RTC Retired Employees Demand Immediate Resolution of Pending Issues

“Khammam, July 19 (Indian Chronicle): “The Telangana State RTC Retired Employees Association has urged the government and TGSRTC management to immediately resolve the long-pending issues of retired employees. Addressing a press conference at the Khammam Press Club on Sunday, State President B. Rajayya and General Secretary S. Buchi Reddy outlined several key demands. “They called on the management to promptly remit the Provident Fund (PF) contribution related to the 2013 CRC arrears to the PF Commissioner's Office. They also pointed out that the 2017 PRC arrears for retired employees have remained unpaid for nearly nine years and demanded the implementation of the 2021 PRC, along with the release of



arrears under both the 2017 and 2021 PRCs. “The association requested that retired employees and their spouses be allowed to travel free of cost on Super Luxury RTC bus services. It also sought improvements in medical facilities, including the restoration of the earlier practice of providing two months' supply of medicines at the Tarnaka RTC Hospital instead of the current one-month supply, as elderly pensioners from distant districts face hardships due to frequent travel. “The leaders further demanded that all district RTC hospitals maintain an adequate stock of essential medicines and that retired employees who were unable to obtain membership at Tarnaka Hospital for various reasons be given another opportunity to enroll. “They also urged the management to extend the ₹30,000 funeral assistance to the families of employees who had opted for voluntary retirement (VRS) and later passed away. In addition, they requested relaxation in the submission of life certificates for elderly pensioners suffering from prolonged illness and sought the provision of four beds in the rest rooms at CBS or JBS in Hyderabad for retired employees visiting Tarnaka Hospital for medical treatment. “Regional President B.V. Rao, Regional Organising Secretary G. Leela, Karimnagar Zonal Secretary J.J. Ratnam, and R.V. Bhadram were also present at the press conference.

Special Prayers Held for Good Rains and Prosperous Crops

Comprehensive Inquiry Demanded into Corruption Regarding Construction of Gram Panchayat and Rural Health Center: Palakuri Vijay Kumar

“Chennaraopet/Warangal, July 19 (Indian Chronicle): Palakuri Vijay Kumar—

a member of the Warangal District SC/ST Atrocities Vigilance and Monitoring Committee and District President of the International Human Rights Organization—submitted a representation to District Collector and District Magistrate Dr. Satya Sharada. He sought a comprehensive inquiry into alleged corruption surrounding the construction of the Jalli Gram Panchayat office and the rural health center in Chennaraopet Mandal. “Speaking at the district-level SC/ST Atrocities Vigilance and Monitoring Committee meeting held at the Warangal Collectorate, Vijay Kumar alleged that although approximately ₹15 lakh was sanctioned for the construction of the Jalli Gram Panchayat office about ten years ago, the building has not yet been constructed. He demanded a thorough investigation into the roles of the contractor and the concerned government officials, strict action against those responsible, and the construction of the Gram Panchayat office. “He further alleged that irregularities had occurred during the construction of the rural health center in Jalli village. He urged the district administration to conduct a comprehensive inquiry into the contractor and relevant officials, take strict action against the wrongdoers, and ensure the construction of the Primary Health Center building. According to Vijay Kumar, District Collector Dr. Satya Sarada received the representation and directed the concerned officials to conduct a comprehensive inquiry into these complaints. “On this occasion, he also urged the district administration to take stringent action against the rampant illicit arrack production and the operation of unauthorized liquor outlets ('belt shops') across the six mandals of the Narsampet division. “Furthermore, Vijay Kumar brought to the Collector's attention allegations that false cases under the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act were being registered at certain police stations due to political pressure. He urged the police to ensure that justice is served only to genuine victims and that the process of registering SC/ST atrocity cases remains transparent and free from political interference. The meeting was attended by the District Joint Collector, Warangal East Zone DCP Ankit Kumar, DRO Vijayalakshmi, Warangal RDO Suma, Narsampet RDO Uma Rani, officials from relevant departments, ACPs, members of the SC/ST Atrocities Vigilance and Monitoring Committee, and other officials.

