Hand Over Land Allocated for Shaadi Khana and Haj House: Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar

“Hanamkonda, July 20 (Indian Chronicle): Former Government Chief Whip and former MLA Dasyam Vinay Bhaskar has demanded that the government hand back the land previously allocated for the construction of a Shaadi Khana in Hanamkonda and a Haj House in Warangal, and also sanction the necessary funds to complete these projects. “On Monday, he met Dr. T.K. Sridevi (IAS), Secretary of the Telangana Municipal Administration Department, at the State Secretariat in Hyderabad and submitted a representation along with minority leaders Nayeemuddin and Masood. “Speaking on the occasion, Vinay Bhaskar recalled that the previous BRS government had allocated 25 guntas of land in Survey No. 579 of Kotha Shayampet revenue village (Kazipet Mandal) for the construction of a Shaadi Khana, along with funds amounting to ₹5 crore. Similarly, he noted that 1,800 square yards of land and ₹2 crore in funds had been sanctioned for the construction of a Haj House in Warangal. “He stated that the then Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao (KCR) and Municipal Administration Minister K.T. Rama Rao (KTR) had taken special initiatives for the welfare of minorities. However, he alleged that the current Congress government has taken back the land that was allocated by the previous BRS government. In the interest of minority welfare, Vinay Bhaskar urged the government to immediately restore the land allocated for the Shaadi Khana and Haj House and to release the necessary funds for their construction. “Criticizing the Congress government, he alleged that it views minorities merely as a vote bank. He challenged the government to prove its sincerity by immediately undertaking the construction of the Haj House in Warangal and the Shaadi Khana in Hanamkonda.



MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya Raises Question in Parliament Regarding Central Funds for Kakatiya University

“Warangal, July 20 (Indian Chronicle): Warangal MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya raised a question in the Lok Sabha seeking details regarding the financial, academic, and research-related assistance provided by the Central Government to Kakatiya University and its affiliated colleges over the past three years. According to the latest report submitted by the Telangana government, ₹28.56 crore has already been released. “Speaking on the occasion, MP Dr. Kadiyam Kavya noted that Kakatiya University is one of the prominent higher education institutions in Telangana. She emphasized the need for further support from the Central Government to provide better academic and research opportunities for students. July 20):- As per the orders of the Telangana government, a joint Nalgonda district review meeting was held on Monday. In this meeting, the impact of El-Nino, cultivation in the wake of the upcoming rains, availability of seeds and fertilizers, procurement arrangements for major crops, development of roads and buildings were discussed extensively. “State Civil Supplies Minister Uttam Kumar Reddy.. Roads and Buildings Minister Komatireddy Venkata Reddy attended the meeting as the chief guests and gave directions to the officials. MLAs, municipal chairmen, district collectors, additional collectors and officials of the relevant departments of the joint Nalgonda district participated in the meeting. Bhuvanagiri Municipal Chairman Tangallapalli Srivani Ravikumar participated in the meeting and expressed his views on the development of the district and public issues. Speaking, the ministers instructed the officials to make seeds and fertilizers available on time and to prepare grain purchase centers in advance so that farmers do not face any difficulties. They suggested that the construction work of

roads and buildings in the district should be completed quickly. They said that farmers should be made aware of the changes in the climate due to the effect of El-Nino and awareness programs should be organized on alternative crops.

