District-Level SC/ST Atrocities Act Monitoring Committee Meeting Held at Collectorate**

“Khammam, August 11 (Indian Chronicle):“District Collector Divakar T.S. directed officials to resolve every issue identified at the district, mandal and village levels concerning the implementation of the SC/ST (Prevention of Atrocities) Act and submit reports on the action taken.”“The Collector, along with Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt, conducted a district-level SC/ST Atrocities Act Monitoring Committee meeting at the Conference Hall of the Collectorate on Tuesday. Before the meeting, floral tributes were paid to the portrait of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar.”“Speaking on the occasion, Collector Divakar T.S. said the implementation of the SC/ST Atrocities Act was being reviewed at the district level once every three months. Steps were being taken to identify and resolve issues concerning SC and ST communities at the district, mandal and village levels.”“He directed the concerned officials to take necessary action on every issue raised by the committee members and submit an Action Taken Report (ATR) without fail.”“Awareness on Atrocities Act”“The Collector instructed officials to create widespread awareness among people about the SC/ST Atrocities Act during the Civil Rights Day programme conducted every month at the mandal level.”“He directed Tahsildars and police officials to coordinate in organising the programmes and ensure that at least 100 people participate in the awareness programme in every mandal.”“Collector Divakar T.S.

said identity cards would be issued to members of the SC/ST Atrocities Act Monitoring Committee. He clarified that the cards would be issued only for identification purposes and would not provide any protocol or special privileges.”“He urged committee members to actively participate in Civil Rights Day programmes and educate people about the provisions of the law.”“Special Focus on Drug Control”“The Collector said the government was giving special priority to controlling drug abuse. Special teams such as Eagle teams had been formed to prevent drug-related activities and take necessary action, he said.”“He appealed to people to inform the authorities if they came across anyone becoming addicted to drugs or other harmful new habits, assuring that necessary assistance would be provided to help them.”“Compensation to Victims Without Delay”“The Collector directed officials to ensure that government-sanctioned compensation reaches eligible victims of SC/ST Atrocities Act cases without delay.”“He instructed officials to release compensation immediately after funds are received from the government. Once the police investigation is completed and the required report is received, no file should be kept pending, he said.”“He directed officials to process compensation files on a priority basis and ensure that eligible victims receive assistance at the earliest.”“Speed Up Investigation and Court Follow-up”“Collector Divakar T.S. instructed officials to continuously monitor the progress of all cases registered under the SC/ST Atrocities Act.”“He directed the concerned departments to effectively follow up all cases pending before courts and work in coordination to ensure that victims receive justice in a timely manner.”“62 Complaints Received in 2026: CP”“Police Commissioner Sunil Dutt said that 62 complaints had been received under the SC/ST Atrocities Act in Khammam district during 2026.”“Following investigation, nine complaints were found to be false, while 53 cases were registered, he said.”“He stated that police were taking steps to file charge sheets, complete investigations expeditiously and ensure that victims receive justice within the stipulated time.”“Collector Appreciated for Expanding BAS Scheme”“Members of the SC/ST Atrocities Act Monitoring Committee congratulated District Collector Divakar T.S. for extending the BAS scheme to 101 private and corporate schools in Khammam district. “Khammam, August 11 (Indian Chronicle): “Serious concerns and allegations are emerging over the activities of some individuals practising medicine in rural areas under the guise of Registered Medical Practitioners (RMPs). There are allegations that some individuals, after working for just a few months in private hospitals, enter villages and introduce themselves as “doctors” while providing medical treatment to the public. “Despite allegedly lacking proper medical qualifications, some are accused of prescribing medicines, administering injections and providing various forms of treatment. This has raised serious concerns among villagers, particularly over who would be held responsible if the condition of a patient deteriorates after receiving treatment from an unqualified person. “Patient Referrals.. A Route to Commissions? “There are also allegations that some RMPs identify patients in villages and refer or shift them to large private hospitals, even in cases where such referrals may not always be necessary. “Local residents allege that some individuals may receive commissions or financial shares for admitting patients to private hospitals. “According to allegations made by some locals, in certain cases, arrangements involving 30% to 50% financial shares may exist between private hospital managements and persons who bring patients to the hospitals. However, these allegations need to be independently verified and officially investigated by the concerned authorities. “If the health and well-being of a patient takes a back seat to questions such as who brought the patient, how much the hospital bill was and how much commission was received, serious questions arise about the direction in which the healthcare system is heading. “Are Poor Rural Patients Being Targeted? “Poor people, those with limited literacy and villagers with inadequate awareness about medical treatment may be particularly vulnerable to such practices. “There are concerns

