

Massive Vanamahotsavam Rally Held in Sathupalli; Collector Calls for Plantation and Protection of Trees for Future Generations

“Khammam Sathupalli, July 3 Indian Chronicle:” District Collector Divakar T.S. urged people to plant and protect trees on a large scale for the welfare of future generations and environmental conservation. “The Collector participated as the chief guest in a grand Vanamahotsavam programme organized by Asha Voluntary Organization at JVR College Grounds in Sathupalli on Friday. He, along with Sathupalli MLA Matta Ragamayee Dayanand, inaugurated the event and planted saplings with students. Later, they joined a massive rally from JVR College to Old Centre, which witnessed enthusiastic participation from students, youth, and members of the public. Students from government and private educational institutions took part in large numbers, expressing their commitment to environmental protection. Performances by folk artists added color and vibrancy to the rally. “Addressing the gathering, Collector Divakar T.S. said he was delighted to witness such a large-scale and spirited Vanamahotsavam programme with active public participation. He congratulated the organizers and citizens for making the event a success. “He emphasized that Vanamahotsavam should not be viewed merely as a tree-planting exercise but as a social responsibility and a festival celebrated by all. Just as people celebrate festivals like Diwali, Dasara, and Sankranti with enthusiasm, tree plantation drives should also be observed with the same spirit, he said. “The Collector recalled the story of Emperor Ashoka, who was inspired by an elderly man planting trees for future generations rather than for himself. Motivated by this thought, Ashoka reportedly undertook extensive tree plantation along roads throughout his kingdom. “Stressing the importance of protecting nature, the Collector said every individual must plant and nurture trees for the benefit of future generations. He noted that the Telangana government has been implementing Vanamahotsavam on a large scale, planting millions of saplings every year, which has contributed significantly to the increase in forest cover across the state. “He also highlighted the growing impact of climate change worldwide, citing instances of extreme temperatures affecting countries such as Germany, where infrastructure and daily life have been disrupted. He said such challenges arise from the reckless exploitation of natural resources and neglect of environmental conservation. “Protecting trees, birds, soil, water resources, and biodiversity is essential to ensuring a healthy planet for future generations, he said, urging everyone to plant at least one sapling and care for it until it grows into a full-fledged tree. “Speaking on the occasion, MLA Matta Ragamayee Dayanand said environmental conservation is the responsibility of every citizen and that protecting planted saplings is just as important as planting them. She described Vanamahotsavam as not merely a government programme but a social movement aimed at safeguarding the future. “The MLA stated that trees play a crucial role in maintaining ecological balance and that increasing greenery is the most effective long-term solution to rising temperatures, climate change, and declining groundwater levels. She called upon citizens to plant trees at their homes, educational institutions,

Illegal sand stockpiles equivalent to 65 tractor loads seized in Karimnagar raid

Police Commissioner Gaush Alam says sustained crackdown on illegal mining, transport and storage will continue; two persons booked for alleged violations.

Karimnagar July 03 (Correspondent): The Karimnagar Police Commissionerate on Friday seized illegal sand stockpiles equivalent to 65 tractor loads during a surprise raid at Elgandal village in Kothapalli police station limits as part of its intensified drive against unauthorised sand mining, transportation and storage.

Acting on the directions of Police Commissioner Gaush Alam, the Task Force police, under the supervision of the Assistant Commissioner of Police, conducted inspections and patrols in the area and detected two large sand dumps allegedly stored without authorisation.

According to the police, 40 tractor loads of sand were seized from a stockpile allegedly belonging to Suturi Srinivas (40), a resident of Vannaram village in Ramadugu mandal, while 25 tractor loads were seized from a dump allegedly linked to Sindi Ram Sundar (50), a resident of



Elgandal village.

The seized sand was handed over to the Kothapalli and Ramadugu police for further legal proceedings, with the Task Force obtaining official acknowledgement receipts for the handover.

Commissioner Gaush Alam said the police would continue their crackdown on illegal sand mining, transportation and storage across the district. He warned that those violating government regulations would face stringent action

under the relevant provisions of the mining laws and other applicable statutes. Continuous surveillance has been put in place to curb illegal sand-related activities, he added.

