“Khammam, July 8 indian Chronicle: “Khammam District Collector Divakar T.S. participated in a video conference held on Wednesday from the District Collectorate. The conference was chaired by Manoj Govil, Secretary (Coordination), Cabinet Secretariat, Government of India, New Delhi. “The meeting reviewed the progress of irrigation and railway projects being implemented by the Central and State Governments in Telangana, with a special focus on pending land acquisition issues related to the Kazipet–Vijayawada Third Railway Line (including electrification) Project. “During the meeting, the District Collector informed the officials that the pending land acquisition of 0.786 hectares required for the Kazipet–Vijayawada Third Railway Line Electrification Project in Khammam district was successfully completed in May 2026, thereby resolving the pending issue. “The video conference was attended by SDC Sadanandam, officials from the concerned departments, officers of the Collectorate Land Acquisition Wing, and other departmental officials.”

Khammam Collector Urges 100% Collection of Completed Enumeration Forms

“Khammam, July 8 indian Chronicle: “District Collector Divakar T.S. has directed officials to ensure 100% collection of completed Enumeration Forms from voters as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the electoral rolls. He also stressed that Booth Level Officers (BLOs) and Booth Level Agents (BLAs) should work in close coordination to make the exercise successful. “The Collector chaired a review meeting with representatives of various political parties at the Collectorate Conference Hall on Wednesday. The meeting was attended by Additional Collector (Local Bodies) Dr. P. Sreeja and Kallur Sub-Collector Ajay Yadav. “Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. said that while the distribution of Enumeration Forms has been nearly completed, it is equally important that voters fill in the forms and return them to the respective BLOs. Only the forms received from voters will be digitized, and only those voters' names will be included in the draft electoral roll. “He appealed to all voters to complete and submit their Enumeration Forms without delay and urged public representatives and political party leaders to actively participate in creating awareness. He also requested BLAs to assist voters in filling out the forms and ensure they are submitted to BLOs for online registration. “The Collector informed that 99.07% of Enumeration Forms have been distributed across the district. Forms could not be delivered to 3,744 voters due to their unavailability or because they could not be traced. “He further stated that 31.57% of the completed Enumeration Forms have already been collected and are currently being digitized. Political party BLAs were asked to remain proactive and cooperate with officials in the voter verification process. “The meeting was attended by election officials and representatives of the Congress, BJP, BRS, Aam Aadmi Party, TDP, CPI, CPM, BSP, and other political parties.”

Officials told to begin Urban Challenge Fund works by September.

Karimnagar July 08 (Correspondent): The State Municipal Administration Department has directed civic authorities to ensure that works under the Urban Challenge Fund (UCF) begin by September by expediting the preparation of project reports and completion of the tendering process.

The directions were issued by CDMA official Sridevi during a review meeting held through video conference from Hyderabad on Wednesday. Karimnagar Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai and senior engineering officials participated in the meeting from the Municipal Corporation office.



Reviewing the progress of projects proposed under the UCF, Ms. Sridevi sought details of the Detailed Project Reports (DPRs), project estimates, implementation plans and the status of the tender process. Mr. Desai briefed the meeting on the proposed works, estimates and reports prepared for the scheme. To complete all pending DPRs, estimates and planning documents without delay and initiate the tender process in accordance with the schedule. She directed that separate DPRs be prepared on a priority basis for solid waste management and other civil works to facilitate early execution.

Stressing adherence to government norms and quality standards, she said the projects should be designed to improve civic infrastructure and enhance Karimnagar's urban landscape. She also asked engineering officials to closely monitor the execution of works and ensure coordination among departments for timely completion of the projects.

Expedite land acquisition for irrigation projects, officials told

R&R Commissioner K. Shivakumar Naidu reviews progress of major projects and stresses coordinated action by Revenue, Irrigation and allied departments.

Karimnagar July 08 (Correspondent): Land Acquisition for irrigation and infrastructure projects in Karimnagar district should be completed on a war footing, R&R (Rehabilitation and Resettlement) Land Acquisition Commissioner K. Shivakumar Naidu said during a review meeting with district officials on Wednesday.

