Cyberabad braces for Turbulent Skies - Weather alert issued

“Indian Chronicle” 25 Aug 2026 “Cyberabad Traffic Police has issued a weather update advising motorists and commuters to remain alert as scattered rainfall is expected across the Cyberabad region from Tuesday afternoon through the overnight hours. “According to the weather update issued at 7 am on August 25, isolated drizzle or dry weather is likely from the morning to afternoon. A short spell of

light to moderate rain may occur from the afternoon to evening, followed by one or two spells of moderate rainfall during the night and into Wednesday morning. “The weather bulletin indicates that rainfall could be scattered across 25–55% of the Cyberabad area, particularly from the afternoon through the overnight period. “Yellow Alert During Afternoon to Overnight” The update states that there is no weather alert during the morning to afternoon period, while a Yellow Alert is indicated from the afternoon through overnight hours. “Traffic Police Safety Advisory “With wet roads and reduced visibility possible during rain, Cyberabad Traffic Police has urged motorists to exercise caution. Drivers are advised to: “* Drive within prescribed speed limits. “* Use headlights during periods of low visibility. “* Wear seat belts at all times. “*



Carry an umbrella or raincoat. “* Avoid sudden braking on wet roads. “* Remain particularly cautious during heavy or sudden showers. “Motorists and commuters are advised to plan their journeys accordingly and follow traffic rules to ensure safety on the roads.

Six Fake Doctors Held in Hyderabad for Alleged Unauthorised Medical Practice

“Hyderabad Correspondent, August 25 (Indian Chronicle): Six persons allegedly treating patients without valid medical qualifications have been apprehended in a coordinated crackdown by the Commissioner’s Task Force, Secunderabad Zone, along with police from Ramgopalpet, Chilkalguda, OU City and Domalguda. The accused allegedly presented themselves as qualified doctors and treated patients at private clinics, including by administering IV fluids, injections and prescription medicines. “Vaibhav Gaikwad Raghunath said such unauthorised medical practice not only violated the law but also put patients’ health at risk. The operation led to the seizure of 277 injections, 933 tablets, 12 bottles of glucose, 70 syringes, 57 syrups, 16 ointments, five stethoscopes, five

BP machines, five pulse oximeters, prescription pads and rubber stamps, besides other medical material. Among those apprehended was Nilagiri Prasad, who allegedly ran Family Clinic in Chilkalguda and claimed to be an MBBS general and child specialist. Police said a purported fake MBBS certificate and a Bachelor of Homeopathic and Surgery certificate were recovered from him. Adan Samdani, who allegedly ran Samdani Clinic at Nallagutta, was found preparing a homemade



petroleum-based gel for purported skin treatment, police said. “Another accused, M Srinivas, had allegedly been running Sai Ram Clinic near Lower Tank Bund for several years. The other three accused were identified as Peddapatla Sadanand of Chilkalguda, Chintaluri Ramesh of OU City and S. Lingaiah of Manikeshwar Nagar. Police said all six had allegedly acquired experience while working as assistants or compounders before starting clinics and presenting themselves as doctors. Police appealed to citizens to verify the qualifications and registration credentials of medical practitioners before seeking treatment and to report suspected unauthorised medical practice to the authorities. The operation was conducted under the supervision of Task Force DCP Vaibhav Gaikwad Raghunath, IPS, with officers and personnel from the Task Force and the four police stations.

Three Persons Lose Gold Ornaments in Boduppall Bonalu Rush

“MEDIPALLY, AUGUST 25 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Medipally police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the theft of gold ornaments belonging to three persons during the heavy rush at Boduppall on the night of August 23, when Bonalu festivities were being held. According to the complaint, Kode Venkata Swamy was at the Bangaru Maisamma Temple around 10:30 p.m. on August 23 and later near the HDFC Bank at Boduppall around 11 p.m. During this time, he noticed that a gold chain weighing approximately one tola, which he was wearing around his neck, was missing. In the same crowd, an



approximately one-tola gold chain belonging to Ranjith Kumar, son of Ravinder Reddy, and a one-tola gold locket belonging to Poosa Karthik Goud were also allegedly stolen by unidentified persons. The victims submitted a written complaint to the police at around 9:30 p.m. on August 24, requesting that the persons responsible for the thefts be identified and legal action be taken. Police Action: Based on the complaint, Medipally police registered Case No. 1228/2026 under Section 303(2) of the BNS and commenced an investigation. A free copy of the FIR was provided to the complainant.