that some individuals may prescribe medicines for a wide range of conditions—from fever, cold and body pains to more serious illnesses—without proper medical assessment. “Wrong medicine.. Wrong dosage.. Delayed referral.. “These factors can potentially put a patient's health at serious risk, particularly when timely treatment by a qualified medical professional is required. “Where Are the Authorities' Inspections? “People are demanding comprehensive field-level inspections by the concerned health authorities. “Officials should verify who is providing treatment in village clinics, their educational and professional qualifications, what medicines they are prescribing, who is administering injections, where emergency patients are being referred and whether there are any financial arrangements with private hospitals. “If allegations of commissions being paid for referring patients to private hospitals are found to be true, residents are demanding a proper investigation based on evidence and strict legal action against those responsible. “Does Putting Up a ‘Doctor’ Board Make Someone a Doctor? “A small room in a village.. a board displaying “Doctor” outside.. a few medicines on the table.. and experience of working in a private hospital for a few months—is that enough to legally qualify someone to provide medical treatment? “People's lives are not laboratories. A patient's trust should never become a business commodity. “Complaints regarding unqualified persons allegedly providing medical treatment must be thoroughly investigated through field-level inspections, residents say. “Authorities should also examine whether private hospitals are allegedly using illegal intermediary arrangements to attract or admit patients. “If allegations of practices that put public health at risk are to be stopped, mere warnings or statements will not be enough. “Field inspections.. collection of evidence.. verification of



facts.. and appropriate legal action are essential to protect the health and lives of people in rural areas.

Elderly Woman Goes Missing from Old Age Home

“MEDIPALLY , AUGUST 11 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): An elderly woman suffering from mental health issues went missing from an old age home under the jurisdiction of Medipally Police Station. “Lakshamma (70), who had been staying at Sayodhya Shelter Home in Medchal, was shifted to Amma Aasara Old Age Home in Chengicherla on July 15. “According to the home's management, Lakshamma left the old age home at around 6:30 a.m. on Monday. When she did not return after some time, the staff searched the surrounding areas and made enquiries with her relatives and acquaintances, but could not trace her whereabouts. The old age home management subsequently lodged a complaint with Medipally police. Police registered a case and launched an investigation to trace Lakshamma. Police have appealed to anyone who comes across her or has any information about her whereabouts to inform the police immediately.

He was produced before a court and sent to judicial remand. “The operation was conducted under the supervision of Y. Sai Sekhar, IPS, Superintendent of Railway Police, and S.N. Jawed, DSRP Secunderabad. “IGP Railway and Road Safety K. Ramesh Naidu, IPS, appreciated the GRP and RPF teams for detecting the cases and announced suitable rewards for the personnel.

Names May Change... But Does the Risk Remain the Same?

Roadside food sales raise concerns over hygiene

Are food safety rules and licensing norms being followed?

Is the food safety system in Khammam district functioning effectively?

“Khammam, August 11 (Indian Chronicle): “Falooda, kulfi, milkshakes and ice cream—these products may have attractive names and affordable prices, making them popular among children and adults alike. However, questions are being raised in Khammam district over whether some roadside food carts selling these products are following prescribed norms relating to preparation, storage, hygiene and water usage. “Falooda, kulfi and milkshake carts operating along major roads, particularly during the evening and night hours, attract a large number of customers. But are these food items being prepared under hygienic conditions? Is the water being used clean and safe? Are milk, cream, dry fruits and ice cream being stored at the required temperatures? Are expired ingredients being used? These are issues that the concerned authorities need to examine through regular inspections, residents say. “Food Prepared on Road-sides... Hygiene a Question Mark? “Food carts are often set up along roadsides, where dust, vehicle smoke, garbage and other pollutants may

come into contact with food. “People are seeking clarity on whether food items are properly covered, whether vendors follow basic hygiene practices such as wearing gloves and head caps, whether utensils and glasses are properly cleaned, and where the water used for preparation and serving is sourced from. “Do Vendors Have Food Safety Licences? “Another key question is whether roadside food vendors are complying with applicable food safety regulations and whether they possess the required food safety registration or licence. “Although food safety-related offices and officials are available in Khammam, the public wants to know how frequently inspections are being conducted at roadside food carts and other small food establishments operating in the city and across the district. “Are Children's Health Concerns Being Addressed? “Falooda, kulfi and milkshakes are particularly popular among children and youngsters. Ingredients such as milk, cream, ice cream, fruits and dry fruits require proper handling and storage to maintain food safety. “During hot weather, special attention is required to ensure that perishable and temperature-sensitive ingredients are stored under appropriate conditions. Officials need to verify whether such food safety practices are actually being followed at the field level. “Where Are the Inspections? “Large numbers of roadside food carts can be seen not only in Khammam city but also in major towns, mandal headquarters and along busy roads across the district. “The public wants clarity on whether food safety officials are conducting regular inspections, collecting samples, checking the quality of ingredients and taking action against vendors who violate food safety regulations. “Simply conducting inspections at large hotels may not be sufficient. Food sold directly to the public through roadside carts also requires regular monitoring. “Questions the Authorities Need to Answer “How many inspections have been conducted at falooda, kulfi and milkshake carts? “How many food samples have been collected? “How many vendors have valid food safety registrations or licences? “What action has been taken against vendors violating food safety norms? “Is the water used for preparing food and beverages being tested? “Is the quality of milk, cream, ice cream and other ingredients being checked? “Are inspections being conducted to determine whether expired ingredients are being used? “Is ‘Food Safety’ Only on Paper? “The concerned authorities have a responsibility to ensure that the food consumed by the public is safe. While food safety awareness programmes are being conducted, there should not be a situation where people feel that officials are ignoring roadside food sales. “Regular inspections, collection of food samples and strict enforcement of food safety regulations are essential to maintain public confidence. “The question now is whether the food safety system in Khammam district is functioning effectively on the ground or whether inspections are being limited to paperwork. “The Public Has One Demand “Whether it is a roadside falooda cart or a large hotel, the rules should be the same for everyone. There should be no compromise on food quality and public health.

