custody of official forms, collect completed forms independently, decide voter status or function as a parallel election authority. “The responsibility for the SIR exercise must remain exclusively with BLOs and the authorised election machinery. No political worker, private individual or local intermediary should be allowed to keep, distribute, collect or control SIR forms or voter data,” Sameer said. “He urged the Election Commission of India and the Chief Electoral Officer of Telangana to issue clear instructions to all BLOs in Hyderabad to conduct strict door-to-door visits and personally hand over and collect SIR-related forms. He also demanded that senior election officials verify complaints from areas where deviations from the prescribed procedure had been reported. “Sameer further demanded that any SIR-related forms, records or voter material kept outside official custody be recovered immediately. He said disciplinary action should be taken against any BLO or election functionary found to have delegated official duties to unauthorised persons or failed to conduct proper household verification. “He also requested the authorities to provide police protection or administrative support to BLOs wherever required so that they could perform their duties independently and without political pressure. “The credibility of the electoral roll depends on the fairness, transparency and neutrality of the revision process. Any perception that official forms or voter information are being handled by political workers will seriously damage public confidence in the SIR exercise,” Sameer said. “He urged the Election Commission to treat the matter as urgent and initiate corrective action across Hyderabad to ensure that every eligible voter was protected and the SIR process was conducted strictly in accordance with the Election Commission’s instructions. Erroneous Loan Notice Shocks Farmer in Nelakondapalli

“Khammam Nelakondapalli, July 01 (Indian chronicle): “A resident of Rayagudem village under the Nelakondapalli Primary Agricultural Cooperative Credit Society was left stunned after receiving repeated loan recovery notices for a cattle loan he claims he never availed. “According to the victim, Kosuri Rajababu had earlier taken a loan from the cooperative society to purchase a two-wheeler. While he has repaid most of that loan, with only a small balance remaining, he was instead served multiple notices demanding repayment of ₹74,329, including interest, for an alleged loan taken to purchase a cow. “The notices warned that recovery proceedings, including seizure of assets, would be initiated if the amount was not paid. Shocked by the claim, Rajababu approached the society officials on Wednesday and questioned why notices had been issued for a non-existent loan. “Former society director Polampalli Nageswara Rao accompanied the complainant to meet Society Chairman Theega Ramanayya and lodged a formal complaint regarding the issue. “Following discussions with the secretary and staff, and after examining the records, the chairman stated that the notices had been issued due to a technical error. Journalists Submit Complaint to I&PR Commissioner Alleging Harassment and Vindictive Actions by Medchal DPRO

"Medchal, July 01(INDIAN CHRONICLE)"A group of journalists from Medchal-Malkajgiri district on Wednesday submitted a formal complaint to Information and Public Relations (I&PR) Commissioner Mukunda Reddy and Joint Director Jagan, seeking an inquiry into the alleged harassment and vindictive actions of Medchal District Public Relations Officer (DPRO) Swarnalatha. In their complaint, the journalists alleged that the DPRO has been acting in a biased and arbitrary manner, particularly in the constitution of the District Accreditation Committee and the issuance of journalist accreditation cards. They stated that undue preference was given to a particular community and a single journalists' union while constituting the Accreditation Committee, ignoring fair representation. They further pointed out that several newspapers had already published reports highlighting irregularities in the committee's formation and requested a thorough inquiry into the matter. The complainants also alleged that the DPRO has been deliberately targeting journalists during the accreditation process by creating unnecessary hurdles and behaving discourteously. They stated that despite newspapers fulfilling the eligibility criteria under Government Order (G.O.) No. 252 and submitting applications through their



authorized representatives, there has been an inordinate delay in issuing accreditation cards. The journalists further alleged that even the accreditation cards already approved have not been distributed, causing serious inconvenience. They also claimed that bus pass approvals linked to accredited journalists are being withheld without justification as part of vindictive actions. The complaint also stated that the DPRO lacks adequate professional knowledge in issuing official press releases, resulting in errors that create difficulties for journalists. They alleged that instead of addressing shortcomings pointed out by media persons, the officer has resorted to personal vendetta against those who questioned her functioning. The journalists emphasized that Medchal-Malkajgiri, being one of the largest districts adjacent to Hyderabad, requires an efficient and competent DPRO to effectively publicize the State Government's welfare and development programmes. They urged the Commissioner to conduct a fair inquiry into the allegations and initiate appropriate action against the DPRO. Journalists' union leaders including Merugu Chandramohan, Belide Ashok Gupta, Muthyam Mukesh Goud, Vasu Kumar, and Venugopal Reddy, among others, were present while submitting the complaint.