No compromise on public safety, says Karimnagar Collector

Officials told to identify accident-prone stretches and take corrective measures.

Karimnagar August 25 (Correspondent): Collector Chitra Mishra has directed officials to adopt stringent measures to prevent road accidents and ensure that public safety is not compromised.

Addressing a meeting of the Road Safety Committee at the Collectorate here on Tuesday, Ms. Mishra said officials of all concerned departments should work in coordination to identify accident-prone locations and take corrective measures.



She instructed officials to conduct regular inspections of major roads and address issues such as CC patchwork, major approach road works and open drains in congested areas. Necessary facilities should also be provided near the road-over-bridge (ROB), she said.

The Collector directed the municipal authorities to conduct circle-wise inspections within the Corporation limits and identify locations that posed a risk to motorists and pedestrians.

She further ordered a special drive against roadside flex banners and hoardings and called for strict enforcement of the prescribed regulations.

On hit-and-run cases, Ms. Mishra instructed the concerned departments to ensure that compensation reached victims without delay. She also directed officials to make advance arrangements to prevent any inconvenience during the forthcoming Ganesh festivities.

Police Commissioner Gaush Alam briefed the meeting on road accidents, e-challans and hit-and-run cases.

Officials from the Transport, Police, Medical, Municipal Administration, Fire Services, Roads and Buildings and National Highways Authority of India departments, besides RTA member Padala Rahul, attended the meeting.

Safety standards should be strictly implemented in hazardous factories:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Collector Anurag Jayanti

“(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Indian Chronicle.. August 25):- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District: District Collector Anurag Jayanti has ordered the officials to strictly implement safety standards in hazardous factories in the district. District Collector Anurag Jayanti and Additional Collector of Local Bodies Bhaskar Rao participated in a review meeting held with officials of Factories, Pollution Control Board, Labor Department, Fire and other departments at the VC Meeting Hall of the Collectorate on Tuesday. Speaking on this occasion, the Collector mentioned the recent accidents in chemical and pharmaceutical industries that have resulted in the loss of precious human lives and suggested that the owners of the industries should take strict preventive safety measures to prevent such incidents from recurring. He made it clear that the safety of workers should be given top priority and that no negligence in the implementation of safety standards would be tolerated. He ordered the officials to take steps to obtain safety certification through a third-party safety consultant in all hazardous factories in the district. He ordered the management of the factories concerned to submit a Compliance Report regarding the actions taken on the safety deficiencies identified in their industries within 10 days. The Collector suggested that the management should immediately rectify the deficiencies identified during the inspections on safety standards in the industries. He ordered that dryers, reactors, explosion relief panels, safety valves and other safety devices should be installed in the factories and that they should be checked regularly to ensure that they are functioning properly. The Collector ordered that the Pollution Control Board officials should collect samples from all chemical industries in the district within a week and conduct tests as per the relevant standards. He advised PCB officials to continuously monitor the strict implementation of environmental protection regulations and pollution control standards. The Collector said that the industrial owners should strictly follow the regulations and give top priority to the safety of workers and the people of the surrounding area. He made it clear that the government will not compromise on the safety of the people and workers under any circumstances. 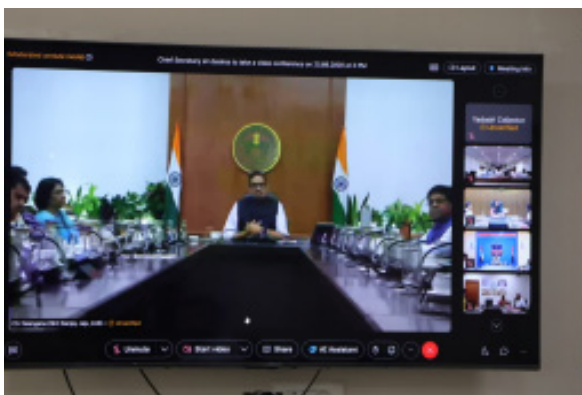
Pending custom milling rice should be completed within the specified time:- Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Revenue Additional Collector Venka Reddy

