

Make AIKMS Telangana State Conference a Grand Success: Ratnam Poshanna

Conference to be held in Mancherial on September 08 and 09

“Kumrambheem, Asifabad, District Reporter "Indian Chronicle" August.31.” “Asifabad, AIKMS Komuram Bheem District Convener Ratnam Poshanna called upon farmers and agricultural workers to participate in large numbers and make the Telangana State Conference of the All India Kisan Mazdoor Sabha (AIKMS) a grand success. The state conference will be held in Mancherial district headquarters on September 08 and 09. As part of the campaign, AIKMS leaders unveiled the conference poster at Janakapur in Komuram Bheem Asifabad district on Saturday. Speaking on the occasion, Ratnam Poshanna said that the agricultural sector in India was facing a severe crisis due to anti-farmer policies and economic liberalisation policies being followed by the ruling governments. He alleged that the promises made by the Central Government during the farmers' agitation in Delhi had not been fully implemented, which reflected the government's lack of commitment towards farmers. He said farmers were struggling due to the lack of remunerative prices and adequate Minimum Support Prices (MSP) for agricultural produce. He alleged that unequal agreements being entered into with several countries were adversely affecting the interests of Indian farmers. He demanded that such agreements, particularly those affecting the agricultural sector, be reviewed and cancelled in the interest of farmers. Poshanna also expressed concern over the increasing use of seeds produced by multinational companies and the sale of fake seeds. He alleged that large-scale seed business was being carried out without proper permissions in some areas and urged the government to take strict action against those involved in illegal and fake seed trade. He said the upcoming state conference would discuss various problems being faced by farmers and agricultural workers and formulate a future course of action. He stated that AIKMS would strengthen the farmers' and agricultural workers' movement and continue its struggles against policies that adversely affect their interests. He appealed to farmers and agricultural workers from Komuram Bheem district to participate in large numbers in the AIKMS Telangana State Conference



to be held in Mancherial on September 8 and 9 and make it a success. AIKMS mandal leaders Kanaji Veeranna, Baba and Abdullah, IFTU district leader Bandari Tirupathi, PDSU district general secretary Jagajampula Tirupathi, mandal president Sameer, leader Akhil and others participated in the programme.

Over Rs 42 Lakh in Public Funds Allegedly Wasted in the Name of Development at Manikguda



“Conduct a Comprehensive Inquiry and Take Action Against Those Responsible: CPM” “Kumrambheem, Asifabad, District Reporter "Indian Chronicle" August.31.” “Asifabad: CPM District Secretariat Member Durgam Dinakar has alleged that more than ₹42 lakh in public funds was wasted in the name of development works at Manikguda village in Komuram Bheem Asifabad district.

He demanded a comprehensive inquiry into the works and strict action against those found responsible. “Speaking on the issue, Durgam Dinakar said that Komuram Bheem Asifabad is already a backward district and every rupee allocated for public development should be utilised properly. Carrying out substandard works in the name of development and wasting public money was unacceptable, he said. He questioned the basis on which the development works at Manikguda were proposed and sanctioned, the manner in which the estimates were prepared, and the procedure followed in awarding the contract.

He demanded that district officials provide clarity to the public on the total expenditure, quality of the works and payments made to the contractor. Dinakar said the allegations surrounding the expenditure of more than ₹42 lakh should be thoroughly investigated to establish the facts.

He urged District Collector to order a detailed inquiry into the development works at Manikguda and examine the quality of construction, utilisation of funds and implementation of the project. If irregularities or misuse of public funds are established, strict action should be taken against the officials and contractors responsible, he demanded on behalf of the CPM. He further appealed to the authorities to ensure that public funds meant for development are utilised transparently and effectively.