“Khammam, July 20 Indian Chronicle:““Deputy Chief Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu said that the challenges posed by the El Niño phenomenon can be effectively tackled only through scientific assessment, field-level realities, and coordinated efforts among government departments. “On Monday, the Deputy Chief Minister chaired a comprehensive review meeting at the Khammam Collectorate along with Agriculture, Cooperation, Marketing, Handlooms and Textiles Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao, Agriculture Principal Secretary Surendra Mohan, Special Officer for the undivided Khammam district Anudeep Durishetty, Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S., Bhadradi Kothagudem Collector Ankit, Wyra MLA Ramdas Naik, and Bhadrachalam MLA Tellam Venkata Rao. The meeting reviewed El Niño conditions, rainfall deficit, drinking water availability, irrigation, groundwater levels, power supply, and crop planning. “Scientist Dr. Sampath from Peddapalli district made a presentation on El Niño, explaining that the undivided Khammam district recorded a 35% rainfall deficit as of July 15. Officials informed the meeting that cotton cultivation has already increased, while many farmers are waiting for rains before taking up paddy cultivation. “Deputy CM's Directions“Bhatti Vikramarka warned that groundwater levels are likely to decline further over the next two months and appealed to farmers not to cultivate paddy under the prevailing drought conditions. “He said the government is conducting district-level review meetings to understand actual field conditions and instructed departments including irrigation, planning, agriculture, groundwater, and power to work in close coordination and implement preventive measures. “He directed officials to ensure every farmer is informed about the rainfall deficit and its likely impact so they can make informed crop decisions. A comprehensive report comparing last year's and current year's water availability, reservoir storage, and groundwater levels should be prepared and made available to the media, field officials, and farmers. “The Deputy CM also instructed officials to examine all technical possibilities of utilizing Godavari waters through the Rajiv Link Canal to meet the water requirements of Khammam district and submit a detailed report immediately. “Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao's Instructions“Minister Tummala Nageswara Rao directed officials to create continuous awareness among farmers regarding rainfall, water resources, and groundwater availability in every village. “He clarified that no irrigation water will be available from the Nagarjuna Sagar Project or for the Paleru ayacut during the current Kharif season, and urged officials to communicate this reality directly to farmers without hiding facts. “He instructed that drinking water should receive the highest priority in both Khammam and Bhadradi Kothagudem districts. Wherever shortages are anticipated, alternative drinking water sources should be identified and developed immediately. Officials were also asked to prepare a one-year action plan to ensure drinking water security. “The minister advised farmers to cultivate crops based only on groundwater availability and discouraged the cultivation of water-intensive crops such as paddy. Instead, he encouraged the cultivation of pulses, green gram, black gram, red gram, cowpea, millets, and other crops requiring less water. “He warned that the water crisis could worsen during August and September and stated that paddy cultivation based solely on borewell irrigation could lead to severe losses. “Officials were instructed to regularly monitor

India Meteorological Department (IMD) forecasts and groundwater conditions. He observed that Karnataka and Maharashtra are also experiencing reduced rainfall due to El Niño and noted that experts believe such severe drought conditions occur only once in nearly 150 years. “The minister also cautioned that reduced hydropower generation and possible thermal power constraints may affect electricity supply in the coming months. “He directed officials to utilize Rythu Vedikas effectively for village-level farmer awareness meetings and ensure that farmers understand the risks of cultivating paddy without assured water availability. “He further instructed engineers to explore lifting Godavari backwaters to fill tanks wherever feasible and to prepare a detailed plan for transferring Godavari water to Khammam district through the Rajiv Link Canal. “He stated that reservoirs such as Wyra and Lankasagar are currently being filled only for drinking water purposes and warned that Paleru reservoir may have drinking water storage only until September 2026. Officials were asked to submit a report on transferring Godavari water to Paleru. “The minister also suggested that the current El Niño situation should be used as an opportunity to expand oil palm cultivation and promote other low-water crops. “Special Officer Anudeep Durishetty“Special Officer Anudeep Durishetty advised officials to prepare action plans not only for the next three months but for at least one year. “He directed that mandal-wise action plans should be developed based on local conditions, with coordinated inputs from agriculture, irrigation, groundwater, weather, electricity, and Panchayat Raj departments. “District Collectors were instructed to establish special committees and control rooms at

both district and mandal levels to continuously monitor rainfall, drinking water, groundwater, electricity supply, and crop conditions. “Collector Divakar T.S. “District Collector Divakar T.S. instructed officials to prepare village-wise action plans before July 31 to promote alternative crops such as pulses, cowpea, red gram, and green gram. “He directed officials to collect village-wise data on water resources, groundwater availability, and irrigation potential, besides identifying farmers dependent on borewells, particularly in the Sattupalli region where paddy cultivation is high. “The Collector said paddy cultivation is being discouraged across the district while vegetable cultivation is being promoted, with sufficient seed stocks already arranged. “He emphasized that all ongoing lift irrigation schemes are intended only for drinking water purposes, not irrigation, and this message must be clearly communicated to farmers. “From August 1, officials should intensify efforts to promote alternative crops. He also announced that farmers have come forward to cultivate an additional 8,000 acres of oil palm, while expansion of horticultural crops over another 5,000 acres has been targeted. “Following the meeting, the Deputy Chief Minister, Minister, Special Officer, and District Collector released awareness pamphlets on Telangana Jalasiri and measures to tackle the El Niño Super Condition. “The meeting was attended by Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt, Horticulture Director Yasmin Basha, Bhadradi Kothagudem SP Rohit Raj, Additional Collectors Dr. P. Sreeja and P. Srinivasa Reddy, SUDA Chairperson Durga Prasad, State Warehousing Corporation Chairman Rayala Nageswara Rao, Municipal Commissioner Abhishek Agastya, DFO, District Library Chairman Khader Baba, and senior officials from agriculture, horticulture, irrigation, groundwater, electricity, rural water supply, and Panchayat Raj departments of the undivided Khammam district.