Uppal Police Urge Public to Avoid Minor Disputes and Public Drinking

“Uppal, July 3: (INDIAN CHRONICLE)“The Uppal Police informed that within the limits of Uppal Police Station, cases have been registered against individuals involved in consuming alcohol in public places, engaging in quarrels, and creating disturbances over minor issues. As part of the enforcement drive, out of 44 cases



registered under E-Petty Cases, 26 individuals were produced before the court today and fines were imposed on them as per legal procedures. The Uppal Police appealed to the public to refrain from getting involved in unnecessary arguments and minor disputes that could lead to legal complications and affect their future. They also urged citizens to maintain public order and avoid consuming alcohol in public places.

Former Uppal MLA NVSS Prabhakar Assures Efforts for Park, Playground and Bathukamma Ghat in Chilkanagar

Bethupalli Re-Survey Process Must Be Conducted Transparently as per Rules: District Collector Divakara T.S. "Every Farmer Should Be Properly Informed Before Conducting the Re-Survey"

"Details of Government Lands, Roads and Public Spaces Must Be Recorded with Coordinates" Each Survey Team Should Complete 50-60 Acres Per Day

"Data Entry and Digital Map Preparation Should Progress Simultaneously" District Collector Guides Officials Conducting Re-Survey in Bethupalli Village, Sathupalli Mandal

"Khammam, Sathupalli, July 3 Indian Chronicle: "District Collector Divakara T.S. directed officials to conduct the re-survey process in Bethupalli village with complete transparency and in strict accordance with government guidelines and regulations. "On Friday, the Collector, accompanied by Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav, inspected the ongoing re-survey work in Bethupalli village. The initiative aims to provide a permanent solution to land disputes and create accurate, scientific land records. During the field visit, the Collector issued several key instructions to the officials involved in the survey. "Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakara T.S. said that resolving long-pending land issues in Bethupalli is the primary objective of the re-survey. He instructed officials to ensure that every farmer is fully informed about the survey process and that the exercise is conducted transparently in their presence. The re-survey will scientifically document land extents, boundaries and ownership details, thereby modernizing land records. "The Collector stated that ten special survey teams have been de-



ployed in the village. Each team consists of one surveyor and two GPOs. He instructed officials to use the Rythu Vedika as the central operations hub and establish a computer system there to facilitate immediate data entry of field-level survey information. "He emphasized that every stage of the

process must strictly follow the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) issued by the government and that no deviations or errors should be allowed. Details of government lands, roads, tanks, canals, public places and government office sites must be accurately recorded along with their coordinates. Proper

panchanamas should also be conducted to ensure accurate documentation of government lands. "The Collector directed each team to complete re-survey work covering 50 to 60 acres per day. With ten teams working simultaneously, the target is to survey approximately 500 to 600 acres daily. Fieldwork should begin at 7 a.m. every day, and land details must be recorded in the presence of farmers. Accurate records of each farmer's name, land extent, boundaries and other relevant details should be maintained, and daily progress reports should be submitted. He also instructed that data entry and digital map preparation continue alongside the field survey process. "Clarifying concerns among farmers, the Collector stated that no farmer would lose land extent due to the re-survey. He assured that the entire process is being conducted scientifically and transparently and urged farmers not to believe rumors or misconceptions. Officials were instructed to organize Gram Sabhas to create awareness and invite every farmer within the revenue village limits to participate, share their views and raise any concerns. "Collector Divakara T.S. further directed officials to work in close coordination and ensure that the re-survey is completed successfully without giving rise to disputes. "Sathupalli Tahsildar, Tirumalayapalem Tahsildar Wilson, surveyors, revenue officials and officers from various departments participated in the inspection.

End to Years of Anxiety: Akarapu Arun Patel Resolves 11KV High-Tension Wire Issue in Venkat Reddy Nagar Colony