Government unveils contingency plan to mitigate El Niño impact

District administrations told to promote alternative crops, safeguard drinking water and step up village-level awareness.



Karimnagar July 19 (Correspondent): The Telangana government on Sunday drew up a contingency plan to minimise the impact of a possible El Niño-induced rainfall deficit, with a focus on crop diversification, drinking water security and groundwater conservation across the erstwhile Karimnagar district.

Chairing a review meeting at the Karimnagar Collectorate, Agriculture Minister and district in-charge Tummala Nageswara Rao directed officials to work in coordination and prepare for below-normal rainfall conditions by promoting alternative cropping patterns and strengthening water management measures.

The meeting, attended by Ministers Duddilla Sridhar Babu, Ponnam Prabhakar and Adluri Laxman Kumar, Government Whips, legislators, district Collectors, police officers, agricultural scientists and senior officials from various departments, reviewed

preparedness in Karimnagar, Peddapalli, Jagtial and Rajanna-Sircilla districts.

Officials were instructed to undertake extensive awareness campaigns through Gram Sabhas and Rythu Vedikas to encourage farmers to shift from water-intensive crops to alternatives such as red gram, sesame, groundnut, pulses, millets, horticultural crops and oil palm, depending on local soil and water conditions.

The Minister asked district administrations to provide farmers with updated information on groundwater levels, reservoir storage, irrigation prospects and rainfall trends to facilitate crop planning. He also stressed the need for contingency measures to ensure uninterrupted drinking water supply and promote efficient use of available water resources.

Expressing concern over declining groundwater levels and lower reservoir storage, Mr. Tummala said all departments should maintain close coordination and continuously monitor the situation. He recalled that the State government had recently released ₹9,000 crore under the Rythu Bharosa scheme and reiterated its commitment to supporting farmers.

IT and Industries Minister Duddilla Sridhar Babu called for a collective response to the emerging challenge and urged public representatives across party lines to participate in awareness campaigns and assist farmers in adopting suitable cropping practices.

Transport and BC Welfare Minister Ponnam Prabhakar emphasised rainwater conservation and suggested making rainwater harvesting structures mandatory in new building permissions. He called for large-scale public participation in groundwater recharge initiatives.

SC and ST Welfare Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar stressed the importance of coordinated action by all departments and advocated widespread dissemination of information on low-water crops and changing weather conditions.

Legislators who attended the meeting sought measures such as strengthening drinking water infrastructure, improving irrigation management, expanding crop insurance coverage and promoting micro-irrigation systems.

District Collectors presented district-wise action plans, including awareness programmes on crop diversification, groundwater management and drinking water contingency measures. Karimnagar Collector Chitra Mishra said preparatory measures had already been initiated at the field level.

Special Chief Secretary Mahesh Dutt Ekka urged officials to begin implementation without delay, while Agriculture Principal Secretary Surendra Mohan said awareness programmes would continue through Gram Sabhas and over 1,600 Rythu Vedikas across the State to help farmers adopt climate-resilient agricultural practices.

After conducting a "dharna" program to release water from the Basavapuram project under the auspices of the CPM district committee on Sunday, Jahangir criticized the Congress government for completely failing to complete the Basavapuram project, which is of utmost importance to the farmers of the district. He said that filling the local ponds and cisterns would increase the groundwater level and water would also flow into boreholes and wells, which would also solve the problem of irrigation and drinking water. He questioned why the local legislators, the district collector and the district officials of the irrigation department were not responding to the release of the water from the project and providing it to the farmers. He criticized the Congress party for being discriminatory in allocating funds to the displaced people of the Basavapuram project ever since it came to power. He also alleged that the government is showing love for Savithi Thalli by releasing the water in the project to the farmers who are waiting for water due to the drought conditions. Jahangir warned that the government should immediately respond and release the water, otherwise they will mobilize farmers and people and besiege the collector's office.