Hyderabad, Aug 11 : BJP Telangana State President N Ramchander Rao today demanded that the state government provide fair compensation to the victims losing their lands, houses, and buildings in the Rajiv Rahadari expansion project. “ He participated in the protest organized by the affected residents in Karkhana and extended solidarity on behalf of the BJP. “ Rao clarified that the people losing lands, houses, and buildings for the road expansion are not opposed to development. He stated that everyone is cooperating with this project being undertaken for public benefit. However, it is essential that those sacrificing their properties receive fair compensation reflecting true market value, he said. “ He requested that just as land compensation was increased in the Thumkunta area, compensation should also be suitably increased for the people of Karkhana losing their properties in the Rajiv Rahadari expansion. He noted that compared to Thumkunta, where compensation was raised, this area is a more expensive urban zone, and under such circumstances, offering lower compensation here is unjustified. “ Reiterating the party’s full support the just demands of the affected residents, Rao demanded that the Congress government extend justice to the victims by increasing compensation here by an appropriate percentage, on par with the increase provided in Thumkunta. He stated that the government must recognize the sacrifice of the victims who are giving up their lands, houses, and properties for the public purpose.

RAHUL GANDHI NOT TO RUN AWAY FROM DEBATE IN PARLIAMENT: NRR

“ Hyderabad, Aug 11 : Strongly condemning the attitude of Congress party inside and outside parliament, Telangana State BJP President N Ramchander Rao alleged that leader of opposition Rahul Gandhi has absolutely nothing to do with the future of the students and he only practicing “ politics of convenience”. “ Addressing a press conference at state party office here, Rao asked where is Rahul Gandhi’s sympathy now, who showed fake sympathy in Delhi, and why does not he go to wipe of tears of the students in Jharkhand. He accused him of keeping stoic silence where Congress and its supported allies government committed police atrocities. But he creates a completely fake narrative in NDA rule states, he alleged. “ Why such ruthless suppression of the youth who are raising their voices in a democratic manner demanding their future and their rights. Will the support for students now be decided based on sheer political convenience and hidden agendas, state BJP chief questioned. “ He claimed that 90 per cent of the people who participated in the protest staged by Congress and the INDI Alliance in Delhi over the NEET paper leak were not students and they were outsiders. He said Anti-national slogans were raised in that protest and slogans demanding “Azadi” (freedom) for Kashmir were shouted. He further stated that members of the LGBTQ community, who had no connection to the issue, showed up there. What connection do they have with students’ problems, he asked. “ The entire country is watching right now how the students in Jharkhand are not just fighting for their issues, but are waging a peaceful, dignified, and disciplined struggle. Neither is there any use of indecent language, nor any abusive words, yet the Congress-JMM government is mercilessly committing atrocities against these students, he said. “ BJP strongly and unequivocally condemned the barbaric atrocities committed against students in Jharkhand and demanded that Rahul Gandhi and the Congress party apologize to the youth of the nation for this hypocritical double standard, Rao said. “ The Bharatiya Janata Party stands like a rock with the youth and students of Jharkhand and the Congress party and the JMM government must immediately fulfill the demands of the students, he said. “ Rao said Rahul Gandhi is no longer a failed leader today, he has become the absolute poster boy for anarchy and spreading lies in the country. “ For the last 15 days, the entire country has been watching how Rahul Gandhi has repeatedly lied, spread absolute confusion and disrupted the greatest temple of democracy (parliament), he said and alleged that Rahul Gandhi’s objective is neither dialogue nor solution, but merely to spread chaos. “ Giving further details, BJP state chief said Rahul Gandhi first demanded resignation of union education minister.