A review meeting was held with the rice millers in the district at the Additional Collector's Chamber on Tuesday. The millers were instructed to immediately deliver raw rice in relation to the pending custom milling rice, complete the custom milling process within the specified time and provide the rice to the government. He also advised that the specified time should be followed without any delay in the matter of rice payable to the government. It was clarified that bank guarantees should be submitted immediately. “(Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Bureau.. Indian Chronicle.. August 25):- State Government Chief Secretary Sanjay Jaju has instructed district collectors to pay special focus on making Telangana an attractive destination for domestic and foreign tourists and strengthening 'Brand Telangana' at the global level. On Tuesday, State Government Chief Secretary Sanjay Jaju held a review meeting with all district collectors through video conference from Hyderabad on the rain-related issues, tourism development, and other issues. District Collector Anurag Jayanthi and Additional Collector of Local Bodies Bhaskar Rao participated from the video conference hall. In this context, the Chief Secretary of the State Government said that 27 special tourist areas selected across the state should be developed on a priority basis and comprehensive development plans should be prepared by connecting the tourist areas in each district. It was suggested that Yadadri, Bhadrachalam, Basara, Warangal, Alampur, Keesaragutta, Kalvakurthi, Medak, Nalgonda, Pochampally, Karimnagar, Charninar, Golconda, Medigadda, Pakala, Manuguru, Kaval, Eturunagaram, Vedurukonda, Nagarjunasagar, Mahabubnagar, Narsapur, Cheryala, etc. should be developed as comprehensive tourist destinations. He ordered that roads, parking, drinking water, toilets, electricity, cleanliness, signboards and other visitor facilities should be improved in tourist areas. It was suggested that clear development activities, responsibilities and time limits should be formulated for each special tourist area and the progress of the work should be reviewed regularly. He said that local arts, crafts, local food and culture should be given priority

and employment opportunities should be provided to the locals, and home stays and local guide services should be encouraged. He said that by introducing Telangana culture, arts, crafts, historical heritage, local food, festivals and traditions to the world, a special identity should be given to 'Brand Telangana'. He ordered that the natural and historical uniqueness of tourist destinations should be preserved and developed in an environmentally friendly manner. The CS said that the state is currently experiencing a 22 percent deficit in rainfall and that weather experts have indicated that there is no possibility of heavy rains till the end of September. He said that so far, crops have been cultivated in about 1.20 crore acres across the state, and in the last monsoon, about 1.38 crore acres were cultivated. He instructed the collectors to continuously monitor the availability of crops, irrigation water and drinking water in the wake of the rain deficit and take necessary preventive measures. Choutuppal Revenue Divisional Officer Sekhar Reddy, DAO Ramana Reddy, DYSO Dhananjayulu and others participated in this video conference.

Before Signing, Records Matter! Deputy b Will Not Sign Without Proper Records

“Kumrambheem, Asifabad, District. "Indian Chronicle" August.26. “Wankidi: The decision taken by Wankidi Major Gram Panchayat Deputy Sarpanch Deepak Munde to insist on proper records and transparency before approving a payment has become a topic of discussion locally. He reportedly insisted that the relevant records be examined before signing the bill for ₹63,600 proposed to be paid from the 15th Finance Commission funds. “Locals say Deepak has demonstrated that elected representatives should not simply sign every file placed before them, but must examine the details and supporting documents. Many residents appreciated his stand, saying that public money should be spent only after proper verification of records. ““Show the Records First.. Then I Will Sign” “According to information, the payment process for ₹63,600 was initiated based on File No. 13/GPW/2026-27, dated 03-08-2026, relating to sand-filling works in Akini, Mandokar, Wada and Ramnagar areas. “When the file was placed before him, Deepak reportedly sought clarification on several issues. He questioned whether the Gram Panchayat resolution, work order, estimates and measurement records were available and asked where the Measurement Book (MB) records were maintained. “Questions Raised for the Sake of Public Funds “Locals say Deepak’s insistence on examining the documents instead of simply signing the file has been appreciated by several people. His stand, reportedly, is that every payment involving public funds must have proper supporting records and that officials and representatives should be able to answer audit-related questions in the future. “He has reportedly maintained that he would sign only after the records and supporting documents were properly verified. “Questions Over the Responses of Sarpanch and Secretary “The responses reportedly given by the Sarpanch and Panchayat