Chairing the meeting at the Collectorate, Mr. Naidu reviewed the progress of land acquisition for major projects, including the Sripada Yellampalli Project, Mid Manair Project, Gouravelli Reservoir canals, Kakatiya Canal, Kaleshwaram Project, Kothapalli-Manoharabad railway line, and the Manair Riverfront project. He sought details on the extent of land acquired, the balance pending, and issues delaying the process.

Stating that the State government accorded high priority to irrigation projects, Mr.



Naidu directed officials of the Revenue, Irrigation, Land Acquisition, and Survey and Land Records departments to work in close coordination to expedite acquisition proceedings. He asked them to ensure the timely issuance of land acquisition awards, disbursement of compensation, and implementation of Rehabilitation and Resettlement (R&R) measures.

The Commissioner said affected landowners and families displaced by the projects should receive compensation in accordance with the rules without delay, while rehabilitation measures should be carried out expeditiously. He instructed officials to identify and resolve bottlenecks in the acquisition process and clear all pending issues to avoid delays in project execution.

District Collector Chitra Mishra said the district administration had initiated special measures to speed up land acquisition for various projects. She said departments were working in coordination under a structured action plan to complete the acquisition process within the timelines set by the government.

Additional Collector (Revenue) Srinivas Reddy, Land Acquisition in-charge SDC Swami, RDOs Sharmila and Jalakumari, Assistant Director of Survey and Land Records Kishan Rao, and officials of the Revenue and Irrigation departments attended the meeting.

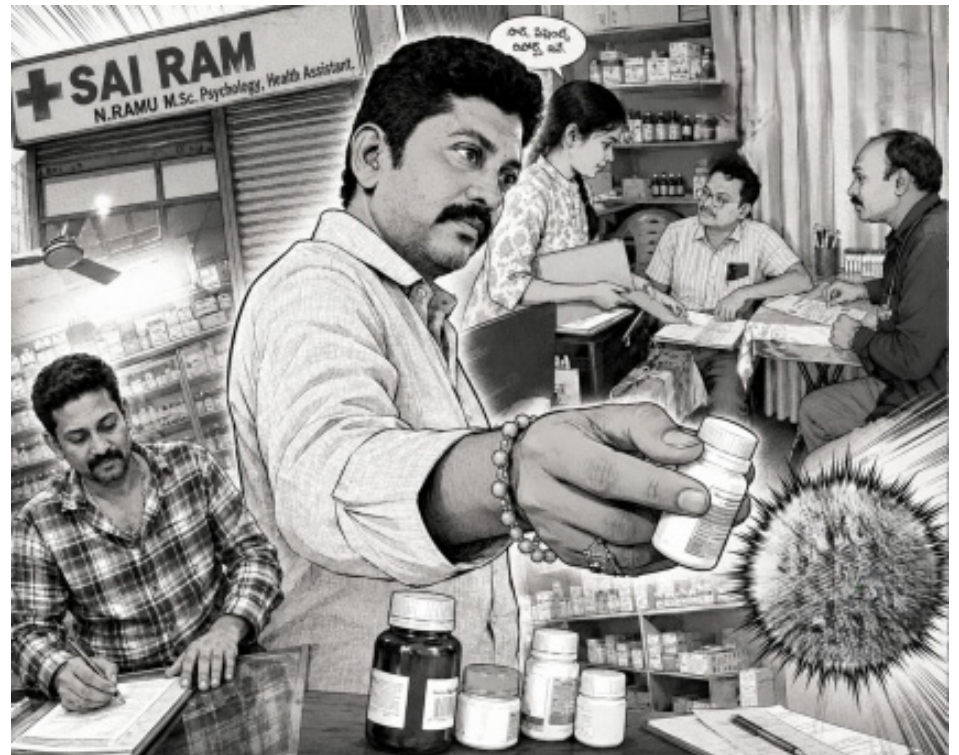

“Unauthorized Medical Practice Posing a Serious Threat to Public Health “Concern grows in rural areas over treatment by unqualified individuals

“Khammam, July 8 Indian Chronicle: “Residents of Mudigonda have appealed to the District Collector to personally intervene and order a comprehensive inspection against unauthorized medical practitioners and illegally operating medical shops. “According to the villagers, several individuals are allegedly using the title