Identify Poor Families for Indiramma Houses— Selvatkar Pentu

Reporter "Indian Chronicle" August.31. “Wankidi: Wankidi Mandal Congress Party Vice-President Selvatkar Pentu urged the government and concerned officials to ensure that only genuinely eligible poor families are sanctioned houses under the second phase of the Indiramma Indlu scheme. He said special attention should be given to poor families living in sheet-roofed houses, thatched huts, old structures and dilapidated houses across various villages in Wankidi mandal. Officials should conduct field-level inspections to identify such families and give them priority under the scheme. Speaking to the media, Pentu said several poor families have been waiting for years for a permanent house of their own. Families living in temporary and thatched houses are facing severe difficulties, particularly during the rainy season. Some houses have reached a completely dilapidated condition, leaving residents worried about their safety. He said the Indiramma Indlu scheme is not merely a housing programme but an initiative aimed at providing security and a dignified life to poor families. Therefore, the selection of beneficiaries should be completely transparent, without political interference, personal recommendations or preference being given to ineligible applicants. “Field-Level Verification Essential” Pentu urged officials not to rely solely on records and lists available at government offices while selecting beneficiaries for the second phase. Instead, they should visit villages and verify the actual living conditions of applicants. Officials should examine whether a family owns a house, the condition of the existing house, its financial circumstances and the type of dwelling in which the family currently lives before preparing the final beneficiary list. He specifically urged officials to focus on families living in sheet-roofed houses, thatched huts, old shelters and severely damaged structures. Every application submitted by an eligible poor family should be examined impartially and justice should be ensured, he said. “No Scope for

Irregularities” Pentu cautioned that even minor irregularities in the beneficiary selection process could deprive genuinely deserving poor families of the benefits. He urged officials to conduct regular field visits and continuously monitor the selection process. “He also appealed to officials to promptly investigate complaints received from the public and ensure justice for eligible families. Coordination between elected representatives and officials is essential to ensure that government welfare schemes reach every deserving household, he said. “Avoid Actions That Damage the Party’s Image” Pentu said it was unfortunate that some individuals may attempt to misuse the party’s name for personal interests and bring disrepute to the ruling party at a time when the government’s welfare programmes are receiving a positive response from the people. He urged the party leadership to take serious note of activities such as unnecessarily interfering in welfare schemes or causing inconvenience to the public in the name of the party. Priority should be given to those who genuinely work for the welfare of the people, while individuals who damage the party’s reputation should be brought under discipline, he said. “Welfare of the Poor Is the Government’s Priority” Pentu appealed to everyone to cooperate with the government’s objective of fulfilling the dream of a permanent house for poor families through the Indiramma Indlu scheme. He said identifying every eligible poor family and ensuring justice without discrimination is the true meaning of public service. People’s representatives and officials should jointly collect comprehensive details of deserving families and ensure a transparent selection process. “He urged the government and concerned officials to give priority not only to families without houses but also to those living in unsafe and dilapidated structures, and to ensure transparency, impartiality and continuous official monitoring in the second phase of the Indiramma Indlu housing allocation process.

Illegal Cattle Transportation Foiled, Six Arrested 41 Cattle Seized by Bejjur Police

Reporter "Indian Chronicle" August.31. “Bejjur police in Kumram Bheem Asifabad district have foiled an alleged illegal cattle transportation operation and arrested six persons. Police seized 41 cattle from their possession. According to police, Bejjur Sub-Inspector M.D. Sartaj Pasha received credible information that some individuals were purchasing cattle at low prices in Maharashtra and transporting them to a slaughtering market in Jagtial. “Acting swiftly on the information, SI M.D. Sartaj Pasha, along with his police personnel, reached the outskirts of Susmeer village in Bejjur mandal. The police intercepted the persons who were allegedly transporting the cattle and took six individuals into custody. During the operation, police seized a total of 41 cattle. The authorities are investigating the circumstances surrounding the transportation, including the documents and permissions related to the cattle movement. Police said that strict action would be taken against those involved in illegal cattle transportation. A case has been registered and further investigation is underway.