Secretary when questioned by media representatives have also raised discussions locally. “It is learnt that the Sarpanch stated that he had signed after being shown certain documents, while the Panchayat Secretary reportedly said that the records had been kept at his residence. Against this backdrop, questions are being raised over the availability and accessibility of important Panchayat records for verification. ““A Signature Also Carries Responsibility” “Signing a bill is not merely a routine procedure, as the signature also carries responsibility for the payment process. Locals say Deepak has made his position clear by refusing to sign without first examining the relevant records. “Several residents expressed the view that such scrutiny can help improve transparency in Gram Panchayat administration and that every public representative should carefully examine bills involving public funds. ““The Bill Was Not Stopped Without Reason” “Some villagers have appreciated Deputy Sarpanch Deepak for asking for documentary evidence before allowing the payment process to proceed. They said that whenever public money is involved, questions should be answered with proper records. “Villagers have demanded that the Gram Panchayat resolution, work order, estimate, MB records, measurements and other supporting documents related to the ₹63,600 bill be officially made available for verification. “They also urged the concerned authorities to conduct a thorough inquiry into the ₹63,600 bill issue and bring the facts to light. “Locally, the opinion is being expressed that Deputy Sarpanch Deepak should be supported rather than criticised for questioning the use of public funds, as demanding proper records before signing is being viewed by many residents as an act of responsibility and accountability.

No to Ramky... We Want GHMC Protest Against Handing Over Garbage Collection to Private Firm Ramky Garbage Transportation Comes to a Standstill at Mallapur Transit Point Swachh Auto Drivers Dump Garbage at Transfer Station in Protests



“Nacharam, August 25 (INDIAN CHRONICLE) : “Protests have intensified against the reported move to hand over the responsibility of household garbage collection to the private company Ramky. Swachh Auto Union auto-trolley drivers expressed their anger by dumping the garbage collected from households in heaps in front of transit points. “Garbage transportation at the transfer station near Elephant Circle in Mallapur has come to a complete standstill. Swachh auto-trolley drivers from five divisions under the Nacharam Circle have been boycotting their duties and staging protests for the past four days. “Nacharam Circle Swachh Auto-Trolley Drivers' Union President Chekka Srinivas expressed concern that the government is taking steps to hand over the garbage collection responsibility to the private company Ramky. “Swachh Auto-Trolley Drivers' Union Protest “Swachh Auto Union drivers and helpers are protesting against the proposal to entrust garbage collection to the private firm Ramky. Union President Chekka Srinivas stated that lakhs of families in the Greater Hyderabad region depend on this work for their livelihood. “He questioned the government's commitment towards poor families, alleging that their livelihoods are being ignored in favour of handing over the work to a private company. The protesters raised slogans and demanded that the existing garbage collection system should continue as it has been functioning in the past. “Union Vice-President Pakirappa, General Secretary Nagappa, and representatives Ramdas, Brahmaiah, Karthik and Vadde Hanumanth participated in the protest. “Transportation Stalled, Garbage Piles Up “More than 60 auto-trolley drivers from five wards under the Nacharam Circle usually collect garbage door-to-door and transport it to the transit point at Mallapur Elephant Junction. The accumulated waste is then transported to the Jawaharnagar dumping yard through large trolley lorries. “However, due to the Swachh auto-trolley drivers' protest over the past several days, the garbage collection and transportation process has come to a standstill. As garbage is not being collected regularly, waste is accumulating in households and at transit points. “Garbage dumped in front of the transit points has formed huge heaps. The area has become unhygienic due to the foul smell. With the monsoon season underway, the garbage is getting wet in the rain and emitting an even stronger stench. The presence of flies and mosquitoes is causing serious inconvenience to residents of the surrounding colonies. “Local residents have urged the government to intervene immediately and expedite the process of clearing the accumulated garbage. “Swachh Families Will Be Left on the Streets” – Chekka Srinivas, Nacharam Circle President “Chekka Srinivas stated that thousands of families have been dependent on this profession for several years. He expressed concern that handing over the work to a private company such as Ramky could leave Swachh workers and their families without a livelihood. “He alleged that the attempt to hand over the work to a private organisation was unfortunate and demanded that the government protect the livelihoods of existing workers. “The union representatives