“Doctor” without possessing recognized medical qualifications. They specifically questioned the credentials of N. Ramu Goud, who reportedly displays a name board identifying himself as “Doctor N. Ramu Goud.” On another signboard, he is allegedly described as “N. Ramu Goud, M.Sc. Psychology, Health Assistant.” Locals have demanded that officials clarify under what qualifications he is using the title “Doctor” and why no action has been taken despite the apparent inconsistency. “The villagers further alleged that despite three separate inspections conducted by senior health officials at the neighboring Alpha Diagnostic Centre, no action has been initiated against the adjacent clinic allegedly operated by the same individual without valid medical qualifications. The inspections were reportedly carried out by District Medical Officer Dr. D. Rama Rao, Mudigonda Hospital Medical Officer Dr. Rajendra Prasad, and District Immunization Officer Dr. Sampath. “Residents also alleged that N. Ramu Goud is operating an unauthorized blood testing laboratory under the name Sai Ram Diagnostic, where laboratory tests are reportedly being conducted by a second-year DMLT student identified as Dilip. They questioned why authorities have not initiated legal action and alleged that the continued inaction has raised public suspicion regarding the enforcement of regulations. “Similar allegations were made against RMP Radhakrishna, who is reportedly operating Krishna Sai First Aid Centre and Surya Medical & General Store. Locals questioned his educational qualifications and pharmacy credentials, asking whether he possesses the required B.Pharmacy or M.Pharmacy qualifications to operate a medical shop legally. “Residents claim that unauthorized medical practitioners across Mudigonda and other parts of Khammam district are allegedly running clinics, dispensing medicines, administering injections, and providing intravenous saline treatment without proper qualifications, thereby putting public health at risk. “They urged the district administration to conduct coordinated inspections involving all concerned departments, register cases against violators under the relevant laws, and, where necessary, seal unauthorized clinics and medical shops. “Health experts have advised the public to seek treatment only from qualified and registered medical practitioners. They also emphasized the need to create public awareness so that patients verify a doctor’s qualifications and registration before undergoing treatment. “Public Demands “Formation of special inspection teams across the district. “Identification and sealing of unauthorized medical establishments. “Strict legal action against unqualified persons practicing medicine. “Immediate action to curb illegal medical treatment in medical shops. “Public awareness campaigns on safe healthcare practices. “Establishment of a dedicated helpline for complaints. “Transparent disclosure of inspection reports and action taken. “Some local residents have also alleged that the concerned departments are not conducting inspections effectively and have called for stricter enforcement to safeguard public health. “Note: The allegations in this report are based on claims made by local residents. The individuals named have not publicly responded to these allegations, and the matter has not been adjudicated by a court.

Clean Buddha Nagar Needs Public Participation to Protect Greenery: MMC Commissioner

Surprise inspection of sanitation management in Buddha Nagar

“** Officials directed to clear accumulated garbage immediately** Daily waste collection and prompt removal of sweeping waste from roads instructed** UBD wing asked to create awareness on maintenance of household planter boxes** Sanitation staff directed to ensure planter boxes are free from plastic waste” Boduppal, July 8 (Indian Chronicle): Malkajgiri Municipal Corporation (MMC) Commissioner Vinay Krishna Reddy, IAS, conducted a surprise field inspection in Buddha Nagar under the Boduppal Circle to review sanitation management and



civic amenities. “During the inspection of the main road in Buddha Nagar, the Commissioner observed that sanitation standards were unsatisfactory, with garbage accumulating at several locations and delays in door-to-door waste collection. He directed the concerned officials to immediately remove the accumulated garbage, ensure regular sanitation drives, and carry out daily door-to-door waste collection on schedule. He also instructed that waste collected during road sweeping should be transported without delay and not be left on the roads. “Later, the Commissioner inspected urban greening and sanitation activities at Road No. 4 in Buddha Nagar Colony. He directed the Urban Biodiversity (UBD) wing to create awareness among residents on the proper maintenance of planter boxes provided at households. Officials were instructed to educate the public on regular watering of plants, removal of weeds, pruning, and overall plant care. “The Commissioner also instructed sanitation workers to check that planter boxes are not being used to dump plastic or other waste during door-to-door garbage collection and to educate residents against such practices. “He emphasized that public participation is essential for maintaining clean, green, and environmentally friendly colonies, and urged residents to actively contribute towards cleanliness and the protection of urban greenery.