Delay in Clearing Waste from Ramantapur Dumping Yard Leaves Garbage on Roads

Residents Warn of Protest if Sanitation Issue Is Not Resolved



“UPPAL, AUGUST 30 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): The garbage problem in Ramantapur has become severe, with huge piles of waste accumulating around the dumping yard located on the route from KCR Kaman to Uppal Metro Station. Residents said that garbage has not been cleared for the past five to six days, forcing waste to pile up along the roads. “People from KCR Nagar, KTR Nagar, Ram Reddy Nagar, Venkat Reddy Nagar and other surrounding colonies said they were facing serious inconvenience due to the mounting garbage. They alleged that waste collected from households was being brought to the dumping yard but was not being transported further, worsening the situation. “Residents said the heaps of garbage were causing a foul smell and increasing the mosquito menace, raising concerns over public health. They demanded that officials clarify whether the Ramky agency has the required permissions for collecting and transporting household waste, where the collected waste is supposed to be taken, and what rules are being followed. They also urged the authorities to resolve any

internal differences, if any, between the Ramky agency and sanitation workers so that residents do not suffer. “Residents questioned why the problem remained unresolved despite visits to the area by GHMC officials and the Uppal MLA. They alleged that repeated complaints to officials and public representatives had not resulted in any concrete action. They demanded that the authorities disclose the actual reason for the delay in transporting the garbage and take immediate steps to resolve the issue. The residents warned that they would launch a protest if the problem was not addressed immediately. Uppal CPM leaders Bheeshmachari and Prajavani voluntary organisation president Erram Srinivas also demanded that GHMC officials coordinate with the concerned departments and take immediate action. They appealed to the authorities to remove the garbage without further delay and address the sanitation problem, keeping public health in mind.

Woman killed as chicken van hits auto-rickshaw in Karimnagar

One critically injured; Choppadandi MLA seeks government compensation for deceased's family.



Karimnagar August 30 (Correspondent): A 55-year-old agricultural labourer was killed and another person was critically injured when a chicken transport van rammed into an auto-rickshaw on the Gangadhara-Karimnagar road in Karimnagar district on Sunday.

The deceased was identified as Lingala Devamma, a resident of the BC Colony in Mangampet village of Gangadhara mandal. She and other agricultural labourers were travelling from Mangampet to Malkapur to work in a cotton field when the accident occurred near the Rayakam Laxmaiah Function Hall.

According to the information available, the van, which was travelling behind the auto-rickshaw, hit the vehicle, leaving Devamma with severe injuries. She died while being shifted to hospital. Another person injured in the accident was admitted to Medcover Hospital in

Karimnagar, where the condition was reported to be critical.

Choppadandi MLA and Karimnagar District Congress president Dr. Medipalli Sathyam visited the Civil Hospital after learning about the accident and enquired about the condition of the injured. He spoke to the District Collector over the phone and urged the authorities to ensure that the injured received proper medical treatment.

Mr. Sathyam also visited the family of the deceased and spoke to the Chief Minister's Office, requesting that compensation be provided to the bereaved family on behalf of the government.

Mangampet sarpanch Lingala Lingaiah, deputy sarpanch Nalla Hanumanthu and Congress leader Bairishetty Sampath were among those who accompanied the MLA.

SIR portal in Telangana gets all 11 document categories

Electors can now upload documents prescribed under the revision process.

Karimnagar August 30 (Correspondent): All 11 categories of supporting documents prescribed under the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls have now been made available on the online portal for electors responding to SIR notices in Telangana.

The development follows a representation submitted by advocates Neha Amreen and Qudsia Tabassum of the Hum Foundation to the Chief Electoral Officer, Telangana, seeking that the online system provide all the document categories prescribed under the SIR framework.

The representation pointed out that the portal initially provided only three options for uploading documents — birth certificate, matriculation/educational certificate and passport. The limited options, they said, could cause difficulties to genuine electors who possessed other documents recognised under the SIR process.

