Khammam Collector Inspects Schools, Shares Midday Meal with Students, Stresses Quality Nutrition

““Khammam Konijerla, July 2 (Indian chronicle): ““Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S. emphasized that students studying in government educational institutions should be provided with nutritious and quality food, stating that healthy children are better able to focus on their education. “As part of his visit to the Wyra Assembly constituency on Thursday, the Collector inspected the Government High School and Government Primary School at Pallipadu village in Konijerla mandal. He reviewed the cleanliness of the school premises, classrooms, toilets, drinking water facilities, and kitchen maintenance, and issued several instructions to the concerned officials. “Later, Collector Divakar T.S. joined the students for the midday meal and personally inspected the quality of the food being served. He interacted with the students to know whether the food was tasty and whether the prescribed menu—including egg, vegetable biryani, dal, and sambar—was being served hygienically. He also sought feedback from the students on the quality of the meal. “Speaking on the occasion, the Collector said that the midday meal scheme plays a vital role in ensuring the health and nutrition of students and stressed that there should be no compromise on food quality. He directed officials to strictly implement the government's prescribed menu, use fine-quality rice in the meals, and establish kitchen gardens in every school to supply fresh vegetables. “The Collector also instructed officials to conduct regular meetings with parents to increase student enrollment and attendance in government schools while creating greater awareness about the public education system. District-level training program on conducting comprehensive health check-ups for Self-Help Group (SHG) women members: Bhaskar Rao, Additional Collector (Local Bodies), Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau – Indian Chronicle – July 2): A district-level training program was held regarding the conduct of comprehensive health check-ups for members of women's self-help groups. “To effectively implement the comprehensive health check-up program for SHG members—a prestigious initiative of the Telangana State Government—a district-level training program was conducted on Thursday at the Collectorate's mini-meeting hall, following the directives of District Collector Anurag Jayanthi. “District Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Bhaskar Rao presided over the event. Speaking on the occasion, he noted that there are a total of 194,493 SHG members in Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district. He instructed officials to formulate and implement a comprehensive action plan to conduct health check-ups for all members in a phased manner, ensuring completion within a three-month period. “He stated that special training programs are being organized for staff from the Medical and Health Department, as well as the DRDA, MEPMA, and Municipal departments, to ensure the effective execution of the program, covering aspects such as health check-ups, sample collection, data entry, and follow-up processes. “He further mentioned that the Primary Health Centers (PHCs) at Pochampally, Sharajipet, and Bibinagar in the district have been designated as master training centers, and lab technicians from each center have been provided with training. It was stated that training would be provided in a phased manner to the remaining health staff in the district by trained master trainers. “On this occasion, T-Diagnostics State Coordinator Mr. Bharat participated and provided detailed training to doctors, lab technicians, and staff from relevant departments on topics such as the procedure for conducting comprehensive health screenings, standards for sample collection, data entry, quality control, and report management. The Additional Collector noted that through this initiative, the state government is prioritizing women's health by creating comprehensive health profiles and ensuring timely treatment through the early detection of diseases. The meeting was attended by the District Rural Development Officer (DRDO), District Medical and Health Officer Dr. M. Manohar, Program Officer Dr. Vamsi Krishna, doctors, lab technicians, T-Diagnostics State Coordinator Mr. Bharat, and officials from T-Hub, MEPMA, the Municipal Department, and other relevant departments.



The old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act should be continued instead of implementing the VBG Ramji Act:- Telangana Agricultural Workers Union District General Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau..Indian Chronicle... July 2):- Telangana Agricultural Workers Union District General Secretary Kondamadugu Narasimha, CITU District Secretary Kalluri Malleshham, and Telangana Rythu Sangam District General Secretary Mathuru Balaraju demanded the government to continue the old law instead of implementing the old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act instead of implementing the VBG Ramji Act, which is being implemented from today on Wednesday. A memorandum was given to the District Collector and District Rural Development Officer, requesting them to implement the old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act instead of implementing the VBG Ramji Act, which is being implemented from today. Speaking on the occasion, they questioned why the Modi government is implementing this law despite the opposition of agricultural workers, the poor, all public organizations and political parties across the country. He said that as a result of the struggles of many organizations across the country, the UPA government brought the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act in 2005 with the support of the Left parties and provided employment to the rural poor to support their families. He said that we all know the situation in which this law helped the rural poor during the difficult times of Corona. He said that the Modi government, which came to power at the Center in 2014, has been making many conspiracies to repeal the National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, bringing new laws, reducing funds for the Employment Guarantee Act in every budget, and causing difficulties to the laborers by not providing them proper work and not paying them. He criticized the decision to repeal the law that was the right of rural workers and to bring the VB-G Ramji Act, insulting the Father of the Nation Mahatma Gandhi, who played a key role in the country's freedom struggle and worked throughout his life to establish village self-government and develop the rural poor. He said that they are promoting the provision of 125 working days, but the central government has shirk its responsibility by not allocating adequate funds for the



work. Previously, 90 percent of the funds were borne by the central government and 10 percent by the state governments, but now in the new law, 60 percent of the funds will be borne by the central government and 40 percent by the state governments. New rules have been brought in the new law to stop work for 60 days during the agricultural work season. The new law mentions minimum wages, but it has been decided that wages will be paid only if a photograph of each worker, male or female, is taken at the workplace in the morning and evening and uploaded online. Previously, the Gram Panchayats had the option to select work for the laborers through the Gram Sabhas, but this has also been abolished in the new law. The central government has also decided in the new law when and where to assign work to whom. If this new law is implemented, there is a risk of losing the jobs of the medics, field assistants, technical assistants and other staff who work crucially in employment assurance. The laborers are also at risk of losing their jobs and are at risk of migrating again. He said that instead of implementing the new VB-G Ramji Act, which is still making the employees working under the Employment Guarantee Act for the rural poor and agricultural laborers unemployed, the old Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act should be implemented. Provide Protection to My Family from Land Grabbers: Victim Swaroopa

*****Hanumakonda, July 2 (Indian Chronicle): Swaroopa, a resident of Ananthasagar village in Hasanparthy mandal, has alleged that certain individuals are attempting to illegally encroach upon her family's agricultural land and appealed to the district administration and police to provide protection to her family and safeguard their property. "Speaking to the media on Thursday, she said that her family owns agricultural land measuring 1 acre and 6 guntas out of a total extent of 4.03 acres located in Survey Nos. 74/B, 73/A/1, 77/A/1 and 78/B in the



revenue limits of Ananthasagar village. She alleged that Vaidyula Pratap Reddy, Vaidyula Tirupati Reddy, Prameela, and some of their family members from the same village are attempting to illegally occupy the land. "Swaroopa further alleged that the CCTV cameras installed on the land and the boundary markers erected by revenue officials after conducting a land survey were deliberately damaged. She stated that the property was inherited by her husband, Vaidyula Sammi Reddy, from his parents and was later transferred to her name. She added that the family possesses a valid Telangana land passbook for the property and has been receiving benefits under the Rythu Bandhu scheme in their bank account. "She also alleged that in January this year, Pratap Reddy, Tirupati Reddy, and Prameela assaulted her when she visited the land, following which a case was registered at the Hasanparthy Police Station. "Swaroopa appealed to the Hasanparthy police to provide protection to her family against any threat to their lives. She also urged the District Collector, the Revenue Divisional Officer (RDO), and the Hasanparthy revenue authorities to intervene and protect their ancestral land from alleged encroachers.

Our goal is to solve the problems left over from the tenure of the former presidents and to put the Handloom Society on a profitable path," they said after filing their nominations.