Case Registered Against Man for Allegedly Cheating Woman on Promise of Marriage

“FIR Registered Under Section 69 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) at Medipally Police Station

“MEDIPALLY, JULY 20 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): A case has been registered at Medipally Police Station in Medchal–Malkajgiri district against a man accused of deceiving a young woman by promising to marry her. Based on the victim's complaint, Medipally police have booked the accused and initiated an investigation. “According to the police, the 25-year-old victim, Reshma, a native of Gadwal, became acquainted with Sheelam Sai Chaitanya in October 2024. The accused allegedly gained her trust by assuring her of a job and a better future. In January 2025, he reportedly expressed his love and promised to marry her. “Believing his assurances, the woman came to Hyderabad in June 2025, where the accused rented a house in Lakshmi Nagar Colony, Boduppal. He allegedly introduced her as his wife, and the two lived together for nearly seven months. During this period, he is accused of establishing physical relations with her on the false promise of marriage, as stated in the complaint. The complainant also alleged that the accused took her gold ornaments and cash for his personal needs. Later, he allegedly distanced himself, stopped responding to her phone calls, and ultimately refused to marry her. “The victim further stated that when she approached the accused's family members seeking justice, they neither resolved the issue nor supported her and instead allegedly subjected her to mental harassment. “Based on the complaint, Medipally Police registered Crime No. 1054/2026 under Section 69 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and have begun an investigation. Further details are expected to emerge during the course of the investigation.

Ministers, Government Whip Beerla Ayilaiah Participate in Review Meeting on Adverse Weather Conditions

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau Indian Chronicle July 20):- In the wake of the ongoing rains and adverse weather conditions in the state, a review meeting was held with the joint Nalgonda District Collectors, police officers and senior officials of various departments at the IDOC (IDOC) office in Nalgonda to take preventive measures to prevent any inconvenience to the people. Civil Supplies and Irrigation Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy, Joint Nalgonda District In-charge Minister, Scheduled Castes Development Minister Adluri Laxman Kumar, State Roads, Buildings & Cinematography Minister Komatireddy Venkata Reddy participated in this meeting. Along with them, Telangana State Government Whip and Aleru MLA Beerla Ayilaiah attended the meeting. The meeting held a comprehensive review on the weather conditions prevailing in the joint Nalgonda district, the impact of heavy rains, flood threat, public safety, impact on the agricultural sector, and emergency relief measures. The ministers suggested that the agriculture department officials should inspect the condition of crops village-wise so that farmers do not suffer losses in the current situation, and if necessary, educate farmers on the cultivation of alternative crops. They instructed the officials to



assess the crop damage from time to time and submit the necessary reports to the government. "They advised that relief measures should be expedited in the flood-affected areas due to heavy rains, and that ponds, streams, culverts, and roads should be continuously monitored. They instructed the relevant departments to work in coordination to ensure that drinking water supply, prevention of power outages, sanitation, medical services, and emergency response teams are ready. It was clarified in the meeting that the officials should be available at the field level and solve the problems of the people immediately, and that the disaster management machinery should be kept alert. Speaking on the occasion, Government Whip and Aleru MLA Beerla Ayilaiah said that in view of climate change and the impact of El Nino, farmers should focus on cultivating alternative crops along with traditional crops. Agriculture department officials asked them to educate farmers village-wise and provide technical advice on which crops to cultivate according to soil type and rainfall conditions. "He advised all department officials to work continuously on alert to ensure that the people of Aleru constituency as well as the joint Nalgonda district do not face any difficulties. He instructed the officials to take steps to ensure that the farmers receive the necessary technical advice and government assistance in a timely manner. "He said that all departments should work in coordination to take immediate relief measures in the event of heavy rains, floods or adverse weather conditions. "Beerla Ayilaiah clarified that the protection of people's lives and property is the first priority of the government and the state government under the leadership of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy will support the people in every way.