Following the representation, the portal has now been expanded to accommodate all 11 prescribed categories, enabling electors to submit documentary evidence relevant to their individual cases.

Adv. Neha Amreen welcomed the development and said the change would help genuine electors furnish the documents actually available with them and reduce procedural difficulties during SIR verification.

"This is an important step towards procedural fairness and ensuring that a technical limitation does not become an obstacle for eligible electors in exercising their electoral rights," she said.

The move is expected to provide greater flexibility to electors across Telangana in responding to SIR notices and submitting supporting documents for verification.

The development assumes significance as the SIR exercise involves verification of electoral roll entries and supporting documentation. Making all prescribed document categories available on the online portal is expected to make the process more elector-friendly.

Commissioner Desai directs officials to hasten SIR notice disposal

Voters who missed scheduled dates asked to submit documents by September 22.

Karimnagar August 30 (Correspondent): Karimnagar Municipal Commissioner Praful Desai has directed officials to expedite the process of disposing of notices issued as part of the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of electoral rolls.

Mr. Desai inspected the SIR notice enquiry counters set up at Kalabharathi on the premises of the Karimnagar Municipal Corporation here on Sunday. He reviewed the arrangements made for each polling booth and checked the process of receiving supporting documents from voters, the registers maintained at the counters and the online uploading of documents.

The Commissioner interacted with Booth Level Officers (BLOs) and supervisors and sought details of the notices issued, documents received from voters and the progress made in their disposal. He subsequently inspected the online process for uploading the documents and issued instructions to the officials.



Mr. Desai directed BLOs and supervisors to ensure that voters who had received notices submitted the required documents in accordance with the notices. Officials were also

instructed to contact voters who had failed to appear on the dates fixed for the disposal of their notices and facilitate submission of the documents within the prescribed deadline.

He emphasised that the online processing should be taken up promptly after receiving the documents and that the entire notice-disposal exercise should be completed at the earliest.

Special counters have also been arranged at Kalabharathi for voters who could not appear on the dates specified in their notices. Mr. Desai appealed to them to submit the required documents at the concerned counters by September 22 and complete the disposal and online processing of their notices.

IVF Facility helps barren cattle

“A good news has come to light for the cattle farmers of Tirhut Division of Bihar where IVF (In Vitro Fertilization) facility is going to provide for barren cows and buffalos of the cattle farmers by the Animal Husbandry department of Bihar government where cattle farming is the backbone of the rural economy. “As the concerned department provides such facilities in District Animals Husbandry Hospitals. The government is going to expence 63.92 crore on this scheme .In the first phase the identification of the barren cattle will be completed and after that they will be fertilised under this scheme.As about 131.35 lac cattle are in reproductive state. But due to climate change and other natural changes several milky cows and buffaloes have reached in non reproductive state which made cattle farmers worried and rural economy would be dwindled. “As in lack of balanced food such as green grass, Vitamin A, E, Zinc, Copper and other minerals the cattle become weak and make them non reproductive. The milky cows and buffaloes may victim of the lack of such minerals and balanced food and after giving birth first calf they become the victims of such disease.The cattle farmers look after some months or years and wating for their reproduction. But when a long period passed they left them abandoned and their barren cattle become a curse for the people of society which move hear and there and destroy the crops of the peasants.The poor condition of cow sheltre or Goshala could not