stated that they would not resume the removal of garbage until the government provides a clear assurance regarding their employment and the continuation of the existing Swachh Auto-Trolley system.

BJP’s 48-HOURS HUNGER STRIKE CONCLUDED WITH MASSIVE PUBLIC SUPPORT

Hyderabad, Aug 25 : The 48-hours Hunger strike initiated by BJP State President N Ramchander Rao demanding state Congress government for early release of Rs 15000 crore fee reimbursement and scholarship dues, ended today successfully with immense public support in spite of police rejection and denying of permission. “

BJP state chief has launched 48-hours hunger strike yesterday at 10 an inside BJP state office after police denied permission to organize it at Dharna chowk. A massive crowd gathered at the Nampally and all walks of people visited the venue and expressed their solidarity. The party cadre successfully conducted the fast despite government blockades and police restrictions. The event christened as “FEES BAKAYI—BJP LADAYI” (BJP struggle for fee dues) was organized by BJYM. “

Rao ended his fast by accepting lemon juice. Rajya Sabha MP Dr. K. Laxman, BJLP Leader Aleti Maheshwar Reddy, Malkajiri MP Eatala Rajender, Adilabad MLA Payal Shanker, and other key leaders offered lemon juice to him. “

This struggle against the anti-people policies of the Revanth Reddy government, which has pushed the lives of 40 lakh students across the state into crisis, shook the foundations of the Congress administration. Initially, permission was denied at Dharna Chowk, and the police even issued rejection letters to suppress the protest in front of the BJP State Office undemocratically. The government even denied a medical team and ambulance services at the protest site. However, ignoring government blockades and police restrictions, Ramchander Rao resolutely began and successfully continued his fast within the state BJP office premises. “The hunger strike protest received an overwhelming response from all corners of the state. Students, unemployed youth, women, intellectuals, and artists arrived in large numbers. The Nampally state office premises echoed like a battleground with movement songs, traditional performances, and cultural displays. Thousands of students from Osmania, Kakatiya, Palamuru, Telangana, and Satavahana Universities, along with prominent engineering, medical, polytechnic, ayurvedic, unani, and homeopathy colleges, came in person to share their distress with BJP chief Ramchander Rao and expressed complete solidarity. The Bharatiya Janata Yuva Morcha (BJYM) submitted documents containing 5 lakh student signatures collected at the field level, issuing a firm warning to the Congress government. “

Along with political circles, all sections of society joined this struggle. BJP MPs, MLAs, MLCs, former MPs, former MLAs, state office bearers, and district presidents gathered at the protest site to offer support. In addition, leaders of Degree College Associations, heads of various educational institutions, college managements, professors, lecturers, employees, advocates, doctors, labor union leaders, and representatives of ex-servicemen associations stood firmly with the BJP in demanding the release of fee dues. “

Speaking at the venue, BJP leaders and public representatives lashed out at the Congress government, Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, and the double standards of Rahul Gandhi. They alleged that Congress leaders who made numerous promises in the name of a ‘Youth Declaration’ during elections, fell at the feet of unemployed youth near the Ashok Nagar library and gave written commitments are now destroying the livelihoods of those very students after coming to power. While they claim to have no funds for fee reimbursement for poor students, they spend hundreds of crores of public money hosting leaders in Delhi lavishly. “

