Padma Rao Goud flays Congress government over welfare promises

BRS stages protest in Secunderabad, organises 'Vantavarpu' at Addagutta



“Indian chronicle Secunderabad, September 04:” Secunderabad MLA and former Deputy Speaker T. Padma Rao Goud on Friday alleged that the Congress government had failed to fulfil its electoral assurances to senior citizens, widows, persons with disabilities and women. “Addressing a protest organised by the Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) at Addagutta in Secunderabad constituency, Mr. Padma Rao Goud alleged that the government had failed to implement its promises, including enhanced social security pensions, ₹2,500 monthly assistance to women under the Mahalakshmi scheme and the provision of one tola of gold along with Kalyana Lakshmi and Shaadi Mubarak benefits. “The BRS leader said the Congress government had completed nearly 1,000 days in office without providing the promised benefits to people. He alleged that the government’s six guarantees and 420 electoral assurances remained largely unfulfilled. “As part of the protest, BRS workers organised a ‘Vantavarpu’ and distributed “dues cards” highlighting the government’s unfulfilled promises. Party workers raised slogans against the government and displayed a large banner. “BRS Secunderabad youth leader Rameshwar Goud alleged that people across sections had become disillusioned with the government. Dowry Harassment: Husband Sets Wife on Fire After Pouring Petrol on Her

““MEDIPALLY, SEPTEMBER 4 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Medipally police have registered a case against a man for allegedly harassing his wife for additional dowry and attempting to kill her by pouring petrol on her and setting her on fire. According to Medipally police, 21-year-old Rathnavath Anitha, a resident of Balaji Township in Mallapur, married Ludavath Lalu in a love marriage on February 3, 2023. The couple has a two-year-old daughter. “For the past two months, Lalu had allegedly been harassing Anitha, demanding additional dowry. Unable to bear the harassment, Anitha left her marital home about a month ago and moved to her parental home in RTC Colony, Chengicherla, along with her daughter. “On September 2, Lalu reportedly came to his in-laws’ house and forcibly took their daughter with him. The following morning, September 3, he returned to Anitha’s parental

home. At around 3:30 p.m. that day, Anitha’s father questioned Lalu about the whereabouts of his granddaughter, which allegedly angered him. “Lalu then reportedly took petrol that he had hidden under a bed, poured it on Anitha’s back and set her on fire. When Anitha’s mother tried to save her daughter, she too sustained burn injuries. Family members immediately intervened and managed to put



out the flames using clothes. “Anitha, who suffered serious injuries in the incident, was rushed by locals to Gandhi Hospital in a 108 ambulance. Based on Anitha’s statement recorded while she was undergoing treatment, Medipally police registered a case against Ludavath Lalu under Crime No. 1277/2026, invoking Sections 85 and 109 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS) and Sections 3 and 4 of the Dowry Prohibition Act. Police have taken up the investigation

Medipally Police Crack Chain-Snatching Case in 20 Hours

Two Accused Arrested; Gold Mangalsutra, Two-Wheeler and Two Mobile Phones Seized

“MEDIPALLY, SEPTEMBER 4 (INDIAN CHRONICLE): Medipally police have cracked a chain-snatching case in which a woman's gold mangalsutra was snatched at RTC Colony in Chengicherla, within just 20 hours. Two accused were arrested, and police recovered a three-tola gold mangalsutra, a two-wheeler and two mobile phones from their possession. The accused were produced before the court and will be sent to judicial remand. According to Medipally ACP Mohan Kumar, Kangal VVSP Prasad, a native of Rajahmundry in Andhra Pradesh, and Ajmeera Venkatesh, a native of Narsampet in Warangal district of Telangana,



had been friends for the past year. Due to financial difficulties, they decided to make easy money by targeting women wearing gold jewellery and committing chain snatchings. As part of their plan, they booked a two-wheeler through the ONN app and collected it from Uppal. They then moved around Pocharam and Chengicherla areas, observing women and looking for potential targets. On September 2 at around 8:20 p.m., they spotted Challa Bharathi walking near RTC Colony in Chengicherla, under the limits of Medipally Police Station in Medchal-Malkajgiri district. Ajmeera Venkatesh forcibly snatched the gold mangalsutra from her neck and fled towards Prasad, who was waiting on the two-wheeler. Both men then escaped towards Chengicherla on the same vehicle. Based on the victim's complaint, Medipally police registered a case and launched an investigation by analysing CCTV footage and technical evidence. Within 20 hours of the incident, police identified and apprehended the accused. During interrogation, police recovered the stolen three-tola gold mangalsutra, the two-wheeler and two mobile phones from their possession. The investigation revealed that the accused had committed the chain snatching due to financial difficulties, ACP Mohan Kumar said. The accused will be produced before the court and sent to judicial remand. The investigation is continuing, and police are also examining whether the accused have any previous criminal cases against them. ACP Mohan Kumar congratulated the Medipally Crime Police personnel for successfully cracking the case within 20 hours and rewarded the staff who demonstrated exceptional investigative skills.

Congress Mandal President Questions BRS Leaders Over KCR's Past Promises

“How many promises made during the 10-year BRS rule were actually fulfilled?” – Gurnule Mengaji Kumrambheem, Asifabad, District Reporter "Indian Chronicle" September.05. “The Congress government has implemented several welfare programmes within 1,000 days” Wankidi: Wankidi Mandal Congress Party President Gurnule Mengaji strongly reacted to the dharnas being organised by BRS leaders, alleging that the Congress government has failed to fulfil its election promises. He urged the people of Telangana to recall the promises made by former Chief Minister K. Chandrashekar Rao before coming to power. Speaking on the occasion, Gurnule Mengaji said that it was ironic for BRS leaders to stage protests alleging that the Congress government was not implementing its promises. “People of Telangana should once listen to the speeches delivered by former Chief Minister KCR during public meetings before he came to power. People should also remember the promises made during the ten-year BRS rule and examine how many of them were actually fulfilled,” he said. He referred to several promises made by the then BRS leadership, including making a Dalit the Chief Minister, providing three acres of land to every Dalit family, implementing Dalit Bandhu, BC Bandhu and Minority Bandhu schemes, constructing double-bedroom houses for the poor and issuing ration cards to eligible families. “Let the people watch the videos of KCR's own speeches and remember the promises made in the past. Those very promises will provide the answer today. Instead of criticising the present government alone, BRS leaders should first explain what happened to the promises made during their ten years in power,” Mengaji said. “Welfare Schemes Within 1,000 Days” Gurnule Mengaji stated that the Congress government, under the leadership of Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, has been giving priority to welfare and development programmes since coming to power. He said that measures have been taken to provide ration cards to eligible beneficiaries and that Indiramma houses are being sanctioned and constructed in villages as well as urban areas, with housewarming ceremonies being conducted for completed houses. He highlighted several welfare initiatives of the Congress government, including free bus travel for women, free electricity up to 200 units for eligible households, LPG cylinders at ₹500 and the distribution of fine rice through the public distribution system. According to Mengaji, the government is focusing on the welfare of poor families, women, farmers, workers and weaker sections of society. He urged people to compare the performance of the previous government with the programmes being implemented by the present Congress government. “The people themselves know which government has done what and which promises were fulfilled or left pending. Rather than relying on political statements, people should assess the promises made in the past and the welfare and development programmes being implemented today before forming their opinion,” Gurnule Mengaji said.