“Uppal, July 3:(Indian Chronicle):The long-pending and dangerous issue of 11KV high-tension electric wires passing through Venkat Reddy Nagar Colony under Venkat Reddy Nagar Division has finally been resolved, bringing relief to residents who had been living under the constant threat of accidents for several years.“The approximately 500-foot stretch of 11KV main electric lines running from the colony bus stop to the hut hotel located in the bus stop lane had posed a serious danger to local residents. Several incidents of electric shocks had been reported over the years due to these hazardous wires.“According to local residents, the severity of the issue was highlighted in 2016 when one person lost his life due to an electric shock and another suffered severe injuries, resulting in the amputation of a leg.“Residents had earlier brought the issue to the attention of former Uppal MLA N.V.S.S. Prabhakar, following which officials prepared an estimate of Rs.16 lakh for the proposed works. However, due to the lack of government support and a proposal that the cost should be shared equally between the government and residents, the project failed to move forward.“Subsequently, the issue was also taken to the notice of former MLA Bethi Subhash Reddy, but no progress was made and the problem remained unresolved.“The residents later approached Youth Congress leader and Uppal Constituency Youth Congress President Akarapu Arun Patel, who immediately responded to their concerns. With the support and intervention of Uppal Congress Party In-charge Mandumula Parameshwar Reddy, discussions were held with electricity department officials regarding the issue.“Recognizing the seriousness of the problem, Mandumula Parameshwar Reddy took special initiative to ensure that the works were sanctioned on a war footing with a revised estimate of Rs.30 lakh under the Congress government.“The cable laying and related works have now been successfully completed, bringing a permanent solution to a problem that had troubled the colony for many years and ensuring the safety of residents.“Expressing their gratitude, colony residents performed a milk abhishekam to the portrait of Chief Minister Revanth Reddy for facilitating the resolution of the long-standing issue.“Residents also thanked Mandumula Parameshwar Reddy for his prompt intervention and Akarapu

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Power Cable Theft in Mangapuram; 10 Farmers Affected

“Khammam Nelakondapalli, July 3 Indian Chronicle:” A gang of unidentified thieves created panic in Mangapuram Thanda of Nelakondapalli mandal by stealing electrical wires connected to agricultural motor pumps, causing inconvenience to farmers during the crucial cultivation season. “According to local farmers, the theft took place in the early hours of Friday. Electrical cables belonging to nearly 10 farmers were stolen from their agricultural pump sets. The victims include Hussain, Tejavath Raghu, Gobriya, Biksham, and several others from the village. “The theft came to light when farmers visited their fields to prepare nursery beds and found the power cables missing. Initially, they feared that the motor pumps themselves had also been stolen. The incident has disrupted farming activities and raised concerns among cultivators who depend on these pump sets for irrigation. “Farmers expressed frustration over the increasing number of thefts targeting agricultural infrastructure in the mandal. They said they are now forced to stay awake at night and guard their fields to prevent further losses. “Just two days ago, copper wires were reportedly stolen from transformers in Painampalli village. Farmers allege that thieves are specifically targeting electrical equipment and motor installations, creating hardship during the agricultural season. “The affected farmers have urged the authorities to take immediate action, increase police patrolling, and ensure the safety of agricultural assets in the area.

Khammam Cyber Crime Police Arrest Woman Accused in Online Trading Fraud Case

“Khammam July 3 Indian Chronicle:” Khammam Cyber Crime Police have arrested a woman accused in an online trading and investment fraud case in which a private employee from Khammam district was allegedly cheated of nearly ₹15 lakh. Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt disclosed the details on Friday. “According to the police, the victim was contacted through WhatsApp and was lured into investing money in online trading and investment schemes of a company named



NM Asset Management Portfolio Limited, with promises of high returns. The fraudsters allegedly convinced the victim to invest around ₹15 lakh through WhatsApp communications and trading links. “During the investigation, cyber crime police traced the money trail and identified the account holder involved in the transactions. The accused, Aryadas Shailaja (34), an advocate and resident of Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala, was found to be the holder of a bank account through which approximately ₹2 lakh linked to the complainant's fraud amount was transferred. “Police further revealed that the account was linked to 38 cyber crime cases across various states, involving transactions worth nearly ₹3 crore. “A special team from Khammam Cyber Crime Police arrested Aryadas Shailaja in Thiruvananthapuram and brought her to Khammam on a transit warrant. She was produced before the Khammam Cyber Crime Court and subsequently remanded to judicial custody. “Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt appreciated the efforts of Cyber Crime DSP Phaninder, Inspector Ravi Kumar, SIs Ranjith Kumar and Vijay Kumar, and the Cyber Crime Police Station staff for their crucial role in investigating and solving the case.

Plastic Bag Free Day Celebrated Grandly at Triveni School

He also stated that proposals for allocating government land for the establishment of a non-vegetarian market in Kallur town are under examination and that further action will be taken upon receipt of a No Objection Certificate (NOC) from the Irrigation Department. “The Collector directed officials to take necessary steps to utilize unused NSP lands in several villages of Thallada Mandal for public purposes. He also instructed them to identify suitable government land and prepare proposals for the establishment of an Advanced Technology Centre. “Regarding the expansion of Neeladri Urban Park, he noted that Singareni authorities need to take necessary measures to resolve boundary-related issues.