BJP leaders further blamed that Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, who holds the education portfolio, ignores the plight of students while making time for foreign trips to Harvard and Oxford. Why can’t Rahul Gandhi who travels across other states staging dramas about fighting for students under ‘Chatron Ki Goonj’ hear the cries of students in Congress-ruled Telangana. History shows that any government will collapse if the youth rise up in anger, they warned. “

Leaders sternly warned that if the Revanth Reddy government does not immediately open its eyes and pay every single rupee of the Rs. 15,000 crore fee dues, they will lay siege to the Secretariat along with the students and bring down the Congress government. “

Speaking to media after ending the fast BJP state chief Rao warned that the fight against the Congress government will not stop until the dues of Rs. 15,000 crore are released. If justice is not served to the students, we will soon lay siege to the Secretariat and force the Congress government to bend, he said. “

Experts Call for Intelligence-Led Action to Break Cross-Border Illicit Trade Networks at ASIA Security Conference 2026

““Hyderabad: ““Seizing ‘illicit goods’ is no longer enough to win the war against illicit trade. Law enforcement and regulatory authorities must shift from simply intercepting shipments to actively identifying, tracking, and dismantling the organized criminal networks behind them, experts emphasized at the ASIA Security Conference & Exhibition 2026 in Mumbai. ““Organized under the theme “Strengthening Enforcement, Empowering Innovation: India’s Next Chapter in Brand Protection,” the two-day summit convened senior representatives from Indian Customs, State Police, international intellectual property agencies, and global



brand leaders to address the escalating sophistication of cross-border smuggling, digital distribution channels, and regulatory arbitrage. ““During the panel discussion “Intelligence-Led Enforcement: Disrupting Counterfeit & Illicit Trade Networks Across Border,” Rodney Van Dooren, Director of Illicit Trade Prevention at Philip Morris International (PMI), emphasized that isolated enforcement actions must evolve into connected intelligence operations, “Every seizure matters, but the greatest value of a seizure is the in-

telligence that it provides. When that information is shared across agencies, jurisdictions, and companies, it allows us to move beyond intercepting products and towards disrupting the criminal networks behind them. ““Stepping in to deliver the keynote address “Combating Illicit Trade in India – Challenges, Solutions and The Road Ahead”, Van Dooren highlighted the massive scale of the issue. He pointed out that India’s illicit trade is estimated at \$231.5 billion annually, making it the second-largest illicit trade market by value among surveyed nations. Focusing specifically on the tobacco sector, he noted that while illicit trade accounts for about 11.6% of the global cigarette market, the problem in India is far more pronounced.

Women reshape professional learning choices in India: TimesPro data

Translating that ambition into meaningful workforce participation will depend not only on women entering employment, but also on their ability to remain, progress and take on greater responsibility across sectors. Against this backdrop, professional learning assumes particular relevance. Structured programmes with recognised credentials can help women deepen domain knowledge, build capabilities for changing roles and strengthen their professional standing as they navigate different stages of their careers. “The TimesPro data makes these choices more visible. In human resource management, women constitute 62% of programme applicants, making them a clear majority in a field that has itself evolved from a largely administrative function into one with significant influence over talent, culture and organisational strategy. In healthcare management, women represent 47% of applicants, reflecting their substantial presence in a sector undergoing rapid professionalisation. Women also account for 32% of applicants to leadership and strategy programmes and 28% across finance and technology, disciplines in which representation has historically been less balanced. Significantly, the application-to-enrolment conversion rate for women is 28%, the same as for men, suggesting no discernible difference in follow-through once the decision to apply has been made. ““Dr. Brillian S.K., Chief People Officer and Head – Places & Processes, TimesPro, said “What interests me most is not only where women are applying, but the seriousness with which they are making those choices. We are seeing women invest in capabilities that can broaden the scope of their careers, from people leadership and healthcare to finance, AI-led technology and strategy.