check their movement. “

But the IVF (In Vitro Fertilization) technology in cows and buffaloes has brought hope for the reproduction and a sign of smiling on the faces of several cattle farmers of the rural areas.First of all the expert veterinary doctor will examin the health and reproductive organs of the barren cattle and after that he may use such technology to conceive them.After that the cattle would live under the supervision of the doctor and the master.“As it is noted that the economy of Bihar is dependent upon agriculture and cattle farming is a part of this.The rural economy of Bihar is also dependent on milk production and other farming such as fishery and goatary. Milk production is the backbone of rural economy in several districts of Bihar as Patna,Muzaffarpur, Saran, Gopalganj, East Champaran,West Champaran, Sita Madhi ,Darbhanga, Khagaria,Saharsa,Madhepura etc.“But in West Champaran District the milky cattle of peasants adjacent to forest villages are preyed by wildlife of Valmik Tiger Reserve (VTR) which made the cattle farmers worried and on the name of casualties the forest department provides them some amount on the name of compensation. Gold and Silver Ornaments Stolen from Woman's Handbag at Peerzadiguda Kaman

“““MEDIPALLY, AUGUST 30 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Medipally police have registered a case and launched an investigation into the theft of gold and silver ornaments from a woman's handbag at Peerzadiguda Kaman.“According to police, Bairi Pushpa (42), a resident of Ranga Reddy district, left her home in Kothapet at around 3:30 p.m. on August 28 and travelled by an RTC bus to Uppal Modern Bakery. From there, she boarded another bus and travelled to Peerzadiguda Kaman.“After getting off the bus, Pushpa checked her handbag and found that the ornaments kept inside were missing. She later discovered that one gold chain and two gold rings weighing around two tolas, along with a silver puja set weighing approximately 15 tolas, had been stolen. The total value of the stolen ornaments is estimated at around Rs. 63,000, according to her complaint.Suspecting that unidentified persons had stolen the ornaments from her handbag, Pushpa approached the Medipally police. Based on her complaint, police registered FIR No. 1253/2026 under Section 305(b) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and are investigating the case.

“““BODUPPAL, AUGUST 30 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): CPM State Secretariat Member and Yadadri Bhuvanagiri District Secretary M.D. Jahangir criticised the government for failing to complete irrigation and drinking water projects even after a decade since the formation of Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district. He demanded that the government immediately release funds for pending projects and announce a clear deadline for their completion.“The CPM Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district committee's padayatra, organised demanding the completion of unfinished irrigation projects in the district, reached Uppal on its second day after passing through Ghatkesar and Medipally. Addressing a press conference at Peerzadiguda under Boduppall Circle, Jahangir said lakhs of small and marginal farmers in the agriculture-dependent Yadadri Bhuvanagiri district were facing severe hardships due to inadequate irrigation facilities.“He said the works of the Bunadigani, Dharmareddy and Pillayapalli canals had come to a standstill due to lack of funds. He expressed concern that multipurpose projects such as Baswapur, Gandhamalla and Charlyagudem were also pending because of insufficient funding, resulting in continued irrigation and drinking water problems in the district.“Jahangir said the canals constructed to supply water from the Nawabpet reservoir to Gundala mandal and from Ashwarayapalli to the Aleru region had remained unused for more than 15 years and had deteriorated with grass growing over them. He demanded that the government explain to the people why the Rachakonda Lift Irrigation Project, which is crucial for the Narayanapur and Choutuppall regions, has not progressed. He also called for the restoration of the Asifnagar and Brindavanam canals.“Godavari Water the Solution for Musi Rejuvenation“Jahangir said people were questioning whether the government's programmes being undertaken in the name of Musi beautification were aimed only at promoting corporate interests. He said the government had a responsibility to provide a permanent solution to the health problems caused by polluted Musi water affecting people in the Bhuvanagiri region.“He stated that supplying Godavari water to the Musi basin was the only way to find a permanent solution to the problem. He demanded that the government immediately announce a comprehensive Detailed Project Report (DPR) for Musi rejuvenation and the linking of Godavari waters.“He also urged the government to develop Shamirpet Lake in Medchal district as a reservoir and implement the proposal to supply Godavari water to the Yadadri Bhuvanagiri region from there.“CPM leaders from the Medchal-Malkajgiri district committee, Ghatkesar mandal committee and Medipally mandal committee accorded a grand welcome to the padayatra team.
